RUGGLES RAMBLINGS ** Part 3

1. Why don't more traders make use of their tape recorder counters? Most machines are built with these 3 or 4 digit counters and I find it very helpful to a. determine if shows are off speed and b. getting shows located properly on a tape, instead of all jammed up tight at the beginning of the reel. First, put on a reel of the standard brand of tape that you narmally use. Let the machine run for 15-30 seconds, using a stop watch. This is your lead-in tape and will avoid frayed or split ends. Now set the counter at 000. Let the tape run to the 15 minute and 15 second mark. Stop the tape and note the counter marking. Do the same at the 30:30 mark, 45:45 and 61 minute mark. Most tapes run about 63 minutes (1200 ft rells @ 3 3/4 IPS). You now keep this list of counter markings handy. You can now see if shows are off-speed and properly space shows.

2. Why are people trying to dub transcriptions on home machines. A good example is the series of 15 Stan Freberg shows from 1957; somewhere along the line, wherever these originated from, shows # 9 and 10 are very poorly dubbed with intros and extros cut off. I have yet to find a collector who has these 2 shows in excellent sound and complete. Transcription dubbing must be done on professional radio equipment, preferably at a station. I've been a radio broadcaster for 25

years and know what I'm talking about.

3. Where are we all going in this hobby? Someone should start to set standards and soon. Many collectors want VG to EX quality; others don't care. Most of us want complete shows; others edit out intros and commercials, as long as they have the story line. I suppose it's up to each person to decide how much time, effort, and money he (she) is going to put into this hobby. But the day will come when you were sorry you collected incomplete and unintelligible shows. You'll want to start over. Take a tip from one who started over twice. accept only quality shows now. They are available.
