With his wife, Norma, he attended our 1977 and 78 conventions at which he helped provide the sound effects for workshops and the radio shows. He was currently providing sound effects for ALL MY CHILDREN...Ed was instrumental in locating many personalities for our conventions and was very enthusiastic about our activities. He and Norma were especially friendly with Joe Webb and his fiance, Anne Nikl...Ed will be missed by all of us.
