

FIBBER MC GEE AND MOLLY

Jim and Marian Jordan, who were childhood sweethearts from Peoria, had been performing together in vaudeville and on radio; but until the "McGee's" came into being, were only mildly successful. The Fibber character developed into the lovable blunderer, while Molly became the faithful and strong, long-suffering wife. The show hosted many other characters, some of the most memorable were Teeny (who's voice was really Marian's), the Old Timer, Abigail Uppington, Myrt (the telephone operator whom you never heard) and Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve (who later left the program to star in his own show). There was no commercial break in the middle of the show. Instead the Johnson Wax salesman would appear as a character in the show, and incorporate the selling of the product into the action. The show lasted from 1935 to 1957, and became so popular that in 1941 it topped both Jack Benny and Bob Hope to become #1 in the ratings.

THE GREAT GILDERSLEEVE

Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve was a former neighbor and rival of Fibber McGee. One day in 1941 he left for a short business trip to Summerfield, telling his tearful employees at the Gildersleeve Girdle Works that he might be gone for three days. However, he did not return, except for occasional visits. He became the water commissioner of Summerfield, and settled down to rear his nephew Leroy and niece Marjorie, while becoming the town's most eligible bachelor. Other memorable characters on this show were Judge Horace Hooker, with whom Gildersleeve had a long-running feud; Peavey, the henpecked druggist; and Birdie, the Gildersleeve cook. Gildersleeve was played by Harold Peary for almost 10 years, after which Willard Waterman took over. The program remained popular until the end, which came in 1958.

LUM & ABNER

The old "Jot 'Em Down Store" was opened for business in



April 1931 by two drawling hill people from Arkansas. Abner Peabody (Norris Goff) was a gambler who loved checkers and horsetrading, and Lum Edwards (Chester Lauck) was careful about money and wheelingdealing, although both men were easily taken in by cons. Most of the action took place in the

store, where the other characters in the show gathered: Cedric Weehunt, village idiot; Grandpappy Spears, who loved to beat Abner at checkers; Squire Skimp, local loan shark; Dick Huddleston, owner of a rival store; Snake Hogan, town tough; and the weak-kneed Mousy Gray. All parts were played by Lauck and Goff, and only much later were other actors added. The series first started out as a 15 minute daily show, growing to a half-hour situation comedy in 1948. Lum and Abner was such a popular show that it had a twenty-two year run on radio!

BING CROSBY

Harry Lillis Crosby was studying law when he discovered that entertaining was much more fun. He became a singing drummer with the name Bing, which he got from a comic strip called Bingville Bugle. He toured with Paul Whiteman, ending up at the Coconut Grove. It was there that Bing first sang on the air, and also met his future wife, Dixie Lee. It was said that Bing's famous recording of "I Surrender, Dear" was done to win her over. The recording won both Dixie, and a contract with CBS. After 6 years of relative obscurity, Bing Crosby became a star.

BABY SNOOKS

Fanny Brice, alias Baby Snooks, was a born entertainer. Before she was 20, she became one of the Ziegfeld Follies girls. She was a singer with a comic bent, and the audience loved her. The movie



"Funny Girl" starring Barbra Streisand portrays this aspect of her life. Although Fanny first introduced "Baby Snooks" at a party in 1921, it wasn't until 1928 that she brought her to radio. Once Snooks was established as a radio star, Fanny rarely was seen out of character, using the Snooks voice and personality. Snooks was a brat, playing her Mommy and Daddy against each other, but was the soul of innocence when confronted.

Snooks was popular, moving from 15 minute skits on the Maxwell House Coffee Time Show to her own Baby Snooks Show in 1944. The show was still going strong in 1951, when Fanny suffered a cerebral hemorrhage and died at the age of 59.

THE BICKERSONS

They fight, they pick, they squabble and squawk—they're The Bickersons, America's most famous bickering couple. Portrayed by Don Ameche and Frances Langford, the couple enjoyed such great popularity as a skit on The Charlie McCarthy Show, that in 1946 they became the focal point of a new show called Drene Time. John Bickerson and his wife Blanche fought about everything, but most often they fought because John loved to sleep, and Blanche, an insomniac, hated to be up alone. Old Gold sponsored the 1947 season, which featured Bickersons skits and monologues by Frank Morgan. Although the show was on for only two seasons, it has become a mini-classic. In 1951, a summertime Bickerson show featured Frances Langford and Lew Parker as the battling pair.

Jack Benny

Jack Benny was bom Benjamin Kubelsky in 1894. He quit high school to go into vaudeville. While on tour, he met Sadie Marks, who became his wife. She later became the character Mary Livingstone on the Jack Benny Show. The Benny Show spanned the years 1932 to 1955, and was later on TV. Jack's character on stage was stingy and vain. He took pride in his blue eyes and his violin playing, worried about losing his hair, and never admitted to being older than 39. This was opposite of his "real" life where he was kind, generous and loyal. He was the first comedian to give major roles to his supporting cast. They each developed distinct personalities—Rochester, Dennis Day, Phil Harris, Mel Blanc (as Professor LeBlanc, Maxwell and Carmichael the bear) and Mary Livingstone. Even though Benny relied on writers for his material, nobody in the business could deliver a joke as well as he.

When George and Gracie first teamed up, George gave himself all the funny lines, relegating Gracie to the "straight man" role.



However, Gracie got all the laughs, and George's "jokes" went flat. George made a big decision, and from that time forward Gracie got all the jokes. The audience loved it! Their humor was timeless, and audiences were enchanted with Gracie and her inside-out logic. Her character was ripe for publicity,

and Gracie's name was constantly in front of the public with such running gags as looking for her "brother", while her real brother had to go into hiding. In 1940 she ran for President of the United States. She made surprise visits on other radio shows spreading her wisdom to the nation, such as on the national debt: "It's something to be proud of; it's the biggest in the world, isn't it?" In 1950 the team made a successful transition into television and had a hit show until 1958 when Gracie retired.

ABBOTT AND COSTELLO

William Abbott and Lou Costello met in 1929 when Costello was doing a vaudeville act in the theater where Abbott was working the box office. Abbott found himself on stage as Costello's straight man, and soon they became a regular team. They became an instant hit on The Kate Smith Hour, and it was on this show that Lou adopted a high squeaky voice when it was found that listeners couldn't tell his voice from Bud's. This radio success led to Hollywood, films and appearances on other radio shows. Their first starring radio roles came when they took over Fred Allen's summer slot in 1940. Costello earned the name "hard luck Lou" because of the many tragedies in his life, including the drowning of his year old son while Lou was rehearsing for his first show. Costello died in 1959, and Abbott thought of going on without him. However, that didn't work, and Abbott died penniless in 1974.

SHERLOCK HOLMES

The world's most famous detective came to radio in 1930 when a young actress/writer, Edith Meiser, finally persuaded NBC to air a series she had adapted from the original Arthur Conan Doyle stories. From 1930 until the final days of network radio, Sherlock Holmes was never off the air for more than 3 consecutive years. The Holmes and Watson characters were played by many different actors, the most famous were Basil Rathbone as Holmes and Nigel Bruce as Dr. Watson, who played from 1939 to 1946. Unfortunately, very few of their shows exist today. In the radio shows Dr. Watson's character was reduced somewhat from the intelligent man he was, to one of lesser brightness because listeners wanted clues that were less obscure so they could try to solve the crimes along with Holmes. The series was one of the high points in radio due to the presence of that genius of high standards, Sherlock Holmes.



DAMON RUNYON THEATRE

Syndicated by Alan Ladd's Mayfair Productions, The Damon Runyon Theatre was a great series that premiered on the West Coast in January 1949. The stories, which had warmth and appeal, were told through the eyes of Broadway, a Brooklyn hood with a heart of gold. John Brown, who had previously played such characters as Digger O'Dell on The Life Of Riley, and Al on My Friend Irma, did a fine job as Broadway. The stories were told in a present-tense narration that moved the action well, and although Runyon's hoods weren't real, they were both interesting and funny.

I LOVE A MYSTERY

First heard in 1939, I Love A Mystery was the ultimate show of wild adventure in a fast-moving serial format. Many today consider it the greatest adventure series ever done. There were three heros: Jack Packard, the team leader, a former medical student, who believed everything had a logical answer. He was the master strategist, who always kept his cool. Doc Long was a drawling, poker playing Texan, a ladies man who constantly craved a fight. Reggie Yorke was a prim and proper Britisher, but ready for any kind of action. They met during the Chinese-Japanese war, when all three were fighting for China. After the war they teamed up and traveled the world, usually on business for their A-1 Detective Agency. They respected the law, but had been known to hide evidence, and would fight before being arrested.

I Love A Mystery ran until 1952, with only five years off during that time. During some seasons it appeared as a 15 minute daily serial, during others in a half-hour format. Carlton Morse, one of radio's most prolific, versatile writers and directors, wrote the series

T804 The Thing That Cried In The Night - The slashing came when a baby cried, but there hadn't been a baby in the house for two decades! A suspenseful tale of a family's life, with many secrets and twisting events. But our heroes will solve the mystery, can you? 150 minutes on two 75 minute tapes.

I LOVE ADVENTURE

A 1948 summer series, I Love Adventure continued the exploits of Jack, Doc and Reggie of I Love A Mystery. Listeners learned that the three comrades had split up during the war, disbanded the Detective Agency, and taken up arms for the cause. Jack went into American Intelligence, Doc became a fighter pilot, and Reggie joined the Royal Air Force. The three lost touch, until a curious message from the "Twenty-One Old Men of Grammercy Park" brought them together again. This group was a London-based organization dedicated to fighting international enemies of peace. A 30 minute weekly show, each episode was a complete story.

THE GREEN HORNET

Britt Reid, owner of the Daily Sentinel newspaper, followed in the footsteps of his famous grand uncle, The Lone Ranger. Britt, too, fought for justice wearing a mask. When necessary, Britt became the Green Homet and fought criminals who were mobsters, swindlers and corrupt cops. He was attended by his faithful valet, Kato, who was a master chemist, had graduated from college, knew Oriental fighting techniques, could cook and care for a house, and was expert at driving the Black Beauty, the fastest car on earth. A popular show, The Green Hornet ran from 1936 through 1952. Each show had the same opening, "He hunts the biggest of all game, public enemies who try to destroy our America." In 1939, a new opening was tried: "He hunts the biggest of all game, public enemies that even the G-Men cannot reach!" J. Edgar Hoover objected to the inclusion of the "G-Men", so it was dropped.

ARCH OBOLER'S LIGHT **EVERYBODY**

Lights Out was first heard as a 15 minute late-night show in 1934. Created by Wyllis Cooper, the show offered imaginative plays filled with such sinister, blood-curdling sound effects that it created a sensation. In 1936, Arch Oboler took over, and it was he who took the show through its best years. It was during this period that Oboler first began to experiment with some of the audio techniques that later made him famous. So popular was Lights Out, that fan clubs sprang up. When NBC tried to drop the show, hundreds of protests forced the scary program back into its late-night time slot-deliberately chosen so that youngsters wouldn't be exposed to the mayhem. In 1942, Oboler introduced Lights Out as a 30 minute show. A few years after the radio show ceased, it went to television, and ran until 1952

Running from 1945 through 1953, this exceptionally popular series glorified the FBI in the typical manner of the era while depicting the criminal as living the lowest, possible kind of life. J. Edgar Hoover himself gave his permission to dramatize from closed FBI cases, changing only names, dates and places. Hoover even gave the series a personal sendoff. Jim Taylor was the name of the agent-hero, although the stories themselves were usually told chronologically from the viewpoint of the criminal or his victim.

Dragnet was the first show to effectively introduce the language of cops to radio audiences, and was one of the first to dramatize cases involving previously taboo subjects. Jack Webb, as Sergeant Joe Friday, was a bachelor who lived at home with his mother. His character, as well as those of his partners, developed throughout the show, but the emphasis was always on the case at hand. Dragnet ran from 1949 until 1956, was later successfully televised and was also the basis for a full-length movie in 1954.

R667 The Big Bobo - A felon takes the name of a police officer, and exposes innocent people to danger.

R669 The Big Sheet - Leroy Finch, already with a long record, goes on a burglary spree.

R670 The Big Missus - Looking for trouble, Rod Flynn, an ex-con from Michigan, purchases a gun.

R671 The Big Father - A hot prowl artist (one who operates during daytime) needlessly assaults a victim.

R672 The Big Set - Two men go into bars and strike up friendships with people they intend to rob later.



GANGBUSTERS

The best remembered of the police shows was given official blessing by J. Edgar Hoover. Hoover agreed to let the show use FBI files on closed cases, provided the Bureau could preview the scripts. The show began in 1935, during "the golden age of gangsters". It was time to "glamourize" the other side, the Gmen, and Gangbusters made crime look like a scary thing indeed. The message: "Crime doesn't pay!!" The show began with an interview with a local lawman or FBI agent who figured in the story. Colonel H. Norman Schwarzkopf, father of General Schwarzkopf, was an interviewer for awhile, and was also one of those interviewed "by proxy". After each show, detailed clues were given for actual wanted criminals. This aspect of the show was so successful, that by 1943, 286 criminals had been apprehended directly as a result of the Gangbuster's clues. The show ran for 22 years, ending in 1957.

Alan Ladd starred as Dan Holiday in the Box 13 detective thrillers. Dan, a former newsman, was a writer of mystery novels who constantly sought adventurous material for his books. To find it, he ran this ad in the Star-Times: "Adventure wanted: will go anywhere, do anything—Box 13." He received mail from all kinds—blackmailers, robbers, killers, and those upon whom they preyed. It all added up to danger for Holiday, and great suspense for the listener.

R478 A Fistful Of Crime - Extortion, blackmail, murder, and a beautiful young woman all in one episode.

R479 Max Alexander - Max Alexander disappeared 7 years ago. Dan listens to Mrs. Alexander's story, then digs for the truth.

HOPALONG CASSIDY

William Boyd came to Hollywood in the early 1920's. Cecil B. DeMille put him to work, and he began making his mark both in



silent movies and in his bawdy life style. Boyd should have done well in the new "talkies" Unfortunately, another actor named William Boyd was arrested for possession of gambling equipment and whiskey, and the press mixed up the two men. That ended his movie career for the time. Four years later, he was given a second

chance as the movie hero Hopalong Cassidy. Hoppy was a man of high morals who never smoked, drank or even kissed the heroine. In his private life, Boyd became "Hoppy" as well, making a complete change from his earlier lifestyle. When TV came on the scene in 1949, Hopalong Cassidy became a true sensation. Television led to a comic strip, then the radio show which ran from 1950-52. Hoppy became such a popular character that TIME reported a national shortage of black dye due to the demand for Hoppy shirts and pants.

R490 Dead Man's Hands - Hoppy helps an old friend out of an ambush set up.

R491 Ten Strike Gold - "The Parson" of Ten Strike is not a "man of the cloth".

R492 Hoppy Meets His Match - The Princess thinks she has found her lost prince—Hoppy! #78

R493 Apaches Don't Need Guns - The fort is being attacked by Apaches. Where did they get their guns? #79

R494 A Shot In The Dark - Hoppy is accused of murder and the lynchin mob is on its way! #80

R706 Rainmaker Of Eagle Nest Mountain - Hoppy is looking for a place to retire after he leaves the Bar 20.

R707 Coltsville Terror - Hoppy and California are seeking shelter from the rain in an abandoned church in Coltsville.

R709 Renegades Of San Rafael - An urgent letter arrives at the Bar 20 asking for Hoppy's help.

R710 Phantom Bandido - Cattle money is being stolen in Council City. Hoppy is summoned to find the thief.

R711 Murder On The Trail - Hoppy rides into Rapid River to investigate a murder. Now there's another one!

R712 Hoppy Takes A Chance - There's a new ranch hand at the Bar 20. He seems to have a secret. #8

R713 Voice Of The Dead - California has gone to the reading of his cousin's will and finds that someone wants his share.

R714 Red Rock Mesa - Cattle are being rustled, and Hoppy needs to find the thief before the town goes to war with the Comanches.

R715 Empty Saddle - When Ace Beaumont's horse returns to the Bar 20 without him, Hoppy and California go to find him.

THE CISCO KID

"Ceesco! The shereef, he ees getting closer!" The Cisco Kid, Robin Hood of the Old West, was first heard in 1943 as he and his sidekick, Pancho rode to adventure. Often mistaken for the "bad guys," the two always triumphed over evil in each episode. Cisco's usual reward was a kiss from the heroine—the kissing effect achieved by dreamy organ music. At the end of each show, a closing punchline was delivered by Pancho—a terrible joke followed by feigned disgust by Cisco: "OH, PAN-CHO!" With a whoop of laughter, the two would ride off on their trusty steeds, Diablo and Loco.

R649 Cisco Wanted: Dead Or Alive - Two crooks disguised as Cisco and Pancho try to rob the Post Office. A man is killed.

R650 Saga Of Sundown Kelly - Sundown, a large and feisty Irish goldminer, strikes it rich. Two nearby miners want his claim.

R651 Ned Dobson's Niece - A mean and greedy man, Ned Dobson plans to cheat his niece of her inheritance.

R652 Cisco Brings The Law - Ranch Thompson and his gang are running the town. Every time a sheriff gets elected, they gun him down.

R653 Run On The Bank - Afraid that the bank is going to fail, depositors want their money. Two crooks see an opportunity to get rich.

The ordeals of adolescence—teenage love, the generation gap, absent-mindedness—were starting points from which Henry, and his best friend, Homer Brown, created the most comedic predicaments. Clifford Goldsmith, a struggling playwright, created Henry Aldrich in his play "What A Life!" When an impressed Rudy Vallee asked him to write some skits about the characters in the play, Goldsmith brought the Aldrich Family to radio. The series became such a success, that within a few years, Goldsmith became one of radio's highest-paid writers.







THE LUX RADIO THEATRE

One of the most successful radio shows of all time, The Lux Radio Theatre premiered in 1934, and aired for over 20 years. Famous movies were adapted for radio, using renowned performers, many of whom had starred in the original movie. Cecil B. DeMille was producer-host, and brought to the show an air of glamour and extravagance. The on-air endorsement of Lux products by DeMille and the stars worked so remarkably well that listeners flocked to stores to buy Lux soap. So popular were the live shows that avid fans mobbed the theater, some even trying to break into rehearsals. To produce each show, there was an initial reading, followed by four rehearsals, the last one coming just 90 minutes before air time. For some of the stars, the thought of broadcasting to 30 million people terrified them, and serious cases of "mike fright" occurred.

FRED ALLEN

Fred Allen, a man of sharp and original wit, came to radio via vaudeville. Allen wrote his own material, but was also the



undisputed master of the ad-lib, often throwing out his own scripts during a show. He and Jack Benny began a long running "feud" which culminated with the famous "King for a Day" skit on Allen's show in 1946. In it, Benny was stripped to his shorts (really) in one of the wildest finishes ever heard (R260). Allen's

last radio show was in June 1949. His guests were Henry Morgan, and appropriately, Jack Benny. He became a panelist on the TV show "What's My Line?" until his death in 1956. The Texaco Star Theater series featured here was a half-hour show. Each week Fred had a guest star, did skits, and took a walk down Allen's Alley where he asked the inhabitants a question of the day, each answer adding to the hilarity of the show.

J641 Show of 10/11/42 - Fred's guest is Roland Young. On News of the Week we hear about "The mayor cleaning up bookmakers". Show of 11/1/42 Guest is Robert Benchley, and on News of the Week we hear about "Coffee rationing".

J642 Show of 11/15/42 - Special guest is Gracie Fields. Fred riss Jack Benny, and News of the Week features "All Holiday telegrams to be discontinued". Show of 11/29/42 - Fred's guest is Adolphe Menjou. News of the Week features "Women in the Workforce".

J643 Show of 1/3/43 - Peter Lorre is guest. The Allen's Alley question is; "How will rationing of canned goods affect you?" Show of 5/16/43 - Fred's guest is "America's Newest Singing Sensation" - Freek Sinatra! Question: "Are you raising chickens?"

J644 Show of 5/23/43 - Guest George Jessel has written his autobiography, and now Fred wants to write his with George's help. Show of 1/2/44 - Fred is starting a Hill Billy Band and guest star Albert Spaulding (a concert violinist) tries out.

J645 Show of 1/9/44 - Fred gets hit on the head with a barrel of beer, and the police carry him into Duffy's Tavern to recover. Show of 3/19/44 - Fred wants to be the star in a film about Ted Lewis (nightclub performer). Question: "Have you started your Victory Garden yet?"

J646 Show of 3/26/44 - The guest is Ed Gardner - "Archie" of Duffy's Tavern Fred visits the Tavern in a hilarious sketch. Show of 4/2/44 Fred takes a site seeing tour of the radio station and runs into Jack Harry Question: "Isn't there some way to stop the egg surplus?"

J647 Show of 45/44 - Easter Sunday show. Guest Reginald Gardner stars in Allen's new play about Sherlock Holmes' brother-in-law, Fetlock Bones. Show of 6/11/44 - Fred wants to be a famous songwriter and performs his new musical "South Dakota" for guest Deems Taylor.

JACK BENNY

Jack Benny was born Benjamin Kubelsky in 1894. He quit high school to go into vaudeville. While on tour, he met Sadie Marks, who became his wife. She later became the character Mary Livingstone on the Jack Benny Show. The Benny Show spanned the years 1932 to 1955, and was later on TV. Jack's character on stage was stingy and vain. He took pride in his blue eyes and his violin playing, worried about losing his hair, and never admitted to being older than 39. This was opposite of his "real" life where he was kind, generous and loyal. He was the first comedian to give major roles to his supporting cast. Each developed distinct personalities—Rochester, Dennis Day, Phil Harris, Mel Blanc (as Professor LeBlanc, Maxwell and Carmichael the bear) and Mary Livingstone. Even though Benny relied on writers for his material, nobody in the business could deliver a joke as well as he could.

J629 1st Show of the 1954 Season - The cast relates what they did over the summer. Then Jack finds out that the microphone wasn't plugged in! 9/26/54 Garden of Evil - This show aired the same day that Jack s TV program premiered. The cast "rehearses" for the evening TV show that includes Jack's rendition of the movie "The Garden of Evil". 10/3/54

J630 Lunch At The Drug Store - The cast goes out for lunch after rehearsal. They meet Bob Crosby there, and Jack tries to get a guest spot on Bob's show. 10/10/54 The Purple Pirate - Jack spends the afternoon reading a good book—"The Purple Pirate". 10/17/54

J631 Ronald Coleman's Party - Jack hasn't been invited to Coleman's party, so he, Dennis and Don decide to go to a drive-in movie. 10/24/54 Sportsmen Quartet - Jack decides to fire the quartet because they won't sing the songs Jack wants them to. 10/31/54

J632 Jack Goes To The Doctor - Jack needs to get some vitamin shots, and wants to see the X-rays from his last checkup. 11/7/54 Dinner At Don's - Everyone goes to the Wilsons' house to see the anniversary presents they got. 11/14/54

J633 Jack Is Sick - Jack has a severe cold from his experience last week at the Wilson's house. 11/21/54 Dennis Goes To A Psychiatrist - Jack is so exasperated with Dennis, that he takes him to a psychiatrist. 11/28/54

J634 Christmas Shopping - For fifteen years, Jack has driven the same store clerk crazy. 12/5/54 Palm Springs - The cast is going to Palm Springs over the holidays, and doesn't want Polly to know. 12/12/54

J635 Christmas Party - Jack throws a Christmas party for the cast. His Christmas tree is an old cactus! 12/19/54 Day After Christmas -People keep dropping by Jack's house, all except Dennis, who is home with a cold. 12/26/54

J684 The New Year - Jack wants the band to reform in the New Year. Then he tells about taking his date to the Rose Bowl. 1/2/55 Jack Reads A Book - After his walk, Jack can't decide what to do, so he reads a book called "Mystery of the Elephant's Graveyard". 1/9/55

THE BLACK MUSEUM

Scotland Yard's Black Museum contains a gruesome collection of murder artifacts, each having been used in one of the Yard's celebrated murder cases. During the year 1952, Orson Welles hosted "The Black Museum" series. He opened each show with a walk through the Museum where he would find an object that would start him telling its story. The stories were both historically and dramatically fascinating. Produced by the BBC, this series was brought to Mutual each week for the entire year.

The stories ranged from amusing to frightening, and were so popular that the series lasted three years, from April 1955 to January 1958.

J637 The Mt. Shasta Mystery - A Hollywood spine chiller. The Trial of Oscar Slater - One of the most mysterious in Scotland Yard's history. The Wireless Mystery - A fascinating mystery at sea. The Disappearance of Judge Draper - The Judge is abducted while walking home. J638 The Witch Doctor - The powerful magic of the African Watch Doctor. He and the other Rangers covered the huge area of Texas. bringing law and order to the state. This successful series premiered in July of 1950 and broadcast weekly stories on NBC for two years.

J648 Apache Peak - A salesman helps a hitchhiker and ends up being robbed and killed. White Elephant - Finding himself at the wrong place at the wrong time, a traveling salesman pays with his life.

J649 Broken Spur - Jase finds a broken spur in the rubble of a fire. It leads him to a suspect. Trigger Man - The crooked Gordon brothers head for Mexico leaving a trail of footprints.

J630 Quick Silver - A family is murdered and there are no class. Jase disgusses himself as a drifter to solve this one. Fool's Gold - The only clue to the bank robbers is a man with gold teeth.

J651 Open Range - Cartle are being stolen. Who would suspect the man that was supposedly being used as a "putsy"? Play for Keeps - The sheriff is murdered. Could it be the constable that did it?

J652 Dead or Alive - A criminal takes on the identity of a man killed in an explosion. Candy Man - There is a prison break! Suygood takes Abbott against his will and the two leave a trail of robberies.

J653 Open and Shut - A beautiful young woman murders the man she loves. Why? Clean-up - Genero, the oil and crime king in town, never seems to pay for his crimes.

THE SIX SHOOTER

Jimmy Stewart as Britt Ponset, frontier cowboy, brought to radio a great series of folksy Western adventures. Britt Ponset was an easy-going man, a drifter, who often wandered into other people's troubles. Sometimes he had to shoot his way out. Stewart was perfect as the slow-talking, adventure prone cowboy, bringing to the series a balance of comedy and drama. This series premiered in September 1953. Unfortunately, this fine series came at the end of the Golden Age of Radio and lasted only one season.



J672 Rink - An 11 year old boy learns the hard way that his father was a crook and murderer—not a hero. The Coward - Will was thought to be a coward for not carrying a gun or fighting. He had a good reason.

J673 Stampede - Two brothers are in love with the same woman. Is that enough to start a stampede and risk their lives? Silver Annie - Everyone thinks Annie is crazy, and should give her property to the railroad.
