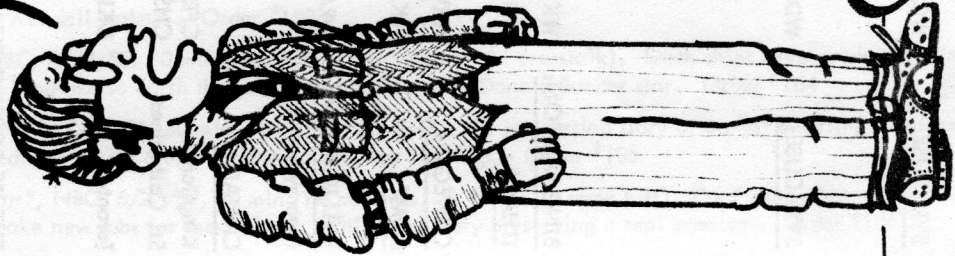

PLEASE SHOW DO NOT HOLD

1. Due to increased printing and mailing costs, we are in the process of reducing our mailing list. Anyone who has been on our mailing list for over six months and has not ordered or does not request to be continued on our list will be dropped.
2. We are happy to announce that our production and delivery schedule is now back to normal (and barring any unforeseen disaster should remain that way). Most orders will be filled in 4 to 6 weeks (2 to 3 weeks for rush orders), hopefully sooner.
3. For those of you who may have wondered, "Rush Order" as used on our order blanks means just that--top priority is given your order on payment of the premium charge. Delivery time is 2 to 3 weeks rather than 4 to 6 weeks for normal service.
4. We have available, for those interested, a souvenir Amos 'N' Andy script. This reprint of the script from the December 25, 1935 program is in limited supply (only 100 copies) at 50 cents per copy. Also included is a brief history of the program from its inception to 1935 (the year of this script).

6. Our master program list (complete as of August 1, 1971), listing over 1000 shows is being mailed with all completed orders. Since that list was printed we have acquired over 300 more shows (at least). If you don't see what you want, write and we will let you know if it's in our latest arrivals.

Due to the general unavailability in quantity of good lower priced cassettes, we are considering dropping the regular tape option for cassette orders and offering only BASF cassettes at the price now listed for that option. 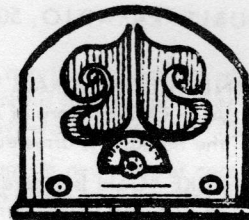

IT CONTAINS 50 MORE OLD-TIME RADIO SHOWS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION - MANY OF THEM PREVIOUSLY UNLISTED EVEN IN OUR MASTER PROGRAM LIST (WHICH IS STILL AVAILABLE - SEE ELSEWHERE IN THIS FLYER). THIS IS ALSO THE FIRST FLYER TO BE ISSUED DURING DOUBLE-R-RADIO'S SECOND YEAR IN BUSINESS. WE'VE LEARNED A LOT IN THE PAST YEAR, AND WE HOPE YOU'LL AGREE THAT WE'VE IMPROVED A LOT, TOO. THIS NEW FORMAT IS ONE OF THOSE IMPROVEMENTS. ANOTHER IS THAT FLYERS WILL NOW BE SCHEDULED SO THAT YOU MAY ANTICIPATE RECEIVING THEM REGULARLY EVERY THREE MONTHS (I.E.: 4 TIMES PER YEAR). An epic story: The launching of various expeditions to Mars; the colonization of that planet; houses on Earth that do everything for their occupants; impending war on Earth calling the colonizers home. - ROD AND CHARLES SHOW "Mirrors", CBC (Canada), late 1960's, 15 min, no comm'ls, VG-Exc. Our heroes' mirror images, Selrahc and Yendor, put in a very tough day reflecting on the boys' investigation of mirrors. Rod Coneybear & Charles Winter star. Order #109. (S) (See "Stereo" note.)

- FALCON "Case of the Substitute Target", NBC, 1950 or 1951, 30 min., Kraft comm'ls. G. The Falcon is in danger of being rubbed out by the mob when he decides to protect a dead gangster's girlfriend. Les Damon stars; Ed Herlihy does the commercials. Order #114.

- AMOS 'N' ANDY "Andy-Trunk Murderer?", CBS-AFRS, 8/25/52, 30 min., no comm'ls, F-G. Andy proposes to a girl, winds up engaged to her mother and finds himself accused as a trunk murderer. Charles Correll & Freeman Gosden star. Order #122.
- BING CROSBY PHILCO RADIO TIME 10/6/48, ABC, 30 min., Philco 1949 radio-phonograph comm'ls, F-G. Songs by Bing and guest Judy Garland, plus a satire on quiz shows hit by an economy wave. Also featuring Ken Carpenter, John Scott Trotter and His Orchestra. Order #123.
- BOB AND RAY PRESENT THE CBS RADIO NETWORK 2/9/60, CBS, 15 min., PSA's. G. Features: One Feller's Family; Mayor For The Day; Barney Sissel, Census Taker. Bob Elliot & Ray Goulding star. Order #124.
- BOB AND RAY PRESENT THE CBS RADIO NETWORK 2/10/60, CBS, 15 min., Promo's. G. Features: Wally Ballou reporting on the Kangaroo Show; Lawrence Fecktenberger, Interstellar Officer Candidate. Order #125.
- BOB AND RAY PRESENT THE CBS RADIO NETWORK 2/11/60, CBS, 15 min., PSA's & Promo's, G. Features: Armed Forces Humor; Nattily Attired saying a song, "I Want To Be Loved"; About The Nuttings. Order #126.

- EASY ACES "Jane's Aunt Louise Is Ill", NBC, 1935, 15 min., Anacin comm'ls, F-G. Out of spite, Jane's Aunt has gone on a hunger strike and become quite ill--or has she? A serial episode starring Jane and Goodman Ace. Order #128.
- EASY ACES "Lady Bus Drivers", NBC, 1/21/43, 15 min., Anacin comm'ls, G. (Missing open & close which were done live.) Jane and Dorothy are driving a bus to aid in the war effort. They are always late. Another serial episode. Order #129.
- FIBBER MCGEE AND MOLLY "Halloween Party", NBC, 10/24/39, 30 min, Johnson's Wax comm'ls. F-G (has scratch in places). Fibber decides to play a practical joke while at a Halloween party given by his next door neighbor, the Great Gildersleeve. The gag backfires, and Fibber becomes his own victim. Jim & Marian Jordan star. Order #130.
- FIBBER MCGEE AND MOLLY "Doc Gamble's Party", NBC, late 40's or early 50's, 30 min., Reynolds Aluminum comm'ls, F-G (has no close). It's nearly Christmas and McGee is concerned that Doc Gamble will spend it alone. A surprise party is arranged and the whole town is enlisted to get things ready. Order #131.
- FRED ALLEN SHOW 3/27/40, NBC, 60 min., Ipana and Sal Hepatica comm'ls. G. One week after the eagle's escape (see item number 36 in flyer number 2) and Fred has some more thoughts on the matter. The Mighty Allen Art Players perform a gruesome, spine chilling Inspector Bungle murder mystery titled, "Who Killed Max Borden?". Fred also interviews Mr. T. Hee, director of Walt Disney's, "Pinocchio". Order #132.
- FRED ALLEN SHOW Mid 40's, NBC-AFRS, 30 min., no comm'ls., F-G. Fred is hit by a beer truck and is carried into "Duffy's Tavern", feet first. Fred sues the brewery and Archie acts as his attorney. Ed Gardner guests. Order #133.
- GREAT GILDERSLEEVE "Kathryn's Boating Date", NBC, 5/116/51, 30 min., Kraft comm'ls, G. Gildy's not happy to learn that his next door neighbor is dating his girl friend Kathryn. When he discovers that they're going boating, he decides to go fishing--in the same place. Stars: Willard Waterman & Gale Gordon. Order #134.
- HALLS OF IVY "Putting Dad Back To School", NBC, 5/17/50, 30 min., Schlitz Beer comm'ls, G. Gentle charm and suavity highlight this series about a college prof. and his wife. Mike Candor's 60 year old father has worked all his life to send his son through school. Now Mike wants to return the favor & send his father through Ivy College, but his father has deep reservations. Ronald Coleman and Benita Hume star. Order #135.



- IMMIGRANT "I Am Curious-Black", CBC (Canada), May 1970, 30 min., no comm'ls, Exc. Dr. Smithe nearly causes a riot when his friends take him to see the notorious film. His objections to its content cause him to try to protect his friends and other irate patrons. They reward his concern for their morality by throwing him out. Alan King & Eileen Clifford star. Order #136.
- JACK BENNY PROGRAM "New Quartet", NBC, 3/16/44, 30 min, Lucky Strike comm'ls, G. Jack forms a new quartet consisting of Dennis Day, Andy Russell, Dick Haymes and Bing Crosby to replace the Sportsmen Quartet with whom he is feuding over their excessive salary. Don Wilson is featured. Order #137.
- JACK BENNY PROGRAM "Rose Bowl", NBC, 1/4/48, 30 min., Lucky Strike comm'ls. G. After a New Year's party Jack and Mary decide to attend the Rose Bowl Game the next day, and wait all night long for tickets. Mary Livingstone, Don Wilson, Phil Harris, Dennis Day, and Mel Blanc are featured. Order #138.
- LIFE OF RILEY "Leaking Roof", NBC-AFRS, 11/30/49, 30 min., no comm'ls, G. The Riley's are plagued by a leaky roof and a pesky landlord. Meanwhile, Junior is accused of cheating in school. Stars: William Bendix, Alan Reed. Order #139.
- LIFE WITH LUIGI "Beach Picnic", CBS, 9/2/52, 30 min., Wrigley's Gum comm'ls, F-G. The night school class goes to the beach, and Luigi-as usual- has many unusual problems with Pasquale's daughter Rosa; the muscle-bound lifeguard; and a very different bathing suit. J. Carroll Naish, Hans Conreid and Alan Reed star. Order #140.
- MARLIN HURT AND BEULAH SHOW "Wedding Ring", CBS, 7/16/45, 30 min., Tums comm'ls, G. When Beulah finds a wedding ring complications ensue. With Bill Thompson and Ken Niles. Order #141.
- PHIL HARRIS-ALICE FAYE SHOW "Jack Benny-Santa Claus?", NBC, 12/19/48, 30 min., Rexall comm'ls., F-G. Guest Jack Benny is hired to impersonate Santa for Little Alice & Phyllis--but all does not go as planned. Order #142.
- RUM RUNNERS "Case Of The New Woman", CBC (Canada), March 1968, 30 min., no comm'ls, Exc. Capt. Charlie and his crew have been at sea for six months. He is afraid they will desert the ship when they catch sight of the "New Woman" of the Jazz Era. The New Woman comes to them in the form of a heavily disguised Inspector McMulloch who fools the captain and his crew into betraying their mission and exposing their illegal cargo. William Fulton & Joseph Rutten star. Order #143.
- SNOW VILLAGE SKETCHES "Trout And A Truant", MBS, 4/28/46, 30 min., no comm'ls, G. Herbie plays truant. Hiram, the truant officer goes after him. Dan'l goes after both of them. Light comedy-drama with Parker Fennelly, Arthur Allan & Sara Fussell. This episode is also called, "Truant Officer". Order #144.
- SONGS BY SINATRA 1946, CBS-AFRS, 30 min., no comm'ls, F-G. A tune filled salute to the great music of Jerome Kern. Stars Frank Sinatra with guests Jane Powell, Pied Pipers, Axel Stordahl & his orchestra. Order #145.
- SPIKE JONES SHOW 6/25/49, CBS, 30 min., Coca-Cola comm'ls, F-G. Last show of the season; from San Francisco. Guest star Don Ameche (as Prof. Gazolla) sings an operatic murder-mystery, "This Is Your FBAida". Order #146.
- VIC 'N' SADE "August Invoices", MBS, 10/26/46, 30 min., no comm'ls, F-G. Vic sneaks home from the office to do an important job in peace and quiet, to find his family and half the town in the living room. Stars: Bernadine Flynn; Art Van Harvey. Order #147.

#### ● ITEMS OF UNUSUAL INTEREST ●

- GUNSMOKE (Mark Dillon, U.S. Marshall) "White Buffalo Saloon", CBS, 7/13/49, 30 min., no comm'ls, G. Pilot or audition program for the later series. It's interesting as it has a different cast and format. Howard Culver and Gerald Mohr star. Much of the show is done with voice over narration. Order #148.
- LIVING 1949 "State Of American Humor", NBC, 1/30/49, no comm'ls, G-VG. Ben Grauer is host with Fred Allen as guest telling the world what's right and wrong with radio comedy and American humor in general. Distilled essence of everything Fred thought and believed in. Much of NBC's obituary tribute to him came from this program. ALSO: Friar's Club Roast of Jack Benny (excerpt), 11/9/51, CBS, F. Fred Allen pays "tribute" to his old pal, Jack Benny. Fred's wit is honed to its keenest edge. TOTAL TIME for both is 30 minutes. Order #149.
- NAUTILUS UNDER THE NORTH POLE. Not a broadcast but a 1958 documentary recording, 45 min, Exc. The late Herb Shriner narrates. At 9:54 AM on August 5, 1958, the atomic submarine USS Nautilus, commanded by Comm. William R. Anderson, USN, emerged from the Arctic ice and informed the world that it had completed the first voyage under the North Pole. Hear the actual voices and sounds of that voyage. Order #150.

#### ● COLLECTOR'S CORNER ●

- AN EDISON ALBUM - Volume VIII. About 30 minutes of classical recordings from the period 1910-1930 as issued by the Edison Company. Both orchestral and vocal selections are included, with artists such as Claudio Muzio, Marie Delna, Paul Payan, Carolina Lazzari, Moriz Rosenthal, Lucrezia Bori, Guisepppe Anselmi, Celestine Boninsegna and Marie Rappold. Included are works by Wagner, Verdi, Bizet, Donizetti, Chopin, Saint-Saens, Meyerbeer and Tchaikovsky. Sound is variable, but generally better than you might expect. (All selections have been dubbed and reprocessed for the best possible sound.) Order # AH.
- AN EDISON ALBUM - Volume III. From the pre-radio and early radio days of 1910-1930 comes approximately 30 minutes of delightful popular recordings originally issued by the Edison Company. (These have been dubbed and reprocessed by us.) 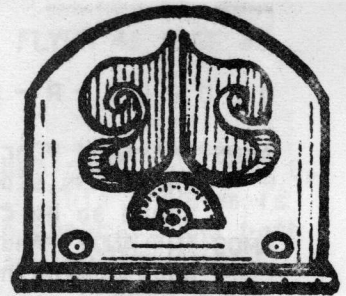

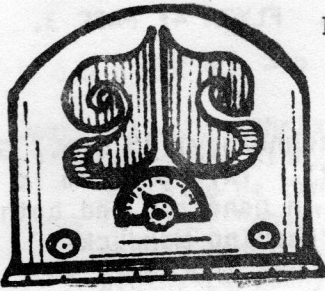
