"PERFORMANCES LOGS OF MARIAN AND JIM JORDAN: 1917-1980". This set of ten logs lists 9,800 performances of the Jordans', from their vaudeville days through the present. This information was carefully obtained by reading over 1,600 microfilms of the "Chicago Daily News" and "New York Times", and an excess of 930 scripts of the 15 minute and the Monitor series (1953-1959) to make the FM & M Log complete. Additional information was derived from Jim Jordan's personal career scrapbooks. Each of the ten logs is accompanied by an historic account; all programs are numbered, dated, and special notes are included where possible. Log #10, Fibber McGee & Molly, is the most ambitious of any log ever produced. It lists every show from start to finish (1935-1959, except for ca. 48 pgms., scripts were destroyed). Each FM & M Pgm is numbered (over 1,600 shows), titled, dated, and actor's names and special notes accompany most programs. Research was undertaken by Tom Price with assistance by Charles K. Stumpf.
