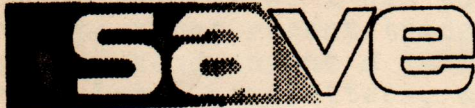

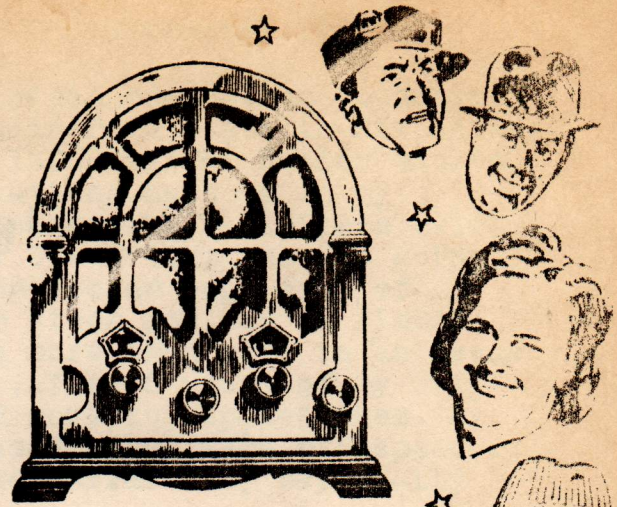

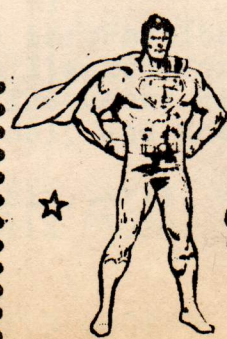

IN FOND MEMORY: Dora McCann, 69, Aug 14th; She, with her husband Alfred McCann Jr, co-hosted the WOR show THE MCCANNS AT HOME from 1931 until last November... Mrs. Jo Bellairs, 57, Aug 22; She and her husband Mel were radio personalities in the Chicago area. They owned WIVS-Am and WXRd-FM. WIVS was one of the pioneers in the area of re-broadcasting oldtime radio shows, starting in November, 1969... Thomas Gibbs, 70; musician with Ted Weems Orch and producer of Dave Garroway radio show. He was also producer and director of Monitor... Bernard Green, 66, Aug 8; Composer, conductor and arranger; Directed music on TV for Sid Caesar, UNITED STATES STEEL HOUR, GARRY MOORE SHOW; Also musical director on radio for HENRY MORGAN. Composed theme music for THE FAT MAN.

MAILING: The package that you mail your tape in (not the tape box) should be wrapped securely. Packaging tape is fine. If it is unclear how to open the package indicate on the outside. In this way the package can be reused.
