

Radio Pictures. On screen in *Three Sons* (RKO-1939), *Blondie Goes Latin* (Col-1941) and *The Stranger From Pecos* (Monogram-1943) he eventually became a contract player at Universal starring in B-westerns and the Canadian Mounted Police features.

Grant stated in a 1956 interview he was believable in the role of *Sky King* not only because of his acting talent but also because of his early environment. "I was born and raised on a Montana ranch where I learned to love the outdoors... ride a horse, hunt and fish. I was an Eagle Scout and later a Ranger at Yellowstone National Park. So you see the role of *Sky King* is not completely out of keeping with my background.

"Since my father was an ex-professional baseball player it was only natural that I would pursue some type of sports. I played semi-professional ball and was a member of the University of Washington track squad, running the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds flat. This training has helped me tremendously in my television series."

Gloria Winters, 19 years old when *Sky King* started filming, had been in show business since age 2, appearing in features with many of Hollywood's top names. She had also played Babs on the

original *Life of Riley* with Jackie Gleason and was in all 72 episodes of *Sky King* playing Penny. Ron Haggerty as Clipper made only the first 19 shows of the series. When production resumed in 1955 Haggerty was in the military.

In 1955 Kirby Grant was living in Chicago, working as a writer and director for Wilding Picture Corporation when Nabisco became interested in making more episodes of *Sky King*. He commuted between Chicago and Hollywood, filming new shows for the series through 1959. While only 72 episodes



of Sky King were copyrighted, Grant stated 130 programs were made. "Unfortunately, they were stored away in a New York film library when a fire broke out. The 35mm negatives, the masters and the 16mm release prints were all in one room. We lost all but 72 films."

Nostalgia buffs always have two questions when the name *Sky King* comes up. What was the name of his plane and what kind of plane was it? The first one is easy. Sky's plane was called the "Songbird." The second part of the question is a little harder. In the first season King dogged outlaws in a Cessna P-50. During the last 54 episodes he flew a Cessna 310-B with wing tanks that gave him a range of over 1,000 miles with a cruising speed of 210 mph.

Episodes of *Sky King* still pop up on television today and are a favorite with collectors. Gloria Winters and Kirby Grant are both retired from acting. Grant is handling public relations for Sea World in Florida.

Terry and the Pirates

ougfair Productions by arrangement with the Chicago Tribune, New York News Syndicate, Inc. brought Terry and the Pirates to television as a syndicated series in 1952. John Bear, a supporting actor in About Face (W.B. 1952), Mississippi Gambler (Univ.-Int. 1953), The Miami Story (Col. 1954) and other feature films, starred as Terry Lee. His sidekick, Hot Shot Charlie was played by William Tracy.

Terry and Hot Shot were pilots for Air Cathay, a small air line ran by Chopstick Joe. The adventure series told of the perils faced by Terry, Hot Shot and Burma in the Orient.

Terry has gone to the Far East after inheriting an abandoned gold mine from his grandfather. There he first encounters the evil Dragon Lady. By the time the story came to television, Lai Choi San, The Dragon Lady was only a sometimes enemy as Terry and his pals fought for the rights of all.



Terry And The Pirates was based on the Milton Caniff comic strip and came to the NBC Blue Network on November 1, 1937 as a three-time-a-week radio show, however the series was dropped after two years.



In 1940 Columbia Pictures released a 15-chapter serial entitled *Terry And The Pirates*. William Tracy, who 12 years later would play Hot Shot Charlie in the television series, was cast as Terry Lee. Granville Owen appeared as Pat Ryan, assistant to Terry's father and the Dragon Lady was played by Sheila Darcy.

The serial tells of Dr. Herbert Lee going to Asia to uncover a lost civilization ruled by a warlord named Fang. Not all the natives were under the domination of the evil Fang however. Some had given their loyalty to the beautiful Dragon Lady, who Terry decided to make an alliance with in his battle against the terrible Fang and his Tiger Men.

After an on again, off again friendship with the Dragon Lady the final chapter finds the two on good terms in the temple of the god Mara. Fang has uncovered a sacred treasure, an enormous diamond, but before he can escape with it a gorilla kills the evil tyrant. The diamond is returned to the Dragon Lady and Dr. Lee is granted permission to enter the temple to study the records of the lost civilization.

In 1943 a new radio series opened on the Blue Network, spon-

sored by Quaker Oats. Once war had been declared Terry and his friends got into the fray fighting the Nazis, at times with the help of the Dragon Lady, who was then working for the Chinese.



In 1946 the rating dropped badly however. The war was over and the Dragon Lady returned to her bandit organization of pirates. Terry and his friends waged war with evil for the next two years and in 1948 the radio show was dropped. Only eighteen eqisodes of *Terry And The Pirates* were filmed for

television. H. Alexander MacDonald was the executive producer of the series while Warren Lewis produced. It was syndicated by Official Films. The show ran in prime time in Los Angeles for a year with second and third repeats. While it never achieved the popularity of the radio series or the comic strip, it was still good entertainment for adventure fans in the early days of television.

Captain Midnight

aptain Midnight was yet another product of radio's golden age that migrated to the small screen in the early 1950s. The Captain Midnight radio program was one of the most popular children's shows of the 1940's. It centered around the character of flying ace Captain Midnight, who had received his nickname years before when he, as Army flyer Jim Albright, returned from a dangerous mission at the stroke of 12, just in time to save the Allied cause.

The program was developed by radio station WGN in Chicago and first aired under the sponsorship of Skelly Oil in 1939. During the early years *Captain Midnight* and his friends belonged to an organization known as the *Captain Midnight* Flight Patrol, but on September 30, 1940 the program went to the Mutual Radio Network under a new sponsor, Ovaltine. At this point the Flight

Patrol was superseded by an organization known as the Secret Squadron. As the story unfolded, *Captain Midnight* was asked by the U.S. Government to head up this special new organization whose mission it is to assist federal authorities in fighting crime throughout the world.

In 1942 Captain
Midnight came to the
motion picture screen as
a 15-episode serial from
Columbia Pictures. Dave
O'Brien played Captain
Midnight with Dorothy
Short as Joyce, Guy
Wilkerson as Ichabod,
Sam Edwards as Chuck
and James Craven as his
inevitable foe, Ivan
Shark.

The radio version of Captain Midnight left the



air on December 15, 1949, but the program spawned a television series that came to the CBS network in the fall of 1954. The program was produced by Screen Gems, a division of Columbia Pictures, who had made the *Captain Midnight* serial 12 years before.

A press release at the time stated, "The imaginative adventure series finds *Captain Midnight* on the side of law and order. He is not a member of any particular organization but rather he is at the beck and call of all law enforcement agencies. The stories have no geographical bounds and most scripts veer towards the scientific. As a do-gooder the captain can go anywhere at any time. He travels by jet, of course."



The television series starred Richard Webb as Captain Midnight with Sid Melton as Ichabod Mudd. Chuck Ramsey, played by Renee Beard, appeared from time to time, but the rest of the radio characters were gone. Olan Soule was added to the cast as Tut, a scientist who worked with Captain Midnight.

Ovaltine sponsored the show for the network run as it had on radio, still offering premiums to young viewers. These premiums were always available by mail for a small sum plus a boxtop or other evidence of having purchased the sponsors' product.

Richard Webb was 39 years old when the *Captain Midnight* television series started filming. The Bloomington, Ill., native had been on screen since 1941 in *Sullivan's Travels* (Par.-1941), *I Wanted Wings* (Par.-1941), *O.S.S.* (Par.-1946), *The Night Had A Thousand Eyes* Par.-1948), *Sands of Iwo Jima* (Par. 1949) and other feature films.

Webb's big television shot in the arm came in 1950 when he replaced an ailing actor and did a 15-minute vignette with actor

Herbert Marshal on the Ken Murray Show. The following day CBS brass signed him as their "new leading man." During the next couple of years he appeared in five episodes of Lights Out, two Suspense, six episodes of The Web, three Studio One, two Broadway TV Theatre and one episode of Philco Playhouse, all broadcast live from New York.

Webb recently said, "In 1954 a poll was taken that showed the character of *Captain Midnight* was the No. 1 hero of America's youth followed by President Eisenhower, Duke Snider and a young man just breaking into show business by the name of Elvis Presley."

The series was so popular even the police were members of the *Captain Midnight's* Secret Squadron.

"In 1955," Webb recalled, "I was appearing at the Sportsman Show in Hartford, Connecticut and during my talk with the fans from the center arena I would ask boys and girls when was "the last time you said hello to the policeman in your neighborhood? They are the best friends you have outside your own home." The following morning the Chief of Police came to my room, asked if he could have some of the Secret Squadron stick-on plastic patches which I was giving out. 'How many, Chief?' 'How about two hundred?' 'Two hundred! What for?' 'You'll find out.' From then on during the balance of the week every uniformed police officer in Hartford wore the SQ emblem on his left breast pocket! The chief explained, 'That is the least we can do for you for what you are doing for us.' "

The 39 episodes of *Captain Midnight* were rerun several times over a span of four years until the series left the network in 1958. It's syndicated title was *Jet Jackson, Flying Commando*. By over dubbing the voice, the name *Captain Midnight* was changed to *Jet Jackson*. Ovaltine owned and reserved the rights to the original name.

Reruns of *Captain Midnight/Jet Jackson* aren't being shown in the United States at this time, but *Jet Jackson* recently completed its third run in Australia. Lucky people over there.

EDITOR'S NOTE: I recently received a letter and had an enjoyable phone conversation with Richard Webb. Mr. Webb is involved in a number of projects at present, two of which all *Captain Midnight* fans will find interesting.

Round Table Publishers will be coming out with a book on Captain Midnight next year. It's titled "The Making of a Hero, 1954 Style" and was written by Webb. The book will contain 314 stills and will be a "must" for all nostalgia buffs.

The second project is a new Captain Midnight script also written by Mr. Webb. Interplanetary Productions is handling the new movie or series, whichever it turns out to be.

In describing the series Webb says, "It's my idea that *Captain Midnight* will be presented as the older guy that you younger people come to for help and advice. Like Lorne Greene in *Bonanza*. He'll be back there in the lab, letting the young people handle the action, but he'll still have the old glint in his eye."

A banker appropriates two million dollars and disappears. The man's daughter employs Captain Midnight to investigate the strange case.

RUNAWAY SUITCASE

January 7, 1956

A policeman, accused of stealing a suitcase, is forced to resign from the force.

A young boy's observation of his father's strange actions, and lapses of memory leads Captain Midnight to uncover a plot of robbery.

Steve Canyon

Steve Canyon was Milton Caniff's second comic strip to appear on the home screen. Terry and the Pirates, in 1952, had been the first. Canyon was a command pilot for the Air Force and traveled around the country for the first nine episodes of the series. With the show of January 3, 1959, "Operation Big Thunder", Lt. Col. Canyon became commanding officer of Big Thunder Air Force Base in California and the series acquired a regular supporting cast.

Steve Canyon first appeared as a comic strip in 1947. Two years later a short lived radio series was syndicated with Barry Sullivan playing Canyon, an air charter pilot for hire to anyone with

money.

When the first of the 34 half hour, black and white films came to NBC television on September 13, 1958 actor Dean Fredericks was starring as *Steve Canyon*. The series lasted for a year on NBC and was canceled in September of 1959. In April of 1960 ABC aired reruns of the original NBC shows until September of that year.

Dean Fredericks, 35 years old when Steve Canyon went into production, started his acting career after being discharged from the Army in 1946. A sergeant with The First Cavalry Division in World War II, he was wounded while serving in the Pacific. Fredericks studied acting on the G.I. Bill and was in over 100 telvision shows (cast as an Indian in many of them because of his high check bones) and some features including Walt Disney's Light in the Forest (1958) before Pegasus Productions cast him as Steve Canyon.

In a 1958 interview Fredericks said, "When I finally met David Haft, the producer of *Steve Canyon*, my hair had grown out a little from my part in *Light in the Forest*, but was still short. He had seen me on a television show and thought I'd be good for Steve. I also had to get an okay from Milt Caniff, who created the comic strip from which our show is taken. It all happened fast. I did a scene for David one day and the next I was shooting the first of the series.

"So far it's been a great experience, making Steve Canyon. The toughest part has been the technical details. Some of the dialogue is murderous to learn, but we are being as accurate as possible. An Air Force officer from the Pentagon is our technical advisor. On our first show we did a slightly fictionalized story, but a Chief Test Pilot I knew had seen it, along with some of his fellow test pilots. All agreed that the material in the show was about 90 per-

cent true and that it was a good training film in many respects.

"The Air Force has already revealed several top secret projects on our shows and almost every one we film brings forth some

new technical development."

The Air Force supplied unreleased footage of scientific equipment such as X-15 test flights and ICBM lift-offs to Pegasus Productions and in return Dean Fredericks "sold" the Air Force as he made trips around the country to dedicate hangars, make "official" appearances and help with recruiting drives. On these missions he wore the official uniform with complete Air Force approval. This worked well for both the producers of *Steve Canyon* and the Air Force.

Steve Canyon wasn't the best series on television, but it wasn't the worst either. The show is no longer in syndication and the episodes are hard to find, so they are very much sought after by collectors on both 16mm film and video tape..
