PERSONALITIES: From Robert Pettit who got it from an office newsletter of Ogilvy and Mather, advertising firm that handles Pepperidge Farm...Titus Moody, whose name in real life is Parker Fennelly, has been extolling the virtues of Pepperidge Farm products for almost twenty years. Over his long career in show business, Parker's experiences have run the gamut. He's acted on radio television, Broadway, and the movies. He's also written radio, television and stage plays; most notably "Cuckoos on the Hearth" which ran 129 performances on Broadway in 1942 and "Fulton of Oak Falls" which was produced by George M Cohen in the 30's...As an actor, his favorite and most famous role is that of Titus Moody, which he played on the Fred Allen radio show, especially in the "Allen's Alley" segment. After the program went off the air, Parker was permitted to keep the Titus Moody stage name. He became the Pepperidge Farm spokesman in 1955. Parker and his wife, Catherine, live in Peekskill, NY. The Fennelly's have two daughters and 4 grandsons. Parker's hobbies are gardening and the New York Mets. He has a great interest in psychic phenomena, in the winter months he writes plays. This summer he was called upon to appear at 2 Pepperidge Farm Bakery division sales meetings. His yarn-spinning was an overwhelming success. A sample of his New England wit: "The town I come from is so small we didn't even have a village idiot. We has to take turns...Folks back home live a long, long time. Once a feller passin' through asked if anyone ever died. I said, "No, but occasionally we bury somebody on suspicion." (Parker gets Hello Again and if anyone wants his address so he can write him, plays send me a SASE and I will send it to you)
