



#### ... ON RADIO: A REVISED LOOK AT 1950-1975

by James F. Widner and Meade Frierson III

On the other side you will find the Table of Contents of Science Fiction on Radio. We do not really limit ourselves to science fiction (including Ray Bradbury stories not strictly sf) or radio (for context, we look at CBS-TV vis-a-vis its radio sf), or to 1950-1975 because we consider the first radio sf in the 1930s, a brief review of 1938-1949, and peek ahead a bit.

The highpoints are the detailed logs of *Dimension X* and *X Minus One* by Jim Widner. Extensive publishing notes on all series are valuable to the sf collector as the logs, cast lists and plot summaries are to the OTR collector.

Unfortunately, despite some requests, we did not broaden the scope of the book to include the sf adventure programs with a fixed cast (sometimes called juveniles) but rather deal exclusively with the anthology programs that contained sf themes, original scripts or adaptations.

Finally, notice that the BBC and SF 68, both significant contributions to recorded sf, are covered with emphasis on the literature adapted for radio.
