<u>LOGS</u>: I have recently prepared a Command Performance listing of all 213 circulating shows. It is in 5 formats. It is in numerical order with up to 4 performers and each performer's field is in alphabetical order. Cost is \$5 plus \$1 for P&H.

I now have completed my longest program log to date. It is the complete log of CBS Radio Mystery Theater. Each of the 2970 chronological entries either has the title of the show and up to 3 performers if a new title, or if a repeat, has the date of the original broadcast. It also includes a list of many of the writers of original shows. Many thanks to Dave Siegel for his help. He has every show that was broadcast.

Cost is \$15 plus \$2 P&H or a total of \$17.

I have also revised my Lux Radio Theater Log. All the programs are listed in chronological and alphabetical order. Just about all programs have 3 performers listed. Cost is \$8.00 plus \$1.50 for P & H.
