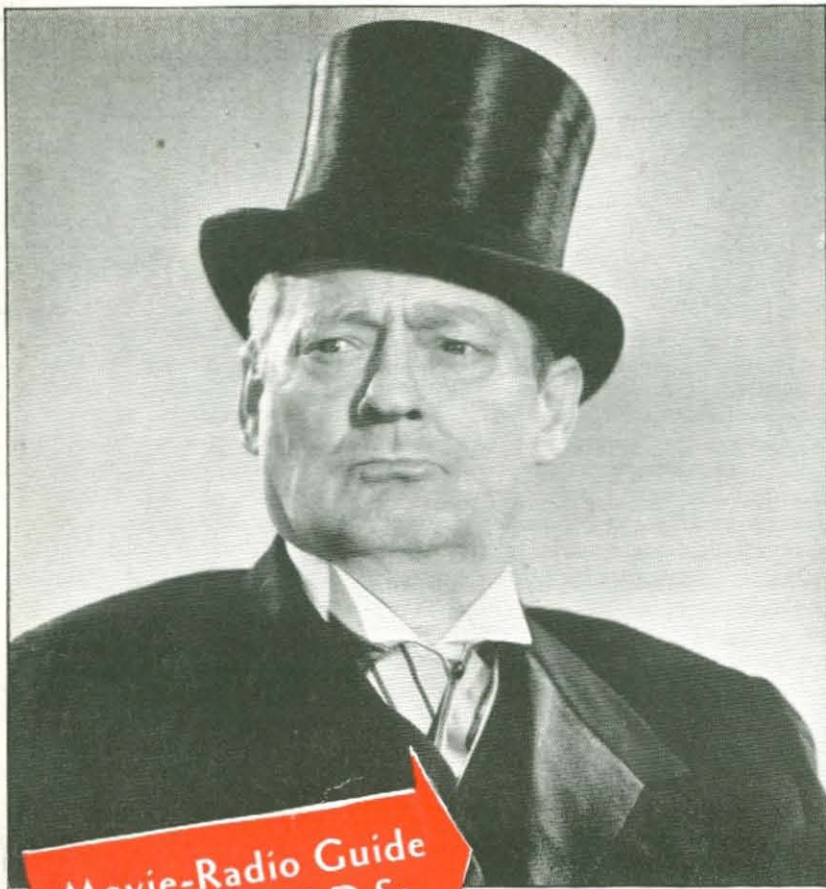

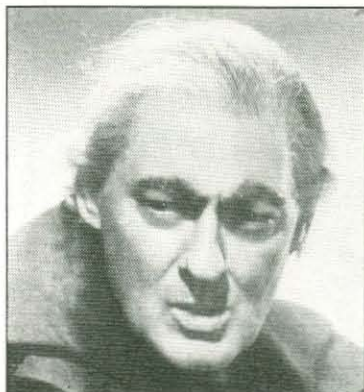

MARY MARTIN has her own plan for coordinating her real life successfully with her reel life. She is keeping them separate. Her careers at home and at Paramount both will be served.

To the singing sensation from Weatherford, Texas, the "My Heart Belongs to Daddy" toast of Broadway, screen fame without a loving husband is peaches without cream—and a husband and home without babies is like a castle without inhabitants—an empty, dreary shell.

Mary believes a childless actress is missing the happiest part of life—the most important role necessary to be a successful actress.

Mary is wise with her plan to get all out of life that she can. She knew when she married film-story editor Dick Halliday there would be two clashing careers under one roof. He did too. So they planned a clash-proof house.

Besides their living-quarters, Mary and Dick have two extra wings in their home. One wing contains his working office and library. The other is Mary's and comprises music-room, files, piano and a recording machine. Even their radio has dual controls so that both may tune in their desired programs simultaneously.

Then, there's a nursery. It's the cutest in Hollywood—done in pale pink and white candy stripes

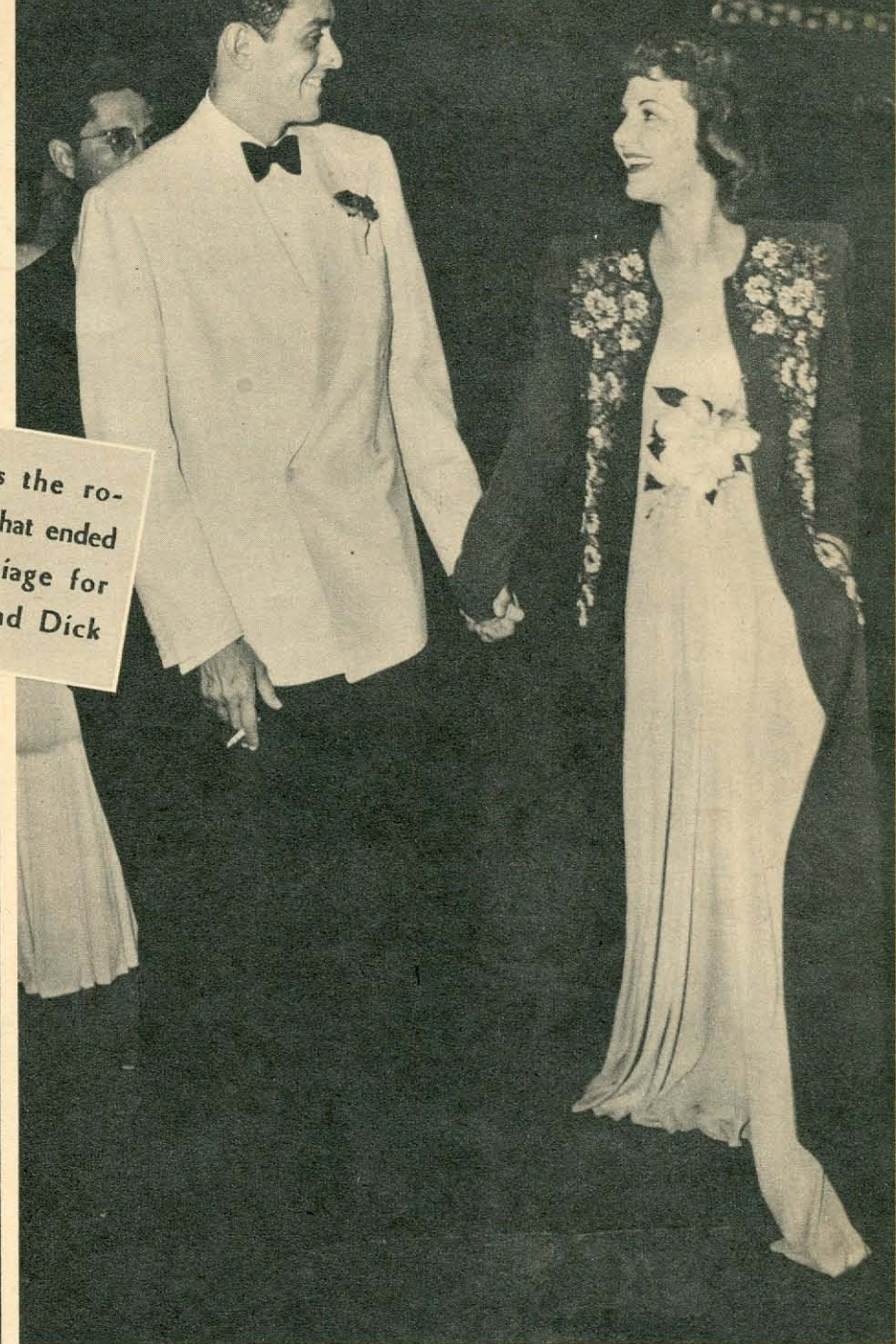
It is said that actresses getting married and having babies lose some of their box-office appeal. I don't think so. I'll bet Mary will have a lot more box-office appeal—and babies!

Ronald Colman

He Tames His Wife



RONALD COLMAN, in "My Life With Caroline," assumes task of older man training a young wife

To Feature Desk:

OVER at RKO they've just previewed Ronald Colman's 1941 picture, "My Life With Caroline." He doesn't make many. He made only "Lucky Partners" in 1940.

But "My Life With Caroline" is one of Colman's most whimsical light comedies. There's but a touch of heavy drama in it. The rest is light, sophisticated and delightfully humorous.

More important to MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE was the opportunity "My Life With Caroline" gave to inspect the elusive Colman at close range.

Colman likes to live his life away from the set, undisturbed by photographers, interviewers and trade associates, makes but one picture a year because he believes one is enough.

What, then, is this fifty-year-old actor like? What are the secrets of his masculine allure?

British actress Anna Lee, his leading lady in "My Life With Caroline," said this about Colman:

"Back in England in the days when my connection with the movies was only as a fan, I used to cut out all of the pictures of Ronald Colman that I could find and paste them in a scrapbook which I kept. So you can imagine

the thrill I got out of playing opposite him in my first American picture.

"I found that everything I had imagined about him was true. He is the most kind, helpful and delightful person I have met. I was very nervous at first, and he went out of his way to put me at ease in a gentle manner, for which I can never thank him enough."

Lewis Milestone, who directed Colman at RKO in "Lucky Partners" and "My Life With Caroline," said:

"A movie set is a good place to get to know a man. Colman isn't bashful, he isn't always on the defensive, and he isn't a snob. He has been accused of all of that. Colman is just quiet.

"Colman is quiet in the way a scientist is quiet; he does things rather than talks about them. He has done everything an actor can do on stage and screen, and he has become an artist at it.

"There is none of the exhibitionist about Colman. Consequently, he has no idiosyncrasies. He has, however, a philosophy. He believes acting's a good way to make a living but too strenuous a way to live. Therefore, when he is not acting before a camera, he is not an actor but a gentleman who avoids flamboyant living."—E. P.

Merle Oberon

She Loves Four Men

EIGHT years ago Merle Oberon crashed through the upper crust of film stardom with her performance in the English Korda picture, "The Private Life of King Henry VIII," in which she was one of many wives.

Shortly on the screen you'll be seeing Miss Oberon—now Mrs. Korda—as "Lydia," a Boston spinster whose private life encompassed four romances, one of them her cherished secret and the reason she had never married.

Quite a new twist. Boston instead of England. A spinster instead of one of many wives. But judging from the rushes of "Lydia," Miss Oberon, who has been making good pictures consistently since "Henry VIII," rings the bell resoundingly again.

In her own private life, in direct contrast to "Lydia," Merle Oberon has loved but one man, her brilliant film-producing husband. She knew few others except her British-officer uncle, who helped her widowed mother ward off the wolf. Miss Oberon's father, also an English army officer, died of pneumonia just before his daughter was born. Her mother had a struggle. Merle sacrificed and learned to do her own hair—which she still does.

It wasn't quite the thing to do, for an officer's daughter to take up a theatrical career. So Merle at sixteen eased into it gradually by joining an amateur dramatic society in Calcutta. She stole three shows and became incurably infected with footlightitis.

When her uncle took her on a trip to England, she persuaded him to let her stay past his leave—at least till her one hundred dollars was gone. It soon went—on clothes to make an impression as an "actress." Her return steamer ticket yielded eighty dollars. But she was penniless when she accepted a cafe-hostess job for three months before she faced her first movie camera as an extra.

Merle Oberon's subsequent rise to riches was rapid. She had known much self-denial and penury. Small wonder then that she indulged in diamond bracelets and fine furs, costly perfumes and scores of fancy slippers. But the war changed that. Merle threw herself into Red Cross work, contributed heavily in time and money to war-relief activities. She lives with her husband in a simple home without even a swimming-pool. After all, she's an officer's daughter. She knows what war means. —E. P.

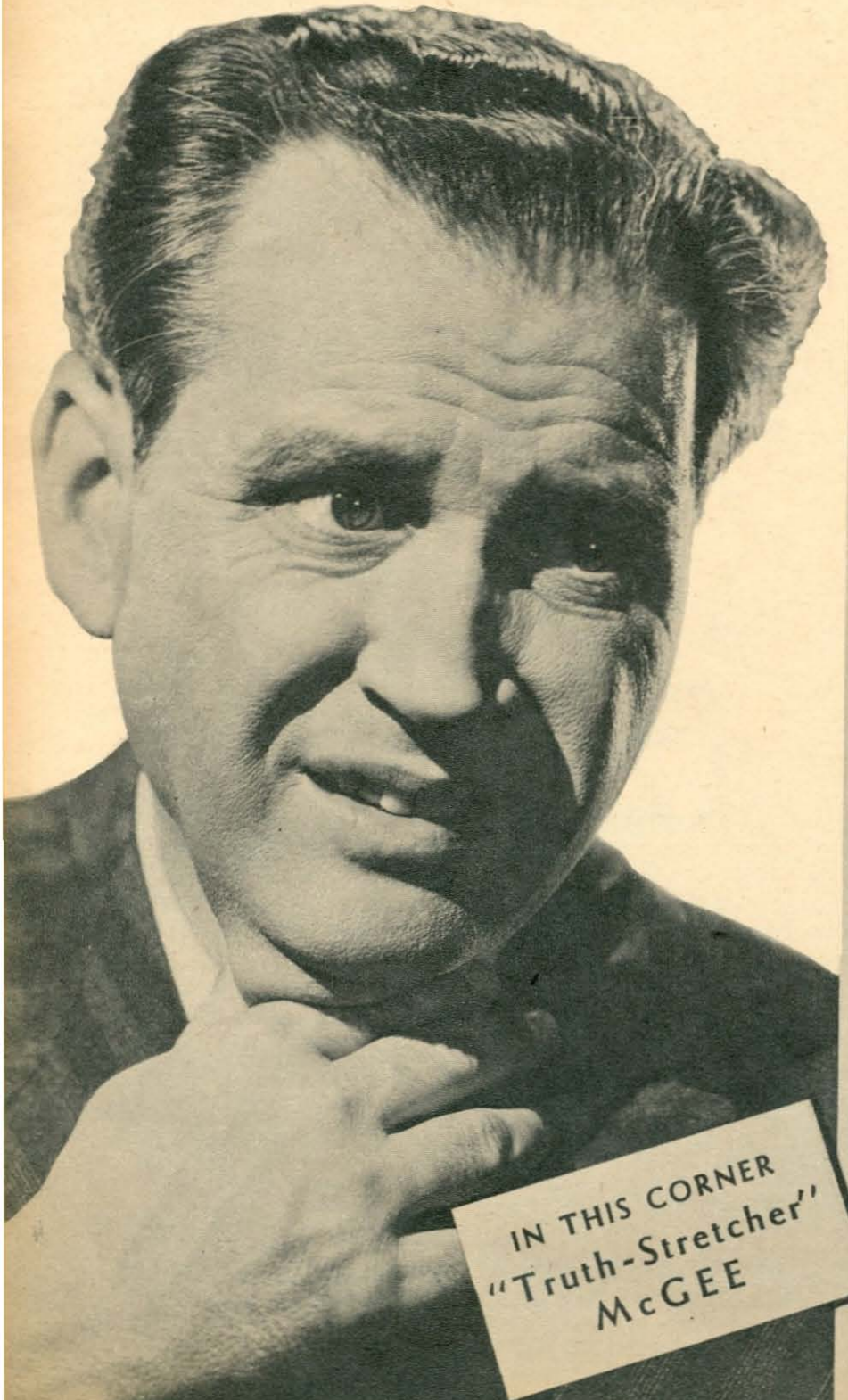

"Truth-Stretcher"

To News Desk:
IN A few weeks RKO's four-radio-star-picture, "Look Who's Laughing," will hit the nation's screens. But the title, frankly, was more literal than general on the sound-stage when the picture was in the making process. Starring Edgar Bergen with Charlie McCarthy and billing next Fibber McGee and Molly, Hollywood insiders wondered first how the cream of two top-rating and established broadcast programs could be merged into one believable screen play. What's more, railbirds were betting that there would be a feud between the McGee-Molly aggregation and the Bergen-McCarthy team before the shooting was over. Of course there wasn't a real fight, but there were bruised feelings. The first and major difficulty was in the star billing. Bergen was signed first and was put on the top line. McCarthy went along with him. Fibber McGee and Molly, who thought they deserved equal billing, were given second place. They weren't exactly displeased over the arrangement RKO had made, but still no performer likes to consider himself of lesser importance than another. Several years ago on the radio, Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy were in the number one or two spot consistently in audience rating and were displaced only by the growing audience of Jack Benny, who finally swung to the top and stayed there. But last year Fibber and Molly made great gains and landed in the runner-up position, outstripping Bergen and McCarthy and pushing Benny. And just before their season ended this year, Fibber and Molly were right up at the top! However, that was after their RKO picture contract had been signed—and such matters as billing are settled at the time signatures are affixed. Ventriloquist Bergen and the Jordans, Marian and Jim (who are Fibber and Molly), are generally to be relied upon for plenty of gags and practical jokes wherever they may be working. Strangely enough, on the

"Look Who's Laughing" set they didn't joke much. Of course they didn't know one another awfully well, and Fibber and Molly both are staid and quiet folks unless they know well the crowd into which they are thrown. Then they cut up and have more fun than anybody. That may have accounted for the lack of gagging and the tenseness of the air while "Look Who's Laughing" was being filmed. Or maybe it was just because they were busy making their second picture and were not too sure of themselves. In this picture a whole gallery of new and popular characters will be brought to the public for the first time. In addition to Charlie McCarthy and Mortimer Snerd, Edgar Bergen introduces three new creations upon which he has been working for some time. One of them is a little girl, Ophelia, and the others are two old biddy hens, Maisie and Mathilda. On the more human side, most of the beloved characters from Fibber McGee and Molly's radio show play important and characteristic roles in the story. These include such nationally famous names as Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve, Mrs. Uppington, Sis, Old Timer, Nick De Popolos, others. However, toward the end of the making of the film, pretty eleven-year-old Joan Carroll came to RKO to make "An Obliging Young Lady" and came over to visit McCarthy at work. It was a first meeting for Bergen, McCarthy and Joan. Someone suggested a birthday party for Joan at which Charlie would serve as host. "Let's make it a party for Joan and everyone on the picture," Bergen suggested, and this was done. Bergen ordered gallons of coffee (his sponsor's brand) and cakes. Fibber McGee observed and was not to be outdone. Came the time of the party and he arrived with cream pitchers full of his radio sponsor's liquid polishing wax! Everyone had a big laugh and everything became more friendly after that. —L. R.

"Charley's Aunt"

Cast: Jack Benny, Kay Francis, James Ellison, Edmund Gwenn, Richard Haydn, Reginald Owen, Laird Cregar. A 20th Century-Fox picture, produced by William Perlberg and directed by Archie Mayo. Screen play by George Seaton; based on the perennial play by Brandon Thomas.

Type of Picture: One of the funniest and oldest comedies extant, "Charley's Aunt" brings Jack Benny to the screen in a vehicle that is almost a perfect natural for those talents of which he has made so much on radio.

This Is the Story: Benny, as Lord Babbs, is in his tenth year at Oxford and still always getting into trouble. His final escapade brings on threats of expulsion unless he can prove, by witnesses, that it was truly an accident. He says he can and will bring in two classmates, Ellison and "Charley" Haydn, to testify for him. They agree—providing he will masquerade as Haydn's aunt to provide a chaperon for their fiancées. 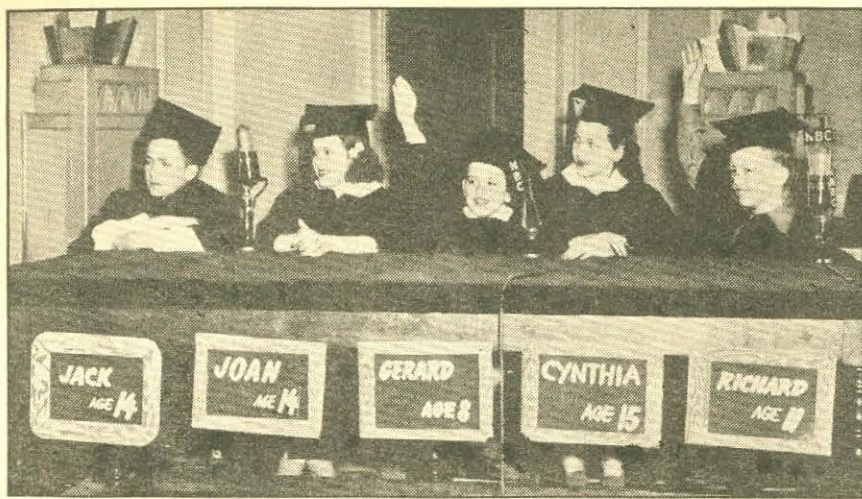

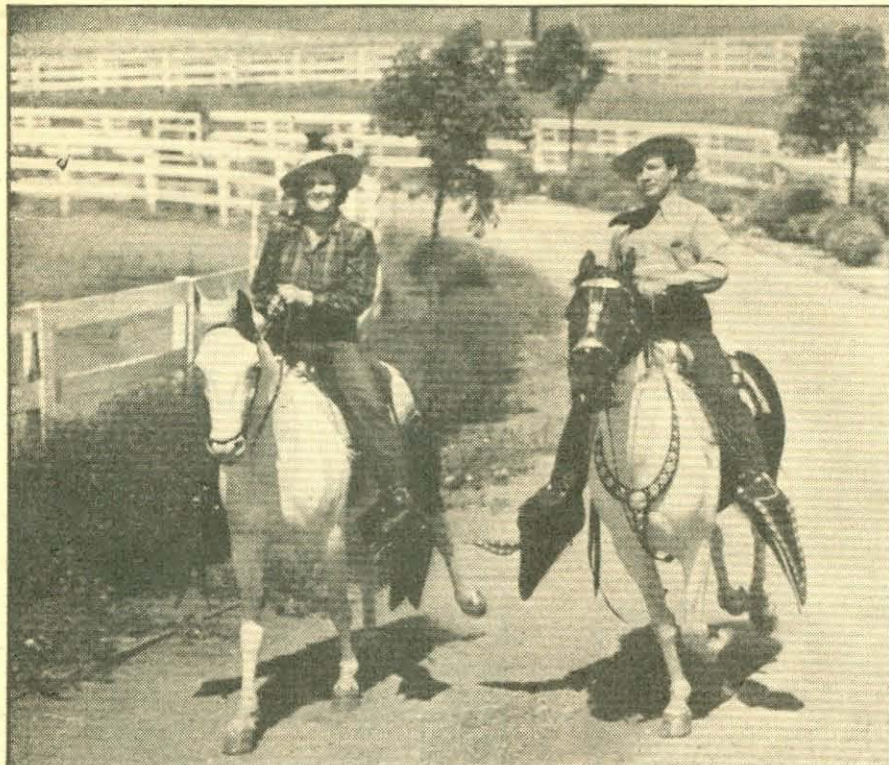

RADIO VIEWS

by Martin Lewis

AFTER twenty-one years radio still has quite a few of the technical problems which were with it in the beginning. One of these is the problem of getting a proper blend of sounds before the combined result goes out on the air.

Despite no little progress along this line, listeners are still annoyed by the tonal disproportion between two voices, or, in some cases, between a voice and the orchestra. It isn't pleasant to sit by a radio and hear one voice of ear-splitting timbre while the other or others are too low after the volume has been adjusted to control the first-named.

It wouldn't hurt for everyone on the air to examine his microphone technique a little more closely. Just because someone has been broadcasting for years is no reason that his work is flawless. A person can still learn in radio, even after he has become a big success.

I have just finished reading William L. Shirer's "Berlin Diary," and I must say that it is as thrilling a narrative as anyone would want to read. More than that, it is a warning to all Americans that they are facing something infinitely more dangerous than they realize. Shirer, a CBS correspondent, spent six years in Europe, where he saw the rise of Hitler and the resulting war. As is the case with most professional reporting, his account of the war is somewhat impartial. It is not so impartial, however, that one cannot grasp the author's fear of the Nazis' tremendous might and the eventual danger to the U. S. from it. If you can get a copy, do so at once. The book will hold you spellbound.

BMI, the rival music society set up by the broadcasters in opposition to ASCAP, is not thrown overboard, for the new agreement provides that NBC may continue using BMI music also. It is expected that CBS will fall in line before long and settle the battle of music for the present.

Defense Programs First

NEW YORK.—So many stations have complained they were finding it difficult to accede to requests from government agencies for air time that the National Association of Broadcasters has adopted a "priorities" resolution. Under this plan programs involving appeals for enlistment of manpower for the armed services and national defense industries head the priority list, with defense financing next. Programs of morale-building nature are third, with non-defense programs at the bottom of the list.

From Bombs to Baseball

NEW YORK.—Upon returning from London, Raymond Gram Swing has confirmed the rumor that he flew to England in an unarmed bomber. The commentator reports that he suffered

from the cold in the uninsulated plane. Incidentally, Swing's first question after greeting his family upon his arrival at the air terminal was addressed to his son: "How have the Brooklyn Dodgers been doing?"

CHICAGO.—These summer vacation days are busy ones for some of the "Quiz Kids." They've already observed their first anniversary with special events. 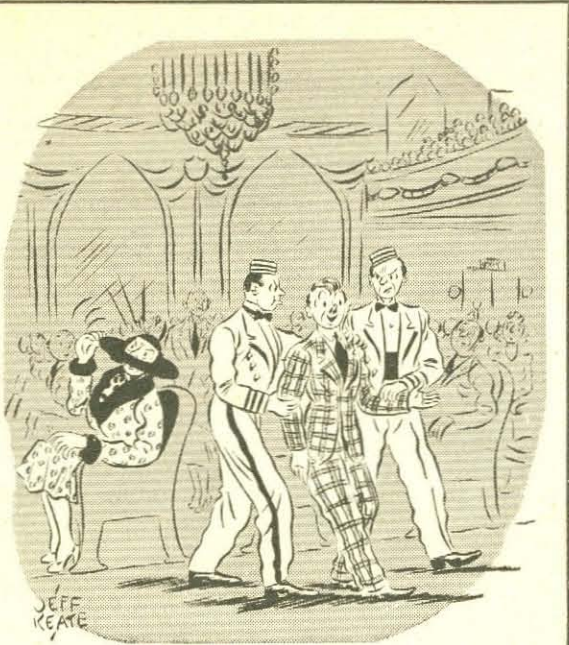

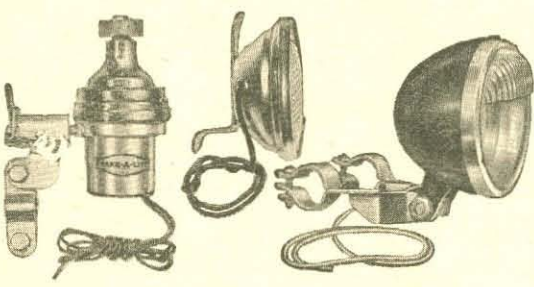

MEET LORD HEE HAW, AN IOWA TRAITOR

Fred Kaltenbach, born in Dubuque, reviles the radio waves in behalf of Nazi Germany

FRED W. KALTENBACH, chief of Goebbels' radio ravers, is a man who assumes many different roles at the German Shortwave Station. On Mondays at 9:45 p.m. he gives the "Dear Harry" broadcasts; on Tuesdays at 11:50 p.m. Fred turns historian to deliver the series "German Contributions to Making America"; on Thursdays at 11:50 p.m. he assumes the role of "Jim, the Know-It-All Canadian," in the program "Jim and Johnny"; on Saturdays at 9:50 p.m. Kaltenbach edits the "Military Review," finishing up his week's activities at 10:20 p.m. EDT the same evening with the part of "Honest American Fred" in the broadcast "Fritz and Fred."

From the state of "Tall Corn" to the land of "Tall Stories" is quite a

hop, but Kaltenbach did just that. Fred was born in Dubuque, Iowa, of German-American parents. His father was a butcher. Most of his life having been spent in this country, Fred has a genuine Midwestern accent. During World War I, Kaltenbach served in the United States Coast Artillery Service, rose to the rank of lieutenant but never saw active service. In 1936 he went to Germany to do graduate work at Berlin University, subsequently receiving his Ph. D. from this institution. While in school Fred met a German girl, Dorothea Peters, who was a secretary on the editorial staff of one of Herr Goering's aeronautical maga-

zines. After a short engagement they were married and Fred went to work in the German Propaganda Office. Assigned to the staff of the German Shortwave Station, Kaltenbach began his propaganda broadcasts before the outbreak of the present war. In May, 1939, he returned to the United States to visit his dying father, then in Waterloo, Iowa. While there he made twenty-five dollars by giving an address to the local Rotary Club. In his presentation he extolled the Nazi cause to such an extent that one of the members suggested that if he didn't like this country he should go back to Germany, to which Kaltenbach replied, "I will."

Back in Berlin he plunged into his activities at the German Shortwave Station with doubled vigor, becoming so prominent that British listeners dubbed him "Lord Hee Haw," thus putting him on the pedestal with the then popular "Lord Haw Haw." Hoping to become as popular with North American listeners as Lord Haw Haw (William Joyce) had become with British listeners, Kaltenbach accepted the title and used it in connection with most of his broadcasts. For several reasons the Lord Hee Haw business never caught on in this country, so it is seldom mentioned any more.

Kaltenbach speaks in an unemotional and clear style. Bold and blunt in his statements, he has been the author of many of the most audacious and sensational propaganda ideas that have been released from the German Shortwave Station. In his talks he tries to maintain an informal and intimate contact with his listeners, often interrupting a talk with "Don't you think?" Fred is addicted to name-calling, jingles and gag-lines. Thus, Lord Halifax becomes "St. Hooey-fax"; Churchill is "Roly-poly Windy," and Duff Cooper is "Toughie Cooper." Kaltenbach's London is always outsmarted by "Socker Berlin."

Kaltenbach's "Dear Harry" broadcasts, the oldest and best known of his propaganda efforts, are directed to a real person, Harry Aayerman,

once a schoolmate of his but now a lawyer in Waverly, Iowa. Aayerman, it is said, does not appreciate the publicity and, in fact, has been considerably embarrassed by this unwanted attention from a foreign short-wave station. At one time these one-sided conversations with "Dear Harry" back in Iowa were quite clever and witty. Now they have become pure propaganda with the pretext of talking to "Dear Harry" usually relegated to an introductory and closing line.

The "Jim and Johnny" broadcast is especially for Canadian listeners. Jim, the Know-It-All Canadian, acted by Kaltenbach, is supported by Johnny, who is known to British audiences as "Sinister Sam." The "Fritz and Fred" program is a similar effort with Kaltenbach taking the role of Fred and old Doc Koischwitz as Fritz. These dialog programs give the two participants a chance to discuss timely subjects presumably on a debate status. Actually the opposition is so weak as to be practically non-existent while the defense has all the cards stacked in his favor.

Kaltenbach's propaganda is really no different than that of Ward, Koischwitz or Lord Haw Haw. He just gives it a slightly different slant, seeking to gain your confidence through informal, intimate presentations. Remember that actually Kaltenbach is an experienced and wily propagandist paid by the German government to make you believe things that you do not want to believe.

For some of the facts concerning Kaltenbach I am indebted to the BBC Press Service, to CBS, *Time*, *Current History and Forum* and the *New Yorker*.

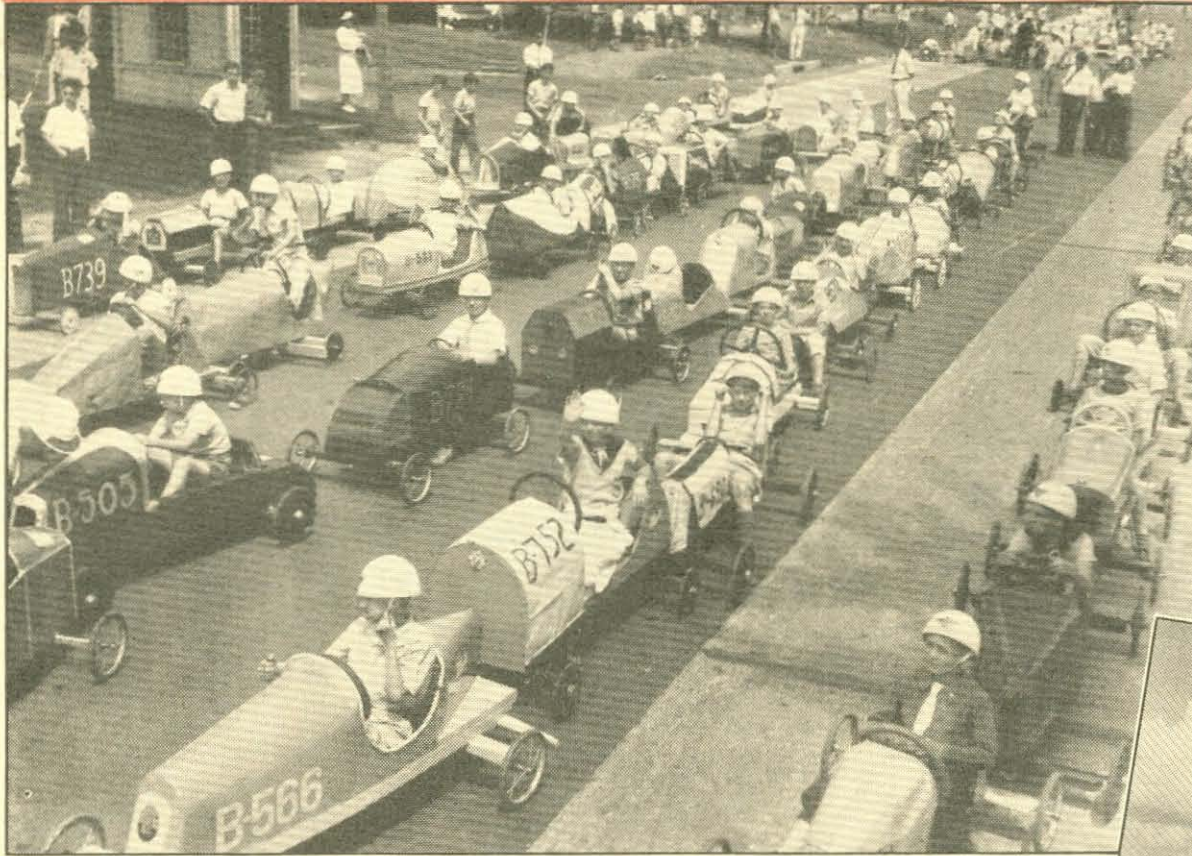

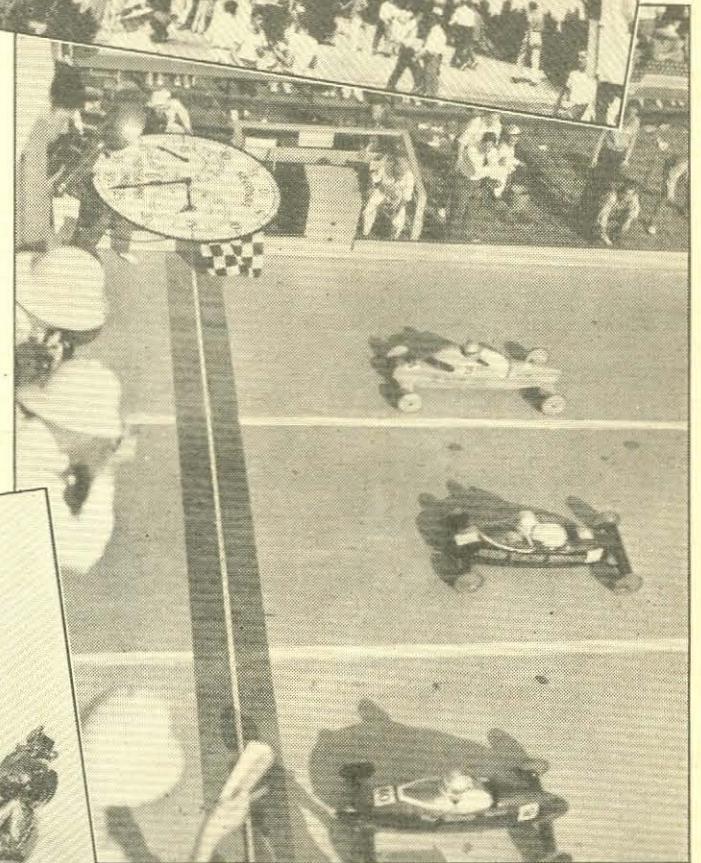
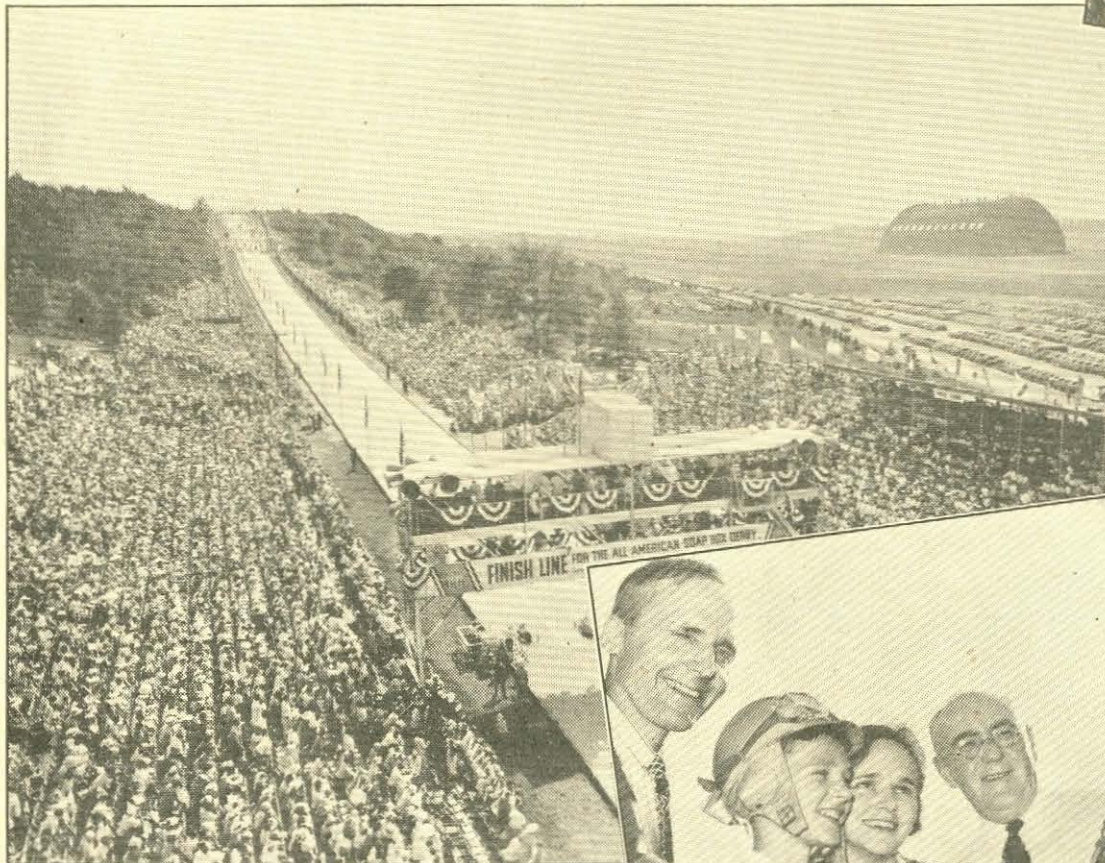
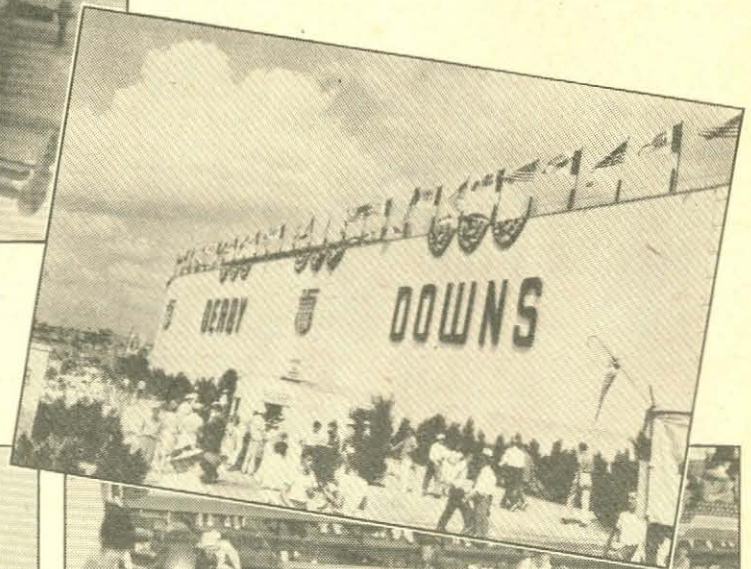

A romantic crooner and a dramatic actor laid aside to some degree the figurative capes and tights that clothed their voices and made them famous, put on the motley of clowns—and have given the radio audience new laugh-thrills and gained themselves new renown. Rudy Vallee and John Barrymore, the pair who have planted corn amongst their gardenias, have made the Sealtest program of Thursday nights one of radio's "don't miss" shows. Guest artists enter zestfully into the burlesque spirit of the fun session, wherein everything is kidded—including the performers themselves. The Vallee-Barrymore show goes on the air from Hollywood in an NBC studio which seats 350 persons. The program has a preview (not broadcast) on Wednesday evening to test gags. Theme of the program is "I'll Give You a Smile for a Smile." Rudy delivers the prebroadcast speech, which sometimes concludes: "There are 3,400,000 cows listening. Barrymore pulls 10,000,000 listeners . . . but the 3,400,000 cows are pulled by our sponsor. I'm only the singer!" —D. M.

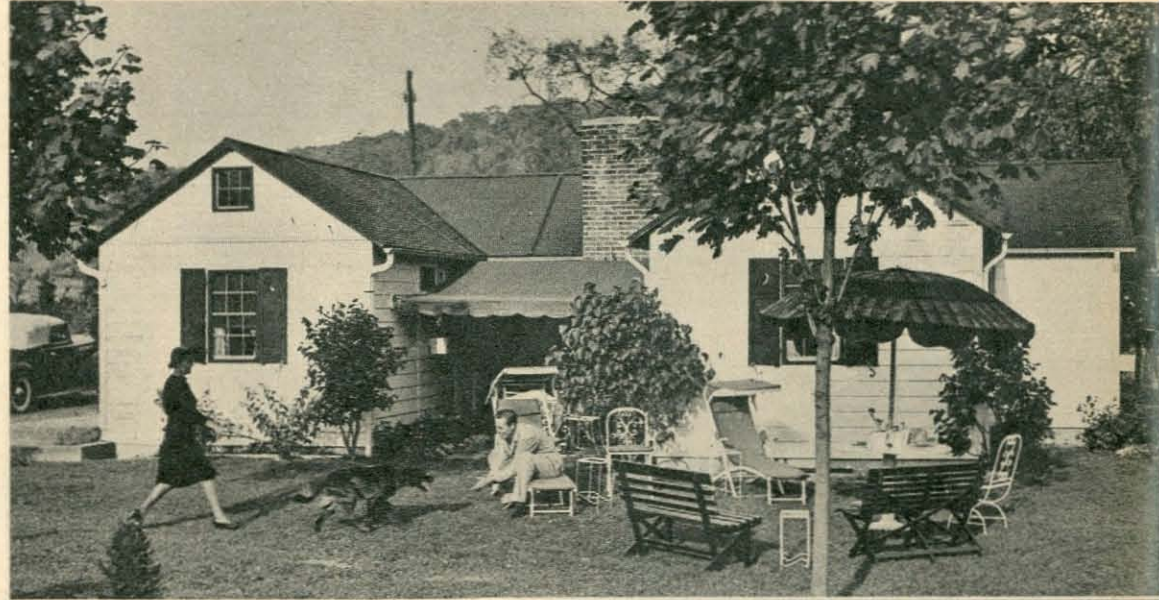

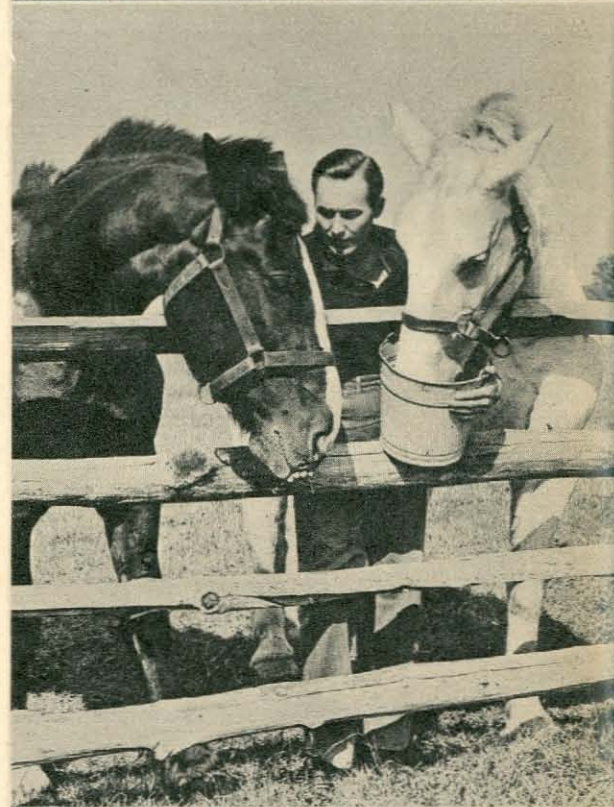

CELEBRITIES are usually expected to haunt city night-clubs or the seashore resorts or to indulge in some fancy form of play for their relaxation. Not Lanny Ross. When his week's broadcasting chores are over (CBS, Monday through Friday), he immediately jumps into his car with Mrs. Ross and motors to the Ross farm in Dutchess County, New York. Here on Melody Farm—as Lanny has musically named his place—the veteran singer hears the "songs" of chickens, hogs, horses and cattle that he raises on his 487 acres, two hundred of which are under cultivation. To Lanny and his wife, New York is a fine place to work, but they prefer living at their rural retreat. It's completely modern. The tiny house—"Singer's Midget"—contains the latest household conveniences. Only a small piano in a corner of the living-room and a radio in another corner give any indication of Lanny's professional life. Lanny whole-heartedly enters into the spirit of small-community life. He's even a member of the volunteer fire department of the town near which Melody Farm is located. Farming is not just a hobby with Lanny, as it is with some professional artists who become a bit bored with the metropolitan merry-go-round and seek new playthings. Lanny believes that farming is too important an industry to be considered a toy. When Melody Farm begins to pay financial dividends, the singer who once thought he'd be a lawyer will be a happy farmer. —D. M.



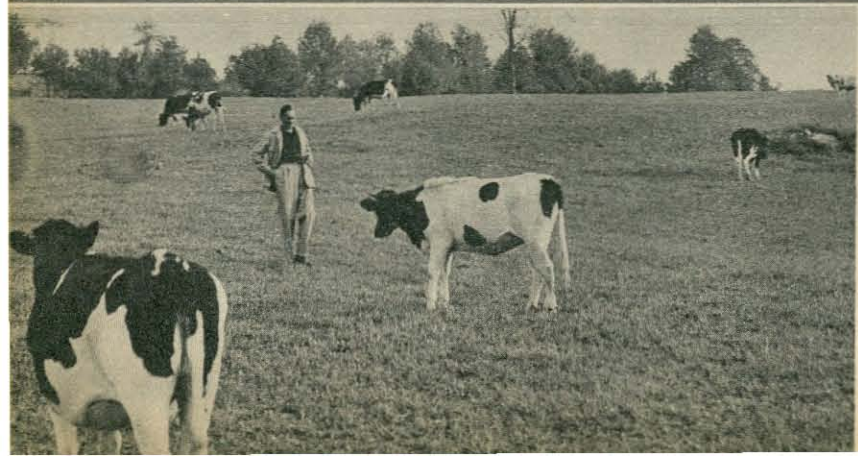

BANDSTAND NOTES

YOUR correspondent was a witness to the celebration of Ted Lewis' 50,000th public appearance the other night. The genial jazz tragedian began his career thirty-four years ago in a nickelodeon in Circleville, Ohio, climbing through the media of tent shows, carnivals, burlesque and small-time vaudeville to the big-time in New York, London and Hollywood. Some people have gone so far as to question Lewis' contribution to jazz, claiming that he was more of a showman than a musician. But regardless of which side you take in the argument, the fact remains that the "Is Everybody Happy?" man was foremost among those who were responsible for swerving music from sweet and soft to hot and fast. Lewis may not have been a great musician himself, but he did employ in his band some of jazzdom's finest instrumentalists. In scanning notes of Lewis' career, one is sharply reminded that the

road along which he has been traveling is a changing one. No doubt the top-hatted maestro is at times given to a feeling of nostalgia, particularly when he hears the names of Goodman, Dorsey and Shaw lauded wherever music is the subject of discussion. Twenty years ago the bass-voiced salutation "Is Everybody Happy?" was a national catch-word. To the credit of Ted Lewis he has not, in the intervening years, allowed himself to become dated. Congratulations upon your long and successful career, Ted.

Bandata

A ruling handed down by the leaders of the musicians' union decrees that all

musicians playing at concerts, in theaters, hotels, restaurants, on radio programs, etc., must begin and end their performances with the playing of "The Star-Spangled Banner" . . . There is a rumor to the effect that the "Hit Parade" program will switch over to the Mutual network this fall. The reason for the change, the rumorites aver, is that on Mutual the program can take advantage of both ASCAP and BMI music . . . I understand that the juke-box operators have placed a ban on the Andrews Sisters' recording of "Juke-Box Jennie." The operators, it seems, don't like the term "juke-box" and would give anything if people would only call the machines something else. Incidentally, our statistics department tells us that there are 250,000 of these machines in use, the operators purchasing each week an average of one and a half records for each juke-box . . .

In that month Basie will make a lecture tour of the country's leading colleges and universities. His subject will be—you guessed it—hot music . . . Bandleader Johnny Long is really getting up there. The band, now in the Hotel New Yorker, will make an appearance at the Paramount Theater early in October. Only bands who are definitely on top receive the theater's bid, this meaning of course that the Paramount Theater recognizes that Johnny and the lads have "arrived."

Purely Personal

Understand that Helen O'Connell, Jimmy Dorsey's vocalist, has switched her affections from Jim Blumenthal, the Fordham football ace, to Cliff Smith, a Harvard law student . . . The Charlie Barnets are expecting a little Charlie Barnett . . . Joanne Marshall, a night-club beauty, and Dick Haymes, vocalist for Harry James, are talking seriously these days, and it isn't about the war or weather, either . . . Clyde Burke and Roberta Louise, both vocalists with Raymond Scott's band, are also singing love-songs . . . It's a baby boy for the Bobby Kings, the vocalist with Mel Marvin's orchestra . . . Leonard Feather, the noted British jazz critic, has married Carol Rovrig, who once sang under the name of Carol Ash.

Songstuff

As one who is a product of the deep South, any rendition of a "blues" song is liable to awaken nostalgic memories—recollections of fish-frys, the greenness of the young corn sprouts against the background of the rich black of the delta land, and—more poignantly—the pleasant voices of the Negroes as they sang in the fields where they labored. Consequently it was with a great deal of interest that we read William C. Handy's account of his life, which he has appropriately titled "Father of the Blues." To those who are interested in knowing something of the background out of which the blues have come, Handy's book (MacMillan Company) is a gold mine of information. In his autobiography, the man who gave the world the immortal "St. Louis Blues" has assembled a wealth of recollections concerning his rise from humble circumstances to a position of honor in music circles. If you are curious as to hitherto little-known facts about spirituals, jazz, boogie-woogie, ragtime, "lowdowns" and blues, then "Father of the Blues" will satisfy that curiosity.

Recordata

If you should hear Sidney Bechet's recording of "The Sheik of Araby," keep in mind that it features a six-piece band in which every instrument is played by the same man. Here's how it was done: Bechet first played the tenor sax part, which was recorded, and then sat with earphones and played the string bass part while the saxophone part was played back to him. Of course this playback was being recorded on another record, which also was picking up the bass part direct from Bechet's performance. This went on through the other instruments—piano, clarinet, soprano saxophones and drums. Believe it or not, but it was actually done that way.

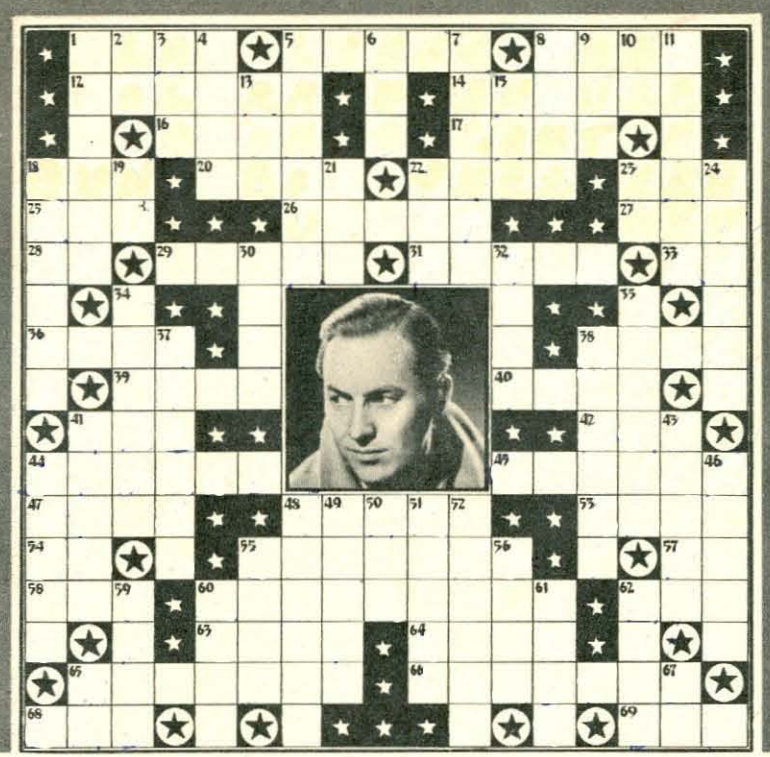

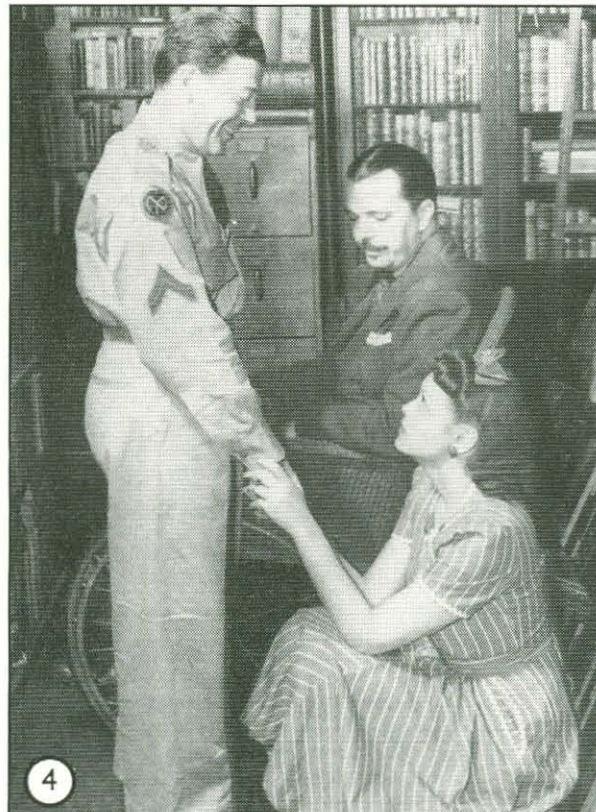
The Cost of Quality
