DEATHS: Harold J. True, Feb 15, age 81. Mr. True was a onetime announcer on the LONE RANGER SHOW...WALLY COX, Feb 15, 48. Mr. Cox was best known for his role as MR. PEEPERS, on television from 1952-1955...Haddox Paul Myers, Jan 29, 76. Mr. Myers was founder of HAVEN OF REST, a religious program that began in 1934 and is still heard over 165 radio stations in the US and Canada.

Don't list any show unless you have listened to enough of it to evaluate it.
