Today Mickey Rooney is a man! Questioned on the set of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's "Babes on Broadway" picture, which he is currently making with Judy Garland, Mickey was asked how it felt to be twenty-one. Rooney-like, he prefaced his remarks sensibly, said: "Man to man, I don't think anything I can say will be world-shaking, but if you really want to know what my future hopes are, I'll tell you. First, I'd

like to continue my music-writing and some day contribute a significant composition; second, eventually, I hope to become a motion-picture director and bring some truly fine plays to the screen, and last but not least, I hope this year and in the years to come that I will continue to make good and live up to the standards set for me by my mother, my Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer sponsors, and those fans who have contributed so much to my success." Incidentally, Rooney is scheduled to open the fall season of "The Silver Theater," CBS radio series, Sunday, October 5, as the guest star of an original radio drama.

Hedy Lamarr Wins Her Battle



LESS than ten years ago Hedy Lamarr was Mrs. Frederic Mandel, rich, unhappy wife of a munitions manufacturer. Before that she was Hedy Kiesler. Wed at eighteen with an acting career hardly begun, it was not until 1937 that she escaped a life she hated and began a flight to America.

Known as the "Ecstasy Girl" because of an early appearance in a dubious film, she had much to live down, more when critics failed to acknowledge she was anything more than a beautiful woman, and certainly not an actress.

"I want to act," Hedy said. "I can act—not live on a false reputation made when I was too young to know what I was doing." Producers have taken her at her word and gradually "brought her along" in better parts. In the meantime, Hedy has wed and divorced Gene Markey, struck for more pay than her \$500 and eventually reached the \$1,000 a week class.

Now at last she has what she always has wanted—a really fine role. Dubious movie-goers have written to the studio protesting that she of all actresses is not the one to do the delicate, difficult role of Marvin Myles in "H. M. Pulham, Esq." She is now before the cameras, playing opposite Robert Young in the title role of this great book.

Ten fantastic years have enriched the personal experiences of Hedy Lamarr, now twenty-six. She has won her battle to become an important star in Hollywood. She is on the verge of proving the bonus point that she is a fine actress. It has been hard work in face of many thankless critics, but it proves that Hedy meant it when she said early in her Hollywood career: "I am young and madly ambitious. I will prove what I am worth!" —C. S.

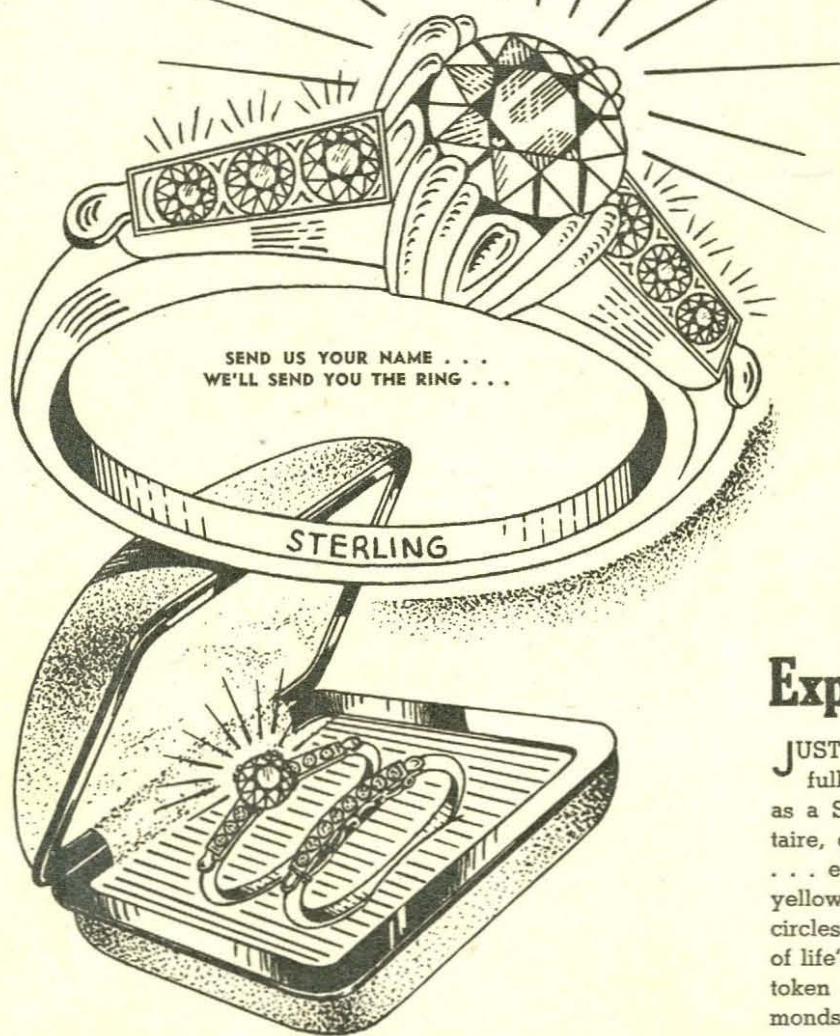

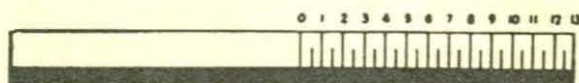

Olivia de Havilland— A Star NOT in LOVE

LOVELY Olivia de Havilland is a star with more male satellites than there are Democratic office-holders. A perfect Technicolor subject, Olivia of the light-brown hair, the deep, brown eyes and classic symmetry of features has a constant train of Hollywood's most eligible and most desirable bachelors winding their romantic way to her door. So far Olivia has treated them like moths around the flame, being kind enough to brush them off before they get their wings singed.

The one exception was her "lengthy" seven-month romance with Jimmy Stewart, now Corporal Stewart. While Olivia's other romantic suitors had the appearance of studio hirelings, as did the Stewart dating at first, the Stewart-De Havilland twosome took on the aspect of something much more serious than a "shore leave" romance, and all of Hollywood's angle-mongers were intimating a secret marriage, a sudden elopement. However, this "pursuit of romance" broke off cleaner than a Sunday suit, and now both Jimmy and Olivia have more variety in their dating than the shape of things on the beach at Coney Island.

Olivia de Havilland got her "break" into pictures by being an understudy to an understudy. As the stardust began to shower down upon her young shoulders, she was often quoted as saying, "I don't want romance or marriage for a long, long time." And for a while she came close to keeping her word on both counts. She became known as the "Elsie Dinsmore" of Hollywood—a sweet young thing to be babied and fathered by every person on the lot but with about as much color as a cold sheet. Her chief claim to fame was as "Errol Flynn's leading lady." As a result they were about to wheel her career into the nearest closet and throw

away the key. All of a sudden Olivia realized that she had a one-way ticket to the old maid actresses' home, and overnight she exploded into a new woman. Sophistication was a long time in coming, but it came!

Overnight the Olivia de Havilland with the air of a gingham-clad country maid on her first picnic excoriated her innocent-sweet disposition. Overnight, cigarette smoke didn't make her cough, a highball began to have its moments (although she still prefers coke and ice-cream and will imbibe in such character dissipation at every opportunity offered, including Ciro's). She quit quoting Shakespeare, she started wearing "clothes for effect" instead of "clothes for use," she started feuding with her studio, and her weekly list of dates sounded like the roster of the Brooklyn Dodgers.

If Olivia can't find the "right" guy from among a bevy of the Screen Capital's bachelors that include Franchot Tone, Gene Markey, Burgess Meredith, Jimmy Stewart, Richard Travis, et al., it must be concluded that the De Havilland girl is enjoying her "rejuvenation" too much to get serious about any one love or any one man for some time to come.

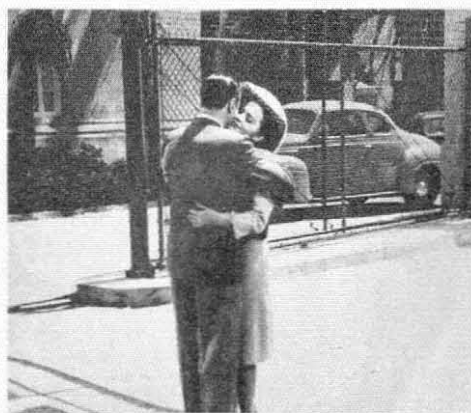

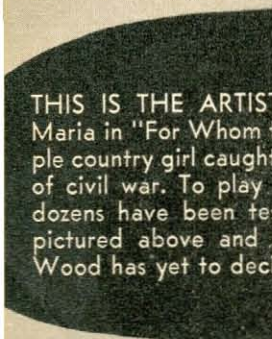

FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS

Inside story behind work on Hollywood's biggest headache since "Gone With the Wind"

REPORTERS in Hollywood who grow tired of trying to find out just when Victor Mature will divorce Mrs. Mature, or when Lana Turner will stop going with Tony Martin and marry him, sometimes turn to constructive sleuthing. For example, Paramount's filming of Ernest Hemingway's best-selling novel, "For Whom the Bell Tolls."

This story of the Spanish war tells what killing and hate does to the common people. A powerful piece of writing, its translation into a screen play via the expert hand of director Sam Wood is an event as important as the

launching of "Gone With the Wind."

While much of the search for Scarlett O'Hara was expert publicity juggling, the struggle to find heroine Maria and hero Robert Jordan is a serious matter, and not staged just for headline purposes. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE presents the first pictures of tests being made for the film, does not guarantee or suggest that any of these people will play the parts. Hundreds will be tested, and when the cameras first start to roll three weeks hence, several of the players will not yet have been cast. But that's Hollywood! —C. S.

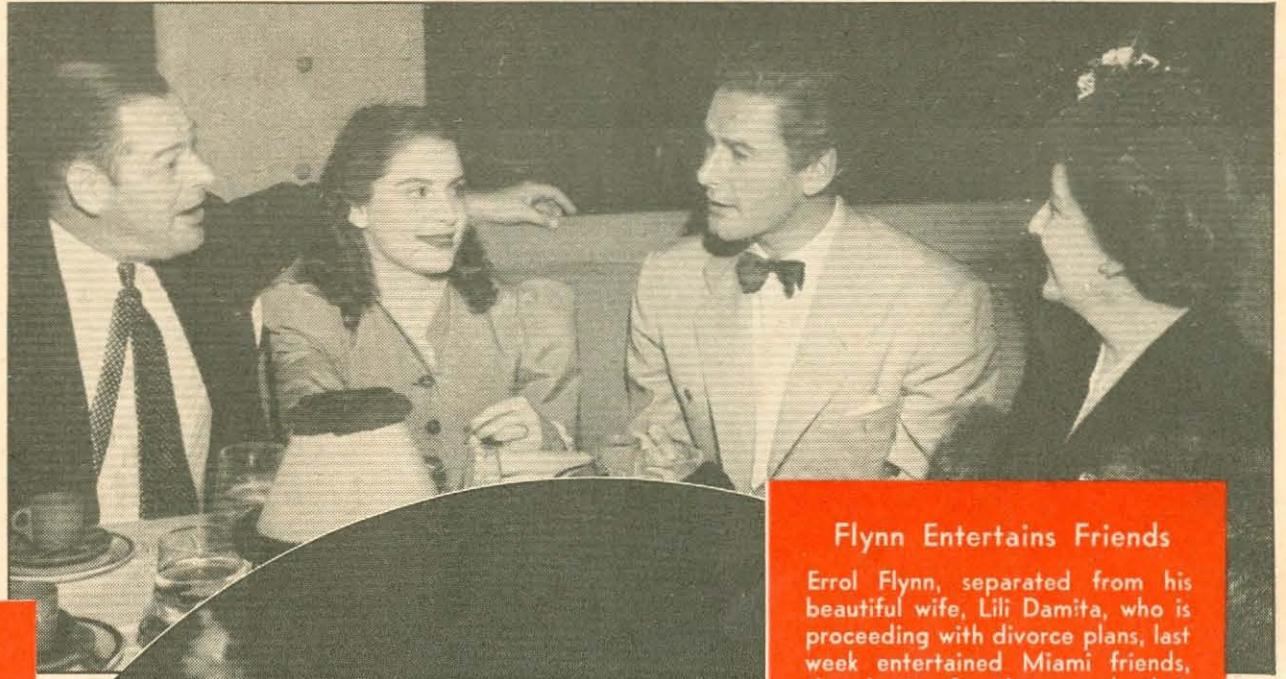

GENERAL V. F. W. Sponsored

Another lethal wallop has been dealt the senate sub-committee charging the movie industry with "war-mongering." This wallop comes from the Veterans of Foreign Wars, which is sponsoring showing of Warners' historical and national preparedness shorts throughout the nation. Warners, called "alarmists" by an oleo-tongued senator, is working hand and glove with the V. F. W. in providing free bookings of these shorts to encourage good citizenship and loyalty among the American people. And regardless of what calumny the senators froth out, few people will have the gross temerity to intimate that the venerable V. F. W. would hitch itself to war-inciters. As claimed by Wendell Willkie, the investigation has been nothing but a ludicrous sideshow, without fact or foundation, trying to flare ever higher racial prejudice and national disunity—and at the same time setting the stage for certain senators to grab buckets of publicity.

will also be delayed. The accident occurred early Saturday, September 13, shortly after Bette and her husband, Arthur Farnsworth, had bidden good night to several friends.

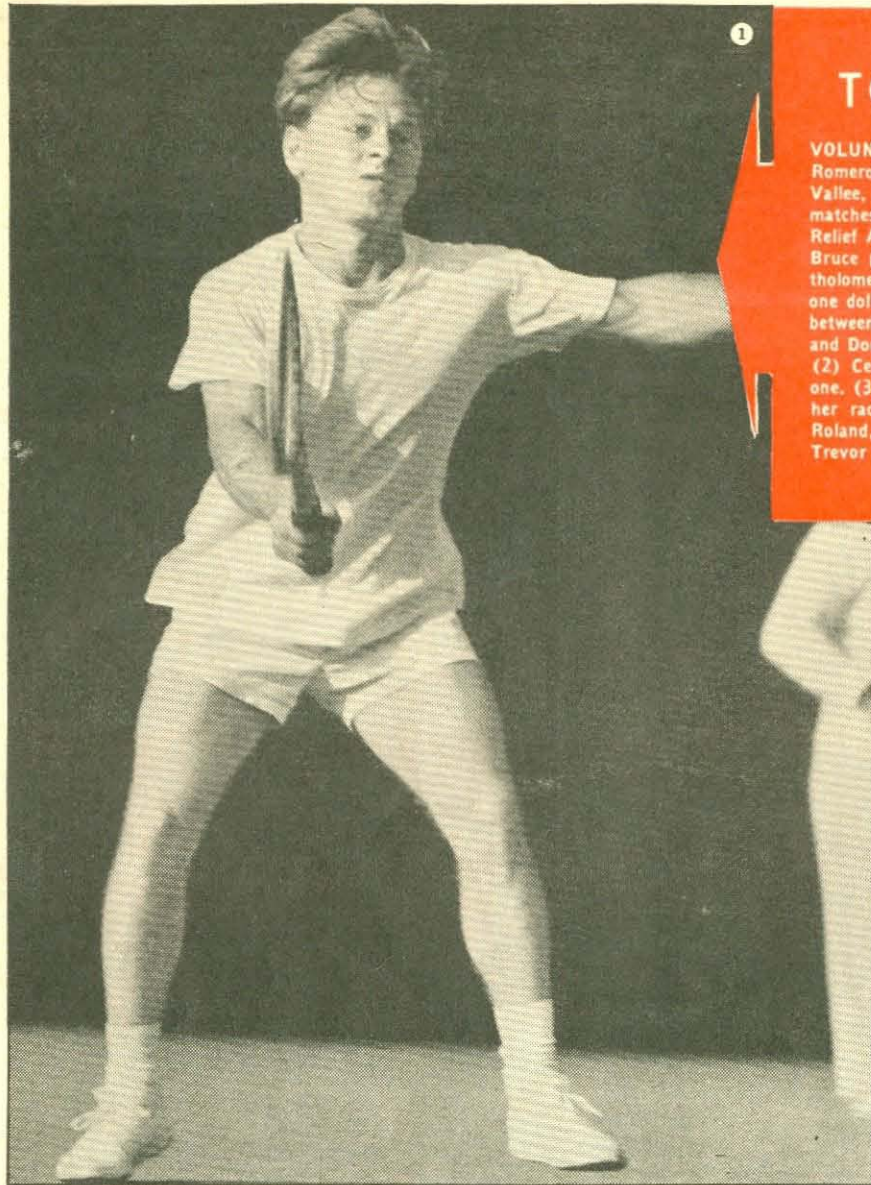

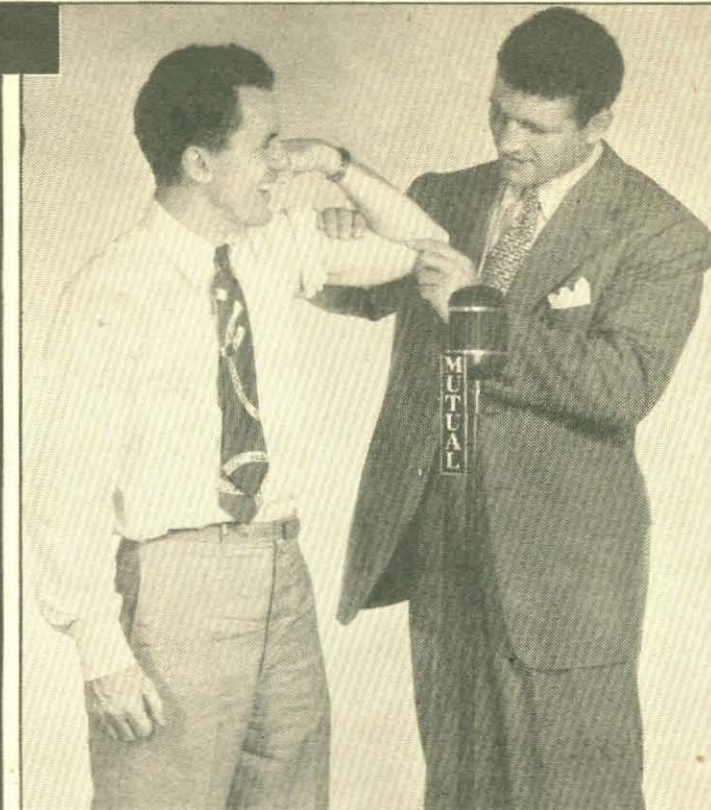

MUSIC NOTES: Arturo Tos-
 canini will not be back conduct-

 nini having completed his con-

 on October 7 and will continue

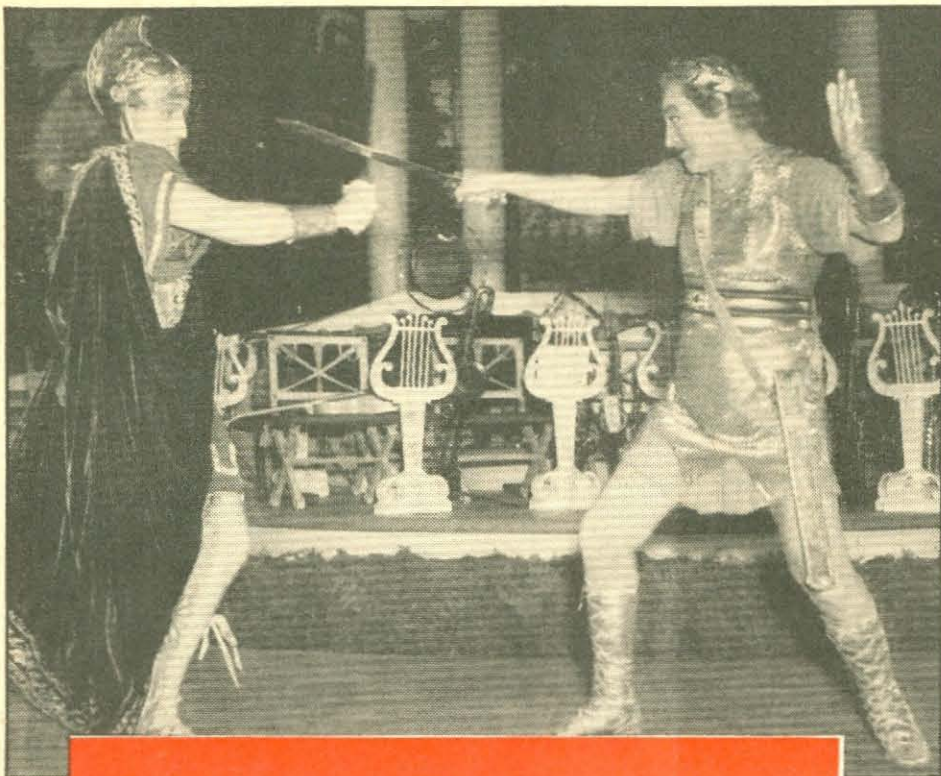

GENERAL

Musical Fait Accompli

NEW YORK.—By the time you read this the music rift between ASCAP and NBC will have been peaceably settled—we hope—except for the approval of a few of the stations affiliated with NBC. The National Association of Broadcasters has formally approved the peace pact.

Trout Relieves Murrow

NEW YORK.—On October 14, Bob Trout, CBS newscaster, will Clipper across the Atlantic, bound for London, where he will relieve Edward R. Murrow, CBS head of the European bureau. Murrow will return to America for a rest that will probably last three or four months. He will undoubtedly have some vivid and revealing stories to tell anent his harrowing experiences in the war capital.

NBC Signs Stokowski

NEW YORK.—Leopold Stokowski has been signed to conduct the NBC Symphony Orchestra during the 1941-42 season. He will succeed Arturo Toscanini, who conducted the fall and winter season for four years in a row. According to NBC officials, Mr. Toscanini "expressed the wish not to undertake any further commitments, as he feels the need for a rest." It was hoped, however, by the NBC officials that he could appear to conduct one or two concerts during the current season.

DEFENSE

And He Went

NEW YORK.—When singer Jean Cavall got himself a singing spot on NBC there were signs of immediate and enthusiastic listener-approval. In three months the French-born vocalist had topped the fan-mail receipts of all the NBC contract artists. Then one day Cavall received a letter from a fan which read as follows: "Why don't you go back to France and defend your country?" P. S. On September 27, Cavall is doing that very thing. He's joining the Canadian army in order that he can fight the enemies of the country of his birth.

Let Me at 'Em!

HOLLYWOOD.—In spite of the current Washington furor about whether or not radio and the movies are propagandizing, Arch Oboler is pleading for air time to dramatize the threat of Nazism and Fascism to the American way of life. The dynamic playwright, who has written many sharp dramatic indictments of the dictatorial systems, guarantees that he can deliver not only scripts for such a series of shows but also the cream of Hollywood talent to perform them—if he can get time on the air and a clear right of way for plain speaking.

A Banjoist and His Band

CHICAGO.—Eddie Peabody, the "National Barn Dance" banjo-banger who is also a lieutenant commander in

the Naval Reserves, has given up most of his civilian activities to act as band music and entertainment officer at the important Great Lakes Naval Training Station. There, with the assistance of Al Kvale, popular dance-band leader now a Navy lieutenant, Eddie has built, according to Navy officers, the finest band at the post since the late John Philip Sousa directed there.

Long-Distance Song

HOLLYWOOD.—The "Buy a Bond" song you heard introduced on a recent "Treasury Hour" broadcast has a unique story behind it. Howard Dietz, who is M-G-M's publicity and advertising chief and also co-ordinator-chairman of the "Treasury Hour" production set-up, wrote the lyrics of the song in New York. They were airmailed to composer Arthur Schwartz in Hollywood. The next day Schwartz completed his melody and sang the tune for a transcription. This was rushed back to New York, where Al Goodman listened to it, wrote a score for the "Treasury Hour" orchestra. From inspiration to presentation "Buy a Bond" traveled across the continent and back in just a few days.

I've been bombed by them (in Berlin) at least half a dozen times!"

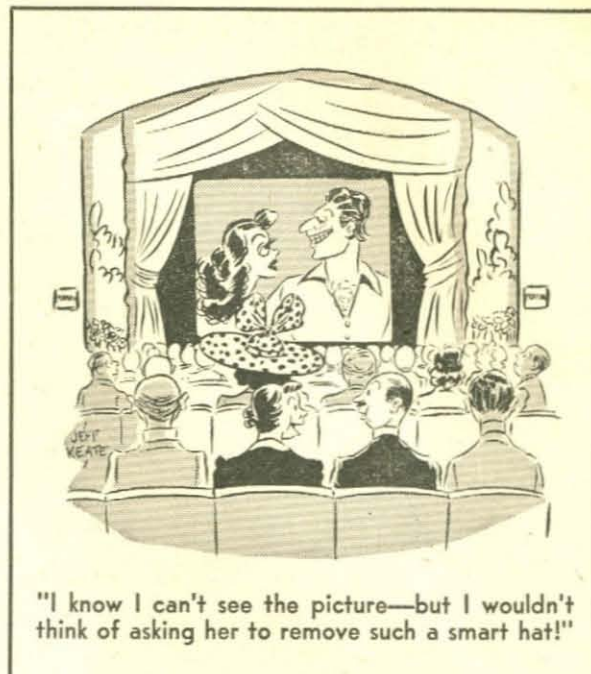

Cairo Now Heard in U. S. Lutherans Broadcast to Occupied Countries BBC's Major Murray Is Composer

"RADIO TOKYO" seems to be unusually anxious for reports on reception of its transmissions in North America. Hardly a night goes by but what the announcer requests communications from its United States listeners asking that these letters be sent to the Foreign Department, Nippon Hoso Kyokai (Broadcasting Corporation of Japan), Tokyo, Japan.

"Radio Tokyo's" many super-power transmitters are quite busy these days. Twelve separate transmissions, representing a total of thirty-four hours, in sixteen different languages are radiated daily. Of this total, four and a half hours daily are devoted to propaganda broadcasts for North America. The transmission to eastern United States is sent out daily from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. over JLG4 (15.105) and

ica and almost the whole program from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST may now be heard. The broadcast begins with clock chimes; news in Egyptian is given at 3:45 p.m. EST. The station signs off with the national anthem at 4:00 p.m. EST.

General Notes

A station believed to be DXH2 (15.12), Warsaw, Poland, is being heard from approximately 6:00 to 11:00 a.m. EST . . . August Balbi of Los Angeles, Calif., writes HVJ (11.74), "Radio Vaticano," Vatican City, broadcasts a special program for Australia, early Monday mornings from 1:00 to 1:30 a.m. EST . . . ZBW3 (9.52), Hongkong, Hongkong, is being heard with good signal strength on the West Coast from 5:00 to 9:15 a.m. EST . . . According to Roger Legge of Binghamton, N. Y., news in English is transmitted simultaneously by Finnish stations OFD (9.50), OFE (11.78) and OIE (15.19) daily at 3:50 and 7:55 p.m. EST. These news bulletins are intended primarily for reception in North America . . . LeRoy Waite, Ballston Spa, N. Y., reports reception of an air-mail registered letter of verification from "Radio Dakar" at Dakar, Senegal, West Africa. According to information given in this communication the station broadcasts daily at 7:15 a.m. EST on 6.435 and 13.355 megs, and at 2:15 p.m. EST on 6.435 and 9.41 megs. The latter frequency is the only one that has been heard in the United States. Programs from "Radio Dakar" open with the hymn "L'Infanterie de Marine" and close with "La Marseillaise" . . . The Rev. K. J. Touch, broadcasting from the Y. M. C. A. in Iceland in describing the arrival of the American convoy, stated that he and the other padres and soldiers on duty (they were only five) went down to the quay and handed out cups of British tea to the American marines. Many of them hadn't tasted tea before and found it took a bit of getting-used-to.

One soldier emptied several mugs over the quay before he acquired the taste. By dawn he had got the tea habit thoroughly, having drunk twenty-five cups.

Peeks at Personalities

Terig Tucci, Argentine conductor and composer, has been named music director of CBS' new Latin-American network . . . According to "London Calling," BBC news commentators are men of varied talents. One of them composed the national anthem of Iraq, which was first sung some eighteen years ago. He is Major Alan Murray, news commentator in the eastern service of the BBC, and it must have given him rather a thrill to read in the papers that when the regent, Emir Abdul Ilah, reentered Bagdad the strains of his composition were the signal for the cutting of a sheep's throat. Major Murray is also the composer of many popular songs, including the favorite "I'll Walk Beside You" . . . Maurice English, war correspondent recently returned from Paris, France, has joined the staff of NBC's international division and is responsible for checking news and comment for factual and objective content so that its uniformity will be assured when broadcast in six languages.

Meet Your News Commentator: Fulton Lewis, jr. Washington Expert

CHIEFLY because of Fulton Lewis, jr.—and his scrappy disposition—radio commentators today can cover Washington with the same inside-track facilities enjoyed by newspapermen. Lewis fought for radio correspondents' space in the galleries of Congress, for recognition at White House, departmental press conferences. He got it all, but only after the passage of a national law. In 1937 Lewis—then a Washington correspondent-columnist—became interested in radio when he pinch-hit for a friend. Soon after, he was on the air with his own program, went to bat for radio's rights in the nation's Capital. Today he's heard over 150 Mutual stations five times a week.

Thirty-eight, Washington-born, Lewis is an old-timer at covering the Capital, with countless personal contacts garnered from a fourteen-year newspaper career. Because he subscribes to no news services and gathers all his own news, he gets the news fresh, much of it through telephone conversations, making as many as fifty calls a day in town or out of town, whenever a story is brewing. Members of Congress have chosen him the best network commentator on national news.

Lewis lives with his wife, the former Alice Huston of Chattanooga, Tenn., on their seventy-five-acre farm in southern Maryland. They have two children—Betsy, nine, and Buddy, five. Mrs. Lewis is her husband's chief advisor, helps him make many contacts, has even written columns for him. Their pet hobby is the farm, but covering news-jammed Washington leaves little time for hobbies.

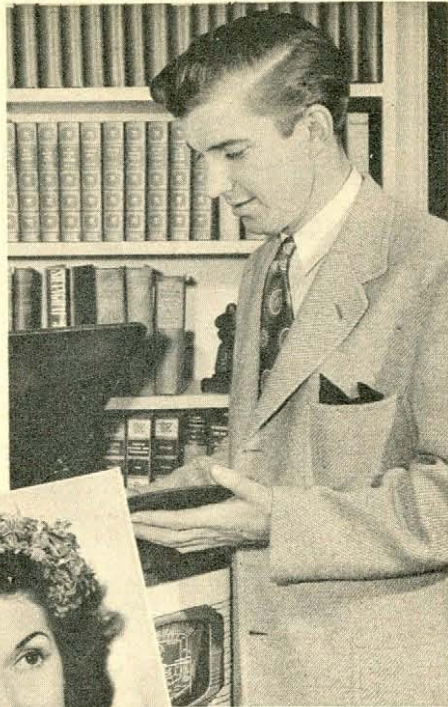

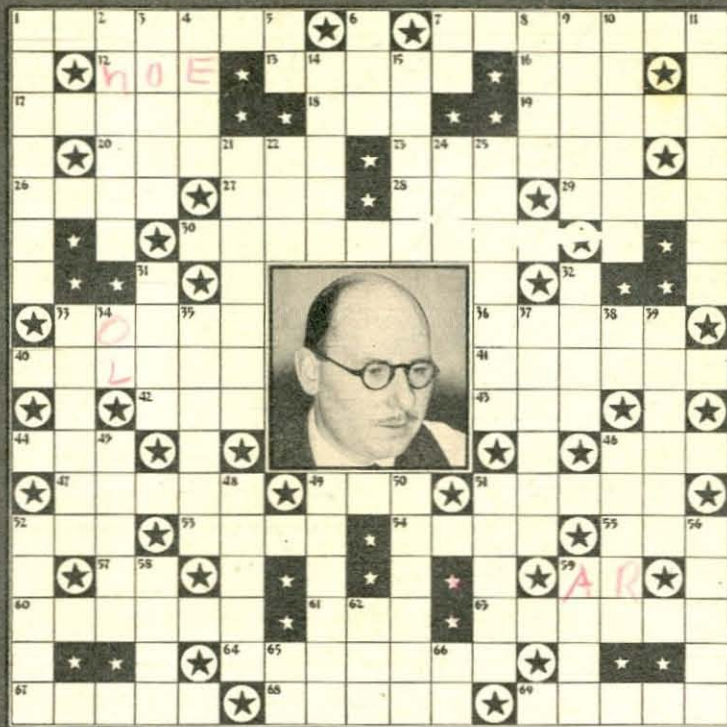
