Monday, November 4—Republican Rally from 10:15 to 11:00 p.m. EST, on CBS.

Monday, November 4—Republican Rally from 12:00 midnight to 1:00 a.m. EST, on NBC, CBS and Mutual.

Election returns are of special importance to every listener and every voter this year. The networks have taken great pains to speed the news to an audience which will surely reach 70,000,000 persons. Your commentators, analysts and news reporters will include the ablest men on the networks. Among them: CBS—Bob Trout will be in New York, Elmer Davis will be in New York, Albert Warner will talk from Washington, and Elmo Roper, director of the "Fortune" magazine survey, will examine results from the viewpoint of his and other polls of opinion-research groups.

# She's OKIE — DOKIE

Here's the heart-warming story of Betty Brewer, a great-hearted child, a real-life Okie who's making good!

**B**ETTY BREWER, the thirteen-year-old, honest-to-goodness Okie from Joplin, Mo., is one of those things that just happens. She is snub-nosed, cavern-eyed, plain as bread and butter, and the public is going to make her the next big-name child star. There isn't a person that knows her who isn't rooting for that to happen. If ever a kid deserved a break, she does.

Betty was singing for pennies in front of the Vine Street Brown Derby with her sister Ilene, age eleven, and

her brother Monte, age seven, when Opportunity in the shape of Sam Wood, the director, touched her on the shoulder. Without hesitating, or stopping to inquire why Opportunity had been so long in coming, she took a test for the role of the little frontier waif in "Rangers of Fortune." Surprisingly enough, she got the part. That amazed Betty, who had never had anything nice happen to her before. Her performance confounded Paramount officials, who suddenly found themselves

with a budding child star on their hands. Working sincerely and honestly, without publicity build-up, experience or training, she stole the picture.

She doesn't know how she did it. Paramount doesn't know why she did it. Betty's bewildered, simply says "she did the best she knew how." And that's probably the answer.

Betty Brewer is plain, honest, sincere, unspoiled and unpolished. There isn't a thing in her family background to give her an iota of acting ability. She has been shoved around, kicked, mauled and beaten by circumstances. She is a child of poverty-stricken parents born in the Dust Bowl, a section of the country even Mother Nature has forgotten.

Now she is in Hollywood. She has a picture contract. She has finished a second film, "The Roundup," with Preston Foster, Richard Dix and Patricia Morison. She's getting an education. She has a great future. But all of those things aren't as important to Betty as the fact that her family has a house to live in. That they're all getting three square meals a day.

Betty Brewer was born in Joplin,

Mo., January 17, 1927. She is the second of four children, having an older sister, Violet (now married), and a younger sister and brother, Ilene and Monte. Mr. Brewer is a carpenter by trade, who worked in the lead mines near Joplin until his health failed. The family's migration from Missouri to Sacramento, Calif., in 1938 is the story of "Grapes of Wrath."

But this family's arrival in Sacramento was the end of their "Grapes of Wrath" hegira and the beginning of the story of Betty Brewer. With her father still ill, unable to get work, Betty, Ilene and Monte (called Sunny) organized a trio. They organized it because Betty figured out people were paid for entertaining others, and decided that if money could be made by singing, she, Ilene and Monte could make some too.

How the youngsters sang at banquets and entertainments for five dollars per performance and sometimes less and the entire family lived on what they made, how they came to Hollywood when bookings in Sacramento ran out, got a job on a radio station for a few dollars a week, sang anywhere and

everywhere for whatever they could earn—all these things have been faithfully reported by the press since Betty became a movie personality. Other things have not been told.

There's the time, just before they left Sacramento for Hollywood, that Betty, her mother, Ilene and Sunny applied for relief. All they asked for was enough food for a week. They promised to pay for it as soon as they were able. The official to whom they were referred was pretty unkind. When she learned they were from Missouri, she called them "low-down trash" and refused to give them a thing. That hurt Betty more than anything that has ever happened to her, especially since the remarks were leveled at her mother, whom she adores. There's one experience she isn't going to forget in a hurry.

Then there was the time they sang at their first banquet. Betty, Ilene and Sunny had organized their trio with, as Betty describes it, "Ilene doing the lead, Sunny the hot licks, and me the harmony," and had obtained working singing at a banquet being held in honor of Governor Merriam. In addition to five dollars in cash, they were to receive their dinner. And were they hungry! They dreamed of that dinner!

All went well, as far as the singing was concerned, but the Governor didn't speak as long as he had been expected to. Waiters started to rush the meal, serving one course after the other with such rapidity that the kids didn't have a chance to eat one before the plate was whisked away and the next course served. This was not only a waste of good food, as they looked at it, but they weren't getting enough to eat. They slipped away from the table, found the kitchen and ate there with the waiters. They got second helpings, too!

Betty has seen and done a great deal since she completed "Rangers of Fortune," but she hasn't changed a bit, according to those who know her best. In company with Rachael Smith, representative of the Board of Education in charge of minors at Paramount, she made a plane trip to New York, Boston, Chicago and Kansas City in connection with that picture.

Naturally, Betty was impressed with what she saw—and there wasn't much that missed those deep, brown eyes of

hers, you can bet on that—but what she enjoyed most about the trip, of all things, was an afternoon she spent at the Delano School for Crippled Children in Kansas City. The best thing about it, she explains, is that it wasn't a "charity" school, or a "pity" school—that it was a regular public school. She believes if every kid who says "I hate school" could see that one, and if they saw what pride those crippled youngsters took in being able to do even the most ordinary things, they'd never object to going to school again. They'd be thankful they were able to go.

**B**ETTY was invited to meet President Roosevelt during this same trip, and it will always be the regret of her life that she wasn't able to take advantage of the invitation. You see, President Roosevelt is a sort of a special idol to Betty. She believes he is responsible for giving poor children a chance to amount to something. Having been so poor herself, that calls for a very extraordinary kind of respect on her part.

It happened while she was flying to New York from Hollywood. Miss Smith had cautioned her not to say anything about being in pictures, feeling it would draw undue attention to both of them ("Rangers of Fortune" hadn't been released yet, so she'd never been seen on the screen). Betty, however, got to talking about her favorite person, the President, to a very nice man on the plane. The man turned out to be Mr. Oswald Ryan, vice chairman of the Civil Aeronautics Authority. He extended the invitation and, to her dying day, Betty will always bewail the fact she and Miss Smith were not able to stop over in Washington and

take advantage of his kindness.

The first thing a person notices upon meeting Betty Brewer is that she is smaller than she appears on the screen. The second is her plainness. The third is her deeply set brown eyes, by far her most expressive feature. Those eyes are hard, yet soft; they're pain-touched and brave, compassionate and understanding. They're the passage-way her soul peeks through.

Betty is essentially a young-old person. Fighting for survival and shouldering responsibilities has given her the ability to size up persons and situations quickly. Impulsive by nature, she's wary and cautious about every-

thing she does. Living has been a tough enough business with her to cause her to peer behind the surface of things to see that they're as they're represented. She isn't easy to fool, and while she isn't constantly on the defensive with people, she keeps her guard up.

Once she has decided a person is a "right guy," however, Betty goes all the way. Her thirst for friendship is as violent as a drunkard's for liquor, and she can become literally intoxicated with happiness if she thinks a person she admires likes her. She covers this craving for friendship with a kidding attitude. Everyone she works

with or meets gets a nickname.

During the making of "Rangers of Fortune," she called Sam Wood "Li'l Abner." Patricia Morison was "Butch." Y. Frank Freeman, Jr., son of the head of Paramount, is "Pistol Pete." She's called "Ski Jump" around the studio herself, but Wood has a special name for her. He calls her his "Oomph girl." She likes that.

She lives with her family in a small house close to the studio, and pays the rent from her earnings of one hundred dollars a week. Her gang consists of her sister Ilene, her brother Sunny, and "Pootsie" and "Dink."

"Pootsie" is a beautiful blonde, a little older than Betty; "Dink" is a genius. "Pootsie's" only failing is that she thinks about boys and all that mushy stuff, but "Dink" is just about perfect. He knows whole acts of Shakespeare and can go to a movie

# MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE *Award* FOR DISTINGUISHED ACTING

CAROLE LOMBARD, Thomas Mitchell and Charles Laughton have been selected by Jimmie Fidler to receive this month's MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED ACTING, Miss Lombard and Mr. Laughton for their sterling performances in "They Knew What They Wanted," and Thomas Mitchell for his work in "Angels Over Broadway."

Jimmie Fidler, in making the awards, explained:

"It would take a Solomon to judge between the respective claims of Charles Laughton and Thomas Mitchell to this month's acting award for men. Being no Solomon, I'm doing the next best thing—giving an equal rating to each candidate.

"In 'Angels Over Broadway' Thomas Mitchell achieves one of the greatest characterizations in screen history. Laughton equals it with his portrayal of the illiterate Italian grape-grower in 'They Knew What They Wanted.' Both assignments were exacting—far beyond the abilities of average skill. Both portrayals pack a maximum load of emotional TNT.

"Without wishing to detract in the least from Laughton, who never fails to make the most of his roles, I want to take time out for tribute to Thomas Mitchell's consistency by noting the fact that his other performance of this month, in 'The Long Voyage Home,' is also worthy of top rating. His name on a film's cast is becoming a guarantee of excellence."

Mitchell wavered between journal-

ism and the stage for a long period in his early years, working as a newspaperman in Newark, N. J., at one time, and later appearing with a Shakespearian troupe in New York. Later, he compromised between the two by writing plays ("Little Accident," "Cloudy With Showers" and others) and appearing as an actor as well. His work in Hollywood has been largely in featured character roles up to now.

Laughton's theatrical experience was gained in England where, as a hotel clerk, he found plenty of time to study people and dream of a theatrical career. The war put an end to his dreaming for a while, but when he was mustered out of the army he enrolled in the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art. It was not until 1928, however, that he got his first stage role in "The Government Inspector." During this interval he had made his living by working at various jobs.

Although slow in getting started, Laughton made up for lost time, was soon in the front ranks of London stage players. While playing in "Mr. Prohack" on the London stage he met a young actress, Elsa Lanchester, also in the cast, and before the play's run

was over they were married. His first American appearance was in "Payment Deferred," on Broadway. As a result of this performance he was given a Hollywood contract.

Aside from being a consistently fine performer, Laughton is something of a star-maker, Vivien Leigh and Maureen O'Hara being among his finds.

The award for the best feminine performance of the month is made to Carole Lombard.

"A good many critics," Fidler went on, "snickered when Carole, the zaniest comedienne in Hollywood, was given the somber role of the tragic mail-order bride in 'They Knew What They Wanted.' But those same scoffers came out of the theater with wet eyes. Particularly notable is this fact: Carole put over her most tragic scenes without once resorting to 'hamming.' She made her audience respond because she felt the emotions of the girl she played. And that is the secret of all good acting.

"Carole's triumph in a new field leaves only one thing to be desired—and that is assurance that she won't desert the many fans who like her clowning, too."

Carole Lombard grew up

with Hollywood. This despite the fact she was born Jane Alice Peters in Fort Wayne, Indiana, thirty-two years ago. When she was seven years old, her family went to Hollywood on a visit, liked the film capital, decided to stay. Carole started her career in comedy—the slapstick comedy of Mack Sennett—and comedy has remained her first love ever since. She has appeared in many laugh-films.

Her specialty has been zany, non-sensical stuff of the "Nothing Sacred" type, which makes her conversion into the serious Lombard of "They Knew What They Wanted" a striking achievement. Nearest approach to a role so serious yet attempted by Carole was her part as the nurse in "Vigil in the Night," a role which brought her her first MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED ACTING.

Not only on the screen has Carole essayed the zany comedienne role, but in private life as well she has earned a reputation as a practical joker of notable stature. What goes on between her and hubby Clark Gable would be grounds for divorce in any other family. The Gables take it all in stride.

On the more serious side, Carole is a top-notch businesswoman and, although she has one of the best agents in the business, she generally makes her own deals. Studio executives have every respect for her judgment, often consult her on writers and directors to be used on her films.

## "They Knew What They Wanted"

Cast: Carole Lombard, Charles Laughton, William Gargan, Harry Carey, Frank Fay, et al. An RKO picture, produced by Erich Pommer; directed by Garson Kanin, who also directed "My Favorite Wife."

HERE'S a down-to-earth problem drama which will leave a lump in your throat. But it is not for children who have not learned the facts of life.

Strictly speaking, "They Knew What They Wanted" is the story of a plain, hard-working waitress, Amy (Carole Lombard), and a grape-ranch owner and clod, Tony (Charles Laughton), who both knew what they wanted but were somewhat thwarted, for the moment, because inhuman and overpowering emotions blocked them.

Lombard, as the waitress who knew a good man when she saw him, even if he couldn't write or win a beauty prize, and Laughton, as that man, who proved to be the straightest thinker of the lot, stage performances that may win them top-acting awards. William Gargan as Joe, Tony's foreman and Judas, and Frank Fay in his part as Father McKee, conciliator of tangled lives, are right up with the leads, too, in their characterizations, and in several scenes Fay is so good that it is only fair to acknowledge that here is a new Frank Fay on the way up again to the top.

The play, of course, is Robert Ardrey's adaptation of the late Sidney Howard's Pulitzer-prize drama, with Erich Pommer producing and Garson Kanin directing. To young Kanin must go large credit for the success of the film. He first read the script to the entire cast from stars to prop-men. He acted all parts. Then he asked for suggestions—and got plenty. The meeting lasted until 3 a.m. Next day he asked RKO-Radio Pictures for two weeks of rehearsal with the company before a camera would turn. This revolutionary request was granted on his promise that resultant performances would be smoother, actual shooting of the film faster. So well did his plan work that it may be adopted for all future important pictures.

"They Knew What They Wanted" is strong, earthy stuff and fine acting. (For their performances in this film, Carole Lombard and Charles Laughton receive this month's MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE acting awards. See page 5.)

## Lombard and Laughton file claims on Academy Award in great film

### "Hit Parade of 1941"

WHEN "Hit Parade of 1941" was made the producers took a lot of talented people and put them all together doing what they could do best, and the result is a lively, entertaining piece of musical comedy built around a flimsy story, with gag situations and well-delivered songs to put it over.

When Kenny Baker and Frances Langford get together, something good is certain to come of it, and their singing in "Hit Parade of 1941" is tops. Baker appears

to better advantage in this picture than he has before on the screen, probably because he is cast as an ordinary guy, a part which he enacts with ease. Hugh Herbert is highly amusing in his zany fashion and Patsy Kelly provides many laughs. Ann Miller comes through with some very fancy tap-dancing which is swell. She's funny as a dumb man-chaser. Borrah Minevitch and his Harmonica Rascals provide some very amusing sequences with their pantomime, as well as their music. Songs by Frances Langford and Kenny Baker include "Who Am I?" and "Swing Low, Sweet Rhythm," with "Who Am I?" a shade the best.

CAREER girls who must block their bosses' forward passes, and all married folks, by and large, will get a big load of chuckles out of Metro's new Myrna Loy - Melvyn Douglas romantic comedy, "Third Finger, Left Hand."

In this variation of the story of the couple who are married but not really married, Lionel Houser, the author, has skillfully provided several new twists and much smart and hilarious dialog. Miss Loy, magazine editor, prevents her boss' wife from gunning for her by inventing a mythical husband who supposedly is a globe-trotting newspaperman. Miss Loy and Melvyn Douglas meet in a funny situation, and Douglas quickly falls for her, only to be jilted by the lady when he discovers her to be "married." Undaunted, Douglas checks up on her "husband," learns she really has none, and next turns up at her parents' home and introduces himself as her long-lost hubby. From there on in, the story is a riot.

All characters are reasonably human and believable, and the result is that "Third Finger, Left Hand" has that spontaneous humorous quality so much to be desired.

### "Moon Over Burma"

Cast: Dorothy Lamour, Robert Preston, Preston Foster, Doris Nolan, Albert Basserman, Frederic Worlock, Addison Richards, et al. A Paramount picture, produced by A. M. Botsford; directed by Louis King, who also directed "Typhoon."

CUT off Dorothy Lamour's hair, hide her sarongs, locate her as a stranded Brooklyn showgirl in the teak-lumbering country of Burma, with Robert Preston and Preston Foster both seeking her favors—and you have "Moon Over Burma."

Bob Preston (who in the pre-Greg Bautzer days was "Lamour-Toujour-Lamour") and Dorothy gave some rapid-fire repartee that delighted the Hollywood-wise preview audience. As the love-em-all Romeo of Burma who is held down by his stronger pal, Foster, this would have been Preston's picture if the acting competition hadn't been so strong. The cutting of the Lamour locks not only changed her personality to a softer, less exotic and more beautiful girl but seemed to lend more sureness to her acting. Albert Basserman, as a blind co-owner of the teak plantation, enacts one unforgettable scene when he al-

lows a cigarette to burn itself completely out in his hand to keep from dropping the hot ashes on a ready-to-strike cobra. Doris Nolan, as the menace turned good angel, enacts her role favorably.

Two songs, "Moon Over Burma" and "Mexican Magic," both sung by Miss Lamour, together with the musical score by Victor Young, lighten the film and have a good chance to achieve popularity.

Filled with cobras, lizards, forest-fires and log jams, excitement

reaches a peak when the jam is exploded and Robert Preston and Preston Foster have to rescue each other. Most difficult scene to photograph was one in which an elephant lies down to permit Preston and Miss Lamour to dismount from the howdah. The elephant had to lie down on cue at a certain spot. After fifteen rehearsals and a dozen takes, Miss Lamour was exceedingly uncomfortable and the pachyderm was sick of the whole thing. An exciting Lamour-full picture, this will keep any audience awake, if only to mutter at finish, "I knew how it would end all the time." In case you don't know, see it to find out which Preston gets the girl.

Enclosed find expense account for one trip to Hollywood. Please send check c/o Ye Home for the Weary, Santa Monica, California. If the cost of the investigation so far gives you the jitters, think of me. After all, with MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE it's only money, and it's MY sanity.

Sitting back there in your swivel chair in Chicago, you're maybe going to think I've been wasting my time and the client's money in trailing these movie stars like I was ordered. I'll admit I've been slow but I got a detailed report on a glamour girl (Miss Alice Faye) which I will complete tomorrow, and even if I am laid up in a home for nervous cases, when you see it you'll have to admit a McGinnis never misses. The dope I got on that dame!

The reason I am writing you in detail like this before sending the report is that you could never understand it unless you understand this place called Hollywood.

Then, when I tell you right off there isn't any town by that name (it's a suburb of Los Angeles), you begin to get an idea.

As near as I can describe Hollywood, it's a state of mind bounded by Las Vegas, Nevada; Tia Juana, Mexico; the Pacific Ocean, and entirely surrounded by signs reading "Los Angeles City Limits."

The place is full of "natives"—screwballs from every state in the Union who have been here from two weeks to two months—and a bunch of hard-working people known as stars, directors, producers and technicians, who take their jobs of creating enter-

tainment for the public seriously.

You start getting the feel of Hollywood when you hit Las Vegas, Nevada, where most of the stars elope to. You can get a license, two witnesses, a corsage for the bride and a ceremony in five minutes for five bucks, but it usually costs more because most of the stars fly over and back in a plane. Quite a good many of them are sorry they were in such a hurry afterwards, but they can get good, legal divorces in Los Angeles without missing more than a few hours' work, so it ain't so bad as it might be.

There's no regular procedure the stars follow in getting married, but the Apache Hotel can be considered the headquarters for newly married movie stars, if there is such a thing. (I got the above information from a roulette-dealer, and the "Las Vegas—\$122" item on the expense account is because double zero never did come up on the darn wheel all the time I was talking to him.)

After you leave Las Vegas, you cross a desert and some mountains, all of which are pretty monotonous, except for signs reading "Los Angeles City Limits" which pop up miles from nowhere and are always good for a laugh the first time you see them.

I got that tip from a guy on the corner of Hollywood and Vine whose face looked familiar. In fact, every-

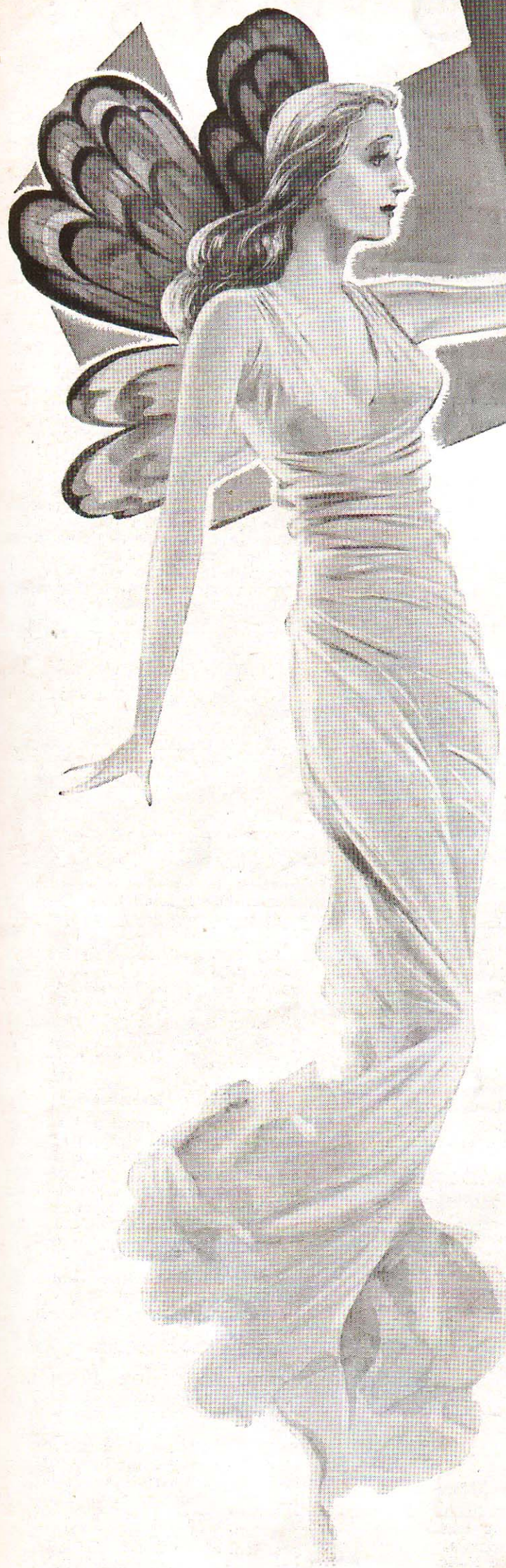

# RADIO CAN DREAMS

**M**OST of us, at one time or another, have wished on "star light, star bright." In childhood most of us waited for the day when we would meet Aladdin with his magic lamp.

Today our waiting is over. Broadcasting tells us to wish, and our dreams will come true.

It is a new program called "Your Dream Has Come True" broadcast over NBC each Sunday afternoon at 5:30 EST. It offers a Cyclopean ear into which all of us, whether Dead End Kids or Buster Browns, may pour our desires and wishes.

Some of us will find those wishes coming true—while the whole world listens. Thereby hangs the story of radio's newest and most entertaining experiment in programming.

Perhaps you heard the premiere last Sunday. If you did you know that there is a Board of Well Wishers headed by Doctor Samuel Stevens, president of Grinnell College, Grinnell, Iowa. This board selects those wishes which they have found to be most deserving and worthy. The wishee is informed. Do you begin to see the evolution of an uncommonly stimulating story?

On the opening broadcast the story of twenty-two-year-old Mildred Denison was dramatized.

Mildred, who dreamed of becoming a famous actress, performed in Milne's "Romantic Age" in her senior year in the Mount Vernon, Ohio, High School. Her mother and father glowed with pride as the audience applauded. The scene then changed to the meeting between the parents and daughter after the play was over. Mildred was in tears, her young heart near to breaking, for she realized that it probably was the last time she ever would have a chance to act. She knew her parents did not have money enough to send her to a dramatic school; that they could not afford even to let her go to Chicago, where she might find an opportunity to follow her career as an actress.

But, filled with the hope and ambition of youth, she went to Chicago and worked to help pay for dramatic and music courses at the Chicago Musical College. She was working as a hostess in the English Tea Room in Marshall Field's store when she wrote her letter to the "Wishing Well," telling of her ambition to be an actress.

Her wish was one of the first selected to be fulfilled on the "Your Dream Has Come True" program.

Blond, blue-eyed Mildred was sent to Hollywood. There she was given a screen test by Paramount Pictures.

Another dream that came true was that of fourteen-year-old Lillian Seregos of Chicago, whose letter revealed that her life was dark and gloomy because she had lost one of her front teeth while swimming last summer. Her family could not afford at the time to have the precious tooth restored.

The sincerity and honest appeal in the little girl's letter won the sympathy of the Board of Well Wishers, and now Lillian is flashing a nice new tooth at the little boys in school.

Jackie Lane, eleven-year-old lad from Fort Madison, Iowa, had one burning ambition, and that was to ride in the cab of the Super Chief, crack train on the Sante Fe Railroad. Jackie longed to enjoy the thrill that comes of guiding a huge engine through the night, feeling the surge of power in the wheels, feeling the mass of iron and steel respond to his very touch. He had inherited his love of engines from his father and grandfather, both of whom had been locomotive engineers on the Sante Fe.

"I want to drive the new Super Chief," Jackie pleaded. "I'd like to ride up there in the cab and feel the wind in my face and see the trees and houses go speeding by."

**W**HEN the Super Chief pulled out of Chicago the following Thursday, Jackie Lane was aboard the cab and was allowed to hold the throttle for part of the run. The engineer in the cab was one of Jackie's father's oldest friends, and he got a tremendous thrill himself out of seeing the dream come true for a youngster who took such pride in the work his father had done.

Robert Fischer worked for a public-utility company in Hammond, Indiana, to help support his mother, two sisters and a young brother.

"I'll tell you what I wish," he wrote. "Ever since I was a kid I've been singing. I've taken lessons whenever I could get enough money together for them. The last time I saw my music teacher he told me to work hard and try to get somebody who knows music to listen to me sing. So

my one wish is for a chance to sing on a big radio program."

The Board of Well Wishers investigated Robert's appeal, visited his home and talked with his mother and the other members of his family. They visited his employers, too, and found his wish to be a deserving one.

So on the first broadcast of "Your Dream Has Come True" Robert Fischer sang on a Coast-to-Coast network. Singing "Will You Remember?" from Sigmund Romberg's "Maytime," he was heard in a duet with Miss Mary McCormic, noted operatic soprano, who graciously consented to appear on the program with the young singer. Thus Robert Fischer was given his big chance to realize a long-cherished dream.

Another wish granted on the first "Your Dream Has Come True" program came from a girl who wanted to be an airline hostess and was subsequently given a position with American Airlines.

Letters are pouring into the Quaker Oats Company, which sponsors this program. Some dream of fame and fortune, some of great things, some of small.

As an example of the great variance in the wishes that have been sent in for consideration by the Board of Well Wishers is one from an old man who has been an invalid for many years. He occupies a small room in a tenement district. His only son, employed at a low-paying job in a distant city, sends the father just enough money to pay the rent and keep him alive. Before he was bedridden, the man had lived an active outdoor life and always had enjoyed the sun and the sight of the sky. His dream is to have a skylight in his tiny room so that he once again can see the blue sky and sunlight.

Another wish comes from a widow who is fighting desperately to earn a living for herself and her child. She has been unable to obtain employment because prospective employers will not allow her to bring her child to work with her and she cannot leave him at home alone. The woman has no particular training, but feels that she would make a good housekeeper or companion. Her unostentatious wish is to obtain a position of that sort in a home where she may earn her living and may be allowed to keep her child with her.

A young girl dreams of a career as a concert pianist. She works in a store in a large city and part of her meager earnings go toward the support of her father and mother. For years the girl has spent on music lessons every available cent she could save. She had been awarded a scholarship in a music conservatory, but after completing the course she found it impossible to obtain employment in her chosen field. She believes that if the right people could hear her play she might be given an opportunity she desires—to follow a career as a concert pianist.

**A** YOUNG man who went out west some years ago dreamed of sending for his father and mother. The boy works as a cowhand and does not have much money, but he wants to bring his parents out west so that they can enjoy their old age far away from the dismal home which, had been theirs in a crowded city.

Each of the dreams will, in turn, be passed on by the Board of Well Wishers and then some will be fulfilled at radio's "Wishing Well."

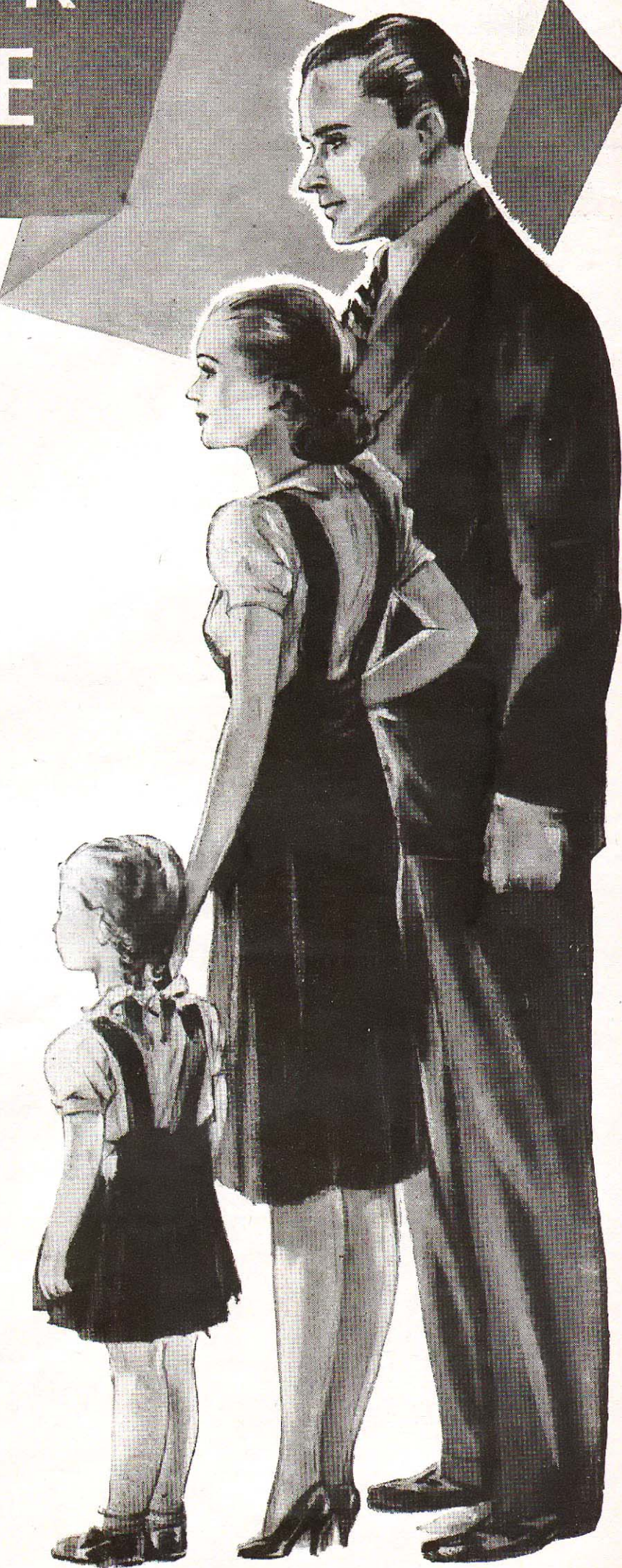
Entirely new in the realm of audience-participation shows, "Your Dream Has Come True" is a fantasy played around a wishing well to which anyone—you or me or the fellow next door—may come with his heart's desire. Deep in the well lives the oracle whose magic power it is to grant wishes and make dreams come true. But there the fantasy ends.

Unlike the wishing wells of Grimm, the wisher does not awaken in the cold light of day to the realization that what he has been dreaming is a fairy-tale, nicely fashioned as an escape from the rigors and heartbreak of life. What he has been undergoing is real, concrete wish-fulfilment. The program itself is a dream come true with unlimited opportunity for honest-to-goodness well-doing from week to week. Perhaps the fantasy doesn't end. Perhaps—well, the very idea is fantastic.

What was that old saying? "Wish long enough . . . wish strong enough" and whatever you wish will be yours.

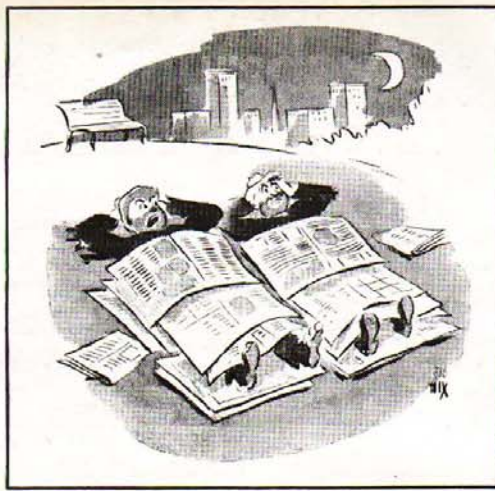

As might be expected of a Rogers character, David Harum (Wilmer Walter) is a kindly, horse-sense philosopher—banker in the New England town of Homeville.

He has never married, occupying himself rather with a multitudinous number of schemes for helping neighbors who are the victims of other less scrupulous neighbors. He is the shrewdest trader in the state. David lives with his sister, Polly Benson (Charme Allen), known to all Homeville as Aunt Polly. Polly's husband, James Benson (Bennett Kilpack), runs the local hotel. Romance of the piece is provided by

Susan Price (Peggy Allenby), the village belle, and Brian Wells (Philip Reed), who came to Homeville recently as owner and publisher of the Homeville *Bugle*. When Tessa Terwillinger (Florence Lake), an ex-vaudeville player, arrives in Homeville to sell encyclopedias, Aunt Polly takes her under her wing and gets her a job as society columnist of *The Bugle*. Tessa lives with Aunt Polly and

David. Because she is flighty and irresponsible, she continually upsets everybody's applegarts and David becomes her long-suffering apologist. Although the domestic life of Homeville takes up most of David Harum's spare time, he is also interested in horses—trotting horses. He buys them, breeds them, trains them and sells them. His horse-trades are one of the commonest reasons for frequent legal and extralegal tangles with his one enemy, Zeke Swinney (Arthur Maitland), who is recognized as the local villain.

# the BERGEN nobody knows

Everybody knows that Bergen has brains — here's the evidence that the great showman has a heart, too!

SOME Sunday night within the next few months—perhaps about Christmas-time, if the radio grapevine whispers correctly—twelve-year-old Thelma Jean Graham will throw her voice out on the air and prove whether Edgar Bergen was right in calling her the greatest natural ventriloquist he ever saw. Her great test may also offer gripping conclusiveness of another gratifying truth—that the man whose voice belongs to a dummy on his knee has a heart that beats solidly under his own shirt.

Charlie McCarthy the air personality is so vividly alive that listeners must find it hard to see Edgar Bergen as a definite individual apart from his lifelike but lifeless chum. Especially is this true because Bergen, naturally reserved and a shrewd showman, deliberately keeps Charlie's personality in front of his own on the air. Therefore it's easy to think of Bergen as a detached, automatic individual, or to just not think of him much in any sense.

But Edgar Bergen the man is very much alive. He has a fine home and plenty of friends, a reputable name and public renown. He has traveled widely, now flies his own airplane. The world's greatest double-voiced entertainer is a man with everything. But how about a heart? Has that, like Bergen's voice, been thrown into the wooden body and colorful career of Charlie McCarthy completely and irretrievably? Or is there a heart left to go out to a real child with warm blood of life and aspiration and triumph over misfortune pulsing through her veins? A child like Thelma Jean Graham.

Listeners who tuned in the first broadcast of this season's "Chase and Sanborn Program" heard McCarthy razz Bergen about almost cracking up but had scarcely dared hope for. After his arrival at Nashville, Bergen was test-hopping his new ship at the airport when he was approached by a wistfully pretty little girl carrying a ragged Charlie McCarthy doll. The meeting had been arranged by a Nashville radio announcer who knew Thelma Jean Graham as a bright little ward of the juvenile court—a child who entertained her little pals in the Children's Home and occasionally the public with her amateur ventriloquism.

"I'm a great admirer of Charlie, Mr. Bergen," said the little girl. Then she added, guilelessly, "I'm a ventriloquist, too."

Bergen gave her a friendly, tolerant smile, thinking, he later confessed, "Sweet girl. Guess I'll have to listen to her."

He lapsed into a McCarthy cackle and said, "Let's see what you can do.

his new plane when he flew it back to Hollywood. A bigger story was at the other end of that air jaunt—at Nashville, Tenn., where Bergen went a few weeks ago to take delivery on his new Stinson 105 monoplane. Bergen made the trip to Nashville as a regular passenger on a giant airliner, unaware that he was a little girl's Prince Charming riding in from the West to rescue her from the curse of a sordid past and perhaps take her into the dream world she had longed for.

Ho, ho, ho!"

An impromptu duel ensued which left the veteran ventriloquist nothing less than astonished. That noon he was going on the air over WSM at a radio-press luncheon in the Andrew Jackson Hotel. He invited Thelma Jean to go on the air with him.

JACK HARRIS, WSM announcer who handled the broadcast, admits he crossed his fingers when he presented the little girl to Bergen at the mike. He knew the comedian was tired, that he might have become a bit callous to the frequent presenting to him of prodigies; and the announcer, knowing Thelma Jean's miserable past, didn't want her to be hurt further by indifference.

Thelma Jean picked up her cue from Bergen and started to tell her life-story, but her dummy, which she calls Elmer, kept interrupting to tell his—which he said was more important and much more interesting. The little showgirl tossed cue after cue to Bergen, who caught them and entered heartily into a spontaneous act which had the spectators on the edges of their chairs rocking with laughter.

The broadcast finished, Thelma Jean, bright-eyed but inwardly tremulous, waited her idol's comment. The tired look had gone from Bergen's eyes, and they too were bright. He had found something fresh, wholesome, exhilarating—something he had not found in Hollywood or all of the show world. Bergen said later, "I know there are thousands of 'home problem' children, and it wasn't sympathy for her that won me to her but the way

she walked up to the microphone that day. She's a regular little showman, and has a natural talent that I think should be developed." But it's hard to believe reticent Mr. Bergen's implication that it was just objective appreciation of talent that stirred his interest. Most people will choose to believe there was something of sentiment mixed up in Bergen's suggestion that the valiant little artist have a further trial.

They went to the WSM studios, and the master showman listened with a critical ear while Thelma Jean did some of her little skits. Then he faced her at the microphone and engaged her in ad-lib banter. Like a veteran trouper the youngster seized the occasion. Without freezing, without faltering she cracked back. The radio comedy ace found himself laughing at, laughing with Thelma Jean—found himself part of the audience, and loved it. No one could listen with coldly analytical ears to such whip-cracking wit as Thelma Jean displayed once when Elmer's pants fell down and she put this impromptu scolding in his mouth: "This would never have happened if you'd stuck to the old-fashioned safety pin. You and your bobby-pins. Phooey!"

Finally Bergen asked Thelma Jean to tell him something of her life-story. Fear must have clutched at the child's heart then. For her new-found friend didn't know she had no mother and daddy, legally. Maybe that would make a difference. Maybe Mr. Bergen would frown on her pathetic past. But neither did Thelma Jean know that Mr. Bergen himself had been through some pretty tough professional struggles. She didn't suspect—but others do—that he must have been thinking of those struggles and how puny they seemed as Thelma Jean told her story.

The girl's parents separated when she was hardly more than a year old. She has no early recollection of her mother. Her father was a one-man medicine show, to whose credit might be marked up service as an army flier in World War I. On the other side of the ledger was his treatment of his tiny daughter. From her babyhood she was carried with her father from town to town. Never in the same place long enough to call it home.

EVER since she can remember, her father had forced her to perform in his medicine show. She danced, recited verses, told jokes, gamely—for hadn't Daddy said they'd starve unless she helped him make money? When there were no customers Thelma Jean had to take her father's battered hat and beg on street corners, courthouse lawns, in beer parlors and dance halls. She remembers her humiliation—but she remembers also that she was often hungry.

Until she was eleven the child was an undernourished waif, a weary little hooper, an embarrassed beggar. And during all this time she never saw or heard from her mother. Her vagrant father was her only companion. It was a lonely life for a little girl—until she found a friend. His name: Charlie McCarthy.

Thelma Jean had saved a few pennies and bought a ticket to a cheap theater. It was the bargain of her life,

for she was entranced by Charlie McCarthy, appearing with W. C. Fields in "You Can't Cheat an Honest Man." She had heard only vaguely of Charlie, but she identified him clearly with the dolls on sale at the drug stores. She held back pennies till she could buy one of those McCarthy dolls. Charlie was her first—and only—boy friend, her inseparable pal. She talked to him.

And Charlie talked back to her! Thelma Jean doesn't know just how she gave the doll a voice of his own. It just happened (Bergen calls her a rarity—a "natural" ventriloquist). Her little friend became more alive to her, and Thelma Jean, too, became sunnier, happier.

This was her first real friend and she began to think of the future—hers and Charlie's. But hers were not make-believe plans, like those of most girls with dolls and doll-houses. Her life hadn't been play. She was serious.

Some kind-hearted person who heard of her plight directed her to the juvenile court. There Thelma Jean found a real-life friend in Judge Sam Tatum. After checking her case thoroughly, he made her a ward of the court. She was put in the Nashville Children's Municipal Home, where finally she and Charlie found warm beds, good food, pretty clothes, playmates and an opportunity to go to school—security and happiness to Thelma Jean.

Now the clouds of her past showed a little silver lining. She retained her trouser instinct. She practiced her ventriloquism diligently, creating for herself a new dummy named Elmer, because she realized for professional purposes Charlie belonged to Mr. Bergen. But she keeps a big place in her heart for her Charlie-doll, her first love. Thelma Jean entertained her playmates, appeared in amateur shows and now and then on the radio. And she dreamed of a big chance for herself and Elmer.

As it should to anyone as worthy, it happened. Came Bergen, the meeting, the tryout, her fear-haunted story. She told it all the way through. Bergen asked her simply, "How would you like to go to Hollywood?"

So Thelma Jean has gone to Hollywood, with a matron-companion, at Bergen's expense. She has become a ward of the juvenile court, in Los Angeles, she has been placed in a private home, and sent to a good professional school (not one of the snooty places), where she is learning, in addition to ordinary studies, dancing and dramatics. All at Bergen's expense. He himself will spend much time coaching her in ventriloquism and showmanship.

Says Bergen of his plans for her: "I'll get her one or two new dummies and some stage clothes. If she continues to show signs of progress I think

Griff Williams honored this week; "Sing for Your Money," new show over Mutual Monday nights; Marion Hutton weds band-manager

**O**UT of the great Golden West in the year 1936 came one Griff Williams plus an orchestra of talented young musicians and a style of music that "sings as it swings." It was both the pleasing personality of the man and the intriguing quality of his band's music which succeeded in obtaining the liking of hotel supper-room patrons in cities such as Chicago, Cleveland and Cincinnati. Today the Williams music is the choice of listeners and dancers alike, due to the frequent airings via the Mutual Broadcasting System, and to Varsity recordings. The Williams music, while in line with the demand for the new rhythm, does not entirely forsake the smoother and more soothing measures which many prefer. Williams' early classical-music training probably has something to do with this. Featured in the Williams band are Walter King and Bob Kirk, who, in addition to their instrumental chores, take over during the vocal interludes. The Williams band lines up for your inspection above as follows (front row, left to right): Joe Poretta, sax; Bob Lipsky, sax; Ron Conrad, sax and violin; Bruce Yantis, violin; Walter King, drums and vocalist (high tenor voice); Griff Williams, piano, et al.; Bob Kirk, sax and baritone vocalist. The theme song of the Williams band is "Dream Music," which the orchestra-leader composed while attending Stanford University. It was the hit song of the campus show. For his tenacity of purpose which was

Lyman is one of the best-liked bandleaders in the country and draws crowds wherever he plays . . . Bonnie King, vocalist with the Crosby outfit, has had a lot of "double-trouble" because a girl has been making the rounds of Los Angeles department stores buying merchandise, including a complete

wardrobe, fur coats and gowns, charging them to Bonnie. The police haven't caught up with the gal yet and the real Bonnie has had an awful lot of trouble because of it.

**Debut**  
The Blackhawk in Chicago has a reputation for giving bandleaders the needed lift to start them on the road to fame. It was in this spot that Kay Kyser inaugurated his "College of Musical Knowledge" idea. From the Blackhawk the other Monday night a new idea was started which should click with the listeners. It's called "Sing for Your Money," and the contestants, selected from the patrons in the place, pick a card on which the title of a song is printed. If they can sing the song they get a cash prize. It's heard over the Mutual network late Monday nights, with Pierre Andre as emcee, along with the exceedingly excellent music of Raymond Scott and his band. Incidentally, watch this band go places. Ray has a lot of new men and their music and arrangements are worth earing.

Those who know them well weren't surprised at the announcement that Orrin Tucker and his vocalist, Bonnie Baker, would wed. They've been singing love songs to each other for months. Now you know why Bonnie turned down that movie offer last year when it didn't include her bossman . . . "Stardust," one of the greatest jazz numbers ever to be written, is sung by Howard in slow time, with both the singer and the orchestra injecting lots of rhythmic feeling. "Old Fashioned Love" is an example of perfected jazz technique.

**RAYMOND SCOTT**—"I Don't Want to Cry Any More" (Columbia 35773)—This number from the Bing Crosby film, "Rhythm on the River," is an entertaining, highly danceable arrangement, with the vocals being handled by Clyde Burke, whom Scott recently hired. Reverse: "Half Way Down the Street" (Scott and orchestra; vocal chorus by Clyde Burke).

**T**HE Democrats, as reported last week, bought up all the time up to 12 midnight EST November 4 to make sure of getting in the last word before voters go to the polls. But the Republicans are having the last laugh. They bought up all networks from 12 midnight to 1 a.m. EST the same night, assuring them of the last word. . . . Bill Adams, actor called upon whenever Roosevelt is to be impersonated, is wearing a Willkie button. . . . When the government made Elliott Roosevelt a captain, the Texas State Network gave its presidency, which Elliott resigned, to his wife. . . . Thanks to radio and the difference in time, California voters can know the trend of New York voting even before they go to the polls, there being three hours difference in poll-closing time. We're reminded that, to be technical, we can add that some parts of the world, because of this time difference, will know the November 5 results on November 4. . . . Mutual has found a sponsor for ten five-minute-election-returns periods the evening of November 5—the first time America's voting has been placed on a commercial basis. . . . The Gallup poll, which in 1936 predicted a fraction of a point the outcome of the election, says that it found thirty-one percent of the nation favors giving the Communists some free time on the air, sixty-nine percent were opposed, fifteen percent undecided. . . . The Communists are again complaining to the FCC, charging that WHK, Cleveland; WREN, Kansas City; WMPS, Memphis; WAGA, Atlanta; KFDM, Beaumont, Texas; WEAN,

Providence; WSYR, Syracuse, and WTCN, Minneapolis, refused to carry their broadcasts.

#### Nazi Kick CBS Out

Nazi-dominated Roumania has kicked Winston Burdett, CBS commentator, out of that country—the first time in history that an American radio representative has been thus expelled. Despite the fact that Burdett's broadcasts were always censored at the source, the Roumanians (at Nazi urging) were irritated and gave him five days to clear out. While Burdett holds the distinction of being the first to rouse the Hitler ire with this result, he has lots of company in Hitler's anti-commentator society. H. V. Kaltenborn and Wythe Williams both have a price on their heads should they ever set foot on Nazi soil.

#### The Duchess Reconsiders

The Duchess of Windsor has reconsidered radio and has indicated she would appear on a twenty-six-week series for \$500,000 with everything above expenses going to the British War Relief Fund. The same agency that handles the "Ford Sunday Evening Hour" is offering the Duchess for sale at this figure with the understanding that the program must originate in the Bahamas. It is reported some cosmetic firms are interested.

#### Oscar Levant Stumped

Oscar Levant's mental capers might be all right for the radio audience but they didn't mean a thing when it came time to register for the November 5 election. The Board of Elections made him take the literacy test given to all first voters—to prove that he could read and write. Then on conscription day, Oscar reported for registration and got along swell until the clerk asked, "What is your complexion?" "Swarthy," replied the musician. "It is not!" shot back the clerk. "It's sallow." "It is not sallow," he retorted. The registration cards have no "swarthy" classification, so Oscar was reported as "sallow," much to his disappointment. Incidentally, when the Levants' baby girl was born, Eddie Cantor wired: "Ha, ha. That's how we started."

#### Myrt Is Married

Myrtle Vail (Myrt of "Myrt and Marge") and Eddie Lambert, song-agent, flew to North Carolina last week and were married. Myrtle's script and real-life daughter, Marge (Mrs. Peter Fick), is expecting a

blessed event this fall—her third. . . . Radio celebrates its twentieth birthday November 11. . . . "Court of Missing Heirs" on CBS has turned up heirs to more than \$244,800 since last December. . . . The minimum pay for all radio artists was boosted from ten to thirty percent under a new agreement signed by the networks and the American Federation of Radio Artists.

Westinghouse demonstrated on October 18 just how electric power can be transmitted by radio. A group of professors were handed flashlight bulbs, which they held aloft. Then engineers turned on the new radio generator. The bulbs lighted. When the generator was turned off the lights faded out. Wonderful thing—this radio!

Because Robert Ripley's broadcast last week was canceled for a political talk, three persons get two trips each to New York. One from California, one from Canada and one from Massachusetts came for the show. Ripley couldn't hold them over for the November 1 program, because that program is about Navy Day and they wouldn't fit into the theme. So all were sent home to return again to New York on November 8.

Fred Allen, entertaining the president of the League for Less Noise on his show, saluted him with ten seconds of complete silence, a new idea in comedy. . . . Col. Schwarzkopf has been called for military service, so "Gang Busters" is looking for a new head man. . . . James Caesar Petrillo, the czar of the musicians union, got mad at CBS again and jerked off all the late dance bands. . . . Katharine Cornell of the stage will bow to radio November 10, when all three networks salute the Red Cross. . . . Jean Holloway, only twenty-one years old, is writing the scripts for the "Kate Smith Hour" and "My Son and I". . . . November 22 will be "Mary Margaret McBride Day" in Missouri. ## WLWO—THE INTER-NATION STATION

THE forging of a powerful cultural link between the United States and its Latin-American neighbors was completed when the new 50,000-watt transmitter of WLWO—The Inter-Nation Station owned by the Crosley Corporation at Cincinnati, Ohio—was dedicated with an elaborate Pan-American program on Saturday, October 12.

The station's transmitter is located at Mason, Ohio. Here also is the rhombic-beam aerial which radiates an effective power of 600,000 watts in the Latin Americas, towards which the programs of WLWO are directed. WLWO has six assigned frequencies, namely, 6.08, 9.59, 11.71, 15.25, 17.80 and 21.65 megs.

The first experimental broadcasts over the new station were sent out last April. Programs on a regular scheduled basis are now being broadcast daily over WLWO. These include selected offerings of the NBC-Red and Blue networks; English programs from the studios of WLW—the mother station at Cincinnati—and English, Spanish and Portuguese programs produced by WLWO's own staff at its Cincinnati studios. Eugene Patterson is the program director. Wilfred Guenther is the general manager. On the station's staff are also several well-qualified Spanish and Portuguese announcers.

## STARLIGHT on Your Dressing Table

DINAH SHORE'S EYES have been called the most expressive in radio. She's songstress with Eddie Cantor (Wed. on NBC)

NOW that the movies as well as the fashion trends in every-day life are sponsoring what I might term the gesture of coquetry and pompadour bonnets, forehead curls and frou-frou touches are framing feminine faces more coyly than they have been framed since the Watteau era, it is obvious that the eyes—the normal focus (or should I say foci?) of attention—should be played up as dramatically as possible.

With that thought in mind we finally tracked down the popular Miss Dinah Shore, slim, eager-faced young southern girl who has what have been rightfully called "the most expressive eyes in radio" and asked her if she would mind telling us (for the benefit of our readers) how she manages to retain such eye beauty and brilliancy and lead such a busy, exciting life at the same time!

(We could see that Miss Dinah had been fairy-blessed in a number of other directions, aside from her eyes. She has a twenty-one-inch waistline and a hauntingly lovely voice.)

She told us with the most charming frankness that the appeal of her eyes is the result of design as much as accident, or more specifically, that proper care and make-up had a great deal to do with achieving their large and luminous appearance.

"Since fatigue and strain show up immediately in eyes, it's important to rest and refresh them occasionally with an eye lotion or with a mild solution of boric acid," she informed us. "This solution can be used with an eye-cup or medicine-dropper, and the business girl who values her eyesight should make a practise of doing it every night, particularly," she added with an understanding twinkle, "if she has a date where she wants to look as decorative as possible."

Clever girl that she is, Dinah avoids eye-shadow during the sunlight hours, using instead a bit of cream or oil on the lids to give them the dull gleam of waxed petals. But she makes no such reservations for evening.

"I love eye-shadow after dark," she confessed youthfully, "particularly the

new iridescent shades that give the eyes such fascinating highlights. But I always remember to choose a shade that will blend with my natural eye color," she added, practically. "If one's eyes are hazel or brown, a harmonizing bronze shadow will be most becoming. If they are gray or blue, the bluish-gray or violet shades of shadow will make them appear deep and mysterious, a very good thing for evening."

I asked Miss Dinah for some pointers on applying eye-shadow and this is what she told me:

"Unless your eyes are widely spaced, don't apply eye-shadow too near the bridge of your nose. Keep it deepest in tone at the very rim of the lid and shade it up toward the brow. Then with a very fine pencil outline the edge of the upper lid, carrying the line past the eye, and smudge it with your finger-tip. This is a trick all the movie stars use to make their eyes appear larger. It makes small, deep-set eyes look much bigger than they really are.

"MASCARA," she continued, "is another potential eye-magic. I say potential because like any other enchantment it can be used wrongly. I love mascara on my eyes because it makes them look brilliant and nicely groomed at the same time, but I am always careful not to use too much. I like a dramatic effect but not a burlesque, and thick, spiked lashes are not pretty at all.

"When applying mascara, the safest rule is not to let the brush get too wet. Curl the lashes backward as you darken them, and if you want to look doubly alluring, add a second coat from the center of the eye outward, thus keeping the mascara heaviest toward the temples. This gives an illusion of length and is especially effective under artificial lights.

"Eye make-up of any kind is taboo on the lower lashes," concluded the girl who is said to have the most expressive eyes in radio.

(Listening to Dinah talk, I couldn't help feeling that what came smiling through her lovely, shining eyes was

neither accident nor design, but personality, the same vital, splendid quality that has made her voice so memorable!)

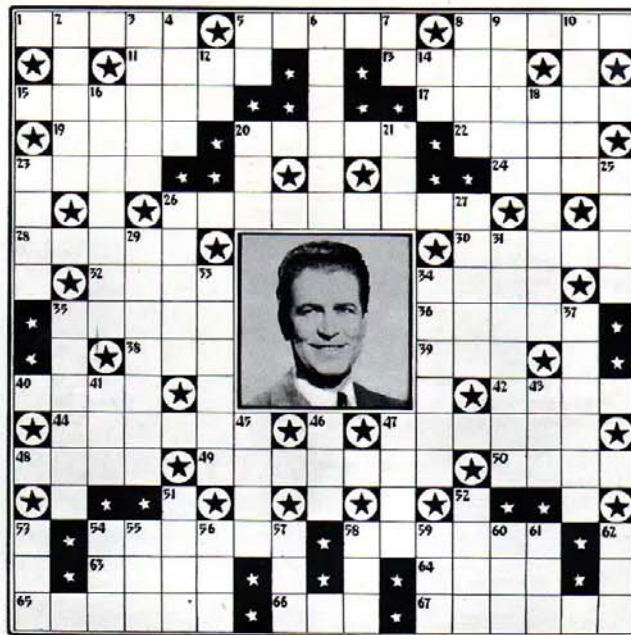

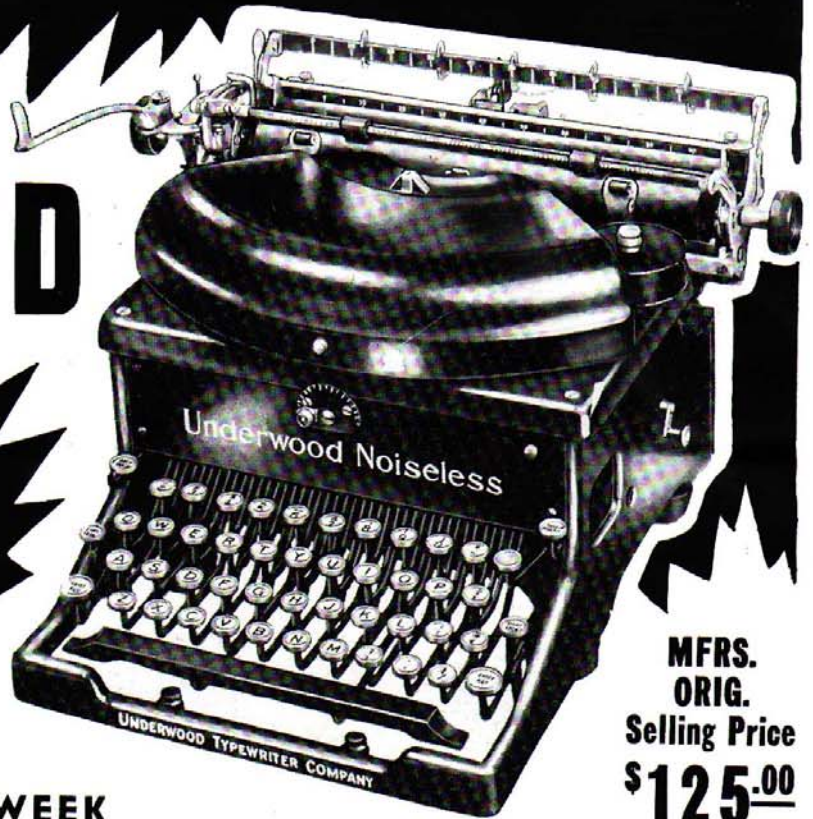
