The Editors' Note:

A READER writes: "Of late years I have almost given up listening to the radio because of the terrible commercial announcements. Some of them are an insult to the average listener's intelligence. If the sponsors had to listen to the radio every day for a whole month, they would know exactly what I mean. Can't something be done to rid the airwaves of these boresome announcements?"—Mrs. K. M.

Can something be done? It would certainly seem that something should be done, for the writer of the above isn't the only person who feels that a large number of the announcements heard on the airwaves are missing the bus. In proof of this there are hundreds of letters reposing in **Movie-Radio Guide's** files.

The trouble with a good many radio announcements is that they belong to another era of radio. They might have been extremely effective selling agents when radio was young, but I'm afraid they just don't fit in the present-day broadcasting.

Despite the fact that radio has grown up, we still have "horse-and-buggy" era copy writers who daily dash off announcements which are liberally sprinkled with high-powered adjectives and verbal clichés to sell the listener. However, the plain truth is that many listeners consider such announcements to be only annoying.

One of these days writers of commercial radio announcements are going to discover that superlatives such as

amazing, wonderful and sensational no longer overwhelm the listener. They would discover it today if they could only realize that the present-day listener is not gullible.

And that reminds us, there is a manner of announcing which is extremely annoying. It is known as the "staccato attack," wherein by the use of a rapid-fire delivery the announcer attempts to impress the listener with the advisability of dropping everything and rushing out to buy the product in question—presumably before it is too late. Instead of that sort of delivery, how much better it would be if the announcer toned down his message a bit—ridded his voice of its hysteria—and did a little more of the direct, friendly type of selling.

Listeners report that they will buy the sponsor's product just as quickly by a calm announcement as by one that is shouted. They will perhaps buy it even more quickly, for if the announcer will but maintain a calm, friendly attitude, then the listener won't be apt to turn him off, and so will get a chance to know something of the product he is selling.

STIRLING HAYDEN

THIS six feet five inches and 212 pounds of muscle, wavy blond hair and blue eyes made the feminine hearts of the nation add quite a few beats when they first saw him in "Virginia" making love to Madeleine Carroll when Fred MacMurray wasn't looking. "Virginia" was Stirling Hayden's first picture, and it meant the end for him of as colorful a seagoing career as any Hollywood leading man, not excluding Errol Flynn, can lay claim to. Hayden really worked at the old-salt business and has held master's papers. Flynn did not, and thereby hangs a feud. Hayden was America's youngest licensed captain for vessels up to eight thousand tons. Sailing from Gloucester to Tahiti in 1938, per of the brig *Florence C. Robinson*. CLAIMING descent from "Applesed Johnny" Chapman, father of American apple orchards, lovely Marguerite Chapman was minding her own business as a model in New York City when along came Howard Hughes, producer-director, and placed her in the movies. Before discovered, Marguerite had never acted. In high school she was a member of the dramatic society—an understudy. She became a hat-designer, but a wise boss urged her to become a model. While riding up the elevator in the building where John Powers, leading model agent, is located, a man stared at her. Promptly she was ushered into John Powers' office and hired as a model. It was while demonstrating advantages of finger-nail polish that Hughes saw her, and the first thing she knew she was in Hollywood. Marguerite Chapman and the five other girls pictured here are a sextette in Warner's forthcoming "Navy Blues."



ONE of America's most-photographed girls, luscious, long-legged Katherine Aldridge, is a blond version of Kay Francis. Currently cast in "Navy Blues," Katherine, a former Powers model, was introduced to the movies by Elsa Maxwell. Born on a plantation near Richmond, Va., Katherine worked alongside colored help in the best Scarlett O'Hara tradition to keep the old place in the family. She attended a girls' seminary and then went to work in a Baltimore bank. John Powers models she met at a West Point dance urged her to seek out the agent. Carrying her three dresses and six dollars, she walked into Powers' office, got a job. The next two years she was America's most-photographed girl. Her beauty made its mark in the film capital, so upon her return she soon found herself a decorative part of musicals at Warner Bros., Paramount and M-G-M. She was Earl Carroll's unqualified selection as "Miss America" for the New York World's Fair. Brown and Bigelow, the big calendar manufacturers, call her "The most beautiful girl in the world." Claire is strikingly suggestive of blond and vibrant Lana Turner. Born in Minneapolis, Minn., she developed a proficiency in all branches of dancing while attending high school. With her equally lovely sister, Lois, she started in small vaudeville acts early in life. Both girls appeared in "Artists and Models," "Fast and Furious," "Strike Up the Band," and "Ziegfeld Girl." "Navy Blues" marks her first real break.



TAPPED on the shoulder by Louella Parsons while dancing in the Stork Club, Peggy Diggins, the daughter of a trial lawyer, shortly found herself in pictures. Her sylph-like beauty is somewhat like that of Hedy Lamarr. Peggy's present ambition is to become a fine actress. Born in New York, none of her people were actors. School dancing led to night-club work and at the same time Peggy became a professional model for Walter Thornton. She has made a promising start with roles in "Honeymoon for Three," "Santa Fe Trail," "Lady with Red Hair," "High Sierra" and "Affectionately Yours." Outside of acting she is interested in governmental and economic problems, politics, sketching, playing piano and designing dresses. She plays golf, tennis, badminton, rides and swims. Her indoor diversions are bridge, ping-pong, bowling. She likes to watch football, tennis, hockey. She can cook but doesn't.



CLASSIFYING her theatrical career in Lincoln, Nebr., up to the age of fifteen as undistinguished, Lorraine Gettman, redhead, began her movie career shortly after her father entered her in Hollywood High School. Lorraine became a model, appeared on a magazine cover or so and, presto, came to the attention of the screen. In high-school plays she played Portias and Juliets. Her family has no theatrical background, but a lot of them were musicians, and Lorraine would like to be a singer. She credits her motion-picture opportunity to Tom Kelly, a photographer. His picture of her in *Stage* magazine turned the trick for her. Her favorite stars are Vivien Leigh, Laurence Olivier and Brian Aherne. Lorraine sketches, paints, plays the piano, likes to whistle. She is a close edition of Myrna Loy. An alarmingly pretty girl, she was selected for a part in "Ziegfeld Girl," then was signed to a Warner Bros. contract.



DISCOVERED by Buddy De Sylva in a restaurant on her first trip to New York, Georgia Carroll is another of those girls who are making Texas famous for its beauties. Brought to Filmtown by Warner Bros., she appeared in "Mr. and Mrs. Smith" and "They Met in Argentina." Neither was made by Warners, but her work was noticed by Warner executives and they offered her a long-term contract. She was one of the most-photographed girls in the country and appeared on many magazine covers. Music, painting, photography and ballet interest her most outside of acting. Designing and interior decorating occupy a good deal of her spare time. Georgia's father, Roger Carroll, is a sheep-raiser. His financial success enabled Georgia to travel extensively. 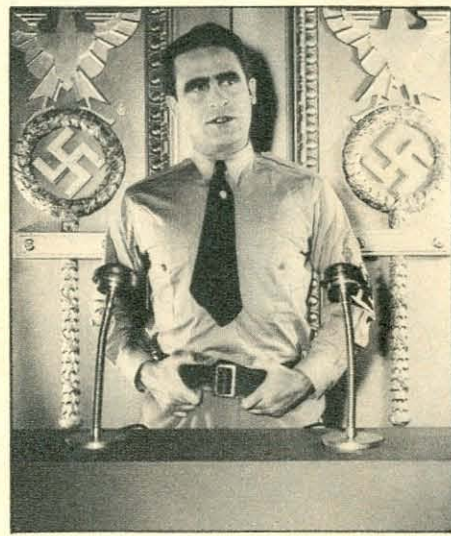

Nazi Spies in Hollywood?

Dead ringer for Hess, this man is a respected actor



MORE THAN ONCE annoyed by smear propaganda of Nazi stooges operating in Hollywood, Warner Bros. continues to make hard-hitting anti-Nazi films. Quickly cashing in on the fantastic story of the flight of No. 2 Nazi Rudolph Hess to England, Warners has included a sequence in the forthcoming picture, "Underground," showing Hess haranguing the Reichstag, escaping to Britain. To portray Hess, they used actor Frank Wilcox. The three shots above show Wilcox as Hess, bearing striking resemblance to the real Hess, whose photos are shown at left and right

ARE there Nazi spies in Hollywood? My investigation revealed some eye-opening stories. Consider first:

Case 1: In San Fernando Valley there is a restaurant operated obviously by a German management. The attitude of one arrogant waiter aroused the suspicion of an actor, who decided to "cover" the spot. He did, and noted boxes of "vegetables" being delivered late at night. That seemed unusual, so the actor concealed himself in the basement and pried into a couple of the vegetable crates. They were filled with guns and ammunition! He turned the story over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. "We know all about that place," he was told. "We've had it under surveillance for months and are tracing the higher-ups."

Case 2: There's a beauty shop on Vine Street near NBC. The network girls and actresses don't have their hair waved there any more. The reason: Besides being good beauty operators, the employes are skilled Nazi propagandists and artists in the technique of pumping their patrons for defense information.

Case 3: Another actor entered a cafe near his Hollywood home. He heard bar talk centering on the war and detected ardent German sympathy. So he posed as an isolationist favoring the German cause. Before he could stop the bartender, the actor had almost been signed up for the Bund! But when the neighborhood Quislings came in to talk to the actor, he told them off in no uncertain terms. In the brawl which started, the actor wound up with seven fractured ribs—and the FBI now has its men covering the spot, the bartender and the Quislings.

Case 4: Harry Warner, of Warner Bros. Studio, was annoyed a year ago when Nazi handbills of a vile sort, belittling American movie producers, were distributed widely over Hollywood, throughout every studio, and even in Harry Warner's car. He called a mass meeting of employes of every studio, requested them to bring along their wives, and pointedly asked them, "What is wrong with America?" No one had an answer to that, and although the Nazi-sympathizing handbill circulators were not ferreted out, no more were distributed.

In retaliation, Warner Bros. has been brutal with the Nazis in its films. Their most recent jab at Hitler is the inclusion in the anti-Nazi film "Underground" of scenes showing the "great" Rudolph Hess fleeing to England. Shown herewith are stills from those scenes showing actor Frank Wilcox portraying Hess.

Likewise shown are a series of pictures of character actor Charles Arnt, an American, who asks, "Would you know a spy if you saw one?" Take a look at his "disguises" and answer "No!" But don't think, just because a new neighbor wears a beard, that he is a foreign agent. He may only be hiding a weak chin.

Are there Nazi spies in Hollywood? Yes, and probably in every other community of size in America!

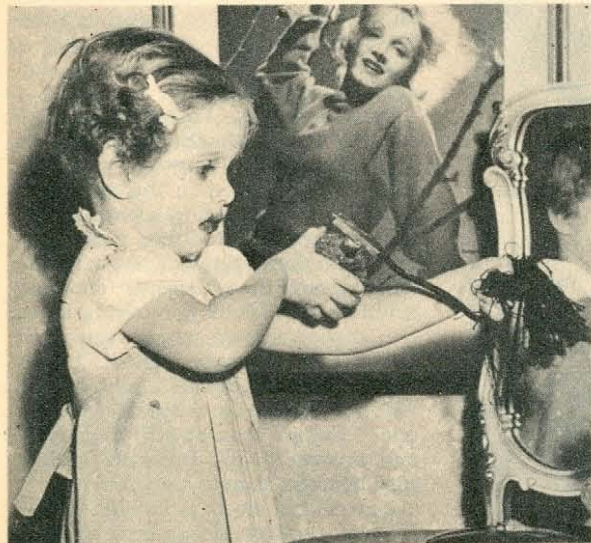

Tierney Parents Disapprove

The elopement June 1 of Gene Tierney, nineteen, socialite-actress starring in the 20th Century-Fox production "Belle Starr," to Nevada with Oleg Cassini, twenty-eight, dress designer, was greeted coldly by her parents, the Howard S. Tierneys of New York, both of whom voiced disapproval of the match. Said her father: "I wish she had stuck to her own standards instead of getting married in that abrupt fashion . . . I was sorry to hear she'd gone Hollywood." Said her mother: "Gene is just a misguided child. She has been carried away by this—this suave man of the world." Said the bride: "I have my own life to live. I am sorry that my parents disapprove of my choice, but I love my husband sincerely." After the parental word-battle, Mrs. Tierney flew west to visit daughter and smoothed over the situation. MOVIE VIEWS by Carl A. Schroeder

Dear Public:

THERE is something truly inspiring about the spirit in which our English movie-making friends are carrying on these days. It is always possible that in the midst of a highly emotional love scene the hero's passionate moment with the heroine may be punctuated suddenly by a bomb that will bring the entire studio down on their heads.

We don't know whether the English prop-boy who last week wrote us a letter is alive today or not, but this is what he had to say: "I used to think we had tough days sometimes in Hollywood. That place, with its petulant stars who frequently 'collapse from overwork,' seems like another world now. The fear of being bombed isn't so bad. We are more annoyed than anything else by the air-raid alarms that stop production at the most inconvenient moments.

"Then, too, some of us work at being air-raid wardens at night or on similar jobs and it's no joke to get on the set in the morning after not more than two hours' or so sleep a night for some weeks."

We quote this letter not to chide Hollywood, which is hardly to blame for not having the war in its back yard, but to point up a fact: When you see an English-made picture now you are getting double your money's worth in behind-the-scenes drama.

No one can convince us, for instance, that the low rumble which can be heard during portions of George Bernard Shaw's "Major Barbara" is not the sound of distant bombardment or bombing. This does not detract from the film, rather it adds to the whole effect of a stirring war-time message.

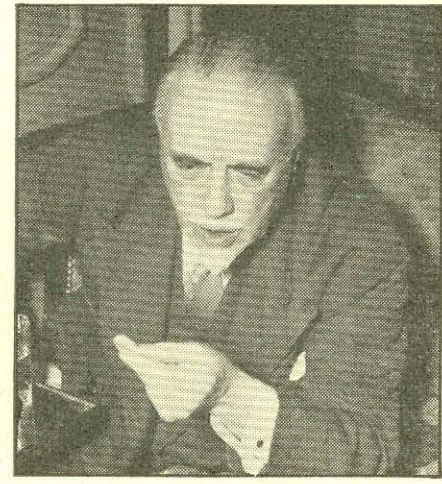

Today in Radio

Morton Downey obtains divorce;
comedienne and commentator die

HOW many fan letters have been written to radio stars since broadcasting began? Nobody knows, but just to give you an idea of the widespread nature of this curious habit, more than fifteen million letters and cards are sent annually to NBC sponsors and artists alone.

That's a whopping big pile of mail for your Uncle Samuel to deliver. But what is even more important, it represents a cross-section of the thoughts and emotions of many millions of people. Fan letters have admittedly done much to make radio the sort of thing it is today. In no other field of entertainment is the "public" so feared, so despised and so devotedly worshiped.

History doesn't say who wrote the first fan letter. The practise probably began when our caveman ancestors learned that they could convey a message by carving a series of pictures upon a piece of whalebone. Fan mail largely came into prominence when the "matinee idol" of the theater reigned supreme. It later advanced as an art when the films supplanted the theater as America's greatest entertainment medium. Unable to see their idols in person, film-goers turned to letter-writing as a means of expressing their appreciation. But neither the theater nor the movies have managed to pull the number of fan letters which radio receives. "In radio," says Lowell Thomas, "the sounds that wing their way on the ether waves are the supreme incitement of that peculiar form of epistolary art called fan mail."

When you write a fan letter to, say, Young & Rubicam, Inc., who are the agency representatives for quite a number of important air shows, what happens to your letter?

One thing you may be sure of, it is read. The first thing the readers look for is adverse criticism. If the number of letters indicates that the disap-

proval of a certain portion of the program is general, then that portion is eliminated. Picture requests are usually referred to the star, who in most cases will send one. All questions are answered promptly and every effort is made to please the writer.

Thus the millions of letters pouring in every year serve a useful purpose. By these letters program producers are enabled to discover what pleases more than sixty million daily listeners. True, some are trivial, some are exasperating and some are just plain boring, but the greater majority have been interesting, heartening and instructive. Radiomen, more so than any others, freely acknowledge the debt they owe to fan mail. It is their only link with the listener.

GENERAL

War Talks Scanned

WASHINGTON.—Radio stations throughout the country have been asked by the Federal Communications Commission to send copies of all talks

on the "war issues" to the commission. This request was made at the direction of the Senate Interstate Commerce Committee, at the suggestion of Senator Tobey of New Hampshire, who said he had information

from "the representative of a leading chain" that many Senators and Representatives had been denied radio time to talk against intervention in the war. Tobey's action is similar to that of Senator Wheeler, who a few months ago had the networks submit scripts of speeches on the lease-lend question.

Downey Wins Divorce

BRIDGEPORT, CONN.—Morton Downey won an uncontested divorce June 4 from his wife, Barbara Bennett, sister of Connie and Joan. Downey also received custody of their five children, one of whom is an adopted son. Except for occasional guest appearances, the veteran tenor has not been heard on the networks for a few years, having concentrated on night-club work. Since the divorce the former Mrs. Downey has eloped with Addison Randall, cowboy film star.



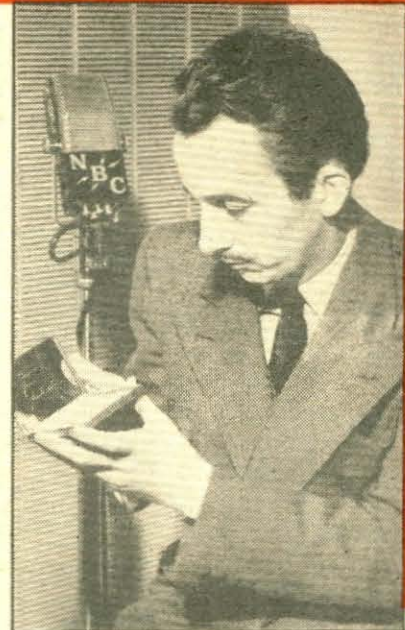

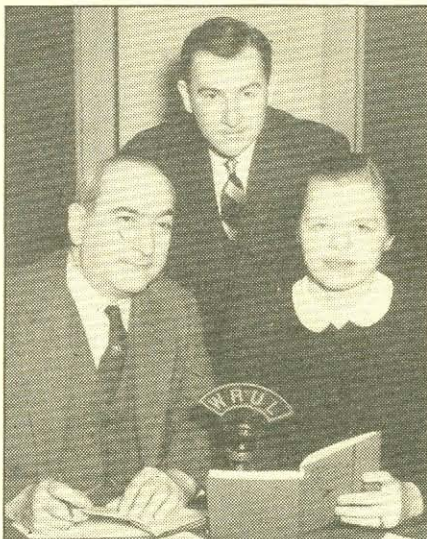
GENERAL ELECTRIC'S three short-wave stations, already among the most powerful in the world, will be made even more effective by new transmitting equipment now being installed in Schenectady and San Francisco.

WGEA, Schenectady, and KGEI, San Francisco, formerly operating at 25,000 and 20,000 watts respectively, are both being increased to 50,000-watt power. WGEO, Schenectady, New York, licensed for 100,000 watts and long famous as the most powerful short-wave broadcasting station in the western hemisphere, is also receiving new equipment to increase further its effectiveness.

It is expected that the new WGEA transmitter in South Schenectady will

may be called into use any day for emergency communication during flood, fire or hurricane. This year as never before there is a grimmer note to somewhat dampen the ardor of the festivities, since amateurs are pondering the national situation and speculating as to whether before another Field Day rolls around these portable transmitters may be in use for military purposes.

News Room Has Distinguished Speakers

The WBOS News Room of the Air program, a radio newspaper, inaugurated on June 1, may now be heard Sundays from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m. EDT over WBOS (11.87), Boston.

Included in this unique program each week are: The latest bulletins of the hour; the news of the week in review; the news of tomorrow; the human-interest story of the week, and the feature page interview. For the feature page interview, a leading authority on the international situation is invited to give his views. Thus far, William Elliot, Professor of Government at Harvard University, and Roland Hall Sharp of the *Christian Science Monitor* have been guest speakers on the program.

Goebbels Gabblers to Be Exposed

Goebbels' staff of trained propagandists, heard nightly over the Berlin short-wave station, has been augmented by the addition of two women commentators, Jane Anderson and Ray Beveridge. Regular listeners are familiar with the usual crew of Goebbels gabblers, consisting of Lord Haw Haw, Paul Revere, E. D. Ward, Fred Kaltenbach and Prof. Otto Koischwitz. Nazi propagandists are intensifying their efforts day by day as America moves ever closer to the brink of war. These Berlin speakers are wily and clever agents who are definitely trying to influence and mold American public opinion now as never before. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE will soon start a series of frank and lucid articles, each one dealing with one of these commenta-

tors, giving the lowdown on his or her background, explaining their methods of operation and the falsity in the seeming logic that each presents.

James Lansdale Hodson, a regular speaker on London's program, "Britain Speaks," aired daily at 8:30 p.m. EDT over GSD (11.75), is the son of a Lancashire cotton-mill manager. A talent for writing dialect verses was his passport to Fleet Street. He joined the staff of the *London Daily Mail* in his early twenties.

But his journalistic career was interrupted by the outbreak of the last war. He joined up in September, 1914; after serving with the King's Liverpool Regiment, he was eventually seconded to the Ministry of Munitions as a special intelligence officer.

Hodson returned to the newspaper world immediately after the war. For eleven years he was Manchester news editor of the *Daily Mail*. Later he joined the *Daily News* and was sent to investigate and report unemployment conditions in Europe during the great depression. More recently his name has become widely known as a writer on social problems. He is also the author of many successful novels and plays.

He is at present an accredited war correspondent with the British Army. In his capacity he has already been twice evacuated from France. He may be recalled for duty at any time.

be put into operation about July 1, after devoting the month of June to the testing of equipment. KGEI's new equipment is also expected to begin operating on July 1. New offices and studios for this station, which has been broadcasting since early in 1939 from Treasure Island, are located in San Francisco's Fairmont Hotel, occupying three thousand square feet of floor space. The new 100,000-watt WGEO is scheduled to open late in August.

Amateurs Have Field Day

On June 7-8 amateur radio operators celebrated their annual Field Day. Out in open fields and vacant lots all over the country amateurs set up portable, self-powered transmitters and established contacts with each other by phone and c.w. (code). Operators working in shifts kept the equipment in constant use during the entire twenty-seven-hour period. Equipment in use ranged all the way from crude, hastily put together, temporary apparatus with a power of only one or two watts to elaborate 500- or 1,000-watt gasoline-generator-powered outfits. There was keen competition both in local groups and on a national basis to see which operator could during the specified period work (establish two-way contact with) the largest number of stations.

While ostensibly Field Day is an outing where hams (amateurs) gather to "chew the rag" (engage in friendly discussion or argument) and test out portable or experimental equipment, there is really a much deeper underlying significance to the occasion, for it is this very same equipment which

law to convert our nation into the arsenal of democracy has been your choice.

But now, and as proved by recent and present events, this is not enough. YOU must submit to further realization and consequent readjustment, namely, that OUR civilization can be made secure only by engaging the full strength and power of this nation in common cause with the British Empire. Only with all of our resources can the danger to our liberty be overcome.

Every day of delay makes your peril greater and brings closer to these shores a war that certainly will take its grim toll not only of gold but of blood. Without evasion or reservation but only with prompt action can this danger be overcome. This means that YOU must now assume a full share of sacrifice in the united defense.

Assuming that YOU want to save the United States of America from the line-up of slave nations chained to the wheel of a conqueror's chariot, it is clear that now you join in the following demands upon our national government:

1. The Navy and air force to safeguard our lifeline with the British Isles.

2. Real aid to China. Real embargo against Japan. Definite declaration to Japan of our intention to prevent the conquest of Singapore and the Dutch Indies.

3. Freezing of Axis assets, and the stamping out of subversive propaganda and sabotage within our gates.

This, of course, may lead to open war. But, according to Hitler, we are already his enemy. If it suits his purpose, he will attack us with or without provocation, whenever and however he chooses. In the path of Hitler's designs the choice is never war or peace. It is submission to his will or resistance to the death.

Adolf Hitler has one great fear that he has often expressed to his intimates, namely, the potential power of the United States. Nothing on earth can resist that power—if it is unleashed on time. However, if Great Britain goes down, Hitler will have the great advantage that then the United States will stand as the last in the line of his enemies—and we will stand ALONE.

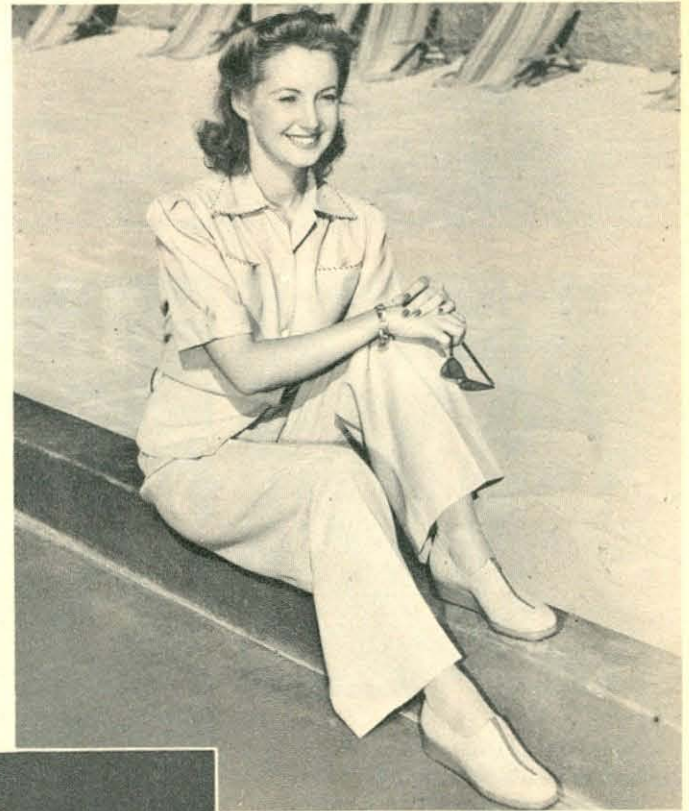

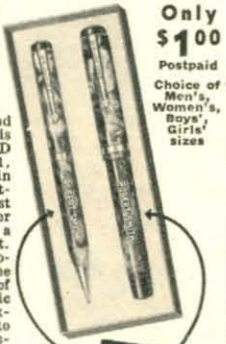

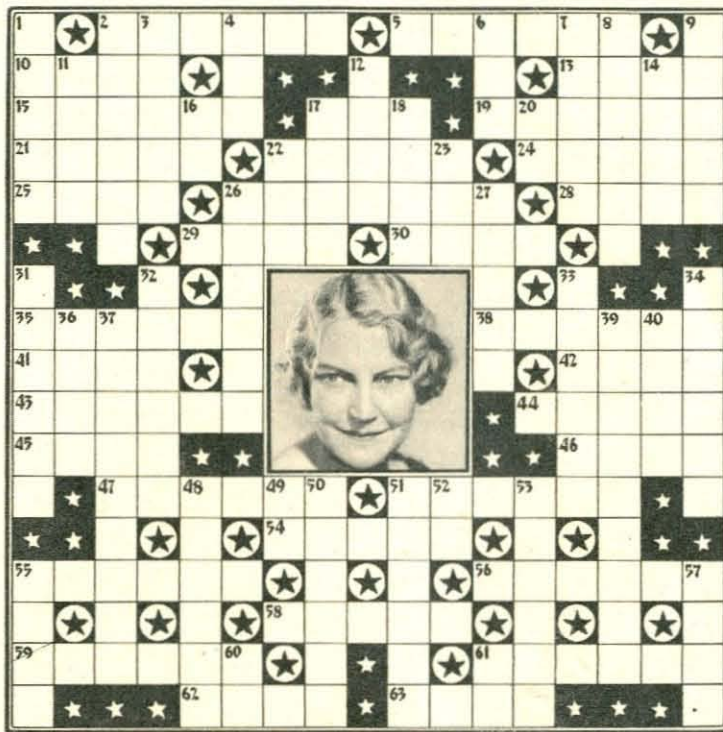
