

Air Strength Will Decide the War, Says Famous Plane Designer

MERICAN radio has done a magnificent job in covering this war. It has every reason for pride not alone in its news reporting but in its interpretation of that news. To complain of one sin of omission may therefore sound carping and ungrateful. I venture to do so, reluctantly, only because the sin seems to me so vitiating that it affects the quality of the entire war analysis by radio. Besides, I am encouraged to intrude with the complaint by the fact that the

the complaint by the fact that the broadcasting companies recently have begun to correct that omission and have thus, in effect, conceded the justice of my "kick."

I refer, of course, to the conspicuous absence of war analysis from the airpower angle, by airmen or others specifically trained to the idiom of the aerial weapon. It was altogether natural for radio, as the war crisis developed, to turn to seasoned military men, oped, to turn to seasoned military men, with splendid reputations in their own fields, for expert interpretation of war events. In practise that meant reliance on Army and Navy officers too old to be in active service, or retired for other reasons; in any case, on men trained in old-style warfare, steeped in the text-


"I'll tell you what, Bill," the District Attorney said at last, "I wish you'd keep on snooping around. Make your own investigation, and if you



Erich Leinsdorf Schedules Prokofieff's "Peter and the Wolf" for NBC Symphony Concert Sun.; Brief Analysis of Popular Music

ITH the Philharmonic-Symphony's inaugural broadcast over CBS this season Bruno Walter turns to two of his favorite composers for programmatic material—Schubert, who is represented by the "Unfinished" Symphony, and Mahler, by the First Symphony.

Mahler has been a special predilection of Mr. Walter and it is not too hard to understand why, for he knew him intimately. Moreover, he studied under him, besides admiring his music.

Gustav Mahler, a native of Bohemia, began work on this symphony about 1883. He was an assistant conductor at Cassel at the time, and his musical surroundings were congenial to composition.

Not till the composer had become conductor of the Royal Opera at Budapest, however, did the work obtain its first performance. And to that Hungarian city went the honor of hearing the first in a line of ten symphonies by Mahler. He conducted the premiere himself at a concert of the Budapest Philharmonic in 1889.

Oddly enough, that first program carried the description of the First Symphony as a "Symphonic Poem in Two Parts," and, still more odd, when it was introduced to a Weimar audience on June 3, 1894, it went by the inexplicable title of "Titan" and its two sections also had mottoes, "From the Days of Youth" for the first and "Commedia Umana" for the second.

Each of these two sections had subdivisions and that same program announced to the uninitiated with considerable eclat the significance of each.

The initial one of these earned the sobriquet "Spring and no end. The introduction represents the awakening of nature in the early morning." The second, "Mosaic" or "A Chapter of Flowers," was an andante which went by the wayside after that Weimar performance. The third offered, "Under Full Sail."

But the most elaborate description of all was given to the fourth. It read, "The hunter's funeral procession; a dead march in the manner of Callot (a seventeenth-century French engraver). The composer found the external source of inspiration in a burlesque picture of the hunter's funeral procession in an old book of fairy-tales known to all children in south Germany. The animals of the forest escort the dead forester's coffin to the grave. Hares carry flags; a band of gipsy musicians, accompanied by cats, frogs, crows, all making music, and deer, foxes and other four-footed and feathered creatures of the woods, leads

the procession in farcical postures.

"This movement, expressing moods now ironically merry, now gloomily meditative, is followed immediately by . . . the abrupt outburst of a wounded heart."

Amusing as this may seem, Mahler later flayed unmercifully all program books as being obstacles to the enjoyment of the music. Once, after a performance of his Second Symphony, he is purported to have said, "Down with program books! They propagate false ideas! The audience should be left to its own thoughts about the work that is being played; it should not be forced to read during the performance; it should not be prejudiced in any manner. If a composer by his music forces on his hearers the sensations which streamed through his mind, then he reaches his goal. The speech of tones has then approached the language of words, but it is far more capable of expression and illumination.'

Since Mahler envisioned this symphony in two parts, despite the fancy nomenclature utilized for four sections at the Weimar performance, he recommended that a pause of five min-utes be observed between the first and second sections, or-to be up-todate about it-between the second and third movements. The symphony is scored for four flutes (three interchangeable with piccolos), four oboes, English horn, three clarinets, bass clarinet, three bassoons, double bassoon, seven horns, four trumpets, three trombones, tuba, kettledrums, bass drum, cymbals, triangle, tamtam and har besides the usual strings. (Bruno Walter and the Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra play the Mahler First Symphony and the Schubert "Unfin-ished" over CBS on Sunday After oon, October 25.)

The Russians Again

Don't look now, but music by modern Russian composers is having an American field day. Probably every tot in the country knows the name of Shostakovich by now. And that of Serge Prokofieff is by no means an unfamiliar one. Hence it should be no startling news to the radio listener to learn that Prokofieff's "Peter and the Wolf" ("An Orchestral Fairy Tale for Children") is to be heard on the NBC Symphony program conducted by Erich Leinsdorf.

A child prodigy, Serge Prokofieff wrote numerous works in all the forms while still a youngster. His later attitude toward these works of childhood would not exactly be termed propagative. In short, he recalled them all.

The compositions of his maturity—an opera, "The Love of Three Oranges," several ballet suites, symphonies, concertos and the like—have been received with particular enthusiasm wherever performed.

He completed the score of "Peter and the Wolf" in 1936, and the first performance was given at a children's concert of the Moscow Philharmonic Orchestra on May 2, 1936. The fly-leaf of the published score

The fly-leaf of the published score contains the following commentary, placed there by the composer:

"Each character of this Tale is represented by a corresponding instrument in the orchestra; the bird by a flute, the duck by an oboe, the cat by a clarinet in a low register, the grandfather by a bassoon, the wolf by three horns, Peter by the string quartet, the shooting of the hunters by the kettledrums and the bass drum. So now that you have heard the different instruments, you will be able to recognize each one of the characters in the music."

Of course, Prokofieff's idea is the instruction of children in the mazes and mysteries of leitmotifs, the thematic subjects upon which he bases his musical work. Richard Wagner, as we well know, traveled far on such paths, assigning special themes to each character, condition, situation, idea, and so on, all through his operas. He interwove them with miraculous smoothness in stunning polyphony. But Prokofieff merely hints at the whole device in "Peter and the Wolf," since in this work he is directing his message to an audience of children.

But "Peter and the Wolf" is an enchanting piece, so much so that grown-ups, both as to years and musical lore, have been captivated by it. The tale on which the music is based is mighty simple—just a little saga of bravery shown by a little boy. (Prokofieff's "Peter and the Wolf." as well as two pieces by Bach, will be played by the NBC Symphony. Erich Leinsderf conducting, on Sunday, October 25.)

POPULAR MUSIC



Benny Goodman led the way in the swing field

SINCE it seems to be the time for definitions, the subject of whys and wherefores of different types of popular music might be taken up. There has been and probably still is a good deal of confusion concerning the classifications of songs, performances and

such, but the whole thing apparently is coming out of the haze and clarity, at last, is setting in.

For a long time the word "swing" was utilized to describe everything that went wild and woolly. That was a wrong assumption, it now appears. There are three general classifications under which most of the popular performances fit. They are swing, hot and sweet music. In none of these does tempo have anything to do with the subject.

Swing music now signifies music that is of a strictly rhythmic nature, usually the instrumental type of piece, but fully or partly arranged.

In other words, where you find order and logic and a definite plan in the music, BESIDES a rather speed-up tempo, there you will find swing.

Hot music is music that is improvised. It is made up on the spot, that is, either by a group of musicians or by a soloist. Here the ensemble starts off on some general thematic idea and then the individual musicians begin to invent figures and phrases which are taken up by the others and developed as the session goes along. When there is real inspiration to such music-making as this, the results often achieve really high artistic pinnacles not only of interesting melodic and harmonic invention but also form. It can be readily seen that even solo performers, a pianist, for example, can do the whole thing himself. The technique is the same, noodling, for a while around a main idea, then to take it up and make it grow under constantly growing inspiration.

Sweet music is music that is, as its name explains, sweet and uninvolved, usually featuring melody. Some of the big-name bands play a great deal of this music with orchestral arrangements that enhance the original melody. And it is not infrequent when an arrangement is much superior to the tune on which it is all based.

These, therefore, are the three general classifications. Blues music can fit into any of these categories, but boogie woogie most often is considered hot music. Of course, even boogie woogie can be planned in advance, which would then make it swing.

from overseas. He may take his singers along and pick up a band over there, or he may simply broadcast a "spot" bit himself, which would be worked into the rest of the show in the U. S. . . .

I've just been watching the hopefuls trying to storm the gates of network radio. It has been a rather depressing experience, despite the fact that the hopefuls were treated with courtesy and consideration.

The occasion was a general dramatic audition at the NBC studios here. was one of the frequent auditions at which anyone is welcome to come and present his talent before the mike.

The hopefuls were all women and children-typical in these war years when many men have grimmer jobs at hand. Most of them were nervous.

They were the people you and I know —the people who recite pieces at church socials, who give "readings" to women's clubs, who act in amateurtheater groups. All of them had some talent; all of them had undoubtedly received the unstinted applause of their friends and encouragement from their elocution teachers and dramatic coaches.

But-and this is the tragedy-most of them are amateurish. To Art Jacobson of NBC and Ted MacMurray of Blue, directors of the auditions, the gap between this undeveloped talent and professional competence is the difference between possible and impossible. One after another the ladies read poetry and excerpts from plays. "emoted" energetically, leaped from dialect to dialect, from tragedy to farce. Finally, as an attractive young lady was playing a grandmother bit, Ted turned to me and said, What I want to see is a nineteen-

TRUTH, VIA SHORT WAVE, PENETRATES LISTENING BAN IN ITALY

Czech Comics Delight Home Listeners; "Maggie and Jiggs" Skit Jap's Latest Propaganda Stunt; Schedule of Soviet English Broadcasts

Italians Reported Apathetic

TALY is apathetic because of disillusionment and betrayal, says Natalia Danesi Murray, head of the Italian section of NBC International.

Mrs. Danesi Murray says that the common people know that their alliance with Germany was a bitter mistake. They hate the Nazis the way the French, the Dutch, the Belgians and all other conquered peoples do, and for the same reasons—the Germans' greed, dishonesty and cruelty.

The dynamic Italian writer-announcer, a graduate of the Royal University of Rome, is one of the bitterest critics of Mussolini's fascist philosophy. For nearly five years she has been broadcasting to Italy, building an immense audience of faithful listeners.

"Talking to people in Italy on the short waves is like talking to a very sick man, and what I have to say to them must be like medicine," explains Mrs. Danesi Murray. "Through various channels we learn that our programs are heard throughout Italy. We are urged to keep up the job of telling the Italian people the truth about the war, since they are completely shut off from truthful news in their own country. Also we have learned that many Italian officers assemble in closed rooms to listen to American and British news programs."

Four basic rules guide Mrs. Danesi Murray in her broadcasts to the Italian people. This is the way she sums up her approach: (1) "I never identify the Italians with Fascism, I talk kindly to the Italians and I speak aggressively against Fascism. (2) I never belittle the fighting qualities of the Italian army. On the contrary, I praise every defeat as a demonstration of their unwillingness to fight for Germany and a German empire. Indeed, I treat the Italian defeats almost as acts of valuable sabotage. (3) I try to speak to the Italian hearts and emotions. Italians are an emotional people. They respond when one appeals to their sentiments. (4) I talk directly and personally to the Italian listeners, though they may number millions, exactly as if I were speaking to one person in the same room."

Asked how this mighty weapon was forged on the airwaves, Mrs. Danesi Murray said: "Well, we forged it long before America went to war. We forged it by broadcasting the truth and only the truth. We told the truth to our listeners before we went to war, and we tell the truth today. That is more than Axis broadcasters can say."

Out of the Loudspeaker

According to Frank J. Cuhel, speaking over the Melbourne short-wave station, the forces of the United Nations are on the march. The former Japanese rashness and bold military

strokes must now give way to a concentration of forces at important points. The Japs are not having their own way anywhere now. The out-come will henceforth be decided by that side that has the best gray stuff under their caps; that has the most ammunition around their midriffs . . A commentator on "Radio Newsreel," popular London short-wave feature, recently described the homing pigeons that almost every bomber carries as part of its standard equipment on long raiding-trips. These little birds are carried in bright-red and orange boxes. They require no especial attention and great height doesn't seem to bother them at all. When they are released they must be thrown head down from the plane and in the same way that it is moving in order that they won't be caught in the slipstream. Once away from the plane they thrash around a bit, and then with that unerring instinct which has defied scientific explanation they take off for home, hedge-hopping over streams or lakes but again taking to higher altitudes once the obstacle is crossed, never ceasing, never faltering until they flutter into the home roost . . . According to the Australian short-wave station, munitions workers throughout the Commonwealth will soon be able to get hot meals for twenty cents. The first canteen already

Comics Delight Czech Listeners

Not with dramatics or oratory but with dialogs and funny two-way conversations two little comedians—escaped from Czechoslovakia—are using a new air technique to deflate Hitler. Their nightly programs over WGEO, Schenectady, are so popular at home in Czechoslovakia, a country where

listening to foreign radio broadcasts means the firing-squad, that John R. Sheehan, program manager, was forced to issue a special warning to the Czechs not to whistle, hum or sing on the streets any songs heard over Radio Schenectady. "We have learned from reliable sources," Mr. Sheehan ex-plained, "that a number of Czechs have been shot because the Nazis heard them whistling the songs we broadcast, and therefore knew at once they had been tuning in our programs." Formerly owners of a theater in Prague, these two men coauthored many songs and plays. Now in this country, they have joined, through the potent medium of General Electric's international broadcasting station, the United Nations forces waging war against the Axis. The two comedians have been ridiculing the Germans for thirty weeks. They have even written new Nazi-stinging words to some of their old songs, which were sung throughout Czechoslovakia be-fore the invasion. For obvious reasons, their names cannot be revealed.

The Kuching, Sarawak (Borneo), short-wave station on 6.98 megs, now under Japanese control, is being heard irregularly by Thomas Van Auken of Alpine, Texas, from 12:15 to fadeout near 2:00 a.m. EWT . . . Tokyo's latest propaganda stunt is a take-off on American cartoon characters, Maggie and Jiggs. Their skit consists of a discussion of war and domestic happenings in this country. It can be heard irregularly at 1:30 a.m. EWT over JZK (15.16) and JZJ (11.80). It is needless to say this very unfunny act falls flat with American listeners . . GRI (9.415), London, has been added to the group of transmitters that broadcast the North American Service nightly. It is in operation from 9:30 p.m. to 12:45 a.m. EWT It is rumored that Germany will put several new 200,000-watt short-wave transmitters into operation soon . . . 

T LAST! The baby you've waited and planned for has finally arrived. He or she is so tiny, so helpless, and seems to look at you as if to say, "Please take good care of me." But of course you will!

And if you are a brand-new mother with a brand-new baby, you are prob-ably worried about all the things you should do. In fact, you may be a bit skeptical even though you have been a mother before. However, all you mothers will agree that she must have the best possible start in life. So let her be a bathing-beauty!

There's nothing in the world more lovely than a clean, sweet baby. What's more, a clean baby is not only more comfortable but is more likely to be a healthy child. War in the Air

book "laws" and deep-rooted traditions of strategy and military thinking.

Not for a moment do I question the

erudition, the intelligence or the patriotism of the superannuated admirals or old-style Army men who have la-bored mightily to make this complex global war more comprehensible to the American people. I do question their capacity to grasp the nature of the aerial weapon and to read aright the implications of the extension to warmaking to the third dimension. Indeed, it is unreasonable to expect a general or an admiral, or anyone else who still thinks in terms of surface warfare of the 1918 model, to interpret war in the "air oceans"; as unreasonable as it would be to expect an expert horse-breeder to analyze automotive methods.

It is no accident that non-military reporters, like William Hillman and Wythe Williams, let us say, have consistently shown more understanding of air-power facts than military experts of the old school. Laymen, at any rate, have nothing to unlearn; they do not start with a set of traditional preconceptions; they do not attempt to fit three-dimensional facts into a twodimensional frame of ideas. No matter how hard they try to modernize their thinking, the normal Army-trained and Navy-trained experts continue to regard the battleship and the soldier with a bayonet as the decisive elements in war; they continue to look upon the airplane as an auxiliary of the older services, as a variation and strengthening of old strategy rather than the instrument of a totally new strategy.

It should be said for radio, of course, that it merely has reflected accurately the general underestimation of air power. The self-same failure to comprehend the air-power factor in modern war-making has been characteristic of military analysis in the press and in a great many books by old-line experts; it has been characteristic, alas, also of our military leadership. The fact that airmen and others equipped by their education and training to view the war from the vantage-point of aviation are at last being invited to use the facilities of radio may be taken as proof that American thinking on the war is going through a much-needed revolution.

No doubt certain elements in the science of war and the arts of strategy remain eternal and unchanging, whether in the days of Attila or Napoleon or Hitler. But what concerns us more immediately are the new elements, of which Attila and Napoleon could not have been aware.

Until our day and age, new weapons changed the tempo and the effectiveness of war. The efficiency with which the enemy's strength could be destroyed, his fortifications leveled, his men disarmed, might be raised; the speed with which distances could be negotiated might be increased; the thoroughness with which siege and blockade could be enforced might be improved upon. But these operations remained on the surface of the planet, where walls-walls of men, fortifica-tions or naval units-could block an enemy or hem in an enemy. Under those circumstances every new weapon meant only an improvement or variation on old methods of war-making, on the age-old procedure of mileby-mile, island-by-island, ocean-byocean conquest.

Air-power cannot be fitted into this pattern. Its advent has not merely altered old methods-it has canceled them out! Walls become useless, at best accessory in character, no matter how big and strong they might be, once nations acquired wings to leap over such impediments. And by walls I mean any surface barrier, such as massed armies or navies.

Aviation caused not only variations in the science of war-making but a complete revolution. It opened up to conflict a whole world until then inaccessible to mankind—the three-dimensional world of air that envelops our planet. The air ocean, let it be remembered, is continuous; only those who haven't succeeded in breaking through the traditional military idiom still think of air-over-land and air-over-water, rather than of one unbroken element. And the air ocean is deep, deeper than any of the seas.

In the past it was enough to capture a surface area, on land or sea, and to erect around it a shielding wall of men and metal. Of what use is such a wall today, when air-power can strike at the heart and vitals of an enemy directly, in total disregard of strength massed on the surface? The only force that can meet such attack through the air is air-power. It avails a country approximately nothing to possess the mightiest armies and navies; these constitute only so many convenient targets for attack from above, unless they are protected by superior airpower.

Let me put the matter in the most elementary—and admittedly oversim-plified—form. Assume that one nation has huge armies and immense naval forces, but is entirely devoid of airpower. Assume that its enemy, on the contrary, has vast air-power but is totally devoid of armies and navies. Which would come out victor in such a struggle?

The air-power nation could not be successfully invaded by land or sea, since every approaching army or naval fleet would be systematically annihilated from above. The armies and navies would therefore be immobilized, useless until they could provide themselves with a cover of aviation. In the meantime, however, that country would be wide open for deadly offensives through the sky-offensives which would wipe out at leisure all the military and civilian targets below. Consider the relative positions of these two nations in the matter of blockade. Not all the armies and battleships could stop air traffic; but air-power could sink ships and cut land communications and impose blockade on the

Obviously conditions are not so simple. The nations in this war have all the weapons, on the surface and in the skies. But military events are so much gibberish unless we recognize the primacy of air-power-the fact that a decision in the air is the first and decisive factor in any modern battle.


In the Battle of Britain, the land and

sea forces of both nations could not even come into contact; they stood aside, helpless onlookers, while the question of who controls the air over the British Isles was being answered. Because it was answered in Britain's favor, a surface struggle became unnecessary and impossible.

In the Battle of Crete, Germany had a virtual monopoly of air-power, Britain a virtual monopoly of sea-power. The outcome in favor of the air-power

nation was inevitable.

Germany is a country with so little (Continued on Page Facing 36)





Tomato preparation: Wash mediumsize, firm ripe tomatoes; peel and scoop out the centers. Then cut one side of the tomato just the same as a pumpkin face or Jack-o'-lantern.

To define the features: For mouth, strip of the white of a hard-cooked egg, cut lengthwise; for nose, triangular pieces of hard-cooked egg white: for eyes, mash the hard-cooked yolk and fill in eyes; for eyebrows, pieces of hard-cooked egg white.

Serve with French dressing.

Hallowe'en Cake

- 1¾ cups flour
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
- teaspoon soda
- teaspoon cinnamon teaspoon nutmeg
- teaspoon cloves
- 1 cup nutmeats
- cup raisins tablespoons shortening
- cup sugar
- egg
- 1 can condensed tomato soup

Celery Curls

Sift flour, then measure, add baking powder, soda and spices and sift again. Wash and cut the raisins. Chop the nuts. Then mix and add two tablespoons of the flour mixture with the nuts and raisins. Cream the shortening, add sugar gradually and cream well. Add beaten egg and mix thoroughly. Then add the flour mixture alternately with the tomato soup. Stir until smooth. Then fold in the raisins and nuts, which have been combined with some of the flour. Bake in a nineby-nine-inch cake-pan in a moderate oven (350-375 degrees F.) for forty minutes.

Cream Cheese Icing

- 1 package (3 oz.) cream cheese
- 11/2 cups confectioner's sugar
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream the cheese until soft, then add the sugar gradually and stir until smooth. Add vanilla and spread on cake.

To smooth icing: Dip silver knife in hot water and smooth out icing before putting on design.

To make cat design: Outline design on cake with toothpicks.

Chocolate Butter Cream Icing

(for black cat design)

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 square chocolate, melted
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 11/2 tablespoons milk

Cream the butter well and mix in one-half cup sugar. Then add the melted chocolate, vanilla and remaining one-half cup of sugar, and one tablespoon of milk. Mix well and add rest of the milk if necessary for a good consistency that will spread. Spread the icing to form the design or put it into a pastry tube and put design on cake that way. Pull out toothpicks before serving cake.





is dry, she is ready for his first tub bath! Place your tub on a low stool or chair. Fill it half full of water (ninetyfive to one hundred degrees Fahrenheit)-warm enough but not too hot for your elbow. Start baby's bath while she is lying on a table. Cleanse her nose and ears and wash her face with pure water-no soap. Carefully sponge her head and scalp, then pat her dry with a soft towel. Soap her little wiggling body with a sudsy cloth and she is ready for the tub. When you lift baby from the table, be sure you do not frighten her. Carefully support her head and back and place her in the tub feet first. Support her head with one hand and rinse her with the other. The job finished, she is ready for oil and fluffs of Johnson's Baby Powder.

Of course, you must give baby's diapers meticulous care, so they are always soft, smooth and fresh. Soiled diapers should be placed in a pail of water into which you have added two tablespoons of borax. This makes the water soft and all traces of soil are easily cleansed from the fabric. So with your baby clean as a whistle and as radiant as the morning sun, lay her on the bed, watch her kick, listen to her coo. And if you notice carefully, a tiny smile will cross her face as if to say, "I like this—it's fun!"

War in the Air

sea-power, as compared with the United Nations, that it may justly be regarded as wholly lacking this element. Britain and its allies have a monopoly of surface strength at sea all around Europe. Yet the fact remains that sea forces cannot approach the Continent, Because it is girded with land-based Axis aviation. If ever we do invade that continent it will be because we have neutralized or knocked out the defending Axis air-power.

What has the struggle in the Pacific been, when viewed from the revealing perspective of aviation, but a race for

air bases? Japan has carried her airpower from island to island, the range of its aviation determining the extent of every surge forward. On the several occasions when Japan ventured beyond the range of its land-based aviationin the battles of Coral Sca and Midway Island, for instance-and into the orbit of our land-based air-power, it has been defeated. The struggle in the southwest Pacific takes its name mostly from land groups, such as the Solomon and the Midway Islands, but always it is a struggle for air bases, in which the outcome is decided by conflict in the skies. Indeed, none of these battles can be understood except in relation to mastery of the skies, and anchor points on the surface for that canopy

of aerial domination.

The whole war, in sober fact, can no longer be judged by this or that battle, or measured in square miles of land or sea. It is in the first place a struggle for ascendancy in the skies, and that on a global rather than on a local scale. Air-power has upset every old rule of war-making. It is in the process of evolving strategies and techniques of its own, to which all surface strategies become secondary and subordinate. There are no books from which this can be learned—the unfolding war itself is the book, and only those familiar with the language of aviation can hope to read it with some approximation of accuracy and to interpret its meaning for the future. There is no skirmish or battle which does not require judgment and interpretation from the angle of aviation.

These are a few of the manifold reasons why the war events must be analyzed by airmen, must be seen in relation to the three-dimensional realities. The war in the air is not just a phase of the larger war. This is primarily an air war. Victory and defeat will be determined, in the final analysis, by the respective aerial potentials of the contending nations.
