IN FOND MEMORY: Frederick Borton, 86, July 20th. built the first radio transmitter in Florida. Borton was founder of WQAM in Miami... Floyd Revoir, 77, July 22; song stylist on WBBM in Chicago from 1919 and WFBL in Syracuse from 1929...Ray "Crash" Corrigan, July; was in early movies and serials...William Redfield, 49, August 17; "Billy" acted for 40 of his 49 years. He gave more than 2000 performances on stage, films, radio and TV. During the last 3½ years he has been on 87 CBS Radio Mystery Theater programs. 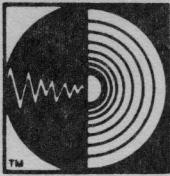
