FALL CONVENTION (Second report): On April 4th the second committee meeting was held at the home of Jay Hickerson. Attending were 1 DeSalvatore, S Weiss with Herb Goldman of the Al Jolson Society, L Palmer, S Trapani. Not present were J Smith, J Webb, C Stumpf, C and B Witte, P Greco...Possible sites were discussed. A tentative reservation has been set at the Holiday Inn in Meriden, Ct on Oct. 30th. This was the site of our third convention. It is right off I-91. Jon Smith is checking out hotels in New York City and a definite decision will be made at the May meeting.
