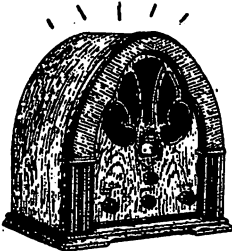

- KEY TO ABBREVIATIONS -

- (A), etc. - Sound ratings. See page 3.
- (60), etc.- Numbers in parentheses following a listing of a show denotes the approximate time of the show. If no number is given, the show is approximately 30 minutes in length.
- 1-L, etc. - The sequence of all reels listed is side one, left track (1-L); side two, left track (2-L); side one, right track (1-R); and side two, right track (2-R).
- no op. - No opening. The opening title, name of series, etc. is missing--but dramatic or main part of the show is complete.
- no cl. - No closing. The closing credits are missing, but dramatic or main part of the show is complete.
- no beg. - No beginning. Dramatic or main part of the show is missing part of the beginning.
- no end. - No ending. Dramatic or main part of show is missing part of ending.
- muff. - Muffled. Sound is fuzzy and requires careful listening to understand.
- vol. flux.- Volume fluctuation.
- x-talk - Cross-talk. Another program can be heard faintly in background.
- rec. - From commercial record.
- exc. - Excerpt.
- scratchy - Surface noise from transcription disc.
- skips - Groove skips from disc.
- drop-out - Program fades out in spot.
- spd. var. - Variation in the speed of the tape.
- waver - Unsteadiness of speed.
- hiss - High frequency noise.
- hum - Low frequency noise.
- clipped - Abrupt ending, etc.

This catalog presents the entire available collection of reels as of 1973. It is intended to serve for many years and not be reprinted each year, although prices may change without notice.

GOLDEN AGE RADIO is the result of one person with an avid hobby--and a desire to keep the magic moments of radio in its golden age alive. This once personal collection is now available to be shared with the general public.

WHERE DO THE SHOWS COME FROM? Most of the old broadcasts have been lost, having either not been recorded or the transcriptions destroyed when TV came in. Most of the shows in existence have come from the remaining 16 inch transcription discs once used by radio stations. Radio networks have made little effort to save these shows. They are in existence mainly because private collectors have kept the discs they have found and exchanged tapes made from them with other collectors.

HOW GOOD ARE THE SHOWS TODAY? Better than you might at first think. Relying heavily on imagination, the drama and mystery shows hold up very well as modern entertainment. Some of the comedy is topical, but the genius of the old radio comedians keeps it fresh even today. Radio reached its peak during World War II and thus many of the shows reflect war attitudes and events of considerable importance.

THE SOUND QUALITY of many shows in existence is poor. Some are fragmentary, and some are plagued with sound problems such as record scratch, record skips, hum, whistles, static, cross-talk between tape tracks, and just plain fuzzy sound. The ones that are really a chore to listen to have been omitted from this collection. Many tapes have been improved over what was supplied to Golden Age Radio by correcting over-all speed errors and running the shows through amplifier controls and audio equalizers to improve the tone. Further improvements can still be made in some of them because of new and better equipment, and listed reels are occasionally reworked when they can be helped. Most other sources for radio tapes are making no effort to improve sound quality. In summary, most of the programs in this catalog are in very good sound--and all are listenable on good equipment. A general guide to over-all sound quality on each reel is given in parentheses following the title of the reel as follows:

- A - Top notch sound. Almost too good to be true!
- B-- Above average. Very clear. No serious defects.
- C - Average. Clear and quite listenable with a few sound defects.
Programs on these reels usually came from many sources and may vary considerably from show to show within the reel.
- D - Below average. Recommended only when content is more important than sound quality. Still understandable, however.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE? Most reels are kept in stock for immediate shipment. Others are recorded in the order in which orders are received. Only in very rare cases does it take over a week for an order to be processed.

TRADING. Golden Age Radio will trade tapes for items of radio memorabilia such as the rings, badges and other premiums once offered by children's programs for 10¢ and a boxtop. And also for 16" transcription discs of certain radio shows in case you come across some in a local junk shop or Aunt Martha's attic. (They cannot be played on modern equipment.) If you have any of the above, please send a description of what you have and what you would trade it for to Golden Age Radio. Do not send the items without first inquiring. Trading is also done for radio shows on tape, but only for shows that are not in general circulation.

THE RECORDING TAPE used is first line--such as Irish 200 Professional series or its equivalent from another manufacturer. This tape sells retail unrecorded for about \$6.00 per reel. Reject tapes like Shamrock and Concert are no longer used. Tapes are recorded on professional duplicating equipment--not tape decks. Golden Age Radio is dedicated to preserving the wonderful old shows in the best possible condition.

ADDITIONAL LISTINGS will be sent to those who order from this catalog, but only when material of special importance is found. It is not planned that they will be frequently available. The Golden Age Radio collection is considerably larger than is listed here, but the remaining shows have not been put on master reels. When preparing the listed collection, the very best shows were chosen for inclusion, so what remains is definitely of lesser interest or poorer quality. It is felt that this catalog presents the most important shows that are in circulation at present. Future listings will only be released if and when important discoveries are made. Rather than trying to offer everything that may be available, Golden Age Radio plans to devote its energies to improving the present listing.

MOVIE SOUNDTRACKS AND TV audio portions are not generally a part of the present collection, as it is felt that they are not as satisfying to listen to as radio shows. Many hours of tapes are available taken from old phonograph records and cylinders, however. These are listed in summary in the "Old Timer's Corner" on page 149.

GUARANTEE? Your complete satisfaction is guaranteed. If you get defective or unsatisfactory tapes, they may be returned for re-recording.

GOLDEN AGE RADIO is dedicated to the preservation of old radio--and to customer satisfaction. It is run as a business and not just a hobby, and service is an important consideration. Your comments and suggestions are very much appreciated--whether they be praise, criticism, or helpful ideas. Your comments about old radio, your memories of it, and your reactions to the taped programs are read with interest. Not all such letters are answered, but none are ignored. Please, however, do not write asking about unlisted shows as nothing is available beyond the printed listing. Thank you for your interest. Have a happy trip down memory lane!

TAPES OF OLD RADIO SHOWS MAKE EXCITING AND UNUSUAL GIFTS!

PRICES

Golden Age Radio is pleased to share the radio programs in its collection. The programs are free of charge--but a nominal charge must be made for tape costs, recorder wear, mailing costs, and time involved. The charges are as follows:

REELS AS LISTED (Most are 1800' 4-track, 3 3/4 i.p.s., up to 6 hours of programs; a few are 1200' with up to 4 hours of programs and are so marked) are \$10.00 each. Order three at one time and choose a fourth one free! They are playable only on recorders which take 7 inch reels and play 4 tracks (such as stereo recorders which play 2 tracks in each direction.) Each of the four tracks contains different programs. Order by reel letters and numbers.

REELS AS LISTED RECORDED ONTO TWO 7 INCH REELS FOR TWO TRACK RECORDERS are \$15.00 each. Order 3 sets of reels and choose another set free!

5 INCH REELS recorded at 1 7/8 are available for the same prices as 7 inch reels. These are recommended only to those who have recorders which will not take 7 inch reels.

CUSTOM RECORDING OF INDIVIDUALLY SELECTED SHOWS is not a regular service of Golden Age Radio but is available at special request for \$10.00 per hour or 4 hours for \$30.00, either on reel or cassette. All orders must total even hours with a minimum of one hour. Short programs may be added together to equal each hour. Alternates may be given for best sound quality. 7 1/2 speed--add 25%. Full tracks from listed reels may be chosen for the same price as one hour, but only at 3 3/4. Give full program and recorder information when ordering and allow two weeks recording time.

STOCK CASSETTES are available for \$5.00 each (1 hour each) or 4 for \$15.00, but not from this catalog. Send for free cassette catalog. 8 TRACK CARTRIDGES and LP RECORDS are not available.

QUANTITY DISCOUNTS are as follows: On orders totalling \$100.00 or more, deduct 5%. On orders totalling \$500.00 or more, deduct 10%.

POSTAGE is free within the U.S. by Special Fourth Class uninsured mail. If you wish faster or safer mailing, two services are offered. SPECIAL MAILING SERVICE is 25¢ per reel or 4 cassettes. It includes insurance from Golden Age Radio that your tape will not be lost or damaged in the mail, and Special Handling which goes with First Class mail. AIR SPECIAL MAILING SERVICE is \$1.00 per reel or 4 cassettes and includes Air Mail postage and insurance. (For two-track tapes remit for each of the two reels you will receive.) Golden Age Radio is not responsible for tapes lost or damaged in the mail without Special or Air Special Mailing Services.

CANADIAN POSTAGE for all reels is 75¢ for each reel (allow for each reel on two-track recordings) for surface mail and \$1.50 for each reel for Air Mail.

FOREIGN POSTAGE for all reels is \$1.00 per reel for surface mail. Check with your postal authorities for Air Mail rates. Each reel weighs about one pound.

The beginnings of commercial radio rose out of a nation facing a severe depression and it reached its height during a devastating second world war. America needed something to laugh at to relieve its troubles and radio proved to be the perfect solution. The genius of the radio comics entered the homes and hearts of millions of people with a unique form of comedy--comedy that relied on mental pictures instead of visual ones. Fibber McGee's closet, for example, was created by sound effects men dropping a lot of tin pans and hardware, but the listener saw in his mind a huge pile of personal items cascading onto McGee or an unsuspecting guest whenever that door was opened. Radio could produce a loveable woman negro maid named Beulah when played by a white man. A grown woman, Fanny Brice, created a most believable brat named Baby Snooks. And Charlie McCarthy even proved that ventriloquism could work on radio without the visual illusion for its basic effect.

Probably the majority of the radio comedians came from successful vaudeville careers to even greater success in radio. They developed lasting styles and characters, and some like Jack Benny developed an image so permanent that it would carry over into the rest of his life, and be identifiable to people who never even heard him on radio. Many of the comedy stars surrounded themselves with a stock company of excellent supporting players who got the best comedy lines, using the star of the show as the butt of their jokes. Phil Harris had Frankie Remley, Judy Canova had Pedro, Eddie Cantor had The Mad Russian, Jack Benny had Rochester, etc. Humorists like Fred Allen poked fun at even the most serious of issues and developed an incredible following.

Many comedy teams emerged from radio. None are better remembered than Amos 'n' Andy portrayed by two white men, Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll. For a long time this was the number one show on radio and even many movie theaters had to stop their movies for a broadcast of the current Amos 'n' Andy show over their theater speakers in order to get people to attend the movies. If some today could criticize that show as being racist, they need only to look at the fun poked at the white man, too, in such shows as Lum and Abner. They ran the Jot 'Em Down Store in Pine Ridge, Arkansas, with incredible--but hilarious--stupidity and are finding new fans today with rebroadcasts over many stations.

How funny are the tape recordings of these shows today? Most have stood the test of time very well. Fibber McGee, Fred Allen, Jack Benny and Vic and Sade are just as funny today as they were when they were performing live. Some of the series, especially the situation comedies, were and are less hilarious than the greatest comedians and some of the humor is lost now because it was topical (although that adds to the historical and nostalgic interest.) But give a listen to a few and see if you don't think that today's humorists could benefit from the same kind of clean and fresh approach to humor.

"Tired of the everyday routine? Ever dream of romantic adventure in a far-off land? Want to get away from it all? We offer you. . .Escape!" So began the superb series of adventure and mystery called Escape. And that is what radio did for all the people trapped in their hum-drum lives. A flick of the switch and suddenly one was transported to any part of the world and from one incredible adventure to another. Imagination filled in all of the details for these exciting trips whether one was swinging on ropes through the dark and cavernous expanses of the Temple of Vampires on I Love a Mystery or tiptoeing through the morgue on Inner Sanctum where one body was always alive!

Anyone who has felt the chill up his back when Raymond opened the creaking door on Inner Sanctum as he listened to his radio in a darkened room--alone!--or who felt his pulse quicken as the Lights Out announcer told him to turn out his lights amid sounds of howling dogs, will never forget the effectiveness of radio mystery. These spine-tinglers are still as effective today when listened to carefully in a darkened room. In fact, movies and TV have never, in many persons' opinion, with all of their special visual effects equalled the effectiveness of these dramas on radio.

Writer Arch Oboler lived in a world of his own, but his Lights Out scripts, later rerun as Arch Oboler's Plays and The Devil and Mr. O, are unforgettable episodes of horror and imagination.

The incredible genius of writer, Carlton E. Morse, created--along with the totally different One Man's Family--mystery serials for children that were so popular with people of all ages that Golden Age Radio decided to list them in this section instead of with children's shows. And adults of today need not be ashamed to admit that Jack, Doc and Reggie on I Love a Mystery are their favorite adventurers.

And who knows what audience Lamont Cranston, better known as The Shadow, was aimed for. But this hero, who had the power to cloud men's minds so that they could not see him, and his constant (!) companion--beautiful Margo Lane--was listened to attentively by young and old alike for many years after his introduction in 1937.

Probably the most successful of all of the mystery and adventure shows was Suspense which began in 1942 and lasted until the death of radio drama. Top stars and foremost writers made this series a highlight of radio listening every week. The most remembered broadcast was Agnes Moorehead in "Sorry, Wrong Number," which was broadcast eight times by popular request, and later made into a movie which was weaker than its radio counterpart in spite of the Hollywood treatment.

And now, the man in black, brings you "a tale. . .well calculated. . .to keep you in.SUSPENSE!"

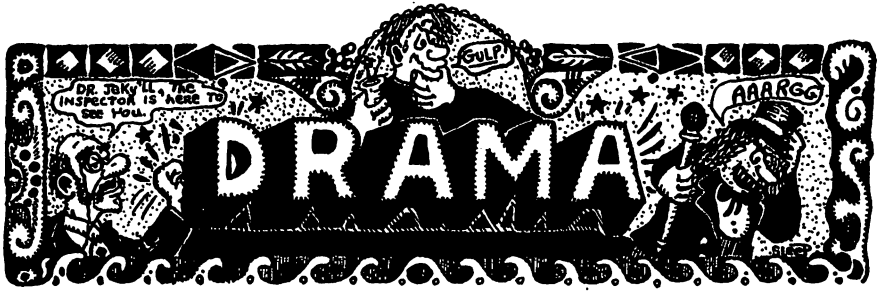

"Lux presents. . .Hollywood!" Radio's golden age coincided with what many think was movies' golden age, and it is only logical that the popular movie stars could bring some of their glamor and talent to radio as well. Nearly every major movie from Hollywood was brought to radio over Lux Radio Theater and most productions featured the same stars as the movie featured. Cecil B. DeMille hosted the show from its beginnings in 1936 until union problems forced his resignation in January of 1945, after which William Keighley and Irving Cummings took over until the end of the run in 1955. Owning tape recordings of these fine productions is the next best thing to being able to see the old movie classics whenever one wants to.

While Lux Radio Theater is the most remembered series, many others like The Screen Guild Players, Theater Guild on the Air, The Hallmark Playhouse, and Academy Award kept writers busy producing new scripts or adapting the classic stories for radio. From the late 30's when Orson Welles tackled such classics as "Les Miserables" and "Julius Caesar" and formed the highly praised Mercury Theater on the Air, nothing was too difficult to adapt to radio. Through the years some series such as the CBS Radio Workshop have taken real flights into the realm of sonic creativity and drama.

The weekly First Nighter Program actually created some of the excitement of attending the first performance of a show at the Little Theater off Times Square as the genial usher led the listener to his seat. Hurry, curtain going up!

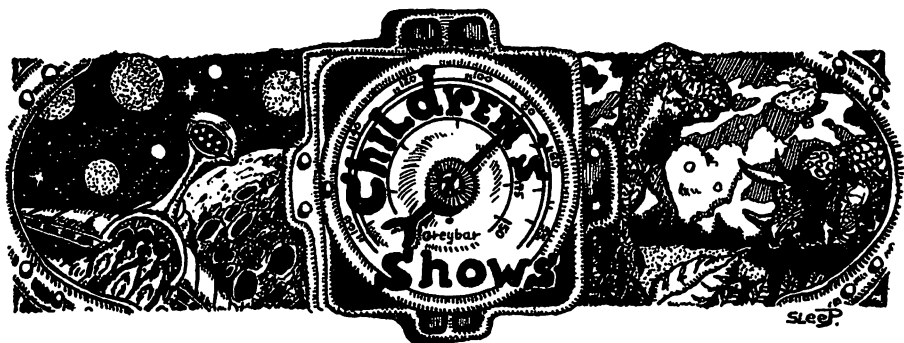

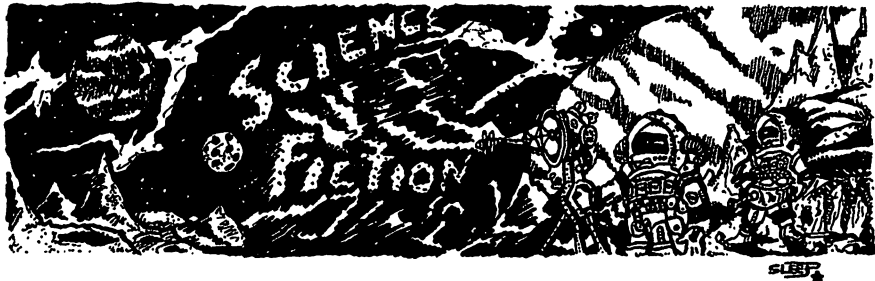

Probably the most imaginative of all fiction is science fiction. And radio, being the theater of the mind, is an effective way to present it. The monster in a science fiction radio play is not just a man in a rubber suit, but is as terrible as one's imagination will allow.

Perhaps the earliest and certainly the most devastating of the science fiction radio broadcasts was the Mercury Theater production of "War of the Worlds" in 1938. A nation driven to panic because a fictional radio production convinced thousands of people that we were actually being invaded by Martians is certainly good evidence of the power and effectiveness of radio drama.

After occasional science fiction productions on such series as Suspense and Escape, radio got its first SF series in 1950 with 2000 Plus. And about a month later the excellent series Dimension X began. This NBC series concluded a year and one half later, but was reincarnated in 1955 under the title of X Minus One. Many of the same stories were produced again, and many new stories were aired before it was removed from the air in 1958. This catalog lists all of the titles of Dimension X and X Minus One that were aired, although some of the productions which were done on both shows have not been located in both formats. Radio science fiction reached its pinnacle with these two shows before radio drama bowed to TV. Tales of Tomorrow was ABC's entry running between these two series and Exploring Tomorrow was heard on Mutual for a short time during the 1957-58 season. Other excellent science fiction dramas were produced in England and South Africa where radio drama lived on.

Recommended to the devoted SF fan is a private publication "Science Fiction on Radio" which describes the known productions and gives dates, cast and plot information, etc. It is available for \$1.50 from Meade Frierson III, 3705 Woodvale Road, Birmingham, Alabama 35223. Enclose 25¢ for postage.

The pioneering spirit in all of us and a desire to live the simpler life are probably the main reasons for the success of Western stories. Radio can take us there without getting our boots muddy or our backside sore. The greatest radio Westerns mainly for adults came late in radio's golden age. But that did not diminish the importance of such excellent series as Gunsmoke and Have Gun, Will Travel, who went on to become classics on TV as well. And, of course, The Lone Ranger wasn't just for the kids, was it? This hero and his Indian companion blazed the west on radio from 1933 until 1954, becoming really bigger than life with the skillful acting of Brace Beemer.

The radio detectives became bigger than life, too, as they found a neat solution to every crime they encountered. A few clues dropped here and there and we, too, became detectives in our armchairs. Elementary, my dear Watson!

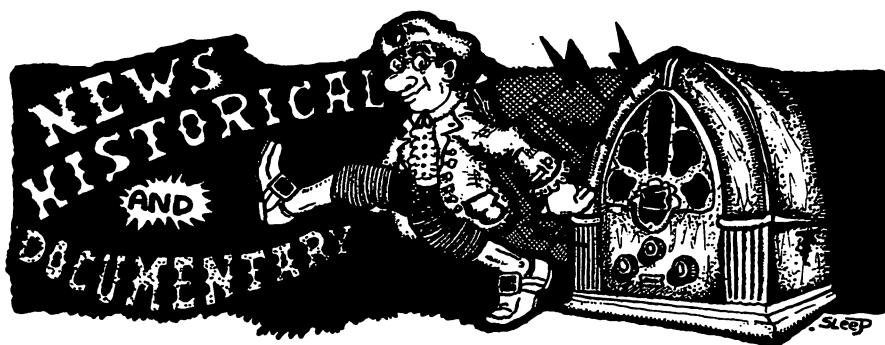

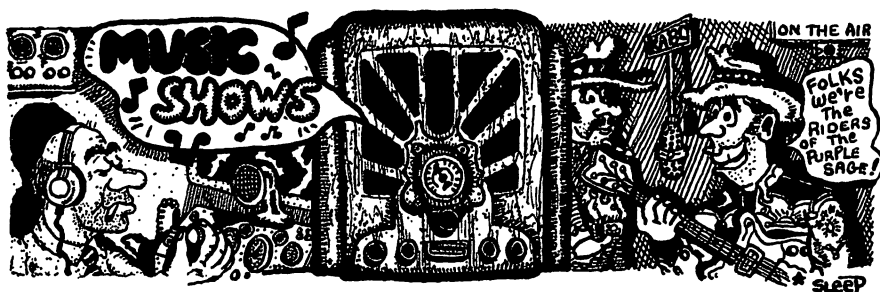

From the beginning of radio, music shows were among the most popular. It was an inexpensive new way to bring all of the top musical performers into every home. America fell in love with the crooning of Rudy Vallee and that kid named Frankie on Your Hit Parade show. A turn of the dial could give you music for any taste—from the broadcasts of Toscanini and the NBC Symphony Orchestra to the stomping fun of the National Barn Dance.

The early days of radio—the '30's and the '40's—were also the era of the big bands. These bands played one-nighters in ballrooms from coast to coast and radio soon produced broadcasting installations in many of them to take their music to the masses. Since these broadcasts originated outside of the studios, they became known as "remotes." These broadcasts are among the most nostalgic of all of the radio recordings that have survived. Just a few strains of a live Glenn Miller broadcast, for example, brings memories of the 1940's to the many people who lived important parts of their lives at that time.

Recordings of these shows have survived by being passed from collector to collector. Therefore, the sound quality is not of the same level as will be found on the reissues of commercial recordings made at the same time. Music suffers more on the old radio recordings than does vocal shows; so if you are looking for music approaching high fidelity, you will find little here. But you will find recordings with more warmth, spontaneity, and historical importance than any that exist in the local record store; because most of the musical performances were broadcast live.

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Serialized drama was a mainstay of radio as it brought back the same audience for episode after episode. Many of the serials can be found in other sections of this catalog. Comedy serials like Lum and Abner are listed under comedy, children's adventure serials under children's shows, etc. But the most important feature of daytime radio broadcasting is herewith sampled--the soap opera. If the list seems meager compared to the thousands of episodes broadcast to the breathless audience of housewives (not to mention a few nonchalant males) it is because most of them were done live and few recordings were left for posterity.

Soap operas were so called mainly because they were sponsored by one or another of the many soap products on the market. Most were 15 minute shows broadcast between 10:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., at which time the airwaves were taken over by the children's serials. Endless "real-life" horrors were depicted as they lingered over terminal illnesses, marital problems, long lost lovers or relatives, and cases of amnesia.

The first soap opera is claimed to be Clara, Lu and Em--three ad-libbing gossips which began network broadcasting in 1932. Some rare broadcasts of this series were recently found and are listed on page 128. Most of the soap operas originated in New York or Chicago. Some actresses made an entire career out of being on these serials and actually became this person to millions of listeners. Virginia Payne was "Ma Perkins" for the entire 27 year run of 7,065 shows. Anne Elstner played "Stella Dallas" for all but two broadcasts in the 18 and 1/2 years that it was on the air, and Mary Jane Higby played the heroine of "When a Girl Marries" for 18 years. Many of the series were produced to formula by the same people. Frank and Anne Hummert produced about 200 different series which include many of the most successful ones. The last of the "soaps" met their demise in the fall of 1960.

Golden Age Radio is pleased to help you relive a few moments from the tortured lives of Just Plain Bill (the barber of Hartsville); Lorenzo Jones (and his useless inventions); David Harum (a small town banker); Ma Perkins (a lumberyard operator in Rushville Center); Young Doctor Malone (from the Three Oaks Medical Center); The Couple Next Door (who will make your neighbors seem dull!); Mary Noble, Backstage Wife (or what it means to be the wife of a famous Broadway star--dream sweetheart of a million other women!); Our Gal Sunday (an orphan girl from the little mining town who married a handsome lord); Young Widder Brown (the story of the age-old conflict between a mother's duty and a woman's heart); and many more. Does anyone have an extra handkerchief?
