Friends of Old-Time Radio Script Contest

The 11th annual script writing contest is now open. This year your half-hour script must be based on any recognizable classic radio program - comedy or drama, with original characters and new ones added if you wish.

But please, no spoofs with Jack Benny, Abbott and Costello, others. That hasn't worked in the past. The script must be ready to produce - typed double spaced, large enough for actors to read, all sound cues included. Usual format includes short opening, middle and closing commercials, whether for a product that existed then, or one of your own. Try to set the story in its original time period, unless science fiction. Try to keep cast to ten or less, although some actors can double in smaller parts.

First prize in the contest is \$200, and the script will be performed live at our 2005 convention. Second prize winner, which will not be performed, is \$100.

Scripts must be submitted by August 31, 2004 to Dave Zwengler, 319 Plymouth Road, North Brunswick NJ 08902 (732 - 0940 - 7639). Three experienced judges will pick the winning scripts and detailed suggestions for improvements will be sent to non-winners. If you want a primer on preferred page format, send SASE to Mr. Zwengler.

This year's winner, "You Are There" by Edgar Russell, III will be performed at our October convention.

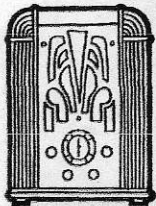

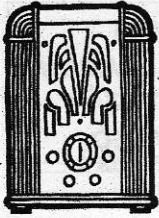

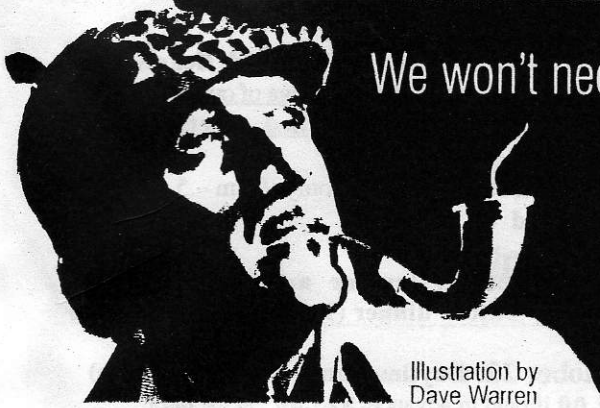
