

THE WRITING OF THIS ISSUE of HELLO AGAIN is one of the most enjoyable experiences I have had. On July 4-6 I spent a 3 day period at Dunfey's Hotel in Hyannis that I am quite sure will never be duplicated and I know I will never forget. For 3 days I talked with, dined with, played piano with, drank with, and took pictures of more radio personalities than I thought I would meet in a lifetime. They are the friendliest and warmest people you would ever meet. Many brought their spouses. One of my greatest thrills was to accompany Dennis Day informally in the dining room. All this was done to raise money for muscular dystrophy... For 54 continuous hours from 6:00 Friday night to midnight Sunday there were rebroadcasts and recreations of your favorite programs all heard on WBZ in Boston. They never hesitated in talking to the many people who came to see them.
