In the past few weeks I have been listening to more and more of the old radio programs, I have borrowed from the club library. Also reviewing my own collection. It the process of checking my own collection i have found many cassettes of very poor quality.

There are several reasons for this which I am sure other club members have also. When I started my collection way, way back when I first started collecting and joined the Old Time Radio Club I only bought the cheaper brand of cassettes, after all I thought there all the same. Also I recorded everything and anything I could get my hands on. A lot of the shows were of poor quality but no matter I copied them anyway, because I wanted to build up may collection.

Another reason was the cassette recorder I bought. It was of lesser quality, too. Most of my cassettes at that time (about 15 years ago) were music from my old record collection. Mostly 78 rpm and some 45's. I borrowed a lot of records from my friend Ed Coons, who has a huge collection of records of all types of music.

I brought a reel to reel unit from Ed Wanat for \$75, a real goos buy. I began to record on reels then by the dozen. My son-in-law (Poor-Jim as the Evil Prof Boncore calls him) still has the unit and it still works like almost new.

By the was Prof Boncore, I gave "Poor-Jim" the Roberts for free no strings atachedm no charge. Well anyway, I started taping radio shows on the reels as I have said because reels were cheaper than cassettes. I still copied some of my favorite shows on cassette so I could listen to them in my van.

It makes it easy to pick out 4 or 5 shows to listen to, even at home or now in my woodshop while making a toy for one of my grandchildren.

The problem I had with the reel to reel unit was locating the show I wanted to listen to. Now thats no problem with the cassettes. Then of course I couldn't use my reel to reel unit in my van or car.

I remember way back when Dick Olday and I were talking about the merits of reel to reel units and the many more uses of a cassette unit. Dick pointed out all the arguements in favor of a cassette unit over the reel to reel unit. Now after fourteen years have gone by I believe him.

I'm glad I finally did go to a cassette recorder. Not only are they cheaper in cost for an excellent unit but are easy to find. On the other hand reel to reel units are hard to find and very expensive when you do find them. Fast dubing and fast rewind helps also on cassette units.

Its a long hard process to review a large cassette collection (mine contains about 900 cassettes About 100 or more are music, with all the rest are devoted to Old Time Radio programs) I have recopied a lot of the radio shows and a few of the music cassettes but thats just the beginning for

Ine thing I did notice when I re-wrote my cassette catalog, was that I had very few of the after school radio serials. My collection of Christmas shows is in pretty good shape and soon will be better. The EVIL Prof Boncore has taken a "I am a good guy pill" and loaned me a couple of his reels of "Star Wars" which I will begin to copy on cassette next week. Of course I will use "Poor-Jim's" reel to reel unit.



ANOTHER WORD ABOUT DEALERS

Last year I wrote a couple of articles about dealers, that aroused some ire among a few people. Personally, I was astounded at the over reaction by some people, though I had been hoping for a few comments. After all, why write anything if you can't create a little discussion, or at least thought.

Since writing that article, I have attended tow OTR conventions and met a few dealers. And yes, I did make some purchases too! More than I planned, but none that I regret. So, I would say that perhaps I look upon dealers more favorably than it may have come across in my articles.

I was never against dealers within the OTR group. My articles tried to explain that dealers were handy but not necessary to a beginning collector of OTR. the benefit of one or more OTR club libraries, a good start could be made on any collection without the expense of purchasing everything from a dealer. This was based on an assumption that most people starting out were like I was. a family and other expenses, they couldn't afford to buy many shows. They needed an inexpensive way to begin. I remember when I first started collecting, I had a problem just to find the money to buy blank tapes. One reason I have a squealing tape problem today!

However, if your finances can handle it, the use of one or more dealers is an easy way to build up your collection, and specially to obtain many of the less widely distributed shows. It also usually insures you will receive a decent copy. I say usually, because I have occasionally received a lousy show from a dealer. Either poor sound, or terrible editing.

in addition to the occasional show with poor sound, I have ran into a few other problems with dealers. The most common one is an incorrectly identifiied show. The label will read one thing, and the actual show will be something else. Over the past year, I have purchased at least a dozen shows with this problem. Luckily, I have been able to identify most of them. However a couple of them had to be returned to the dealer for correction.

Another problem has been in obtaining a reply from a dealer, either when writing for information, or regarding a complaint. I know most of these dealers do this as a one man operation, but I would think

their goodwill would require they keep up to date on their correspondence. I wrote to one dealer almost ten months ago, and hae received no reply to date. Naturally, he is now off my list.

As I said above, one of the main benefits of buying from a dealer is the sound quality. Another is information. Most dealers carry a wide array of shows, but they seem to concretrate on a few. Probably because those are the ones they are interested in. Because of that fact, you can usually obtain a lot of information from them about those particular shows. This is specially true if you are able to contact them in person at an OTR show or convention.

Just a few suggestions for those who have never, or seldom, purchased anything from a dealer, but may be considering it. The best way to get acquainted with a dealer is to attend an OTR convention, or anyplace else where you can make direct purchases. Buy a few tapes, and check them out.. If they all check out satisfactorily you can assume that any mail order purchases from him will also be satisfactory. Check out as many dealers as you can find at that time. Even if you don't want to purchase from all of them, it is always nice to know where you can obtain decent shows, if you want to do so in the future.

If you are unable to contact dealers in person, I would suggest you make a few small orders by mail, from various dealers who advertise in OTR publications. After checking out a few purchases, you'll have some idea of what to expect from that dealer regarding quality and service. Over a period of time you can obtain a list of respectable dealers, as above.

I have not mentioned checking for price among the dealers since I have found their prices are pretty competive. MOst of them are in the same price range, so price is not a real consideration. Quality and service are.

I have not had the benefit of Jim Snyder's many years of checking out OTR dealers, but he mentioned several times that there were a few dealers who did not provide what they should have. And according to a letter in the last issue of this newsletter, it still happens ocassionally. So, just becasue you read the ad in a respected OTR publication, it doesn't mean you can accept the ad as gospel. Check

them out as I suggested, so even if they don't produce, you will only be out a few dollars.

As for me, now that the children are grown and gone and I have a little more time and money to spend on my hobbies, I notice I am turning to dealers more and more often. They are convenient, they are reasonable in price and they usually provide a quality show. And they do add to the enlargement of the volume of collectible shows by searching for and releasing additional shows. But remember, you can collect and enjoy OTR without ever making any contact with a dealer. It's an option, not a requirement!


