TAPE DECK: Fred Dickey with the help of a doctor made some extensive tests to see the effect of X-rays on tape. His conclusion was that X-rays do not affect the recorded program but too much of it may affect the base tape so if a recorded tape has been exposed to X-ray it may be wise to redub it...Paul Thompson mentions that Shamrock tape is apparently getting worse with poorly done splices and missing oxide...A good tape as Capitol.

TAPE TIP3: (This information is mainly for the beginner) 1. When you list programs be as detailed as possible. Give full descriptions, date, title if any (don't make one up but describe action or opening), guests, time, etc. Also indicate if few generations as well as quality.

2. Don't send master tapes in the mail. They could very easily get lost or stolen 3. Keep a record of programs ordered and keep a master list of all shows so you don't duplicate orders.

ASHER AND LITTLE JIMMY: from Raymond Nemec, 1631 Garol 3t, Downers Grove, Ill 60515. I just obtained 18 15-minute programs of Asher and Little Jimmy, a father-son singing duo that sang the old mountain ballads. They were extremely popular during the 1930's starting about 1931. Asher Sizemore stayed active in radio until the late 1950's. The programs I have are numbered 10-28, except for #15. They are complete with an ad for their song book. The programs were transcribed for evening broadcast and each one contained 5 songs. Little Jimmy usually did two novelty numbers or old standards such as Home on the Range. Dad sang the old ballads. Little Jimmy closed each program with Now I Lay me Down to Sleep. Their popularity was almost boundless. When they were at W3M visitors came from all over the country to see them! They received as much as 40,000 letters a week at the peak of their popularity. Later Ahser Sizemore showed his ability to adapt to other phases of radio when he became commercial manager of a station in Indiana. I will send a list of songs they sung for a SASE. If anyone has ASHER & LITTLE JIMMY, BOB & JIM RAINES or PACKARD FAMILY please write. Also looking for old radio guides from 1939-42 era with WDZ schedules in them.

TARZEN: contributed by Pat Murray: I have given up on doing any more work on logging the several Tarzan series since there are more competent hands at work on such projects.
