Majority of Public Shows Distaste for BMI Music in Battle Poll

THE music heard on network programs since January 1 is worse than when radio used ASCAP tunes. So say the readers of Movie-Radio Guide who voted in the recent BMI-ASCAP Battle Poll.

As the result of our scientifically conducted test of a cross-section of typical radio listeners, we are able to announce the listening public's opinion of BMI music. In the scrap between ASCAP and BMI, little consideration has been given to the public. The fight is over money, although each side would have listeners believe that great principles of integrity and morality are involved. Very simply, the broadcasters did not want to pay what ASCAP demanded. ASCAP refused to take less. So the broadcasters organized their own music sources, and called it Broadcast Music, Inc. Its tunes, plus those which are in the public domain and not covered by copyright, have been our exclusive musical fare since January 1 on all network programs.

After one month of hearing BMI music, the public has formed an opinion of it. That opinion is important to every broadcaster. Radio men have demonstrated that they can get along without ASCAP by substituting BMI music, but they have yet to demonstrate that they can make the public like BMI music. In the end, the public will either continue to listen or it will stop listening. If it continues, BMI has nothing to worry about. If it stops, everyone in broadcasting suffers and so does the public. That it may stop soon is indicated by the results of our Battle Poll.

In this poll, we asked voters to make the following statement: "I think music on network programs since January 1 is better, worse, or about the same."

When three out of every four radio listeners say that the music they hear today is worse than it was, they will not long support such music. Broadcasters are a little smug these days over having put ASCAP in its place. Our figures show that the battle is not over. Broadcasters must do either of two things. They must get together with ASCAP or they must improve the quality of their BMI music.

The American listener demands and deserves the best.

GABRIEL HEATTER is saying some significant things these days. If you run into his broadcasts, pause long enough to sample his Americanism. He believes deeply in the soundness of his country and he minces no words in evaluating the subversive propaganda of totalitarianism. Mr. Heatter has come a long way since he went to Flemington, N. HOW LONG is a radio rehearsal? Many people ask that question, and we believe the best answer lies in this analysis of the time spent on that great weekly broadcast called the "University of Chicago Round Table." Here is a typical routine: Tenth day preceding the broadcast, research staff selects a subject for discussion. Ninth day preceding, the staff gives precise wording to the subject and selects the angle of approach. Speakers for the program are also selected. Eighth day, the research staff goes into action, consulting participants for their points of view and providing them with whatever background material they may wish to read. Sixth day, a two-page outline is drawn up and sent to each speaker. Fifth day, speakers who live in Chicago meet for lunch and spend three hours on perfecting the outline. First day, all speakers meet for dinner on Saturday night for a general discussion. Day of broadcast, speakers gather in the Mitchell Tower studios of the University of Chicago. An informal "run-through" is made on a record, which is played back so the speakers may hear themselves and correct their faults. Coffee and sandwiches are served. Just before airtime, the studio secretary lays out cards which will be used to correct the speakers. Those cards are cute. They say: "Keep your elbows on the table (signed) Emily Post"; "Don't be polite, INTERRUPT!" "Do you know a JOKE? USE IT; stress the American angle"; "Two minutes is a long time. DON'T RUSH!" The Round Table goes on the air at 2:30 p.m. EST over NBC, the speakers keep their elbows on the table on special rubber arm-rests. They don't crack many jokes but they are amazingly interesting and expert in their discussion of the question of the moment. They have been in rehearsal, in their own systematic fashion, for ten days.

GIRL ON THE COVER: Twenty-nine years ago the Ben F. Wilsons were en route to California after a trip abroad when a daughter, Kathleen, was born to them in the prairie town of Girard, Kansas. Four years ago Kathleen's son, Garrick Holmes, was born while "One Man's Family"—on which she portrayed Claudia Barbour—was actually on the air. Except on such rare occasions, Miss Wilson has been heard as Claudia since the great family serial came to the air in 1933, becoming in this role one of radio's best-loved actresses. She made her stage debut at the Berkeley Playhouse, founded by her cousin, film director-actor Irving Pichel, and played in a number of Shakespearian productions. In 1933 she married Rawson Holmes, from whom she is now divorced, living alone with her son in Hollywood. Although Miss Wilson is a trained painter and singer, her favorite hobby is gardening. THIS ACTUAL budget for one of Levee's clients shows where star's salary goes

ARE you having budget trouble? Do you lie awake nights wondering how you can make both ends meet without leaving a crimp in the middle? Are financial worries getting you down? If you are—and who isn't?—here's a story that's written expressly for you. It isn't a miracle story or another "Brewster's Millions." It's simply what movie stars do when they have such

worries, and they do have them in spite of their fabulous salaries. But even more than that, these revelations can help you put your financial affairs on the same sound footing as those of the stars. All that really separates Kitty Foyle, with her thirty-dollar-a-week income, from Joan Crawford or Greer Garson is the number of ciphers at the end of the weekly pay-check plus the ability

of the stars to hire expensive experts to budget their incomes and guard their outlays. That is the studied opinion of M. C. Levee, agent and watchdog for the incomes of such stars as Crawford and Garson, Leslie Howard, Franchot Tone, Joe E. Brown and a host of others. Now MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE whittles away half that difference by having Mr. Levee's corps of financial experts

concentrate their efforts upon two budgets to fit the needs of you and me and Mrs. Smith, with her baby. One budget is for a girl who earns thirty dollars a week. The other is for a couple with one child whose income is forty dollars a week. Both are scientifically compounded to meet the average reader's needs, and by sliding the proportions one way or another can be made to operate for almost any normal income.

But before getting down to figures, let's consider for a moment Mr. Levee, typical of the successful Hollywood agent, Mr. Levee's organization, and the need for such a service.

The stars of yesterday were a fabulous lot beginning with their salaries and ending with their endings—usually in the direst poverty. "People still shake their heads at the fate of Charles Ray," Mr. Levee will tell you. "Here was a chap who was ill-advised. He didn't need to surround himself with million-dollar mansions. He could have gone to the top on the strength of his own simple personality alone."

"BUT he wanted to be his own boss, his own producer. He spent thousands of dollars surrounding himself with glamour. His parties were the talk of the nation. His bathroom had gold taps and expensive mosaics. When times changed, everything was lost for Charles Ray, and the boy with the unsophisticated way who was swept to oblivion by a false sense of values."

Mr. Levee can cite numerous other cases, including the one so fresh in the public's mind—that of Agnes Ayres, who, at one time among the brightest of Hollywood's stars, died a few weeks ago in near poverty, practically unremembered.

"Saving is the important thing," Mr. Levee insists, "whether you're a star or a stenographer. If you save only fifty cents a week, you may be doing a better job of saving and living a wise life than stars who save \$30,000 a year. But the important thing is to get the habit of saving."

Neither does this mean that the Levee foot is put harshly down upon spending.

"The late Lilyan Tashman," he explains, "built her earning power to its height by spending lavishly for furs, gowns and jewels. The Tashman glamour still lives and no one has quite taken her place. But glamour can become a costly necessity—and unless it is a necessity, even a movie star is better off without it. A personality like Tashman needed it, and her expenditures were business items. Others, like the beloved Will Rogers, are never called upon to tread the golden path."

Today's crop of stars, benefiting by the example of their predecessors and perhaps because they seem to be a more level-headed group on the whole, anyway, insist upon more from their agents than the procurement of jobs and salary increases. They demand that their agents handle their financial affairs as well.

"If you think that an agent makes easy money, you should hear some of the arguments that take place in any agent's office over the matter of spending and saving even today," Mr. Levee

continued. "A star like Joan Crawford, like Tashman, must make vast expenditures for glamour. She must be the shining personification of a Cinderella who started in humble surroundings and became the queen of Hollywood. But—we see that Joan's savings are sufficient to take care of her when old age comes, and for every cent Joan spends upon herself she makes a donation to worth-while charities."

Warren William, who is a Levee client, loves the sea, and despite the fact that he could use a yacht only two or three times a year, he insisted upon maintaining one. It was not until the Levee staff—consisting of a business counselor and three specialists (one on real estate, one on taxes and insurance, one on securities)—could show him in black and white figures that he could save a thousand dollars a week and have a much better yacht by simply chartering one on the few occasions he had need for it, that he gave it up. Greer Garson insisted upon buying a mansion-type home in Hollywood, and the argument which finally prevailed against it was the fact that such an investment would cut so deeply into her contributions for British war relief.

"But Greer Garson and Joan Crawford and your average working girl are sisters under the skin," Mr. Levee insists, "and the same principles which govern them in their expenditures and savings should govern the working girl in proportion to income. The thirty-dollar-a-week girl should keep herself well dressed and pleasing to the eye, and this is not easy on her salary. As a mere male, I suggest that simplicity in dressing

and living be made the keynote. "A small budget must be given much more thought than a large one. A girl who makes a thousand dollars a week can make a few mistakes, but our thirty-dollar-a-week girl finds every mistake costly and difficult to repair. She must start out on her shopping-tours with a grim determination to outwit the zealous salespeople and stick to her own predetermined ideas on what she wants, trudging from shop to shop to get the right thing at the right price.

"Here is a budgeting plan I'd suggest for such a girl:

THE SAME scientific principles of saving employed by Joan Crawford, with Mr. Levee's aid, can be employed by you. In this story, Mr. Levee tells you how to save

Of course, in a general budget of this type, where attention is focused upon the average rather than upon a specific case, allowances must be made for various factors and adjustments according to the individual and environment. For example, food costs, utility costs, transportation costs will vary in different cities and in different sections. The point is that regardless of individual items on the budget, a working girl earning thirty dollars a week should save at the very least two dollars a week.

"Of course, there is a great difference between the budgets of the thirty-dollar-a-week girl and Greer Garson, but there is one thing I feel I cannot



stress too much in either case," Mr. Levee insists, "and that is the matter of savings. All of us—if we would be happy—must get the savings habit. I have seen too often the unhappiness that has come through depleted fortunes.

"The same variances which apply to a working girl's budget will apply to the budget for the family included in this article.

"Also, in the case of the married couple with children, the savings will become all the more difficult to make but even more important than in the case of the working girl with no dependents. And while these budgets seem financial molehills beside budgets prepared for the stars, believe me they're of much greater importance.

"ALMOST any average person feels that he would gladly change places with the gilt-edged stars. But there are plenty of high-salaried figures in Hollywood who lack cash in hand to meet their large income-tax payments when they're due, the necessary contributions to community chests, Red Cross and other charities to which they must contribute. Also, the stars often have to take care of relatives. "It is my honest opinion that a couple with one child who manage to live on the budget I am about to present will do a much better job of living and saving than a great many stars—and their chances for happiness not only today but tomorrow are greater.

"Here is the budget I suggest for the

couple with one child and a weekly income of forty dollars:

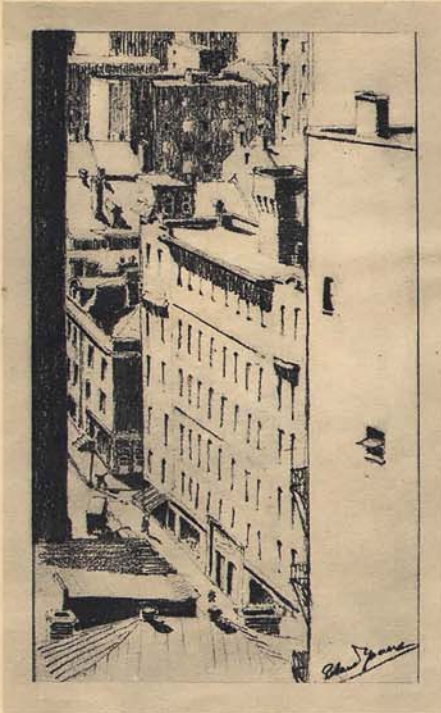
"*Social security, etc., as required in different states is included in this amount."

What it all boils down to, Mr. Levee insists, is that the spender should ask before every purchase, "What do I get for the checks I sign?" Mr. Levee demands that one of the prime things his clients must get is the freedom which is born only of economic security in old age. All of his management and budgeting is directed toward that end.

MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE has presented these budgets, prepared by Hollywood's best financial consultants, in the belief that what applies to the stars applies also to the average employe. They have been offered with the hope that they will not only help readers to extricate themselves from current financial involvements through wise budgeting but with the further hope that they will prove a foundation upon which everyone may build a real security against the unknown future—and the certain prospect of old age.

YOU can live a long time in Hollywood without ever coming to know fully its many and varied facets of expression. No one who has lived there long escapes the feeling that, while movie-making is the hub of the wheel which spins so rapidly and draws so many people into its whirling vortex, movie-making is by no means all of Hollywood. Most recent demonstration of the varied interests and talents of Hollywoodites came in the exhibit this year by the Gump Galleries, in the Ambassador Hotel, of the creative art of filmdom's actors and actresses, writers, directors and others, under the exhibit heading, "Avocations in Art." The exhibit served two purposes. First—and oddly for Hollywood where, they say, backbiting is developed

to the nth degree—the exhibit aroused the liveliest interest among studio folk in the off-screen activities of their fellow workers and created a feeling of camaraderie among many who saw, for the first time, that nodding acquaintances were doing work in which they had the deepest interest. The second purpose served was the simple furnishing of an outlet for people with creative ability. Because of the success of the show, prominent motion-picture executives are seriously considering a national tour for the show which brought out, in addition to the items listed above, water-colors by John Howard, an oil painting of his mother by Richard Cromwell, photographic exhibits made by Henry Fonda and Tyrone Power in Central America.



LOYALTY is one of the rarest of human traits. I believe that one of the most painful and personally grievous shocks the average human being can suffer is to learn how little loyalty there is in the world, in the life he lives, in the people of whom he is fond. And not only that . . . far worse is that day, which comes to practically every one of us, when we discover with shame and humility that we too are not entirely loyal; when we find ourselves betraying a friend for the sake of a good story, a laugh, a wisecrack—or because of some fancied wrong or injury.

Loyalty is a shining sword, and it cuts both ways. The person who climbs upward to success, leaving earlier associates behind, is very apt to forget old loyalties all along the way. Or, remaining himself loyal, may learn after difficult experience that the loyalty that he expects from old friends is sometimes caused by a desire to profit, to sun in reflected glory.

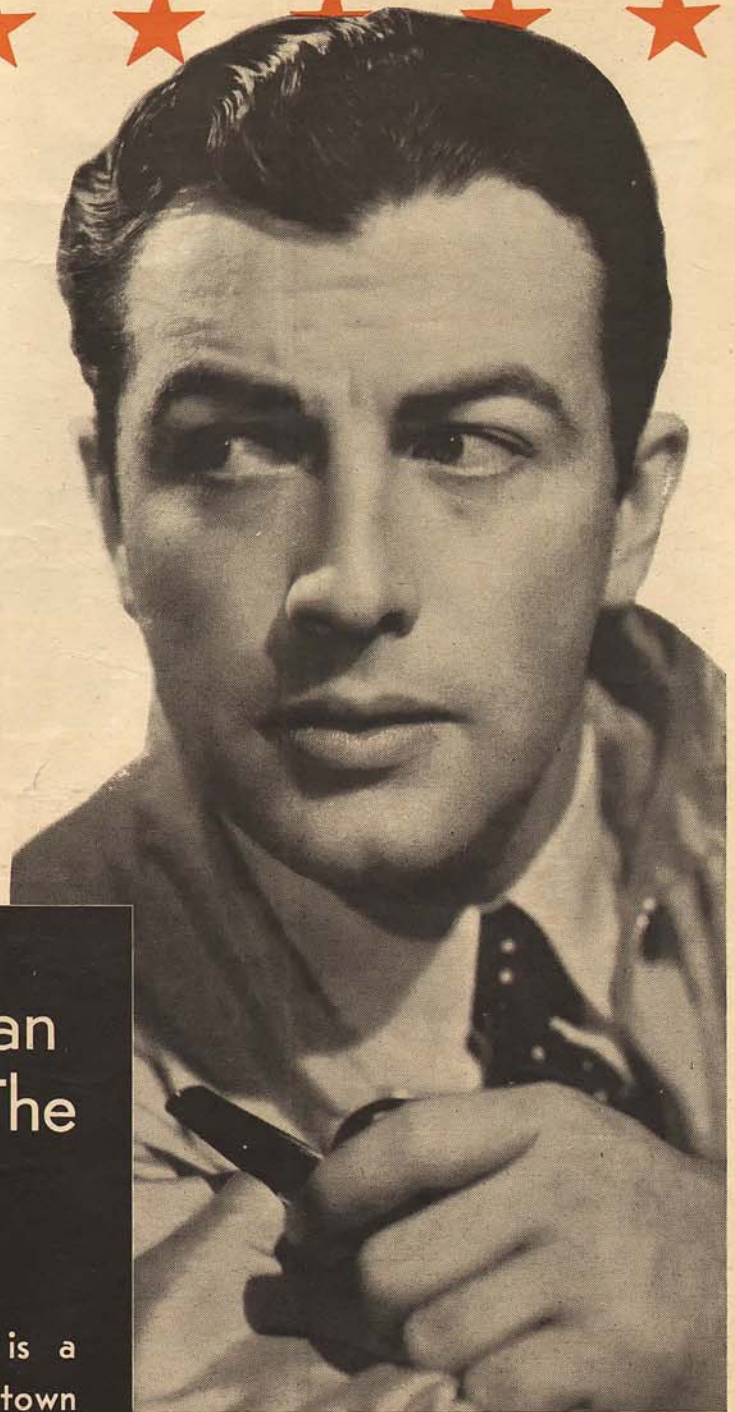
It is not an easy thing to be loyal. When your friend meets you unchanged, unaltered by time and circumstance, proving himself in no wise different from the person you admired and loved, it is simple. But when the friend alters, fails you at the crucial moment, is himself disloyal because of some misunderstanding, some sudden quirk in his own character, some suspicion of envy or jealousy, then to remain loyal to him is a task in which very few of us succeed.

You have all read "Gone With the Wind" and will remember the extraordinary loyalty exhibited toward its heroine, Scarlett, by Melanie. The average reader grew impatient of that loyalty. It seemed weak, not strong. It seemed childish and absurd, built as it was upon an entirely wrong premise . . . the premise that Scarlett was as devoted to Melanie as Melanie to her . . . The reader knew she was not and never had been. The reader knew that Scarlett desired to take Melanie's husband from her, that Scarlett resented and, in a measure, despised the other girl. Yet Melanie's loyalty, blind and, it seemed, mistaken, was neither, as the reader eventually learns. It had, by its stanch, undeviating belief in another human being, proved itself right. For although it took Melanie's pitiful death to drive it home, Scarlett knew, standing there watching Melanie die, that the beatitudes are true . . . the meek shall inherit the earth, that the victor is one whose strength lies in apparent weakness. And knew too that she loved her, that all along the way she could never have deserted her and that Melanie's loyalty had been one of the most marvelous experiences in her colorful and tumultuous life.

Loyalty, difficult as it may be to most of us, pays in the long run. If we

can be loyal in the face of no matter what odds, we shall be repaid if only in the strengthening of our own characters. I sometimes think that true loyalty is belief in one's fellow man and in one's own instinctive judgment, and beyond and above that, in God. I know I have learned in a very hard school that I would far rather be loyal and find that the object of my loyalty had failed me than go about suspecting my fellow man of motives and dishonesty in friendship. For if ten fail, one will not fail. And that one is worth all the suffering caused by the others.

FROM Hollywood one hears that Robert Taylor possesses the gift of being loyal. He, as we all know, became famous overnight. His friends are the stars whom once he watched flicker in shadow across a screen as one of the audience. He is popular among them, success and his own personality constitute an unbeatable recipe for popularity, but it is said of him that he still feels closer to the friends of his less spectacular days. He has his former classmates come to Hollywood and watch him on the set. When he was first starting out in pictures he roomed with a lad who shared his dreams and ambitions . . . dreams which came true for Mr. Taylor but not for his friend. But he did not forget. Taylor procured for him the position of stand-in.



What You Can Learn From The Stars

Robert Taylor's loyalty is a shining light in Glamtown

In his early starring days Robert Taylor did not like to be alone. He liked to take trips, he could afford the time and he could of course ask any one of a dozen "names" in Hollywood to go with him. But he didn't. He chose, invariably, one of the friends who used to go with him, when each could afford, as far as finances went, a junket to the beach only.

Years ago, when Mr. Taylor's stu-

dio sent him to the Texas Centennial and again when he went to Omaha, a publicity man went along to fend off the crowds of avid people who almost destroyed the young star. It was just a job to him . . . and perhaps a little less fending-off would have been, from his viewpoint, better publicity. But he was loyal to Robert Taylor, and Robert Taylor, recognizing this quality and grateful for it, appreciated it deeply.

LONG AFTER Bob Taylor's screen career has ceased to pay dividends, the star will know the warmth of real friendships built upon his loyalty

His own loyalty to the friends of his other era will pay him enormous dividends as time goes on. He may long remain the brilliant star he is now. He may not. The public is as veering as the wind. Sometimes it tires. It is not as loyal as Mr. Taylor. A few bad pictures or a few bad roles at any time may harm his career. Any one of a number of other factors may damage—or even destroy—his career without a moment's notice.

But Robert Taylor knows, I think, that if his career is curtailed, or even if it fails entirely, he will still have his friends, those who appreciate the quality of his loyalty—and return it.

"HIGH SIERRA" is an intensely dramatic story of the weaknesses and strength of Public Enemy Number One, the last of the Dillinger gang. Humphrey Bogart enacts this story of Roy Earle with deep conviction.

The story begins with Earle (Bogart) being pardoned from a life term in prison, after serving only six years of his sentence. His former boss has

obtained the pardon through bribery. Bogart is sent to California, where his first assignment is to hold up a swank resort. En route he meets a family driving west in a dilapidated car. They are "Ma" and "Pa" and their crippled granddaughter, Velma. Earle helps them out, and falls in love with Velma, a youngster of twenty (Joan Leslie). They separate; Earle meets his gang at a mountain hideaway. Here he also meets Marie (Miss Lupino), a dime-a-dance hostess.

Meantime, Earle has discovered Velma does not love him, turns to Marie. When the robbery finally comes off, Earle is fatally wounded.

Bogart's fine portrayal is his best in some time. Ida Lupino is vital and absorbing in her devotion to him.

HERE is another story of the refugees in Europe and their trials and tribulations, but it isn't just another story—it is the best to date!

"So Ends Our Night" not alone is suspenseful entertainment, that brings lumps even to masculine throats, but it establishes a new actor, young Glenn Ford, as headed for eventual solo stardom. Of course, Ford is most capably surrounded by Fredric March, Margaret Sullavan, and Frances Dee,

and likewise has the support of Eric von Stroheim and Anna Sten, but mark young Ford as a comer. He steals many scenes.

"So Ends Our Night" is practically a line-to-line transfer of the serialized novel, "Flotsam," to the screen. For those who did not read the story, it concerns principally three refugees: Fredric March, banned from Germany because of his political beliefs; Margaret Sullavan, with no passport because she is a Jewess, and Ford, who is pushed around from Germany to Czechoslovakia to Austria and back again, because in his blood there is a Semitic strain. Meet Mr. KITTY FOYLE

Meet Mr. Morgan, who had everything but a good break

BIG BREAK for Dennis Morgan was part with Ginger Rogers (above) in "Kitty Foyle"

THE story is told how Charlie Chaplin, taking Paulette Goddard out to dinner one evening while he was cutting "The Dictator," met Gary Cooper and Sandra Shaw in a restaurant. Charlie, shaking hands with Gary, nodded towards Paulette. "Oh," he murmured, "are you acquainted with my wife, Miss Goddard?"

Gary glanced at him quickly. "Well, yes," he responded drily after a moment, "I believe I am. We've been working together in 'North West Mounted Police' every day for several weeks now."

That incident, which actually happened, has nothing whatever to do with this story except to show how absent-minded Hollywood can sometimes become when immersed in its own affairs. Charlie Chaplin, completely engrossed in his own picture, had altogether forgotten that his wife was working in another picture, much less which one and with whom. In the same way Hollywood itself, frantically searching for possibilities to fill the shortage of leading men, forgot all about Dennis Morgan. For two solid years he was on the salary list of the biggest studio in the industry and

begging for a chance to do something, so nobody knew he was there.

Dennis himself blames that largely upon the size of the studio. On the day he arrived the producer who signed him had forgotten he was coming, and after that, although his paycheck was always delivered on the dot, nobody took any notice of him. He had been brought to Hollywood as a singer, largely because of the hit he made at the Palmer House in Chicago and subsequently on the radio, but M-G-M kept him mute. Dennis has his own idea about the reason for that.

"I really was just a bogeyman for Nelson Eddy," he asserts a bit resentfully. "You see, whenever he threatened to get temperamental, they threatened to trot me out of the closet to sing in his place. Apparently it didn't matter that I wasted two years of my life in that closet and that it was stuffy in there. I was being paid and that, of course, made it all right. In addition, the studio was so big, with so many big stars, big directors, big producers and big executives that an unknown like me just naturally got lost."

That isn't quite true, however, be-

cause Dennis did get one role at M-G-M, or at least it started out to be a role. At the time, the studio was making "The Great Ziegfeld," and one day Dennis was told that he had been chosen for the biggest spot in the biggest sequence of that biggest extravaganza. It was the "Pretty Girl Is Like a Melody" number, which alone cost \$250,000 to film, and undoubtedly everybody who saw it recalls that sky-high revolving pyramid of pretty girls, all photographed in Technicolor with Virginia Bruce and a man singing that lovely song on the very top.

Dennis was tremendously enthused when he learned that he was to be the man who virtually starred in the number. All his disappointment since coming to Hollywood, all his mental chafe from that closet, disappeared immediately he knew he was going to have a chance. He practised singing the song day and night, at length recorded it with a full orchestra, and then that resplendent sequence was photographed with him lip-singing to a playback of his own recording.

It took days to shoot that one number, which was really the climax to the whole film, and during all that time Dennis was in his glory. Long shots, close-ups, dolly shots, crane shots, every kind of shots were shot and shot—and then, when the picture was previewed, Dennis nosedived from the top of the pyramid into the lowest depths of the deepest Hollywood storm drain. For what audiences saw of him was just a full-dress dummy in a long shot—a dummy who might just as well have been any extra or even Charlie McCarthy, and what they heard was this anonymous and indeterminate dummy lip-singing to Allan Jones' voice.

Dennis' close-ups, as well as the recording which he had made after so much practise and with so much care, were left in that yawning grave of so many Hollywood hopes, some-

where on the cutting-room floor.

Shortly after that Dennis asked for his release from his contract and got it. The M-G-M executives were very nice indeed and explained that they had no wish to exercise their legal right to keep Dennis if he thought he could be happier elsewhere. Just the same they shook their heads. After all, Dennis had never before had salary checks like those he was drawing, and especially for doing nothing.

"I want to sing," Dennis told them obstinately.

AT THAT time, as a matter of fact, he wasn't actually Dennis Morgan at all, because, as yet, nobody had got around to making an Irishman of him. Altogether he's been christened three times so far, once just after he was born and then each time he went to a different studio, and while at M-G-M he was still known as Stanley Morner, which happens to be his real name. At Paramount, where he went next, he became Richard Stanley, he played two gangster roles, and it was only after he went on to Warner Bros., his present studio, that the inventive Jack Warner, upon learning that Dennis' father is Swedish and his mother Scotch and Dutch, figuratively stuck a shamrock in his buttonhole, broke a shillalah over his head, and slid him down the celluloid ways as Dennis Morgan.

That launching brought him luck because, after playing a lot of minor roles in distinctly minor pictures, he was recently borrowed by RKO to become Mr. Kitty Foyle opposite Ginger Rogers. He considers that his first decent break since Hollywood called and then hung up, although he's still waiting for his first real singing role. However, he recalls philosophically that many other people have had much the same experiences in Hollywood as he, notably Deanna Durbin, who was also a non-starter at M-G-M. Now Hollywood

concedes that Deanna can sing too. Anyway, as Dennis Morgan he's apparently found his correct numerical combination, and pretty soon, no doubt, the publicity boys will discover that he is a lineal descendant of Sir Harry Morgan, the famous buccaneer, and have him believing it himself.

Meanwhile, and just to keep the record straight before the inevitable happens, Dennis is six feet two at 195 pounds—not because of any swash-buckling, plank-walking privateers but because the trees grow tall and sturdy in the North Woods country around Prentice, Wisconsin, where his father, Frank Morner, was in the lumber business, though by no means the lumber baron which Hollywood has already made him and which erroneous impression Dennis is himself the first to correct. Actually, he recalls, his family went broke in the depression of 1929, at which time Dennis, then nineteen years old, was going to Carroll College, studying dramatics and, of course, with those shoulders, playing on the football team. Also he was even then paying court to pretty Lillian Vedder, his high-school sweetheart, whom he married when he was twenty-three. They have two children, Stanley, Jr., now six, and Kirsten, three, and among all the Hollywood passion flowers, where'er he may roam, Lillian is still Dennis' first and only love. He thinks there's no place like home because, since they were married, Lillian and he have taken the jumps together.

During school vacations Dennis swung an ax side by side with the lumberjacks in the woods, slept with them in the bunkhouse and ate as many hot cakes for breakfast as they did. They were tough guys and he got into innumerable fights with the more quarrelsome of them, all of which, he believes, taught him to take it on the chin like a man when he got to Hollywood. The northern woods, he declares, are a lot less brutal than the corner of Sunset and Vine, say, even if the latter is more subtle.

However, Dennis never had any real desire for the great open spaces, even if, when the financial debacle hit the old homestead, he did go to Milwaukee looking for a job as a lumber-cruiser. He had always wanted to be a singer and fate was looking after him, although at the time he couldn't have dreamed it, when instead of the timberman's job he wound up in a radio station as a combination singer and announcer, sports broadcaster, midnight record-player and poetic narrator—all because, while still at college, he had sung on the glee club and then toured the Middle West in a tabloid version of *Faust*.

DENNIS remained in Milwaukee, spending his thirty-five dollars a week mostly for lessons at the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music, for eighteen months. Then, believing himself ready for the bigger time and anxious to earn enough money to get married, he went to Chicago. He still doesn't think much of Chicago.

"Chicago is civilization with its pants down," he said. "It's the worst place in the world to be broke."

Dennis really shouldn't feel that way about Chicago, because, although he had a pretty tough time at first, Chicago was good to him. After some weeks of shuttling indiscriminately between church choirs and cocktail lounges, singing in the one and being master of ceremonies in the other at ten dollars an appearance, he connected with a dance band just opening an engagement at the famous old Palmer House. He remembers very

vividly the New Year's Eve when he did his first lip-singing there, the reason then being simply because the merrymakers were raising such a din that he didn't see any sense in straining his vocal cords for nothing.

"I was supposed to be a featured soloist," he reminisced, "and I followed several other acts which laid eggs one after another because nobody paid any attention to them. So, instead of singing, I just walked about the floor moving my lips without making a sound. A couple, seeing me make gestures but not hearing anything, stopped dancing to listen, and soon several other couples followed their example. By that time the orchestra had reached the end of the number and, since I could be heard now, I let 'em have it. I just hit the last note of the song, hit it high and held it true, and they applauded as though I had been a

Caruso. After that I had to sing seven numbers one after another, and during any one of them you could have heard a pin drop, right there in the Empire Room on New Year's Eve. I was a hit overnight and I stayed there for a solid year, then went back for a return engagement at three times my original salary."

HE DIDN'T wait anything like that solid year to get married, though. He called up Lillian as soon as he got his first check and they both took a chance—in Chicago.

It was during his more affluent days, but still in Chicago, when Dennis was "discovered" by Mary Garden, Chicago's favorite opera star. Dennis was still at the Palmer House, he had appeared with some success at the State-Lake Theater, and he was now also on a Coast-to-Coast radio hook-up as

vocalist on a "Singing Strings" program. Mary Garden wanted to put on her perennial *Carmen* and persuaded Dennis that opera was his forte. He was quite willing, but Miss Garden's financial arrangements fell through and the show never was produced. However—and after Dennis had worked himself almost to a shadow learning the whole opera in two weeks so that he could audition three arias for her—Miss Garden herself, descending from the sublime to the ridiculous, as she phrased it, suggested that Dennis should become a singing star in motion pictures.

"Hollywood needs you," Miss Garden assured him. "Those who can sing out there can't act and those who can act can't sing. I'm sure you would be a sensation because you can do both."

And this time something did ma-

"BACK STREET," film version of the Fannie Hurst novel of the other woman, who spends her life in the back street of her lover's heart, brings together for the first time in their careers Charles Boyer and Margaret Sullavan. In an earlier film version of the same story Irene Dunne and John Boles played the leading roles. Highlighted over the years from 1898 to 1930, it meant months of toil and trouble for technicians, beginning with Muriel King, who designed Miss Sullavan's clothes for the different periods, to the tenth assistant property man. Miss King found it necessary to go back for inspiration and technical accuracy to magazines of the period, to sketches by Gibson, Du Maurier

and Boldoni made at the time. Two hundred horses — dray, carriage, hansom-cab, tally-ho and riding — were used in the production. They required special stabling, special handlers and special harness-makers to assure authentic trappings and equipment. Property men also had to round up for the period sequences: early automobiles, carriages, bicycles, hacks and other trivia. Filming of the Vanderbilt Cup auto races was under the direction of famed auto-racer Barney Oldfield. 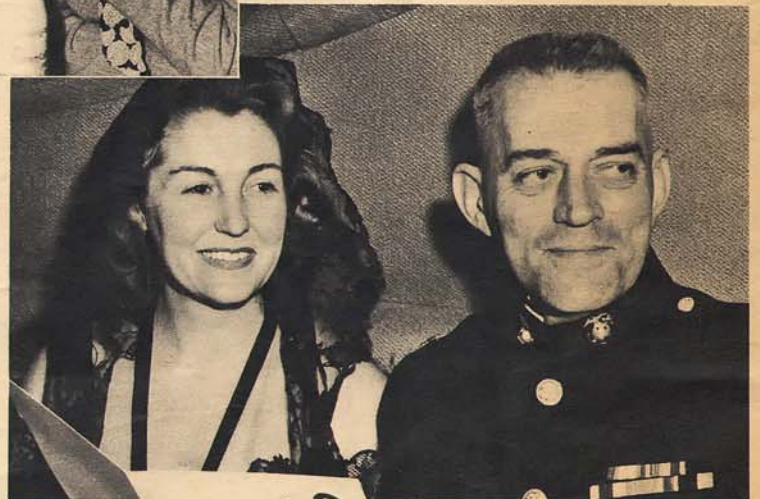

"Tristan and Isolde," besides being a powerful and tragic music drama, contains some of the most beautiful love music ever written. The "Liebestod" or "Love Death," Isolde's aria that ends the work, is a supremely thrilling apotheosis of love and death and one of the truly great experiences of music, particularly as it is sung by Kirsten Flagstad. Equally wonderful is the second act, one long, ecstatic love duet. The time of the opera is during the legendary King Arthur days, and the plot is the never-aging one of the eternal triangle. The first act is laid aboard a ship which is bearing to her bridegroom the Irish princess Isolde, kidnaped by the Cornish knight Tristan as a bride for his uncle, King Mark of Cornwall. He had previously killed Isolde's betrothed in a war against Ireland, had been wounded and nursed back to life by Isolde. They had fallen in love without revealing it to each other. On the ship, Tristan, loyal to King Mark, refuses to come near Isolde, who tells

Brangaene the story and rages bitterly against Tristan. Finally she summons him, and orders Brangaene to prepare a poisoned drink for them both. However, Brangaene secretly switches the poison for a love potion, and, as sailors shout of the arrival of the ship, Tristan and Isolde are in each other's arms, oblivious to what is happening.

Act II takes place in the garden of King Mark's castle. He is off on a hunting expedition led by Tristan's false friend, Melot. The lovers meet while Brangaene keeps watch on the ramparts. Melot bursts in with the king, who reproaches Tristan sadly. Melot, unable to control his rage, stabs Tristan. In the last act, Tristan's devoted follower, Kurvenal, has taken him back to Tristan's ruined castle in Brittany. He lies on a battlement under a big tree, delirious from the pain of his wound. Kurvenal has sent for Isolde, and a shepherd is on the watch for the ship, blowing his pipe gaily as he sees it approaching. Tristan rises from his couch, tears off the bandages and totters to meet Isolde, who runs to him. He dies in her arms. A second ship arrives bearing King Mark, who has come to forgive and unite the lovers, but Kurvenal, misunderstanding, attacks the party, kills Melot and is himself slain. Isolde sinks down over the body of Tristan and dies singing the glorious "Liebestod."

This is a queerly mixed program, with a little bit of everything included. The Brahms symphony is the most interesting and enjoyable work on the list, and well worth your time. Premiered in 1883, it is the clearest, least complicated and possibly most lyrical of all the four Brahms symphonies, with melodies which you will hum if you hear them enough, especially the third movement. The Liszt piece is the last of his thirteen symphonic poems, written in 1883, three years before his death, and has not been heard in this country for many years. The "Dances of Marosszek" are by the contemporary Hungarian composer, Zoltan Kodaly, famous for his research into Hungarian folk music. Marosszek is a town in Transylvania, formerly part of Hungary (and maybe now Roumania—I haven't read the papers this morning). The dances were originally written for piano and

transcribed on Toscanini's suggestion for orchestra. He premiered the work in 1930 in New York.

It is character alone which can make us free."

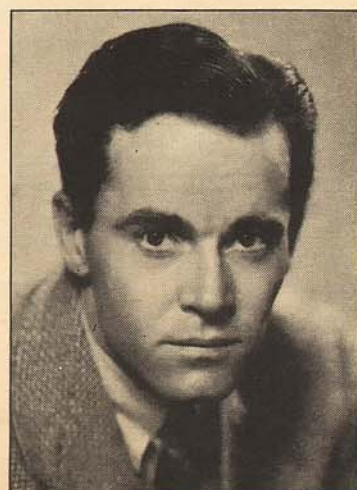

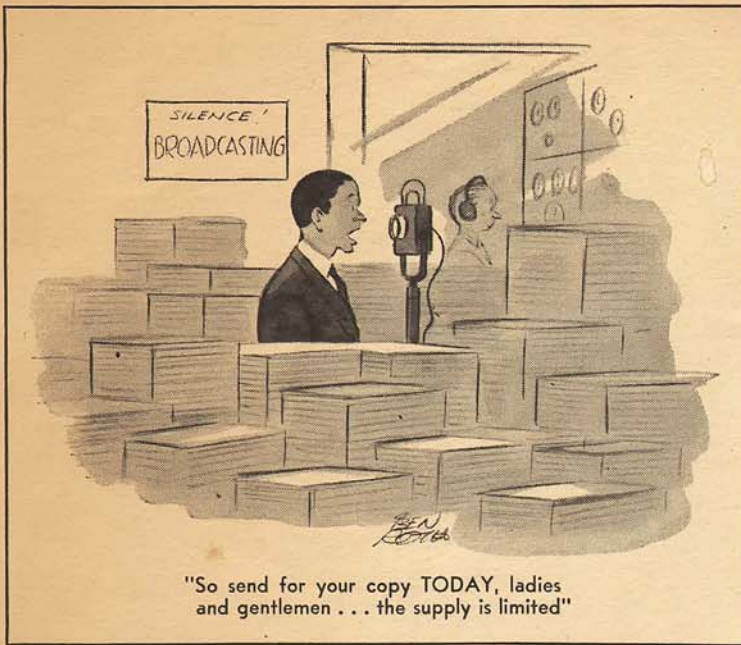

Carol is the serial's real heroine. Big money and nation-wide renown
leave the "Quiz Kids" just kids

HIT show of 1940, one of the natural winners in all radio history is "Quiz Kids" (Wed., NBC). This isn't news, but there are some facts which bring the phenomenon up to date. On the air only about eight months, the program has probably garnered more unsolicited nation-wide publicity than any radio program in history over a comparable period. In one recent week the "Quiz Kids" rated five big national magazines. They've been publicly toasted by Mrs. Roosevelt, Winchell, numerous radio personalities, even Bugs Baer. Now they're to appear soon in Paramount short subjects. There's a nationally syndicated column, "Beat the Quiz Kids." Their stamp is appear-

ing on toys and kids' clothing. About fifty children between the ages of seven and fifteen have appeared thus far on the show, earning a total of some \$17,000 in government bonds. Almost all the earnings are being saved for future education, though nearly all the children are of families in moderate or even poor circumstances. The contestants have all come from the Chicago area, but plans soon to be put in operation will expand the source-area. Many nationalities have been represented; and on several programs Protestant, Catholic and Jewish children rubbed elbows. The beauty of it all: They're almost without exception real kids, wholesome, unspoiled.

ON THE BANDWAGON

BAND OF THE WEEK belongs to Charlie Spivak, one-time trumpeter for such famous bandmasters as Ben Pollack, Bob Crosby, Ray Noble and the brothers Dorsey. Later he organized his own outfit, pictured here, has been playing at the Glen Island Casino and is heard frequently over NBC wires

BECAUSE none of his family took an interest in music, Charlie Spivak decided that the family honor demanded he become a musician. The only disagreement resulting from this decision was in the choice of instruments, his father wanting him to learn to play the violin. Charlie, however, preferred the trumpet. (P. S. Charlie won.) It was a tiny thing, that trumpet, so small in fact that you could almost push the first valve down with your nose. But then Charlie was a small lad at that time, so to a certain degree it served its purpose. Later he acquired a better one and also a bunch of phonograph records of popular bands, whose trumpeters he would imitate. It was this sort of training which prepared Spivak for his first job with a New Haven, Conn., band. Charlie, incidentally, was born in New Haven, on February 17, 1912. In 1920 (a year after his first professional job) he got an opportunity to play in a nationally known orchestra, when Paul Specht came to town and happened to hear him play. Since then he has played with some of the best bands in the country. Among them were Ben Pollack's, Ray Noble's, the Dorsey brothers', Jack Teagarden's, Bob Crosby's, Richard Himber's, etc. Following his association with Jack Teagarden, Charlie organized his own outfit, picking choice men and rehearsing them for months. His first engagement was as a relief band for Glenn Miller at the Hotel Pennsylvania in New York. But no longer is his band a fill-in, as it has become a feature attraction wherever it plays. The orchestra, posing in the picture above lines up as follows: Front row

Charlie's success as a bandleader undoubtedly stems out of his close association with the greats of the band world. By playing alongside Glenn Miller, Bob Crosby, Jack Teagarden, Ray Bauduc, Nattie Matlock and others, he acquired the skill and knowledge needed to become a good musician, and, later, a good bandleader. News from the Music Front

ALTHOUGH the lights of art and culture have not gone out completely over Europe, they are dimming rapidly, and recent reports from what were once great capitals of music and art make one heartsick, if perhaps a little more aware of just how fortunate we are over here.

In London the famous Promenade concerts under Sir Henry Wood had to be stopped because of bombing. Symphony performances are at a minimum, but very popular are the concerts organized by Myra Hess, noted pianist (well known to American audiences), in the air raid shelter under the National Gallery. Piano and song recitals and chamber-music are given every day between one and two p.m. by first-class artists who volunteer their services. The concerts are patronized by all types of people. Other artists perform in the large shelters around London. Bombing has badly damaged the famous London Guildhall School of Music, training place for many famous musicians, and the windows of Queen's Hall, London's renowned concert hall, were blown out by a bomb. The news item about the latter read, "A Bach concert scheduled for the following Saturday afternoon, it was feared, would have to be postponed, but repairs were made in time for it to take place."

From France a few facts have leaked out via Switzerland about musical conditions in the occupied zone. Concerts and opera have started again in Paris to entertain the numerous German officials and functionaries. All Jews have been forbidden to perform. Catalogs of all French recording firms have been seized and the records, as well as record matrices, of all Jewish artists have been destroyed. These include records of such people as Heifetz, Měnuhin, Rubinstein, etc. No Frenchman may perform either Italian

or German music, especially Wagner, and all programs must be approved by a special commission. Many French musicians were killed in the blitzkrieg, and still others are in German prison camps. Among those who died was Maurice Jaubert, composer of the scores of many successful French movies shown over here. Wanda Landowska, world's best-known harpsichordist, favorite of record collectors, is living in a small Pyrenees village in occupied territory, her marvelous collection of ancient instruments and manuscripts left behind in Paris. Germaine Lubin, French dramatic soprano, was forbidden by the Germans to leave France.

In Spain, concerts are plentiful but suffer for lack of soloists and first-rate conductors. And from Finland comes word that the concert season in the much-bombed capital, Helsinki, is flourishing, incredibly enough.

And if you like it well enough to want to listen to it again, a new Victor recording of it is at your disposal, by the Philadelphia Orchestra, Eugene Ormandy conducting and Emanuel Feuermann playing the solo cello

Musician of the Week

Lauritz Melchior

He's sung 176 Tristans, but he'd like to sing "Pagliacci"

EVERY year around this time the newspapers report on how many Tristans Lauritz Melchior has sung to date. This appears as regularly as the American League's batting averages and the choice of an all-American football team. For Melchior is a record-breaker in the field of Wagnerian opera. In keeping with tradition, it is this writer's solemn duty to inform Mr. Melchior's panting public that after this Saturday's performance (see listing, p. 14) he will have sung 176 Tristans. Despite this, he is still sound in wind and limb, and looks good for another 176 performances. However, he'd like to sing something else for a change, like "Otello" or "Pagliacci," which he sang in Europe with great success. These are star roles at the Metropolitan of Martinelli, who, believe it or not, has yearned for years to sing Tristan. (He finally did last year in Chicago.) The Met would have something if they'd let the two tenors swap their roles once in a while. Kleinchen Melchior, Lauritz' wife, thinks it would be a nice change, too, and think of all the fun she'd have picking out the costumes. Kleinchen was originally christened quite prosaically "Maria," but, since marrying the Danish colossus, everyone, from elevator boys up and down, calls her Kleinchen (Little One). Kleinchen is undoubtedly one of the prettiest women this side of Hollywood or anywhere else. She was for some years in films, was known as the German Mary Pickford, and even now, whenever she sticks her beautiful nose over the California border, is pursued by movie offers, which she cheerfully turns down. Sixteen years ago she jumped out of an airplane and her parachute landed in Melchior's garden. His heart and her movie career stood still, and since then she has been trotting happily along wherever

Melchior led, loving every minute of it and radiating an enthusiasm that dazzles the spectator. She has learned to cope with anything, from shooting "boofalo," as she calls it, to bargaining quite capably over a contract. She handles all her husband's business affairs, dictates his letters, makes his appointments and shoos away nuisances. She goes to every one of his performances and either stays in the

back of the opera house with the standees, applauding like mad, or bounces in and out of the dressing-room. She always gives her husband a final pat before he goes on stage and yells a lusty "Hals und Beinbruch," which means "I hope you break your neck and legs," a solemn German good-luck wish. She is an excellent hostess, plays a good game of bridge, and is equally at home cooking hamburgers in the bar of their apartment after a performance or giving state dinners to Danish royalty, when she dons an impressive diamond tiara and the manner of a regal dowager. Through it all she manages to look unbelievably beautiful, with a satiny skin, curly brown hair, twinkly dark eyes, a perfect size-twelve figure.

The Melchiors live in a rambling apartment in an ancient New York hotel beloved of musicians. Kleinchen's mother, Mrs. Hacker, known as Mutti, supervises the household and also tends to the fan mail, although her English is sketchy and she makes mistakes like addressing a six-foot football player as "Miss." Feature of the apartment is the bar, complete with red-leather wall seats, tables, and red-and-white peasant linen curtains. The apartment is overflowing with hunting trophies, a large stuffed eagle glaring at you as you come in. Here Lauritz Melchior and his diminutive wife live—comfortably and happily.—Viva Liebling.

terialize, for it was Mary Garden who eventually introduced Dennis to the M-G-M executives in New York and persuaded them to make the screen test of him, upon the strength of which he was given his dead-end contract. To this day Dennis hasn't quite made up his mind whether to be grateful for that or not.

"As soon as I had my contract," he said, "I got an idea. I thought it would be nice, and incidentally a lot cheaper, if Lillian and I and the baby drove out to the Coast. I bought a big old bus and, in our innocence, we started cross-country. We went broke at El Paso."

With the last money they had Dennis and Lillian adjourned to a roadside cafe and bought themselves a stiff drink to decide what they should do now. They were sitting there talking things over pretty disconsolately when a rancher came in and, overhearing them, pulled out a roll of bills as big as his ten-gallon hat.

"Here, take this to tide you over," he said, casually peeling off a green-back with a cipher for each of Dennis' bulging eyes, "you can pay it back whenever it's convenient."

That is the first debt which Dennis squared with the first Hollywood money he got, but before that could happen another jolt awaited him. He reported at the studio as instructed, his contract was okayed as he expected, and then he found out just what funny things can happen in Hollywood.

"Of course," smiled the executive with whom he was talking now, "all motion-picture contracts are drawn for forty weeks of work each year, with a layoff period of twelve weeks at the studio's discretion. Because we haven't anything for you to do just yet we're going to begin your contract with the layoff period."

Which meant only that Dennis began his Hollywood career with twelve weeks of no pay, during which time he couldn't work anywhere else, either. Somehow he and Lillian survived that endless three months.

"During my thirty months at M-G-M," he said, "I was given a trifling role as an orchestra-leader in 'Mamma Steps Out,' that dummy part in 'Ziegfeld,' and one appearance in a short. The studio was nice to me, they said they thought they could use me, but that time never came. I spent two and a half years trying to earn the money they paid me, but I became restless and nervous from waiting. Everybody told me I was crazy when I walked out; however, I don't think so."

The actual break came when studio officials refused him permission to appear in "The Student Prince," which was being produced by the Civic Repertory Company and the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra.

As a result of his appearance in "The Student Prince" Dennis did get a chance—but again no chance to sing. A Paramount producer who saw him unhesitatingly signed him to another contract, and six months of this netted Dennis his first name-change and the two gangster roles, but before he could really get his teeth into anything solid, either dramatic or vocal, one of those ever-recurrent studio blitzkriegs came along and bombed the producer, no less, clear out of his swivel chair. That meant curtains for Dennis at Paramount, too.

Dennis wasn't exactly despondent.

By now he had saved a bit of money and he had reached a decision. Hollywood was no good—not for him, anyway. So he and Lillian and the two babies would pack up and go back to Chicago, back to New York, back to anywhere he could sing.

He was so happy in this resolve that he himself was singing in his dressing-room as he packed up his belongings there preparatory to leaving the lot. There was a knock at the door, and Bill Pierce, an assistant to Producer Rogers, stuck in his head.

"Why, Stanley," he said—Dennis was still Stanley as yet, you see—"I didn't know you sang. I've a friend over at Warners who might be interested in giving you a test."

Dennis agreed to make the test, but with a proviso. He would sign with Warners, if they wanted him, only if they had a part for him.

It is a fact that Dennis Morgan, immediately after making that test and without waiting to see whether it was any good or not, shook the dust of Hollywood from off his feet and went to Milwaukee, where he previously had been the all-around radio announcer, for personal appearances. But no sooner had he arrived than he had to turn around and go right back again because Jack Warner wired cryptically, "Report Monday, picture starts Tuesday."

AND it did. More, other pictures began as soon as that one was finished, and Dennis, who by now had been baptized for, he hopes, the last time, appeared in no less than seven films in little more than as many months, including "Three Cheers for the Irish," "Flight Angels," and most recently, "River's End," in which he first blossomed forth as a full-fledged leading man, playing a dual role at that. He asked for work and he got it, and if after making him an Irishman his first job was to portray a Scotch cop—well, that's Hollywood and those things don't bother Dennis Morgan.

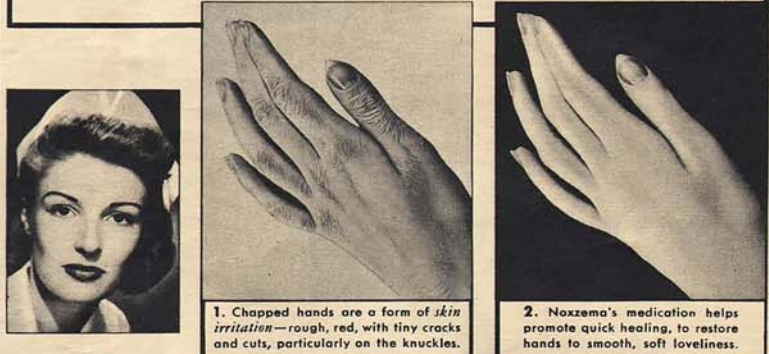
However, he's still waiting for his chance to sing. Outside of a few little ditties which he has been permitted to hum in a few little pictures he hasn't realized that ambition yet, but since his work in "River's End" got him his break in "Kitty Foyle" he has hopes, with his eye particularly upon "Rio Rita," "The Desert Song" and "The Student Prince." Already he has been mentioned as a possibility for all three, and so perhaps he won't have much longer to wait before he gets his real wish—to sing.

Meanwhile—and now that his luck seems to have turned—Dennis is fairly content to sing at home until he can do so on the screen. Between songs he plays tennis and golf, takes his family to the mountains or to the beach as the seasons come and go, and doesn't take Hollywood too seriously. He has his feet pretty solidly upon the ground, likes to shuffle them at the Coconut Grove rather than the newer and more fashionable night-spots, and looks like a gridiron version of Bing Crosby.

After batting—and battling—around in Hollywood for the past five years as he has, his sudden popularity hasn't affected Mr. Morgan. All his trials and tribulations have taught him a lot, and among the things he has learned two are outstanding. One is just how cockeyed Hollywood can be when it wants to have fun with haystacks instead of looking for needles, and the other is that it's a lot easier to sing in a bathtub than in a swimming-pool.

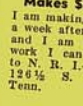
