My Interest in Science Fiction

I came into old time radio as a side to my main love, science fiction. I found out about some fantastic short story recreations in about the 1980's. I am by no means an expert in OTR but I can hold my own when it comes to science fiction. Here is a synopsis of the Science Fiction Presentation I did at the REPS February meeting.

Radio followed where the pulps and comic magazines had trail-blazed. Radio pioneer Hugo Gernsback, considered the father of science fiction was one of the first publishers in 1926 of a magazine exclusively publishing science fiction, aptly named *Amazing Stories*.

One of radio's first science fiction series was *Buck Rogers in the Twenty-fifth Century* (1932). Buck came to radio by

way of pulp to a comic adaptation. Buck played to the juvenile audience. Buck was written by Philip Francis Nowlan. An odd note is Dick Calkins, the newspaper artist for Buck, was a writer for the radio show.



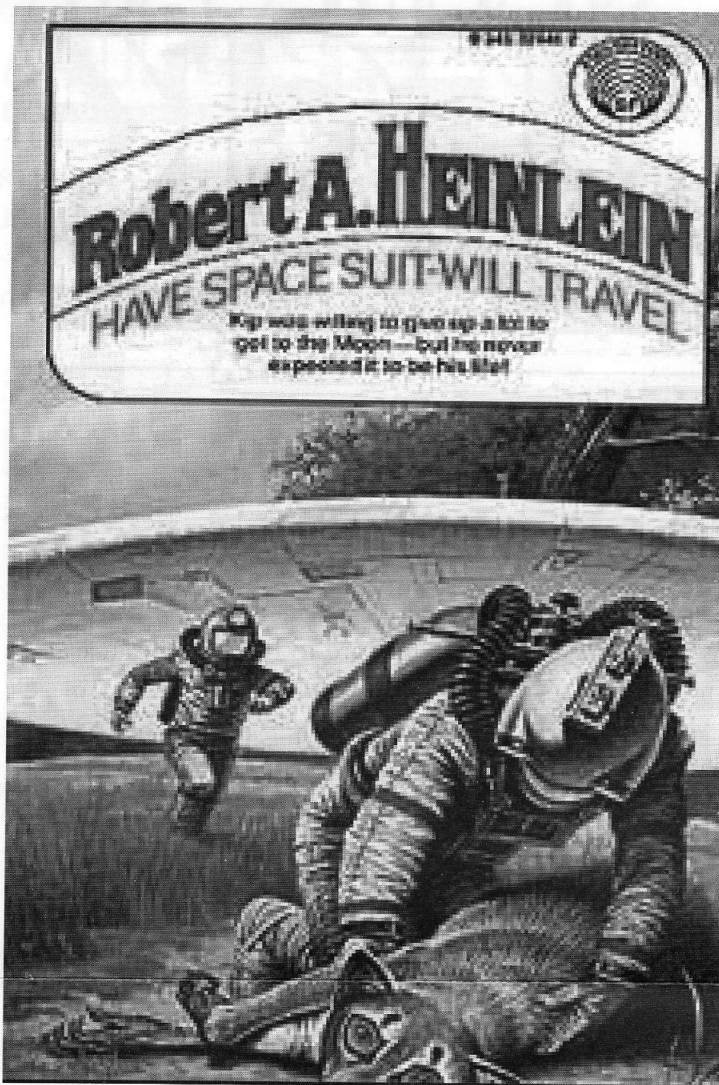

Flash Gordon was another show from the thirties (1935) that originated elsewhere. Flash, however, started in comics, then pulps, followed by radio. Gale Gordon (Lucy TV star as well as Osgood Conklin of *Our Miss Brooks*) starred as Flash. This was another show for juveniles. Alex Raymond created Flash and Buster Crabbe played him (as well as *Buck Rogers*) in the movie serials.

The most famous science fiction produced on radio was Orson Welles' Mercury Theatre production of War of the Worlds, in 1938. This was loosely based on Herbert George Wells' novel (also pulp). Science fiction was largely missing from radio except for science fiction / horror crossovers like The Meteor Man on Lights Out.

The 1940's did not fare much better than the 1930's as far as quantity goes though the quality was better. Suspense, radio's outstanding theater of thrills broadcast Donovan's Brain in 1944, their first two-part episode and first science fiction. Escape did an adaptation of George Stewart's Earth Abides. These are two excellent examples of adult drama.

The first regular science fiction drama, 2000 Plus began broadcasting in 1950. It ran for almost two years. While it was good Dimension X was great. It ran for two years as well. Dimension X plots were based on short stories from Astounding Stories, a digest pulp and were scripted by



George Lefferts and Ernest Kinoy. They also penned some original scripts.

X Minus One came on NBC roughly 4 years (1955) after the demise of Dimension X. The first 15 shows were repeats of it. The other 90+ came from the pages

Many of our regular guests will be back again and we have some people that have agreed to attend for their first time. We are doing some recreations that we have not attempted to do before that will be exciting.

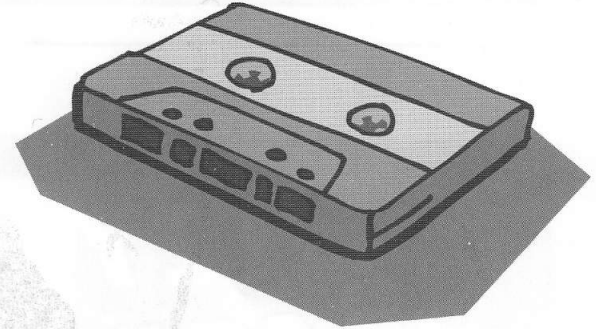
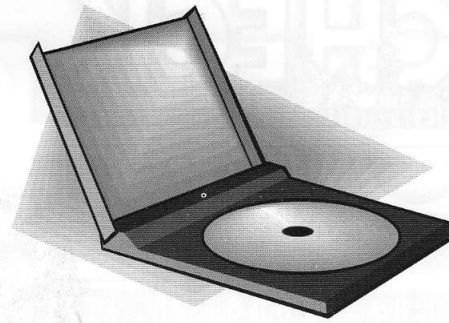
