

FALL CONVENTION: On Feb. 29th the first committee meeting was held at the home of Jon Smith in White Plains, NY to plan for a fall convention for collectors of old time radio programs. Details so far:

2. It will be held between Westchester County, NY and New Haven, Ct. sometime in October or early November.
3. The main purpose will be twofold: to get collectors together to exchange ideas and visit and to honor a few old time radio personalities. It will be a tightly organized one-day affair (Saturday) from about 1 to 9.
4. Activities will include a banquet, at least one live broadcast with radio personalities using scripts of old-time shows, workshops, movies, panel discussions, and TIME to visit each other and the personalities.
5. All the good points of past conventions will be utilized. "Hello Aggin" will be the chief source of publicity and information. Anyone who has any radio related items to display, please begin letting me know. Also those interested in selling items such as books, premiums, blank tapes, records, sheet music, etc. let me know... Anyone who wishes to run a workshop which will be of interest and/or help to collectors let me know also... If you wish to work actively on the convention contact one of the committee members. Also Breakfast Frolic on WHAS in Louisville. Suppertime Frolic began with live talent in the 30's and Randy Blake sang hymns. Later, Consolidated Royal Chemical Corp. sent Randy down to WHAS to run their program on that station. When Uncle Irvin Victor and the live talent, Uncle Henry's Original Mountaineers were moved to the Breakfast Frolic, Randy Blake began doing a daily country and western DJ program. Randy left WJJD in 1955.
