The first 2 are Calamity Jane and Belle Starr...Groucho Marx, Master Detective by Ron Goulart, St. Martins Press (1-800-221-7945) or 212-674-5151; \$23; 260 pp; 1998; this is a mystery novel in which Groucho Marx plays a detective, teaming up with an ex-police reporter turned radio scriptwriter, who works to solve the murder of a young actress...The Creature Features Movie Guide by John Stanley, Creatures At Large, Box 687, Pacifica, CA 94044 (650) 355-7323 < Creature@netwiz.net>. Several editions have been written. I am looking at the 4th edition published in 1994. There is a fifth published in 1997. Soft cover price is \$20. It contains capsuled reviews of over 5600 movies about science fiction, horror and fantasy. All obscure and rare titles are in this. This is a must for anyone interested in this area...Ol' Blue Eyes, A Frank Sinatra Encyclopedia by Leonard Mustazza; Greenwood Publishing Group (Above); 480 pages; 1998; \$59.95. The book covers all aspects of Frank's career in detail including all songs recorded in alphabetical order; It covers his radio career with exact dates in most cases but does not have a log for the shows, just a description with the dates. It even covers the internet... If you are interested in Hollywood Music, the most complete book ever written is Hollywood Song by Ken Bloom (Facts on File; 1552 pages; 3 volumes; \$225; 1995) The book is the most comprehensive reference source guide available to songs from nearly 7000 American and foreign films.
