THE success of "Citizen Kane," whose cast is composed almost entirely of radio-trained actors and actresses, has proved to Hollywood that radio can, and does, produce artists of stellar quality. **Movie-Radio Guide** was one of the first to recognize the potentialities of radio artists for the screen. But Hollywood, as you may or may not know, has been inclined to turn up its nose at the ability of the radio-trained artists.

As a matter of fact Hollywood has always tried to treat radio as a sort of stepchild, to be used when advantageous, but not to be recognized as an entertainment medium of marked importance. This, however, in our opinion, is being changed. The movie industry has decided to kiss and make up with radio. Today film companies are known to have talent scouts who do nothing but listen in to programs in the hope of discovering likely film material or personalities with definite motion-picture qualities. Hollywood has even gone so far as to use several well-known radio programs as the basis for film stories. Examples of this trend toward pictures with a radio history are: "I Want a Divorce," "Grand Ole Opry," "Mr. District Attorney," "Pot o' Gold," "The Lone Ranger," and others. And, of course, there are the shorts, "Information, Please" and the "Quiz Kids."

Why this sudden about-face on the part of the movie moguls? We believe that it is because the movies realize

that many radio programs have definite picture possibilities. And naturally they do not forget the reputation which these programs have with the listeners who are also movie fans. Instead of taking their stars off the air as was done a year or so ago by 20th Century-Fox, when they prevented Tyrone Power and Alice Faye from broadcasting, most studios are anxious to have them appear as guests or the like.

Those radio comedians, Abbott and Costello, are prime examples of the present-day tendency to raid the broadcasting studios for film talent. These two comedians who got their first start on the Kate Smith program were so successful with their first movie that they were signed immediately to make several more. Charlie McCarthy and Edgar Bergen, Fibber McGee and Molly, Hal Peary (Mr. Gildersleeve), Whitey Ford (The Duke of Paducah), Arthur Q. Bryan, the Moylan Sisters and Don Wilson are just a few of radio's own who will soon be seen on the screen in new roles.

To us this tendency to assign more and more radio stars for film parts is a good thing for both the movies and radio. The movies are able to capitalize upon the reputation of stars who already have a tremendous following. On the other hand radio, which can only be heard, gets a chance to let the listener see the stars who previously he could only visualize by drawing upon his imagination.—The Editors.

Ann Sheridan's Record Hula

To News Desk:

ANN SHERIDAN has always liked to dance, but now I think she has enough of the hula. It was ninety degrees in the shade the day Ann did the hula sequence in Warner's "Navy Blues." It was the tenth day she had been dancing it, the first nine were rehearsals.

Ann started working at 9:30 a.m. For an hour previous she had been making up. Stopping only long enough to drink a glass of milk, Ann hula danced straight through to 6:30 p.m. It was then that they put ice on her to cool her brow.

Her stretch of hula dancing—nine hours—is a new world's record for Hawaiian girls to shoot at.

Seymour Felix, dance director, said Ann hula danced twelve miles, counting rehearsals. She had to hula on a series of raised, sand-covered platforms. Felix suffered a strained back and injured ankles just rehearsing. Ann received black-and-blue thighs, having hit herself with gourds. What made the "take" doubly tough was that she had to sing while dancing and remember a lot of off-stage business to be added to the scene later by Jack Oakie, Martha Raye, Jack Haley.

I asked Ann, who was cheerful at the end of the day, how she'd like to do the hula. She came back with:

"I'll take the rumba!" —J. A.

GREER GARSON

SCOTCH-IRISH Greer Garson at the age of four recited in the village town hall, County Down, in Ireland, and became an actress. Of course, that wasn't all there was to it. Greer, whom you will see as the foster mother in M-G-M's Technicolor "Blossoms in the Dust," had training as a schoolmarm, was employed at a London advertising agency before heading toward the stage again.

This happened when she met a fellow employee whose sister was on the stage. Armed with a letter of introduction to the producer of Birmingham's Repertory Theater, she won a part in "Street Scene" as Shirley Kaplan, with dialect and black wig. Critics recognized her as a promising actress.

Two seasons at Birmingham and a tour with Shaw's "Too Good to Be True" were followed by the actresses' curse—a layoff. It ended with her starring with Laurence Olivier in "Golden Arrow," a flop, although it paved her way to success. It was in "Old Music" in London that Louis B. Mayer, M-G-M headman, saw her and brought her to Hollywood. A week before her contract expired she got the role as Mrs. Chips in "Goodbye, Mr. Chips" and was a smashing success!

Greer lives quietly in a modest Beverly Hills home with her mother. She is so serious about her career that she will not go out when working. She's shy, hates big affairs, doesn't like jewelry or sports, but dawdles at the piano and loves her garden. She's five feet six inches tall, weighs 112 pounds, and doesn't mind if you call her "Red."

KISSES and love-scenes in current pictures are getting to be all right, but they can't compare with the oldies when Valentino and John Gilbert were in stride, unhobbled by Hays office rulings. Today a kiss more than thirty seconds is given careful scrutiny by Hays inspectors before it is passed. Twenty years ago it wasn't a kiss unless it lasted thirty seconds or more.

Greta Garbo and Gilbert had their lips together forty-seven seconds in "Flesh and the Devil." John Barrymore and Dolores Costello in "The Sea Beast" recorded a forty-nine-second silent smacker. Valentino and Agnes Ayres' caresses lasted thirty-five to forty seconds in "The Sheik."

De Havilland Gets Serious

Today screen love is different and speedier, but just as effective. Most recent love-scene witnessed by your reporter was that of Charles Boyer and Olivia de Havilland in "Hold Back the Dawn." Step by step it's shown on these pages, but back of that kiss is an interesting story.

Olivia kept blowing her lines because the cameraman was wearing a white shirt which distracted her. She was able to concentrate on her work only after the shirt was draped in black to conceal it from her eyes. After rehearsals, takes and retakes, 'tis said Olivia really was captivated by Boyer's

charm. However, Boyer didn't react accordingly. He just went back to his ever-present book!

Husband-Wife Combination

The rare combination of husband and wife playing a love-scene occurred in "I Want a Divorce" with Joan Blondell and Dick Powell. Making up after a quarrel, Dick jumped from his bed and started for Joan's. On the screen the scene ended there, but Dick really finished it. Said Joan: "Why don't you do it like that at home?"

Clark Gable to most women would be hypnotic. Not so to Rosalind Russell, whom he kisses in "They Met in Bombay." Before shooting, Roz called to her maid: "Bring me my sex appeal!"—perfume atomizer, gum.

Pulls Out Ty Power's Hair

In "Blood and Sand," 20th Century-Fox had to remake the scene in which Rita Hayworth pulls Tyrone Power up by the hair to her lips. First time she did, Ty's hair came out.

John Garfield for a gag kissed Ida Lupino for three minutes in "Out of the Fog." Ida struggled free and was ready to slap John, but didn't when she heard the entire cast laughing.

Generally speaking, modern love-scenes have been cooled off, not only by Hays office, but by sharper-seeing cameras, color photography and more exacting make-up standards.—E. P.

SPOTLIGHT ON:



WALTER PIDGEON

WHEN Walter Pidgeon as a big-game hunter stalks Hitler with a high-powered rifle in "Man Hunt," he is paralleling an actual happening of his youth—he killed a charging moose to save his own life. He hasn't hunted since. In "Man Hunt" he stalks game for a thrill. His telescopic sight brings Hitler into bead, but he doesn't shoot.

In his theatrical career of years, Walter just missed the target, but 1941 is bringing him two bull's-eyes—starring roles in "Blossoms in the Dust" and "How Green Was My Valley," besides "Man Hunt." His days as "Nick Carter" are gone. It's been a long pull for Pidgeon. He left the brokerage business in Boston to play parts in a stock company, toured here and abroad with Elsie Janis. In 1925 he was signed by Hollywood for his singing rather than his acting ability.

Leaving Hollywood because producers only wanted him for musicals, he went back to Broadway. In four plays he proved he could get along without singing. Returning to the screen in 1936, he had a clause written into his contract forbidding singing roles. Said Pidgeon: "When a singer gets old, he's out; when a dramatic actor ages, he simply turns to character—I hope."

Walter served in the World War with the Sixty-Fifth Canadian Field Artillery. A big, powerful fellow with a deep, resonant voice, he stands six feet three inches, weighs 190 pounds, is a good tennis player, horseman, likes to travel, collects travel, biographical books, is happily married.

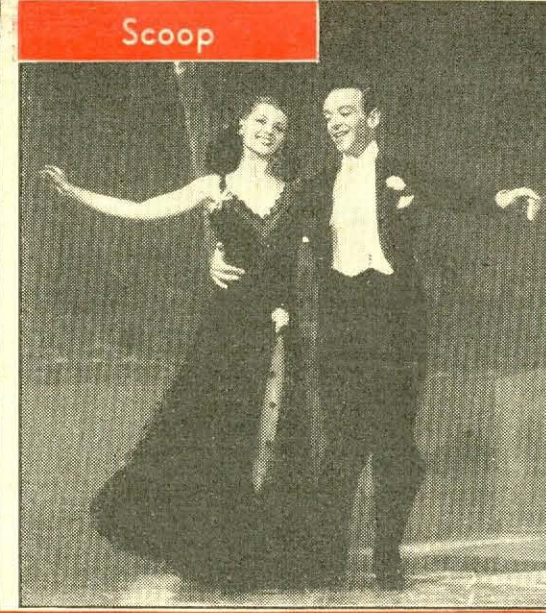

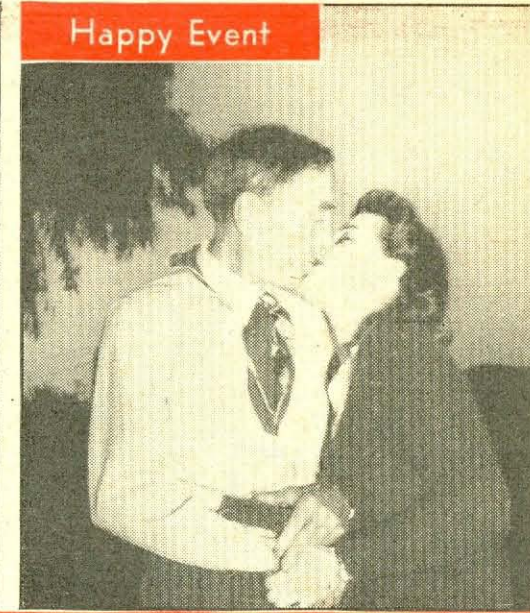

Type of Picture: Technicolor version of Harold Bell Wright's classic story of regeneration.

Story: Under any other name, no producer in his right mind would buy this ancient plot for a picture. Yet Americans all love this story of the convict who, after serving sentence for killing a man, goes home to his hills to lead a good life. Veteran actor Harry Carey plays the leading role, with John Wayne as the embittered son who has sworn to "get" his father.

Verdict: This one may prove to Hollywood that a little less "utter" sophistication may cure public apathy toward movies.—C. S.

"Kiss the Boys Goodbye"

Cast: Mary Martin, Don Ameche, Oscar Levant, Virginia Dale, Barbara Jo Allen, Raymond Walburn, Elizabeth Patterson, Jerome Cowan, Connie Boswell, Rochester, John Scott Trotter, et al. Type of Picture: Musical comedy, with emphasis on music.

Story: Mary Martin plays the Broadway chorine who goes southern to the hilt and tries to win a lead in a New York show which has Don Ameche as director and Oscar Levant as its song-writer. The spark-plug of the whole plot is Mary Martin, who is lovely and in her most beautiful voice. She even does her old strip-tease, but so cutely that no one can object.

Verdict: Everything in this, from photography to costuming to the casting, is excellent. —L. R.

"Underground"

Cast: Jeffrey Lynn, Philip Dorn, Kaaren Verne, Mona Maris, Peter Whitney, Martin Kosleck, Erwin Kaiser, Ilka Gruning, et al. Produced by Warners, directed by Vincent Sherman. Screen play by Charles Grayson and others.

Type of Picture: Melodrama depicting cruelties of Nazi regime.

Story: Those who may wish to shout "propaganda" can make the most of this one but cannot deny its truth: That good will always fight evil. Jeffrey Lynn plays the Nazi soldier who loses an arm in the war, returns to innocently cause the arrest of his father and brother. Philip Dorn is extremely vivid in the role of the brother engaged in secretly working to wreck the Hitler regime.

Verdict: As small-town entertainment or a family show, "Underground" may not have wide appeal. But like it or not, it is a forceful, significant movie.—E. P.

"Hit the Road"

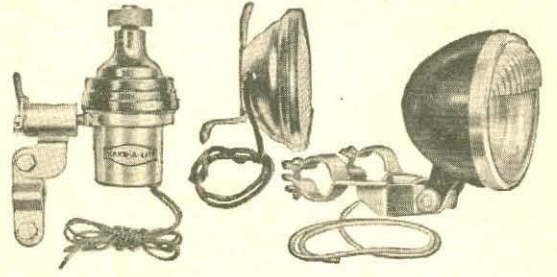

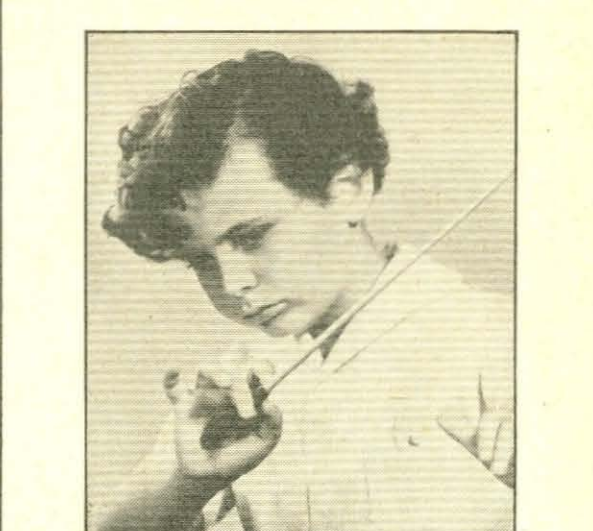

RADIO VIEWS

by Martin Lewis

WHILE the Joe Louis-Billy Conn bout was undoubtedly as exciting a bit of fisticuffs as radio listeners have heard in recent years, its ether coverage, in the opinion of the writer and many other loudspeaker listeners, was marred to a certain extent by the erratic, somewhat amateurish manner in which Messrs. Bill Corum and Don Dunphy handled their first announcing chores on fight broadcasts over the Mutual network.

There's no getting around it. In fight broadcasts the announcer has got to be tops, or else the fight description suffers as a consequence. This is primarily because the announcer must perform the double duty of reporting a blow-by-blow account of the fight as well as maintaining the proper ring color. It is the combination of those two things which make the broadcasting of a heavyweight title match just about the toughest job in radio. Here are some reasons why the announcing team of Corum-Dunphy is too light for the task.

First of all, Dunphy has a bad habit of shouting and at times almost

reached the point of hysteria. It is all right to try and convey an air of excitement, but several times the writer had to get up and adjust his radio volume dial. Another thing, Dunphy is far from being an accurate reporter. From the very first round the announcer stated that Conn was badly hurt. This was true in the thirteenth round, but surely not as early as the first. While the champ did make the challenger wince, he certainly did not hurt him "badly." There were other expressions which were out of place and sounded ridiculous. One was the statement that Conn's eye, which had been cut a little in an early round, was "now healed." It probably is healed by now, but it certainly wasn't then.

I might add that at the beginning of the seventh round the announcer completely forgot to announce the round number, a fatal broadcasting error. Another complaint which your correspondent has is that Dunphy on several occasions made observations which he precluded with the words "in my opinion." This, despite the pre-fight announcement that he "wouldn't editorialize." Lastly, but not leastly, the announcer called a great many blows "the best blow of the fight." There is only one "best" blow in any fight. It is usually the knockout.

Regarding Bill Corum, Dunphy's partner, the less said the better. Suf-

fice to say that he sounded as if he had sprayed his throat with gravel. Toward the end of the fight one could hardly understand him.

Listening to this new fight-announcing team made the writer appreciate more than ever the work of Sam Taub and Bill Stern. They certainly could have been used that night!

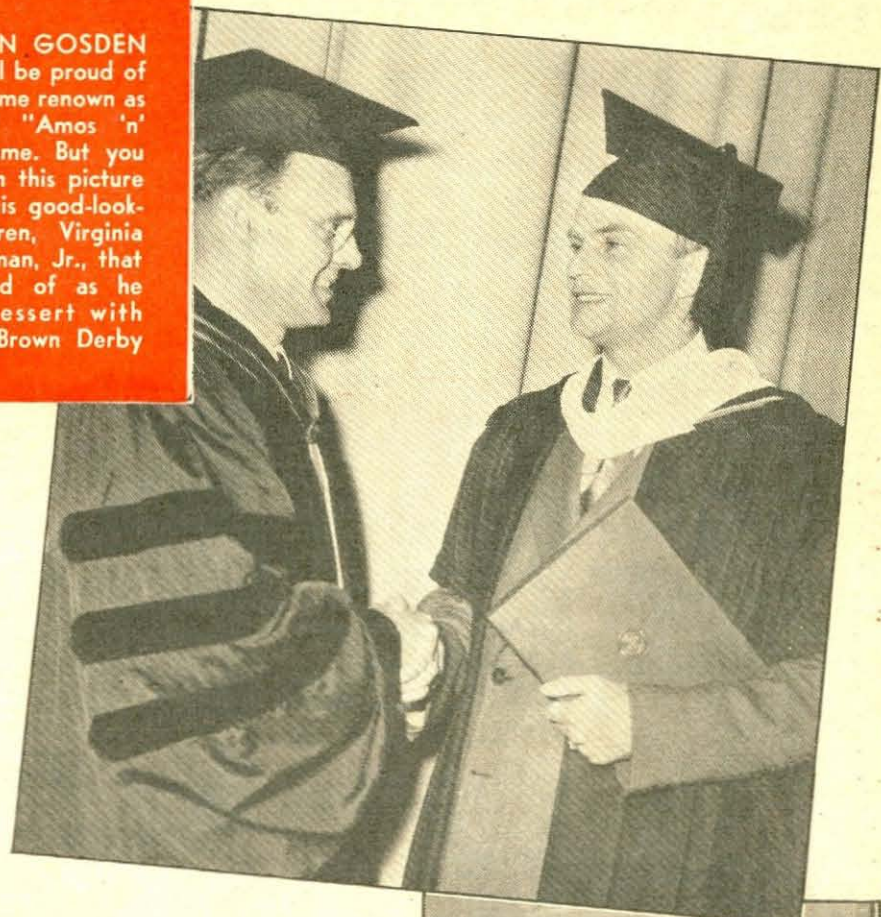

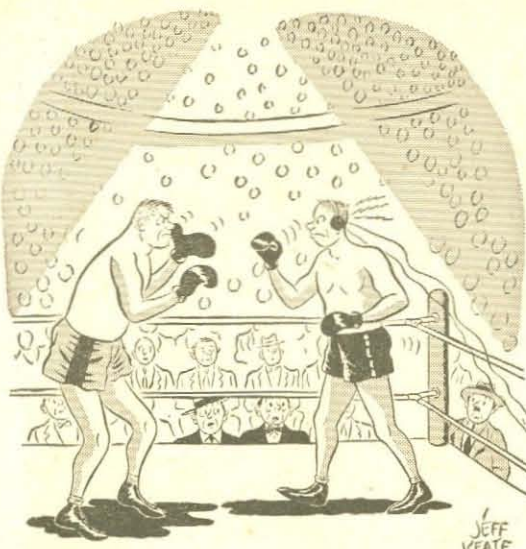

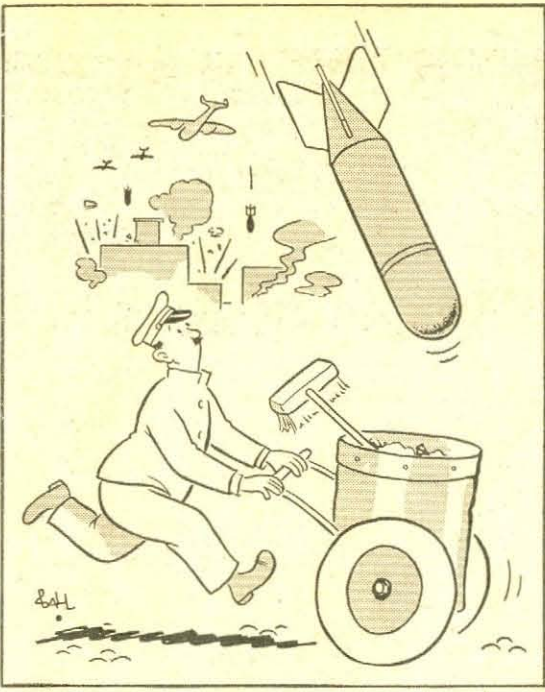

KOISCHWITZ' COCKEYED "COLLEGE HOUR"

Movie-Radio Guide exposes another Nazi broadcaster—he's a former U. S. college professor

EACH Thursday night at 9:45 p.m. EDT, Dr. Otto Koischwitz conducts his "College Hour" over Berlin short-wave stations DJB (15.20) and DJD (11.77). This program is especially directed to American college students and the so-called intellectual listeners of North America.

Dr. Koischwitz may also be heard as Mr. O. Kay in the Berlin program, "O. K. Speaking," and as Fritz in the skit, "Fritz and Fred, the Friendly Quarrelers." Dispenser of intellectual discourse, professional mudslinger or slapstick comedian, Koischwitz plays his part well. However, it is on the "College Hour" that the true Koischwitz emerges as the highly educated,

or gives chats on German folklore, culture and literature.

On the "College Hour" period of Thursday, May 22, Dr. Koischwitz began new tactics, taking up the whole program to personally address via the ether waves the famous American playwright, Eugene O'Neill. Since that date he has personally addressed, in turn, the dancer, Martha Graham, and the author, Upton Sinclair.

To put his audience at ease and to waylay any suspicions that this was just another pretext for putting over Nazi propaganda, his first talk addressed to Eugene O'Neill was very mild and eulogistic in nature. One might easily be led to believe that Dr. Koischwitz had no other motive than to discuss and comment on the famous plays of this playwright. New and novel in form, the new program was seemingly on the level and no doubt many listeners waited with some anticipation to see to whom Dr. Koischwitz would devote his next program.

The next program opened with "Dr. Koischwitz now addressing the famous American dancer, Martha Graham. Now, I don't wish to embarrass you, Miss Graham, by this personal call from the German short-wave station. I rather wish to take this opportunity to express my great admiration for your art." He continued at some great length to give an elaborate dossier on the dancer, interspersing it with several more or less personal anecdotes, also attempting to point out in what way the dancing of Miss Graham was unique and entirely original. Then he asked, "Is it really true, Miss Graham, that you like so much Nietzsche's 'Birth of Tragedy'?" He then launched into a long harangue about Nietzsche and threw in several totally irrelevant remarks about Roosevelt having moved our frontiers to the Rhine and the Danube, but that long after Roosevelt's frontiers were forgotten the famous "Frontier" dance of Miss Graham would live on and on as a work of art.

The next week it was "Good evening, Upton Sinclair. Don't be offended at being eulogized by the German short-wave station." Then followed some general remarks commenting upon Mr. Sinclair and his works. As the broadcast wore on Doc Koischwitz began to really hit his propaganda stride and ripped our good Mr. Sinclair up one side and down the other, the main peeve apparently being a book having to do with the German scholastic system which the author had written several years ago. Koischwitz continued, "If you find goose-step methods anywhere you will find them in American universities. Here we have no class cuts, no exams and no roll call." He ended by saying, "You are a pioneer, all right, Upton Sinclair, a pioneer in the field of American propaganda."

artistic and slightly mystical character that he really is.

Otto Koischwitz was born in Germany in 1902. After graduating from secondary school, he studied modern philology and philosophy at the universities of Halle and Berlin and received from the latter institution in 1924 the Ph. D. degree, his field of specialization having been German literature. Dr. Koischwitz came to the United States in 1925. He taught in the extension division of Columbia University in the fall term of 1925-26, and at New York University in the spring term of 1926. In 1928 he was appointed assistant professor in the German department at Hunter College in New York City and he remained in this rank until his resignation in January, 1940.

It is believed that Dr. Koischwitz fell under the influence of national socialist philosophy during his one-year stay in Germany in 1935-36. During his subsequent years of teaching at Hunter College he often stated that he was violently opposed to the anti-Semitic and racial program of the Nazis. In the summer of 1939 Dr. Koischwitz took his vacation in Germany. The beginning of the war found him in Denmark. A few months later he returned to Germany and in mid-winter he became attached to the staff of the German short-wave station, where he called himself Dr. Anders (Dr. Otherwise) up until June, 1940, when he revealed his true identity as Dr. Koischwitz.

In the "College Hour" Dr. Koischwitz has endeavored to put the Nazi doctrine over in a highbrow method. In the language of the classroom he often speaks on philosophical themes

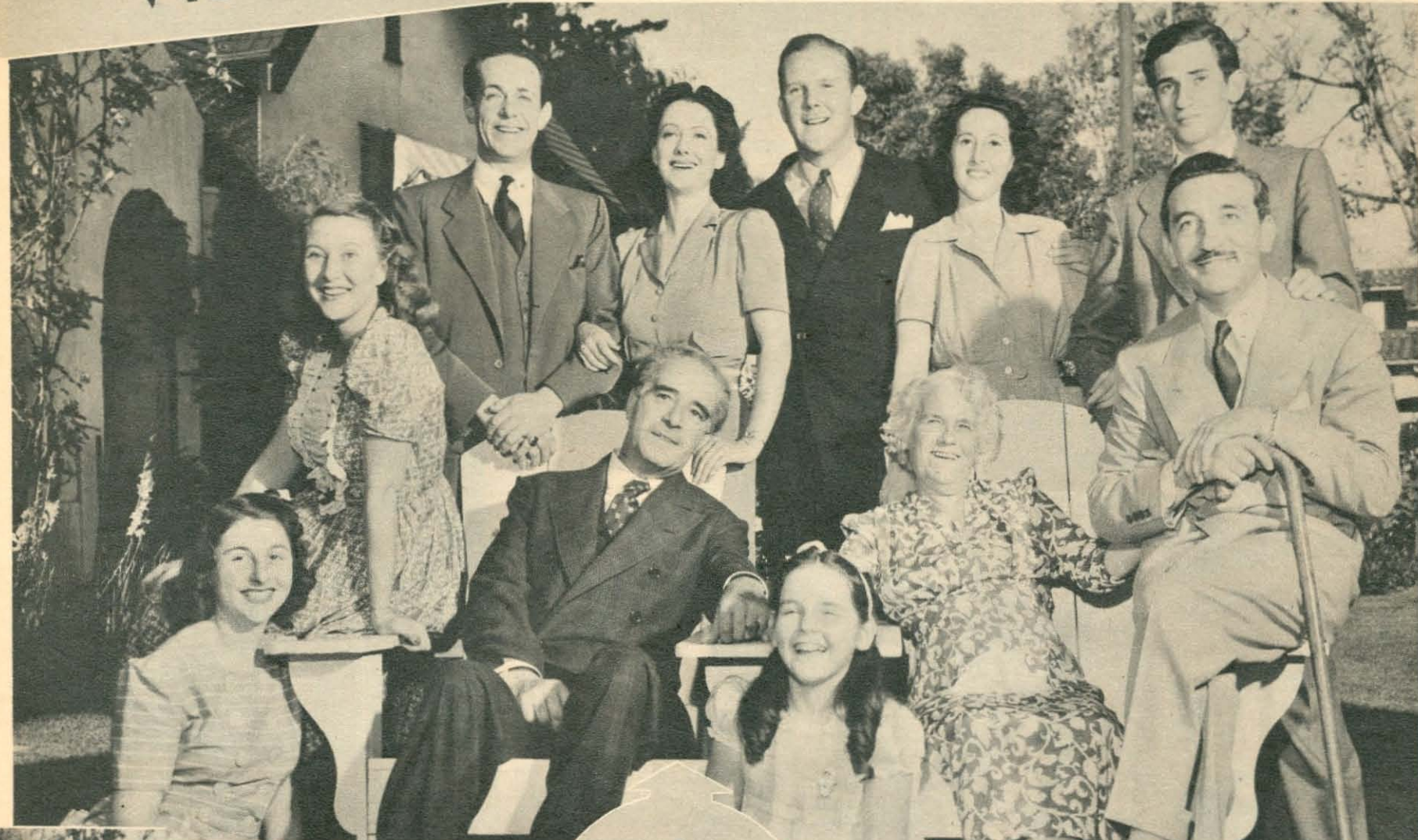

THE unique thing about these Barbours of "One Man's Family" (heard Sundays over NBC) is that the troupe of actors who portray them have become for listeners an actual, living family. This is no accident. Back in 1932 author Carlton E. Morse (above) set out to select men and women for his "One Man's Family" cast on the basis of their real-life similarities to the characters they were to portray. Thus, J. Anthony Smythe and Minetta Ellen, having the maturity and mellowness of middle age, became Father and Mother Barbour. Likewise with Paul, Hazel and Claudia. Mr. Morse also has deliberately retained the nucleus of his cast through the years. While other serials have brought new personalities into the old roles, "One Man's Family" has kept the same group of people together so long that they and their characters have become one in the minds of listeners. "One Man's Family" has never reached into the realm of tears and torture which has lent unreality to other serial dramas. Rather, it has stuck to the reality of problems close to the hearts of parents and young people, of the normal frictions and fellowships of the typical American family. These are some of the reasons why listeners—whose letters show that they look to this serial for suggestions about their own family problems—almost believe that the Barbours are real. DESPITE all you read and hear about summer being the season for play, there are a good many of us who confine our playing to two weeks of vacation and week-ends. The rest of the time we're at a desk, behind a counter, and on the job.

In talking with Claudia Morgan the other day, this very subject came up. Miss Morgan is something of an authority on etiquette for secretaries, having played the part in many Broadway plays and radio programs. A business school in New York thought so much of her advice to secretaries that an honorary diploma was awarded her. So we got together on this problem of warm weather and the working girl, and I'm passing the results along to you.

Though hard be your labors, remember that a perspiring brow is not pretty or an asset even in an office. Put on a good foundation of Hampden Powd'r-Base in the morning before applying your make-up. Keep a box of Kleenex handy and daintily mop up those beads of toil when nobody's looking. With such a good foundation your make-up won't suffer and you'll look fresh all the day.

WE DON'T suggest that you use your desk as a dressing-table, but there are several essentials for daintiness which you should keep in your desk-drawer. Start with one of those neat "Beauty in the Making" budget kits by Helena Rubinstein. 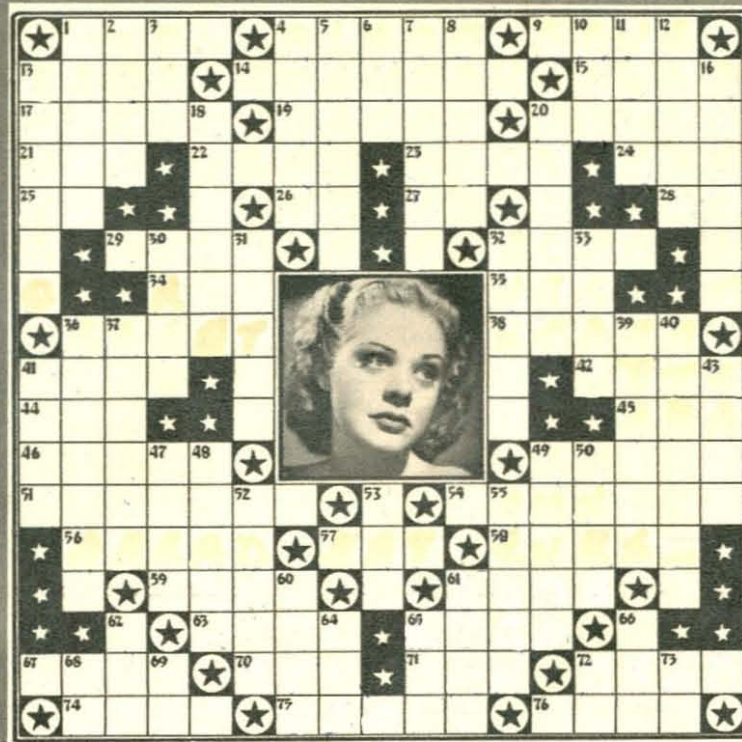

Ball Game With "Nine Old Men"

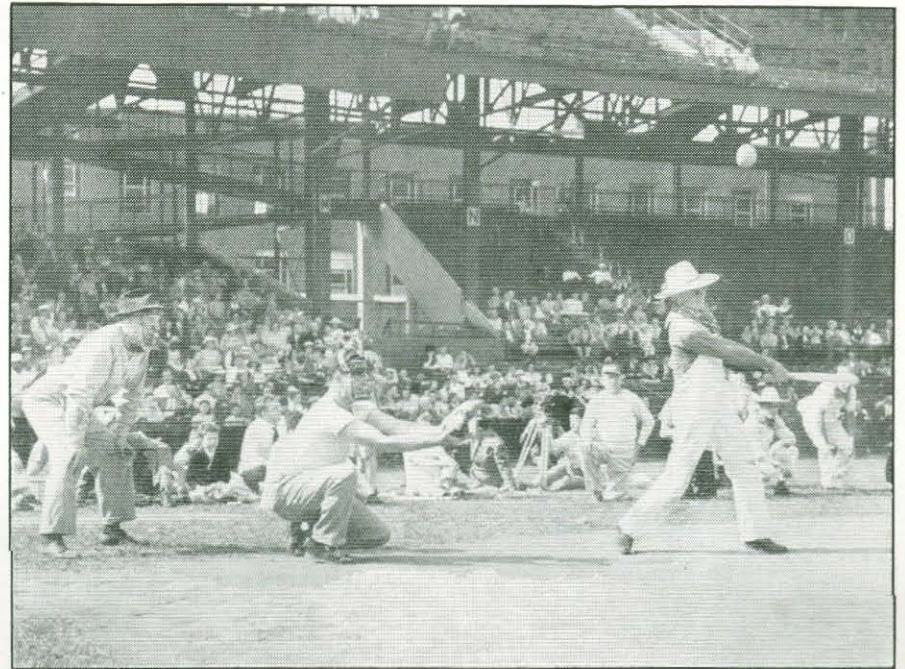

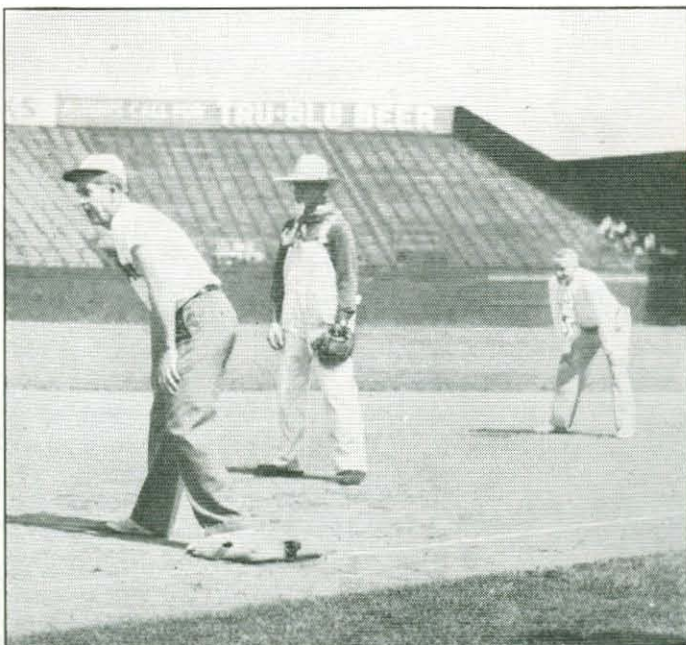
