CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

1991

The Friends of Old-time Radio held its 16th Annual Convention from October 24th – 26th, 1991 at the Holiday Inn – North, Newark, New Jersey. Celebrities present who received awards were: Harry Bartell, Bob Bell, Vivian Block, Oscar Brand, Bob Bruce, Lillian Buyeff, Sam Edwards, Harry Fleetwood, Ray Kemper, Ruth Last, Tyler McVey, George Petrie and Frances von Bernhardi. Anne Hummert received an award but was unable to attend. Other celebrities present were Arthur Anderson, George Ansbro, John Archer, Parley Baer, Barney Beck, Jackson Beck, Joan Benny, Fran Carlon, Lon Clark, Bob Dryden, Louise Erickson, Ray Erlenborn, Earl George, Bob Hastings, Raymond Edward Johnson, Robert E. Lee, Abby Lewis, Peg Lynch, Gil Mack, Charlotte Manson, Shirley Mitchell, Bill Murtough, Bill Owen, Stella Reynolds Moss, Adele Ronson, Terry Ross, Sidney Slon, Margot Stevenson, Ezra Stone, Arthur Tracy, Sybil Trent, Willard Waterman, Florence Williams, and Betty Wragge.
