EDITORIAL

I had planned to make this the 100th consecutive issue of the GLOBE CIRCLER an elaborate edition with extra pages and extra features to celebrate the occasion. Since the time these plans were made this country has been plunged into WAR. A deliberate attack on this country and every thing it stands for has been made. Every thing else must now be subordinated to a single and unified effort by every man, woman and child in these United States of America to win this conflict and to destroy once and for all, utterly and completely, this many headed monster which seeks to rule the universe, to make slaves of mankind, to deprive free peoples of the rights of life, liberty and pursuit of happiness.

Each person can help in some small way. The entire facilities of the I.D.A. are being reorganized on a wartime basis. Listening not for pleasure only but in the interests of vital necessity will be continually emphasized during the emergency period. Experienced shortwave monitors (listeners) are needed in the interests of defense. Many agencies need accurate and up-to-the minute shortwave statistics these days. You can help in making shortwave information of this nature available to press, radio, government and other authorized defense sources that may need it. I will undertake to handle this data, classify it, compile it. You can help by donating a little time each day to a careful & systematic search of the shortwave channels for the following types of information: New stations, changes in frequency or schedule, Times for newscasts in English & other languages, times for peak reception for the weaker stations or those of most timely war interest; types of identifying signals used; other detailed information about schedules, location, power, address etc. Keep a pencil & pad before you and jot down anything you may come across and then shoot it immediately into the headquarters of the I.D.A. Some small seemingly insignificant fact may prove of vital importance to a defense agency that may need it. We are supposedly shortwave monitoring experts. Now is the time to put this skill and knowledge to a useful benefit for those who need it. I am depending upon you.
