### **CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS**

#### 1994

The Friends of Old-time Radio held its 19th Annual Convention from October 20th – 22nd, 1994 at the Holiday Inn – North, Newark, New Jersey. Celebrities present who received awards were: George Balzer, Bob Drew, Dick Dudley, Ed Kemmer, Rex Koury and Jeanette Nolan. Other celebrities present were Arthur Anderson, George Ansbro, John and Ann Archer, Barney Beck, Jackson Beck, Vivian Block, Warren Bryan, Lon Clark, Gwen Davies, Bob Dryden, Ray Erlenborn, Lee Erwin, Harry Fleetwood, Earl George, Bob Hastings, Pat Hosley, Florence James, Raymond Edward Johnson, Rita Lloyd, Ted Mallie, Charlotte Manson, Bill Murtough, Clive Rice, Rosemary Rice, Rosa Rio, Adele Ronson, Terry Ross, Joan Shea, Margot Stevenson, Hal Stone, Arthur Tracy, Sybil Trent and Jane Ward. The guests socialized with fans, participated in panels and workshops and re-created 6 radio shows.

The convention began Wednesday evening with complimentary wine and cheese for the overnight guests. About 60 people attended. On Thursday, many dealers opened at 9 am. There was one afternoon workshop: John Rayburn presented "The Thrilling Days of Yesteryear." Then we had cocktails and dinner. Sixty-three fans attended during the day. One hundred forty-eight fans and guests attended in the evening. The highlight of the evening were Janet Cantor Gari and Brian Gari who reminisced about Eddie Cantor. Also introduced were Marla Slosberg whose father was Charlie Cantor and Tracey Campbell whose parents were Nora Marlowe and James McCallion. Barney Beck also reminisced. The winner of the original radio play was announced. The winner was Michael Giorgio. The

play will be presented next year.

Friday began at 9:00 with the opening of the dealers room. Sixty dealer tables were active during the convention. Two hundred thirty-nine people attended dinner with another 108 in the afternoon. Workshops and panels included the following: Jack French talked about Aviation Heroes; Tim Coco and friends gave a tribute to Fred Allen; Mitchell Weisberg ran a quiz show; The Gotham Radio Players present Lights Out, "The Bark of the Dead Dog;" Mike Mandel, with the help of Rosa Rio, Rex Koury and Lee Erwin presented a panel on Music and Its Interaction with Drama and Comedy; Raymond Edward Johnson gave another of this stirring readings; Dave Zwengler hosted "America's Town Meeting;" Larry and John Gassman with the help of George Balzer gave a tribute to Jack Benny. After dinner The Boogie Woogie Girls and Company E entertained us with songs. Jeanette Nolan was then featured in a re-creation of Escape; then Arthur Anderson, Gordon Kelley, Fran Striker, Jr., and Jordan Young talked about their books.

# LOGS AND LISTINGS FOR COLLECTORS OF OLD-TIME RADIO PROGRAMS

**HELLO AGAIN:** Now in its 25th year, Hello Again is the oldest independent newsletter dedicated to the traders and collectors of old-time radio shows. Much of the information it contains is contributed by collectors including: problems and techniques in dubbing, tape quality, what different collectors are doing and what they are looking for, updated info about new radio shows being circulated and logs related to old-time radio, deaths of radio personalities and much more. It also keeps you up to date on the annual Friends of Old-time Radio Convention. The next convention is Oct. 19 – 21, 1995 at the Holiday Inn-North, Newark, NJ.

The first issue received includes listings of all OTR clubs, publications, many dèalers, all logs available and many radio stations playing OTR. It runs about 4 to 8 pages an issue.

**Subscription is \$12.00 a year** for 6 issues per year. Send a SASE for a complimentary copy. Back issues are \$2.00. Ads are accepted.

SUSPENSE LOG: This 50-page log lists every show chronologically and alphabetically. Each entry lists date, title, and up to 2 performers when known. It also includes an introductory part listing directors, producers, musicians, sponsors and other important information. This log was recently revised in November of 1992. Cost is \$9.50 including P & H.
