## HISTORY

After World War II, performer Jean Tighe began to entertain bed-ridden veterans in military hospitals. But she soon realized that what was needed was a way to get the patients to participate in their own entertainment, and eventually, their own recovery.

So in 1948, the Veterans Bedside Network (at that time called the Veterans Hospital Radio Guild) began its regular VA hospital visits to Halloran Hospital on Staten Island. Today, over one million patient performances later, VBN's unique program of participation therapy is in over one hundred Department of Veterans Affairs hospitals across the nation and is available only to veterans in these hospitals. All of our work is accomplished through private donations - VBN receives no government funding of any kind. We are a private, not-for-profit, tax-exempt organization.

VBN's work is to encourage, to inspire, to break through. A patient whose name doctors have been trying to learn for six months tells all to a volunteer and sings a duet with her to boot. A man living in an angry, unbreakable silence finally accepts a part in a play, and upon becoming a regular participant in the script activity gives "one of the most moving and sensitive performances I have ever seen or heard, anywhere, anytime." When that same patient's recovery accelerates rapidly from then on so that he leaves the hospital within a month—it is very easy to see that VBN is an important part of a patient's recuperation.
