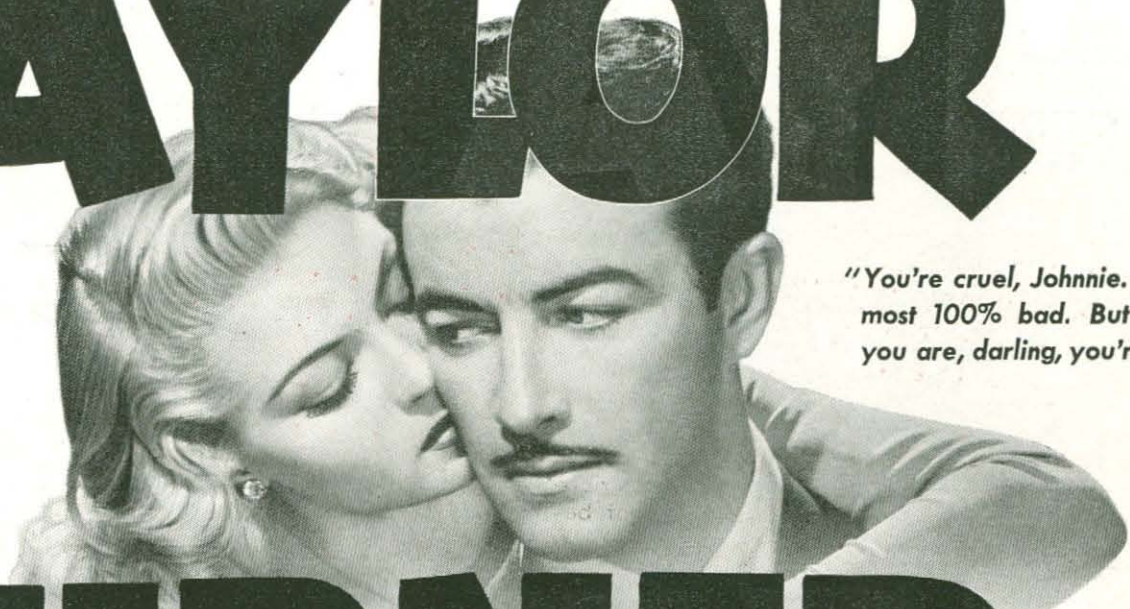
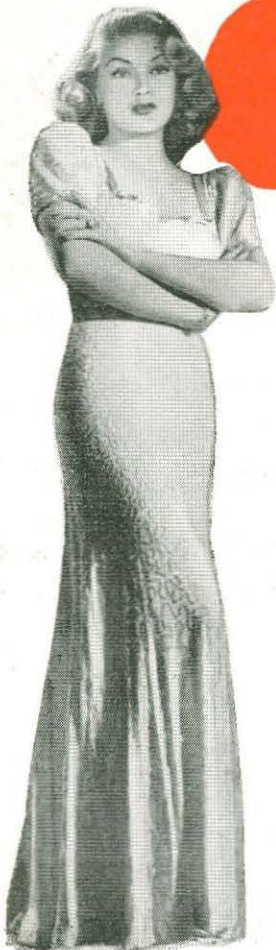

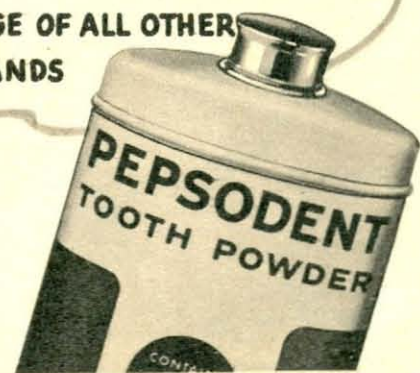

"HOW IT FELT WHEN I DIED"

The value of a lifetime lesson was proved
in forty seconds of actual physical death

I DIED two years ago.

For forty seconds my body was dead. No pulse! No respiration! By all medical rules I had met the Grim Reaper.


I have been asked often how it felt to die. It is not because I wish to dwell morbidly upon death that I have consented to tell of this experience. Rather, it is because something occurred then which has helped me to live.

It was shortly after Thanksgiving two years ago that I was driving my station wagon at a pretty good clip over a rise on Sunset Boulevard, just in front of Jane Withers' home.

A car speeding from the other direction suddenly loomed up, considerably on my side of the white line. As I swerved to avoid a head-on collision, my car was side-swiped and catapulted down over a steep bank, turning over several times.

How I managed to climb out of the wreck is more than I'll ever know. I had had a terrible smash—ribs broken, a collapsed lung, back broken in two places, two of the darkest shiners anyone has ever seen and a severed septum which laid my nose back over my face.

My first flashing thought as I

dragged myself out of the debris was: "I don't want to die."

Without egotism I say that I have always, since my youthful acrobatic days, been without fear, have never expected the worst to happen. I love life; and I can tell you that many times, I am sure, right thoughts, consistently held, have meant the difference for me between continuation of life and its sudden termination.

I always have believed that we influence things around us as well as ourselves by our thoughts.

Hence my first thought in the agony of the accident. I kept repeating in my mind, "I don't want to die." I knew that was my only way to cling to life. The one thing I had with which to fight against the calamity of death was my own thought.

Then came those forty seconds of death as I lay on the operating-table.

During that fateful moment I threw out the negative thought, "I don't want to die," and substituted the positive conviction, "I am going to live."

Death had placed his hand on my body—but my spirit lived on. What is more important, during that brief mo-

ment of "death," I learned in some way, from some source, that man is master of his destiny.

All this would be unimportant to tell about if it were merely a personal experience of my own. But I am writing about it because I believe that right now it is more important than at any other time in our history for us Americans to think straight.

This is no time for defeatism, no time even for pacifism. I am not arguing simply from a military point of view. I am pleading for a courageous approach toward whatever faces us, firm in the conviction that we are right in our assumption that this is God's country, that freedom is one of our inherent rights. I am just as firm in the conviction that we must defend that freedom against any outside aggressor, not only through an adequate campaign by our military forces but also through unity of civilian thought.

I believe in God. I believe that He is on our side. And I have sufficient faith that if we do our part by clear, clean, wholesome thinking, He will do His part.

I learned this when I died.

"PACIFIC BLACKOUT!"



This Is a Movie!

UNCANNY timing, good theater is Paramount's release already of a picture laid against a background of defense blackout in Los Angeles. In making "Pacific Blackout" (originally titled "Midnight Angel") Paramount has cooked up good entertainment. More important, it has anticipated world events. The picture, starring Robert Preston and Martha O'Driscoll (left), tells a thrilling story of a convicted murderer's escape during a "practise" blackout (above) on the West Coast and of his attempt to stave off a horrible double

cross—a plot to put live bombs in a U. S. bomber which is supposed to be carrying "duds," or practise bombs. Actually, for most movie-goers, "Pacific Blackout" will demonstrate America's first blackout from A to Z, from supervising the dousing of lights throughout a great city to hospitalization and care of the injured. "Pacific Blackout" was produced under normal peace-time conditions. Then an America under attack was make-believe. Today it's the real thing. How real may be seen on the following pages!

This Is the Real Thing!

America's fighting war brings M-Day to broadcasting. Here's the behind-the-scenes story of a "special news bulletin"

RADIO felt the cold reality of war first. Radio felt the effect of American blackout first. Radio, of all American civilian institutions, felt—and undertook—the responsibilities of war first. That is all pretty obvious.

But to what lengths radio has gone in order to fulfill its responsibility is little understood by the public. What headaches and heroic efforts lay behind even a terse, ten-word "special bulletin" can be seen only behind the closed doors of broadcasting news-rooms and listening-posts. To the average listener today those doors are locked and guarded by the military. That makes this behind-the-scenes story of war news important to every listener.

No network was caught flat-footed by the Jap attack. With tension rising daily over Jap-U. S. relations, news and special-events chiefs had already dusted off plans made back in 1939. On Sunday, December 7, they were able to triple their news service at a moment's notice.

The mix-ups and mishaps which occurred were unbelievably few, despite the fact that networks had to feed broadcasts as usual, give out regional announcements calling men back to the Army and Navy, break into every program with new war bulletins. Smoothly and quickly, the war news was fitted into an orderly, serviceable pattern.

Radio war bulletins get to the microphone from three sources: 1. The great press services—Associated, United, International. 2. The network listening-posts which pick up foreign short-wave news broadcasts from all over the world. 3. The networks' own cor-

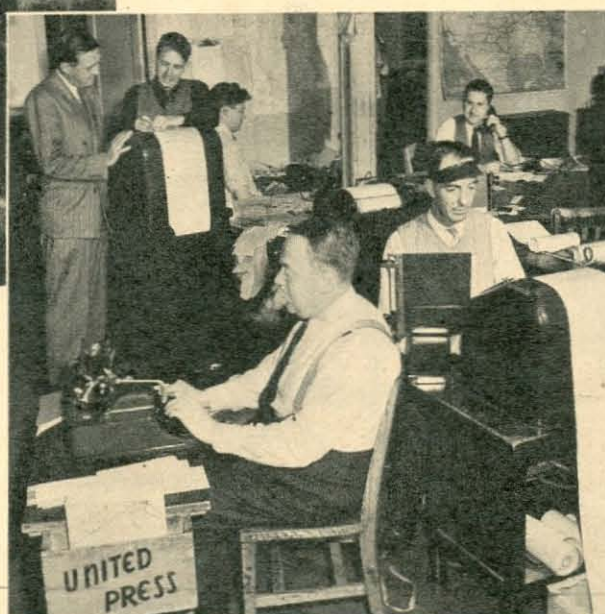
respondents speaking directly from world hot-spots. Each source supplies news—hundreds of thousands of words daily—to network news-rooms.

In the news-rooms a high-powered staff of writers, analysts and commentators do a twenty-four-hours-a-day job. They must sift and classify rumors, fact and official reports. They must compress all the important news into capsule-like paragraphs which will fit into one-, two-, three-, fifteen-minute periods. They must lean over backward to authenticate every report. Above all, they must work with lightning speed to keep up with an ever-changing situation.

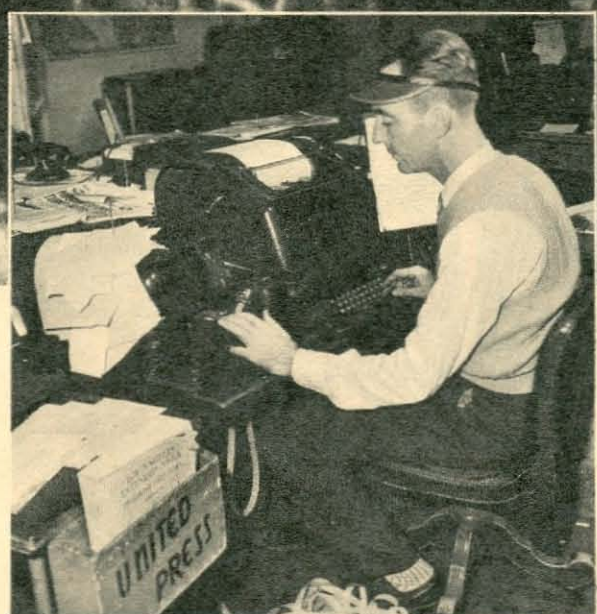

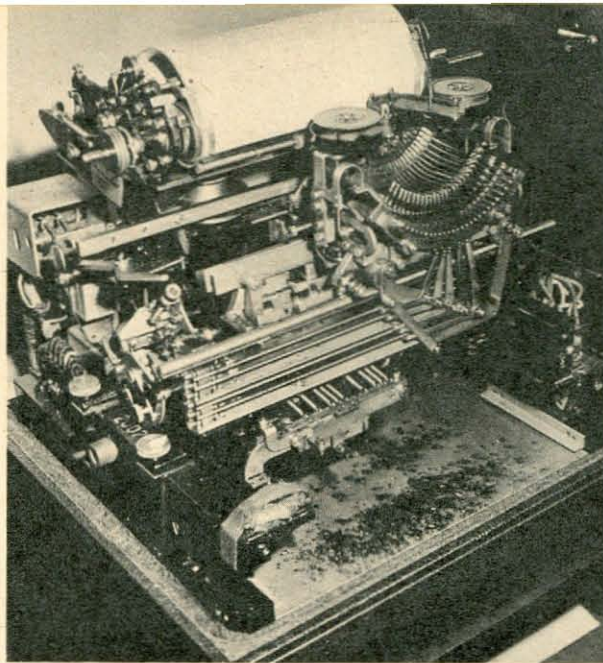

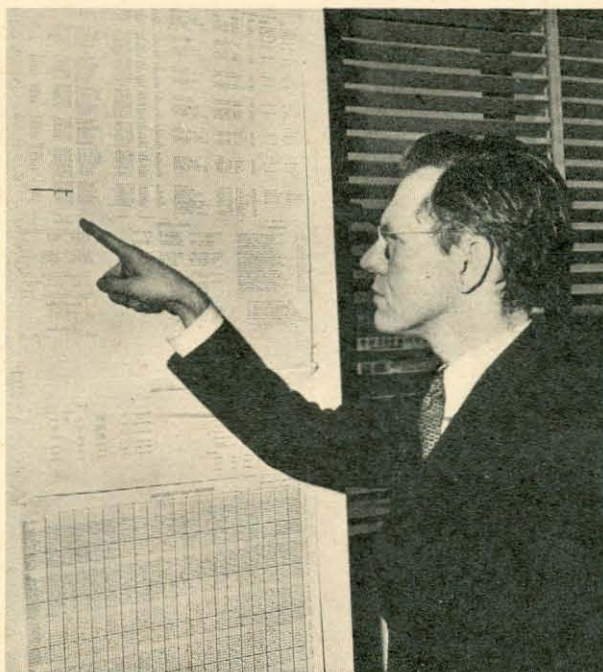

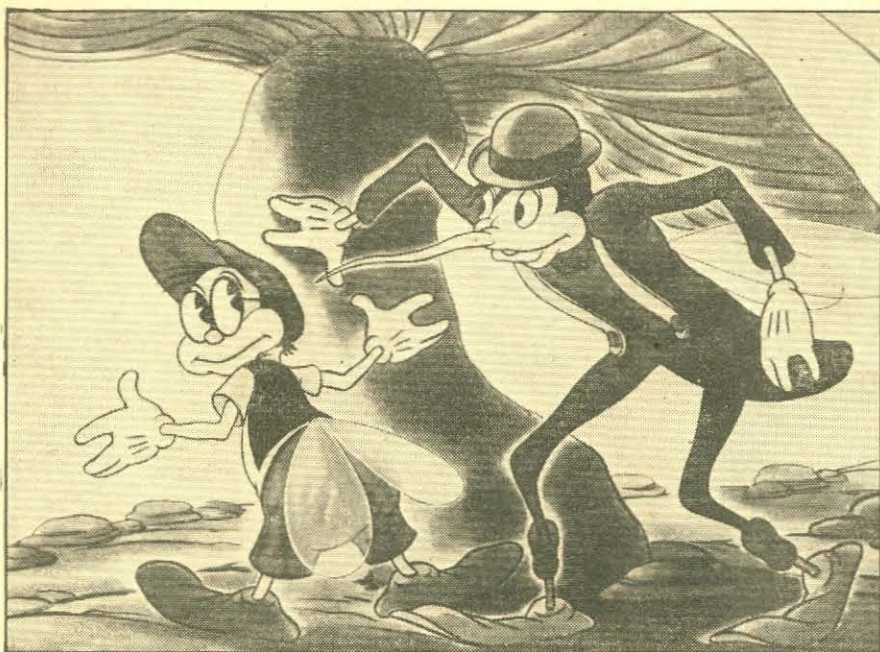

MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE CRITICS' REPORT

"BALL OF FIRE"

Cast: Gary Cooper, Barbara Stanwyck, Oscar Homolka, Henry Travers, S. Z. Sakall, Tully Marshall, et al. A Samuel Goldwyn production for RKO release; directed by Howard Hawks and photographed by Greg Toland, who also photographed "Citizen Kane." Screen play by Charles Brackett and Billy Wilder.

Type of Picture: This is a homely, romantic melodrama with its comic and serious moments. Gary Cooper is a love-starved bookworm intent upon completing the editing of a new encyclopedia; Barbara Stanwyck is the strip-teasing cafe singer and gang moll who meets him when he suddenly becomes aware that his tome is dated in its references to slang—the immediate idiom.

This Is the Story: Cooper hunts slang to its lair and becomes involved with moll Stanwyck, who, since the heat is on her boy friend, Dana Andrews, de-

cides to hide out in the mansion occupied by Gary and his half-dozen unmarried colleagues engaged in writing a new encyclopedia. Immediately she—the "ball of fire"—starts a conflagration. All the old fuddyduddies begin pressing their trousers and boss Cooper unconsciously falls in love with the tricky "sugarpuss" Barbara. That leads to complications, inasmuch as Babs already is wearing a huge, square-cut rock from her gangster employer. Cooper and Babs set a wedding date, but her gang playmates meanwhile have organized to kidnap her from the "squares." Then, the last minute, Sugarpuss discovers that she really loves Cooper, not Andrews, and it takes some mighty fancy shooting with a microscope light condenser before she and Cooper are reunited and the baddies put in the refrigerator.

Verdict: Don't miss this one.—E. P.

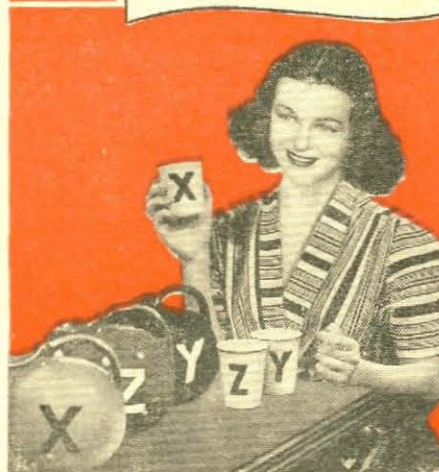

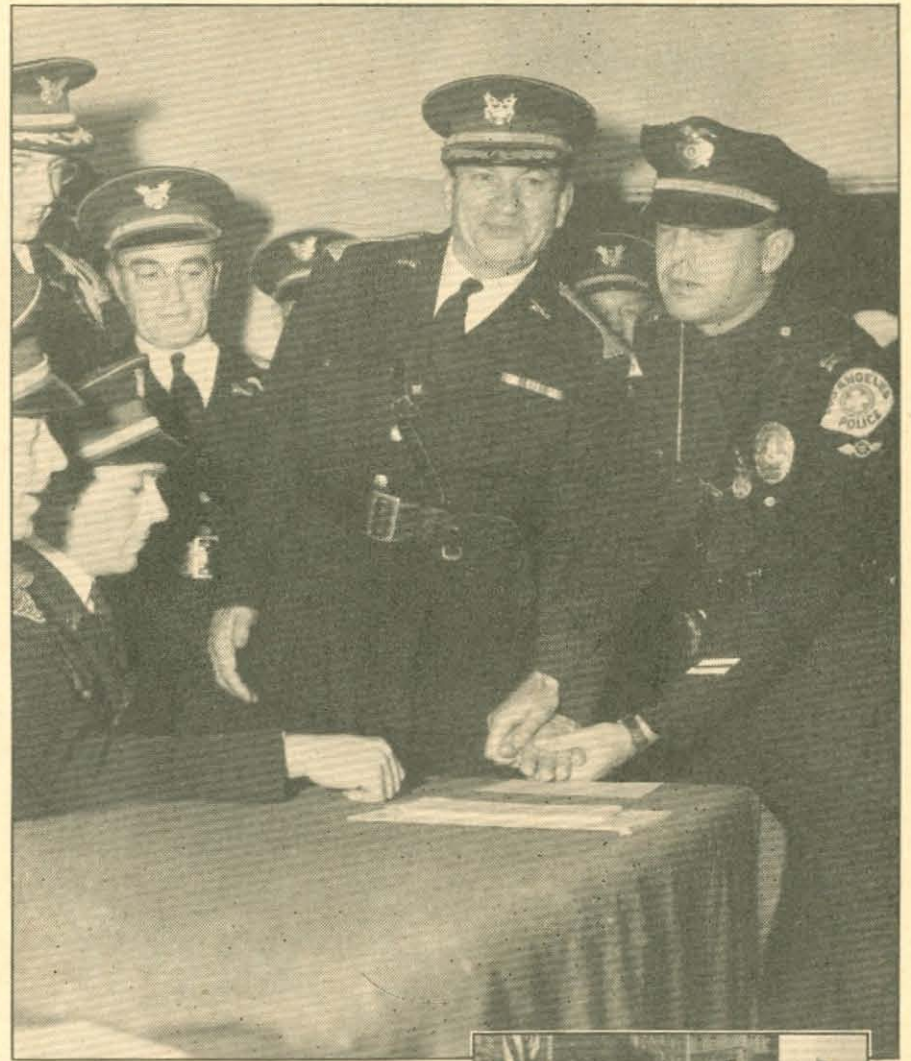

Bette Quits Academy Job

After serving hardly three months, Bette Davis has resigned as president of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. Her resignation was "regretfully accepted" at a meeting of the Board of Governors January 7. Miss Davis, a two-time Academy Award winner herself, said she felt that the presidency is a full-time job to which she cannot do justice and at the same time fulfil her picture contract. Rather than act as a figurehead, turning over most of the duties to another person, she decided to resign.

Gary Cooper Will Be Gehrig!

Discussion as to who shall play Lou Gehrig ended December 27 when Sam Goldwyn officially announced that the role would go to Gary Cooper. Gary won the recent MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE fan poll to choose the right actor and evidently Goldwyn listened. Footnote:

The Arnaz' Dine High

Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz were dinner guests Christmas Day of President Batista of Cuba. The Cuban dancing screen star and his wife were set for a complete personal-appearance tour of South America but have changed their plans on account of war exigencies.

Film Russian Epic

First job for Alexander Korda when he returns to the U. S. from England—which he will soon—will be to film Tolstoy's great novel, "War and Peace." Among Astaire's fellow ranchers are Bing Crosby, Clark Gable, Ginger Rogers, Fred MacMurray, Joel McCrea, Cecil B. DeMille, Douglas Fairbanks, Jr.

Disney Gets Government Jobs

Walt Disney is up to his neck in commitments to the Navy, to the U. S. Treasury Department and the Office of Inter-American Affairs. For the Navy he will produce twenty one-reelers which will teach observers, lookouts and pilots how to distinguish our own aircraft and warships from those of the enemy. The Donald Duck man has also made arrangements to lease part of his plant and staff, and

to give half of his own time, to the Government. The job: Making cartoons and posters in the interest of the Pan-American Good Neighbor policy. In addition, Disney is continuing to supply insignia for Army and Navy units.

Goebbels' Boys Excuse Military Reverses in Russia

THE grand strategy of the Nazi propagandists these days is to discount, excuse and minimize their military reverses in Russia and North Africa while at the same time giving the spotlight to Japanese successes in the Pacific arena. To distract attention from Herr Hitler's next "putsch," which may even be in progress by the time you read this, Goebbels' boys on the Berlin Radio are filling the air with a lot of words about ethics, good sportsmanship in war (this is a good one) and adherence to the Golden Rule. "From where I stand in front of this microphone," says E. D. Ward, "I can see through the window a huge twenty-foot American flag painted on the wall of American House. There has been no effort to remove or paint over this flag. Are the Americans such good sports?" "At the Press Club, where I often eat, there stands on the mantel a large silver trophy. The inscription on it reads, 'Presented to the Auto Club of Berlin by King George.' Despite the fact that England is our enemy and that every bit of metal is needed badly for war materials, there has been no effort to melt up this cup. Are the British as broad-minded? George Bernard Shaw's show 'Pygmalion' is always sold out here in Berlin. We still have culture despite what our enemies say."

Quentin Reynolds, American ace correspondent recently arrived in London from a tour of the Russian and North African fronts, made a fine talk over London Radio the other day. Among other remarks he said that Germany had made two grave mistakes regarding Britain; the first was to wake her sleeping dead. The spirits of Nelson and Allenby walk the streets of London today. You see this spirit reflected in the face of the R. A. F. pilot who jauntily wears his cap over one eye to cover its sightless socket; you see it in the faces of proud children who are registering in the new National Youth Service. The other mistake was to believe that Britain and America have nothing in common. In England we drive automobiles down the left side of the street. In the United States we drive cars down the right side of the road. But the road to Berlin is a wide one and there is plenty of room for both of us to go driving along side by side, and though the way may be long and hard we—together—will get there.

The Nazis Take the Cake

This story—one of the best that has come out of the war—in "London Calling" was just too good to keep. M. Michalopoulos, the Greek Minister of Information, told the tale in a recent broadcast to Australia: "While Athens is starving, General Caballero, Mussolini's commander-in-chief, with true Italian chivalry, was giving parties. For one of these he required six hundred cakes. So he went

to a big confectionery in Athens and ordered them. The proprietor told him he was very sorry but that he had no materials, but General Caballero said that was quite all right, as the Italian army would supply all the necessary ingredients. So the cakes were baked and about to be delivered to the general when a German officer entered the shop and asked for four hundred cakes. The proprietor said he was very sorry but that he had no cakes at all. The German officer then said that he would search the place, which he proceeded to do, and he found the six hundred cakes. The proprietor said that these did not belong to him, as the materials had all been supplied by the Italians. The German officer then looked fiercely at the proprietor and said, "To — with the Italians, who cares about them? Send the cakes to German headquarters at once and don't argue. As for Caballero, you just give him this chit for his cakes and let him eat it."

Tokyo broadcasts to eastern North America from 5:55 to 9:30 p.m. EST, with English news periods at 6:00 and 9:10 p.m., over JLG4 (15.105) and

JZJ (11.80). JLG4 is the best frequency and the early part of the transmission is received with the greatest strength. Tokyo broadcasts to western North America from 10:25 p.m. to 1:25 a.m. EST, with English news periods at 10:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. EST, over JZJ (11.80) and JZI (9.535). JZJ is the best frequency during the early part of the broadcast, JZI during the latter part. The broadcast to Hawaii, from 1:30 to 3:00 a.m. EST, is broadcast over JZI (9.535) and usually well heard on the Pacific Coast. Broadcasts in Japanese to the Nipponese soldiers in China are made daily from 3:50 p.m. intermittently to 1:00 a.m. EST over JVZ2 (11.825) and JVW2 (11.725). This transmission is usually audible in the United States from about 3:50 to 6:00 p.m. EST.

English Transmissions from the U. S. S. R.

A. Khomianin, secretary of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, has written me that the following English broadcasts are now being made from the U. S. S. R. (EST): 7:50 a.m. on 14.41 and 10.04, 8:30 a.m. on 10.04, 3:00 p.m. on 8.05, 4:40 p.m. on 7.36 and 12:00 mid. on 10.04 megs.

In addition to the foregoing the usual English program is still being broadcast from 6:00 to 7:55 p.m. EST on 15.23 megs.

Robert Skyten of East Brookfield, Mass., informs me that Sverdlovsk in the Ural Mountains may be heard on 12.06 megs daily from 7:45 to 8:00 a.m. EST with an English period. "Sverdlovsk Calling" is the announcement. A Moscow station on 9.73 megs is also being heard in English from 9:40 to 10:00 a.m. EST. I would like to hear from readers who are successful in tuning in any of the above Soviet English broadcasts.

The Nazis Take the Italian General's Cake

FM Radio Ends First Year with Great Gains

Despite war with its consequent demand for radio materials and its effect on the listening habits of the nation, FM radio ended the year—its first on a commercial basis—with tremendous gains. The number of FM receivers in the United States has increased more than 1,400 percent in the past twelve months. A year ago there were approximately 15,000 FM receivers in the entire country. On December 1 the total had grown to more than 180,000, while pre-Christmas sales indicated that about now there should be from 230,000 to 250,000 sets in use. This represents a listening audience approaching 1,000,000 persons.

At the start of 1941 not a single commercial FM station was operating in the nation. By mid-December, sixty-two had been authorized, with twenty-four already in full daily operation. The first commercial FM transmitter went on the air in Nashville, Tenn., March 1, 1941.

Today more than twenty manufacturers offer the public more than one hundred different models ranging from table sets to elaborate phonograph combinations.

New Latins Go on Air

Several new South American broadcasters have made their air debut lately. In Colombia, HJCA (4.855), "Radio Cristal," Apartado 744, Bogota, a 1,000-watt station. In Venezuela there are two new ones: YV4RK (3.39), "Radio Maracay," Maracay, being heard evenings to 9:30 p.m. EST, and YV6RC (3.45), "La Voz de Anzoategui," which relays YV6RE, Barcelona, each evening. The most interesting and best heard of the lot is ZPA2 (11.721), "Radio-difusora de la Telico Paraguaya," Asuncion, which relays ZP10, "Radio Guarani," daily from 5:00 to 7:40 p.m. EST. This station is often heard with very loud signal strength. According to *Pan-American Radio*, the new publication edited by friend Herbert Rosen, formerly of Paris, plans for the creation of a Pan-American Broadcasters' Union, to be known as the PABU, are rapidly nearing completion. The PABU will be founded for the purpose of acting as an inter-American clearing house for the latest information concerning broadcasting.

General Notes

Montreal has two powerful short-wave stations. CBFW (6.09) broadcasts daily from 6:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. EST, relaying the French programs of CBF. CBFY (11.705) also operates daily from 6:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. EST, but relays the English programs of CBM. . . . Guatemala Radio TGWA has a new identification signal—consisting of seven chimes in ascending scale which is repeated for several minutes before broadcast time.

Therefore, when the stations you usually listen to are off the air, try tuning to the nearest 50,000-watt station outside of the precaution zone. MOZART'S "The Magic Flute" will be heard over the airwaves this Saturday as the Metropolitan Opera's presentation. It was first produced in Vienna on September 30, 1791. "The Magic Flute" was the last great work of Mozart.

As the curtain rises we find ourselves in Egypt. Sarastro, the high priest of Isis, has induced Pamina to leave her mother, Astrifiamenti, the Queen of Night, who represents the spirit of evil, and come to his temple, where she may be trained in the ways of virtue and wisdom. The dark queen is angry and tries to discover some way to get her daughter back to her and at the same time find some dire punishment for Sarastro. Tamino, an Egyptian prince who has lost his way and is attacked by a huge serpent, is rescued by three attendants of the queen. The queen tells the prince her daughter's story and at the cost of his deliverance he must rescue her. The prince consents and is given a magic flute. So with his companion Papageno, a rollicking bird-catcher, who is also presented with a magical chime of bells, they set out for Sarastro's temple. Papageno arrives there first and just in time to rescue Pamina from the persecutions of Monostatos, a slave, who flees when he sees Papageno in his feather costume, thinking he is one of the devil's helpers. They try to escape but are caught together with Tamino and are all brought before Sarastro. The prince consents to become a novice in the sacred rites and to go through the various stages of probation and purification. Pamina then goes back to her duties. They all remain faithful to their vows and the last ordeal, that of passing through a burning lake up to the altar of the temple, is triumphantly accomplished. Even though all this is being done the Queen of the Night does not abandon her scheme of revenge on her daughter. She makes an appearance to Pamina in her sleep and hands her a dagger, and swears that unless she kills Sarastro she will cast her off forever. Pamina pays no attention to her promise to her mother and goes about her regular sacred duties, trusting to Sarastro's promise that if she endures all the ordeals she will be happy forever. Finally, Monostatos, who has been angered against Sarastro by the queen, seeks to kill him but is vanquished by the might of the priest's presence alone. The night of the ordeals is over. At a sign from Sarastro, the full sunlight pours in upon them. The evil spirits all vanish and Tamino and Pamina are united amid the triumphant choruses of the priests and attendants as the reward of their fidelity.

Movie-Radio Guide Visits: "THE GREAT GILDERSLEEVE"

"THE GREAT GILDERSLEEVE" is one of radio's newest big programs—and one of radio's biggest new programs. Since the comedy sketch starring Harold Peary was launched Sunday, August 31, over NBC, it has rapidly plunged forward in the race for listeners' favor. Shrewdly conceived, brilliantly written, expertly performed, the show is a natural hit. It had a well-tested spring-board to launch it upward, for the Gildersleeve character is no new creation. Everybody has long been acquainted with him as Fibber McGee's blustering neighbor whose bark was worse than his bite—and his laugh worse than either! Hal Peary got the chance a few months ago to be a star instead of a stooge. Jim "Fibber" Jordan slapped him on the back and told him to "go to it." Helping Peary "go to it" are writer Leonard L. Levinson, musical director William Randolph, producer Cecil Underwood, announcer Jim Bannon and this supporting cast: Lurene Tuttle as Marjorie Forrester, Walter Tetley as Leroy Forrester, Earle Ross as Judge Hooker, Lillian Randolph as the maid Birdie, Hans Conreid as Oliver Honeywell and Arthur Q. Bryan in one of his lispng characterizations. Immediately after each program, Peary, Levinson and Underwood go into a huddle and hatch out a basic plot for the following week's show. Levinson then writes a complete script and the three again go over it on Thursday, make revisions, delete and add gags, and the first reading with the cast is held Saturday morning. The script is tossed around in another conference. Rehearsal begins Sunday morning at 9:30. Ten minutes before air time, Peary comes out and warms up the audience. Then the mike opens to that notorious laugh—and "The Great Gildersleeve" is on the air.

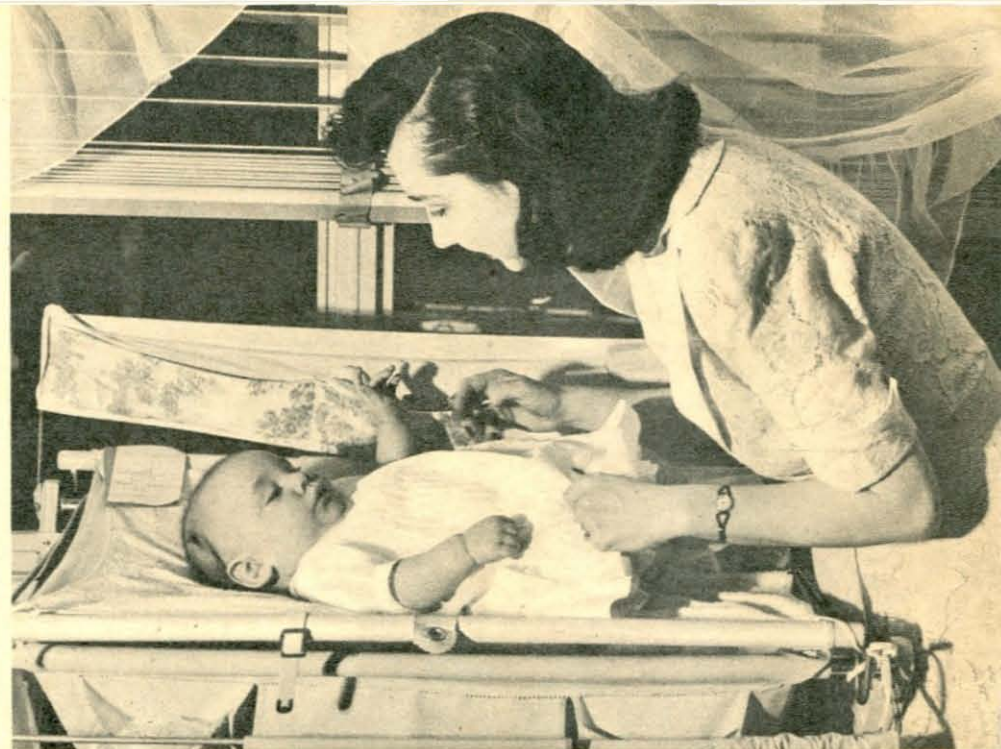

CAREER and MARRIAGE CAN MIX

Dorothy Kilgallen is a busy career girl—also a happy wife and mother

WHEN man and wife try to mix two careers and a marriage and fail, everybody hears and reads about it. But the many cases of successful combination of marriage and career seldom rate news notices. Hence the fallacy of the public idea that every career-and-marriage situation is doomed to failure.

As exhibit A in refutation of this public conception we offer you the case of Dorothy Kilgallen and Richard Kollmar, of radio, stage and fourth estate.

Here are two brilliant professional careers. But in a six-room apartment at 737 Park Avenue, New York, Dorothy Kilgallen and Richard Kollmar live happily together as a plain, average, home-loving couple. They find time from their busy professional pursuits to be together much and to be good parents to four-month-old Richard, Jr. Both are more proud of Dickie's two teeth than they are of their own accomplishments in radio, journalism and the theater.

So here's one couple who successfully mix two very busy careers and one very happy marriage.—D. M.

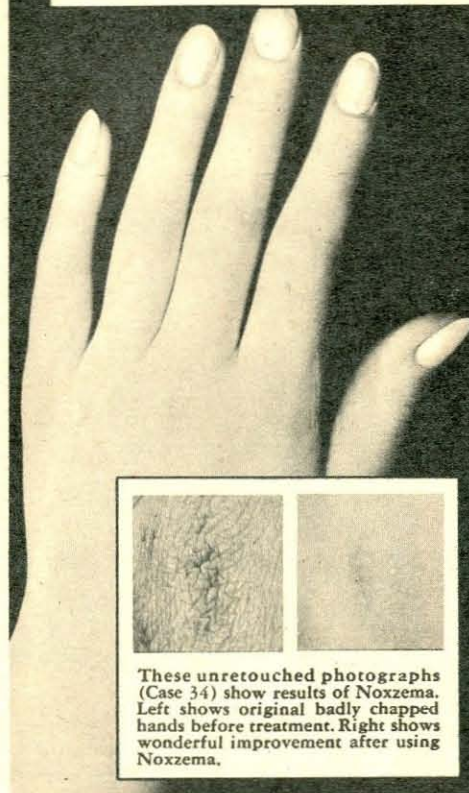

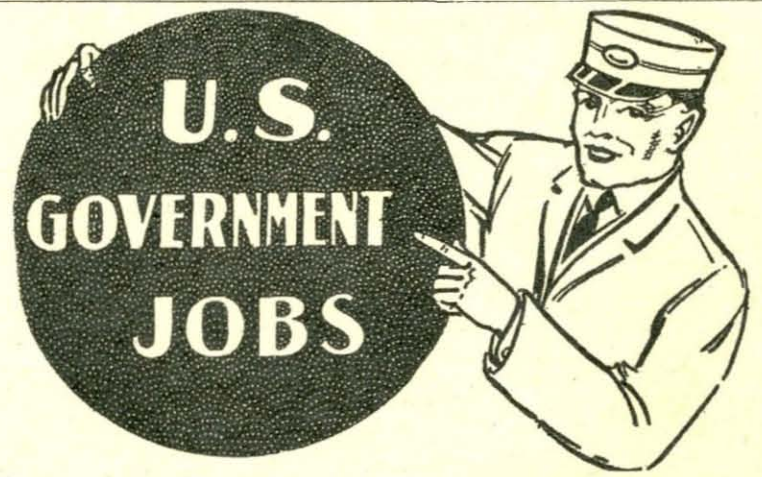

THERE'S an old saying about not putting new wine in old bottles, or is it the other way around? At any rate, the point is that the smart woman sees to it that all the nice, new things she got for Christmas aren't put to shame by messy bureau drawers and untidy closets.

Women's beauty activities center about three important areas—the bureau or dressing-table, the closet, and the bathroom. If lady in the press of defense work, home duties, etc., has neglected these places, now is the time to give them a complete overhauling; particularly since you have the inspiration of gleaming new gifts that will look shabby if they aren't given a clean, orderly setting.

First of all, that little matter of the closet. It's so easy to shut the door and forget that clothes carelessly hung, hats unboxed, shoes flung down make a lot of extra work later. The radio girls at CBS have the right idea about taking care of things. Gwen Davies of the "Let's Pretend" program takes all the clothes out of her closet every other week, repairs, hems, sews on loose fasteners, brushes them briskly on both the right and wrong sides, and presses them. Miss Delma Byron, pictured above, has found that the lucite hangers and the cellulose acetate hat-boxes manufactured by the Duranol people are a big help in keeping her clothes and her hats fresh and tidy. Like Miss Davies, she believes that vigorous brushing with a Fuller clothes-brush keeps her clothes neat and saves too-frequent cleanings. Apply the same care to your shoes—brush them or clean them, depending on what fabric they are, each time you put them away—and do put them away, either in a shoe-bag or in orderly rows on your shelf. Use hangers for everything but your sweaters. You might hang a sachet bag in your closet, too—a mild sachet that will lend a pleasant scent to your garments.

A nice idea for keeping items like

handkerchiefs, stockings, gloves, etc., in order are the adjustable, partitioned drawers available in department stores. Fitted with separate compartments, you'll find what you need without rummaging frantically through your drawers. Bette Davis, now portraying a modern southern belle in "In This Our Life," offers this suggestion for taking care of your gloves—she says it's an old southern custom: Keep them in an air-tight box which you spray lightly with your favorite perfume. Another good suggestion for your jewelry-box is to put a little bag of camphor in, which will prevent metal jewelry from tarnishing.

Your dressing-table top should receive special attention. Replace your old powder-puff, which you used to use over and over again, with the little pads that you can pick up in a dime store, or simply use pads of cotton—a fresh one for each time you powder. Keep your perfume in an atomizer for economy's sake and for most efficient usage. See that your brush and comb are washed each time you wash your hair—else what's the use of shampooing? Miss Byron makes a suds of Ivory flakes and runs her lucite comb and brush through the warm, soapy water—the comb and brush will sparkle like new in short order.

If you're one of the many who can't seem to learn to squeeze toothpaste from the bottom of the tube and therefore waste a lot of it, you'll be interested in the handy gadget, a du Pont product, which serves as a toothpaste dispenser. 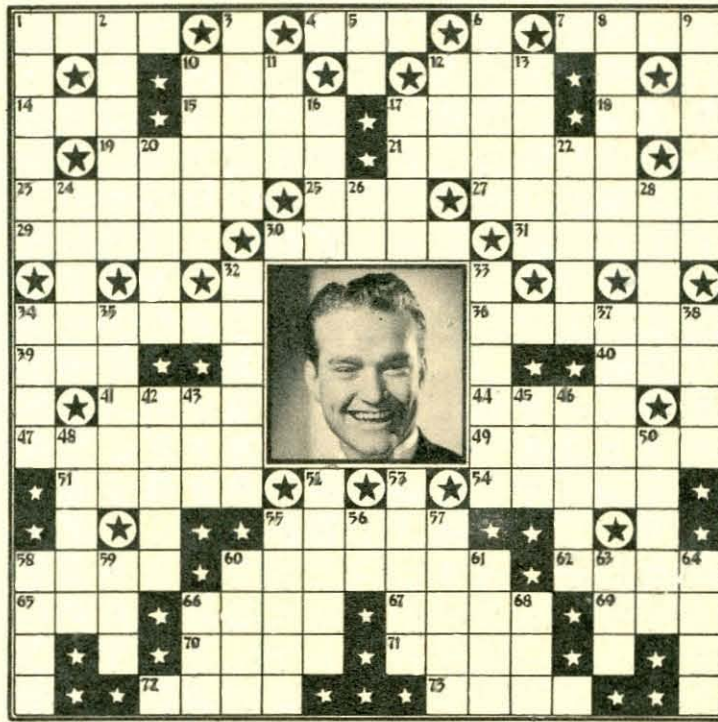
