Movie-Radio Guide's Award of Merit to "MYRT and MARGE"

NOVEMBER 2, 1931, was indeed a fateful day for three people. The three were Myrtle Vail, her husband, George Damerel, and her daughter, Donna Damerel. To them it meant that the pendulum had swung back, a pendulum which had swung heavily in the opposite direction on another day in 1929 when the stock market crash swept away

the Damerels' family fortune. Yet if it hadn't been for the stock crash the chances are that Myrtle Vail today would still be a housewife in Illinois instead of living in New York and acting the part of Myrt in the serial "Myrt and Marge."

Myrtle Vail, who at an early age had gone on the stage, and shortly afterward married George Damerel, had often dreamed of being able to retire from show business and settle down in a little house where she could play a more lifelike role -that of mother and housewife. In 1927 this dream became a reality when the Damerels decided that they had saved enough money to buy a home and, incidentally, invest the rest in income-producing real estate.

However, the stock crash two years later ruined the Damerels' real-estate development and made necessary the step which Myrt finally took.

That step was to sit down and

write out a series of radio scripts based on life behind

the footlights. Myrt used to write the family's vaudeville skits and so had a modicum of experience. With a new fall outfit, procured through the pawning of her engagement ring, the erstwhile housewife secured an appointment with an official of the company which was to become her first sponsor. Three weeks later, on November 2, 1931, "Myrt and Marge" made its debut on the air. Both Myrt, who played the part of a mother, and Donna, who played her daughter, had never seen a microphone

until a few days previous to their radio debut. Since that November day more than 2,650,000 words have poured into Myrt's typewriter.

Award of Merit

Last February the sudden death of her daughter Donna, who was Marge of the script,

brought deep personal tragedy to Myrt and the young actress' numerous friends. But true to the tradition of the stage, the mother decided that the show must go on. To play the part of Marge, several hundred appli-

cants were auditioned. From among them Helen Mack, of the movies, was selected. Said Myrt: "I feel as though she could be a daughter of mine."

Myrtle Vail's little cross-section of backstage theatrical life is now in its eleventh year on the air. Her amazingly productive talent has provided the spark of life and reality which stamps "Myrt and Marge" as out of the ordinary. Her courage has enabled her to overcome the tragedy of a daughter's death, to "go on with the show." Her fine apprecia-

tion of others has smoothed the way for Helen Mack. For these qualities, and because her serial story consistently has been one of radio's best, Movie-Radio Guide is proud to present its Award of Merit to Myrtle Vail and her series.

does little dancing, portrays most vividly a tough young wife who accepts a murder charge on a reporter's promise of national publicity and a vaude-

ville headlining tour. But while en-sconced in jail awaiting her trial, Roxie's thunder is somewhat stolen by one Velma Wall (played by Helene Fortescue Reynolds), who has killed her husband.

Roxie becomes furious at Velma, and at her first chance tries to slap her down—as the picture above shows. The jail matron intervenes and bangs Roxie's and Velma's heads together and they are knocked out, cold. A sample scene, this is typical of the powerful dramatic situations in the film "Roxie Hart."

Followers of the Ginger Rogers career, highlighted by her first Academy Award last February, will rave anew at the fire and even greater dramatic ability Miss Rogers displays in her new screen vehicle for 20th —E. Р. Century-Fox.

Returning to the type of role for which he is famous, Jimmy Cagney portrays a

tough, two-fisted bush airplane pilot in his next film, "Captains of the Clouds"

COCKY, hard-boiled Jimmy Cagney, last seen with Bette Davis as one of Hollywood's "honeymoon" pilots in the screwball comedy, "The Bride Came C. O. D.," does some real movie flying for the Royal Canadian Air Force in his soon-to-be-released Technicolor picture, "Captains of the Clouds," which also has Dennis Morgan and Brenda Marshall in the cast.

Unique and thrilling, this brilliant film is the story of the pilots who are coming out of the "bush country" of northern Canada to fly against the Luftwaffe for the Royal Canadian Air

"Captains of the Clouds" is an accurate account of Canada's flying men. It was filmed at No. 2 Air Service Training Station, Uplands, Ontario, and in the war zone itself in Halifax. Here the scenes depicting the departure of planes across the Atlantic Ocean to join England's fighting air force were made. Stunt pilots had to be especially cautious about approaching the war air base. Gun crews there have instructions to shoot down any plane flying higher than two thousand

While a thousand pilots stood at attention, the Dominion's great World War hero, Air Marshal W. A. (Billy) Bishop, appeared before the camera as himself for the opening scenes of "Captains of the Clouds."

Warners went to Canada with the full cooperation of a government at war to make a picture of its fighting air force. The location trip was an experience for every member of the cast, just as seeing the picture will be a thrilling experience for every moviegoer. The Hollywoodites made friends with officers and fighter pilots who today-a few weeks later-are flying over Berlin fighting for peace and democracy! You, too, will see some of these same pilots in action in the battle-scenes.

IG tears rolled down Dinah Shore's cheeks as she stood in a New York telephone booth on New Year's Eve, 1937. She was putting in a long-distance call-collect-to her father in Nashville, Tennessee. The nickel she used to call the operator was a borrowed one.

Dinah was broke. Her courage was gone. She was

When she had left Nashville six months before she had been so sure—so gloriously certain that Dinah Shore could sing her way to fame in radio. The promise she had made to her father-to come home if she didn't make good—was an easy promise to make, then. But now, after months of heartbreaking auditions, of singing over radio station WNEW without pay, Dinah's lovely voice broke as she bowed to the final humiliation of asking for railroad fare home. Sympathetically her father assured her that he'd wire the money. Secretly he wanted with all his heart to tell her to stay on. He was proud that his daughter had not begged for more money. She had made a bargain and was sticking to it. Afraid of weakening, he hung up.

It was all fine and heroic, but afterward Mr. Shore couldn't go through with it. He couldn't let such courage down without another chance. The next day Dinah had a letter. Her father wanted her to stay, to have another try. He'd see her through.

Dinah was still in New York three years later as another New Year rolled around. But the picture had changed. The worm had turned. Dinah Shore had become a sensation, Seven hundred U.S. radio editors had just voted her 1940's outstanding radio

In 1940 Dinah had stood radio listeners on their ears. She had panicked them with her throaty, "moanin' low" songs on a new swing-music show, "The Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street." She had won over the juke-box fraternity with smash-hit recordings of "Careless" and "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes." She had crashed big-time radio with a spot on Eddie Cantor's Wednesday show.

T'S a Cinderella story, Dinah's is, but the happy ending wasn't arrived at by the glass-slipper, pumpkin-coach route. Dinah got there by the old uphill-downhill road, with plenty of heartbreak

curves to negotiate.

The road begins down in the quiet Cumberland Valley village of Winchester, Tennessee. There Dinah was born in 1917, the daughter of Mr. S. A Shore, a prosperous small-town merchant, and there, at the age of three, she made her musical debut singing "The Rose That Grows in No Man's

Land." Four years later she was strumming a ukulele, wowing woman's club meetings with such alarmingly unbabyish tunes as "I Can't Give You Anything But Love, Baby." The Shores sent Dinah to Vanderbilt University. She was graduated in 1938. In the Vanderbilt yearbook Dinah's name appears

as Fannye Rose Shore. Originally it was Fanny Rose. Somewhere along the way Dinah dispensed with her given name after long years of exposure to kidding and unfunny puns. For example, "Fanny Rose sat on a tack-and Fanny Rose."

Vanderbilt yearbook also lists a dozen or more activities for Dinah, from glee club to fencing. One not mentioned is her singing job on WSM. It was Ed Kirby, then of WSM, now on leave from his job with the National Association of Broadcasters to take over a defense job in Washington, who got her introductions to NBC and CBS in New York

JUST twenty, Dinah set out for New York with a fluttery heart. The experience was overpowering. She not only flopped in the auditions; she was so scared she couldn't open her mouth. So Miss Shore went back to finish at Vanderbilt.

A year later Dinah landed her sans-salary job on station WNEW. She worked hard. Jimmy Rich, the station's musical director, became interested and taught her many singing tricks. She taught herself by listening to playbacks of every broadcast. Looking back, Dinah says, "Those days were the most important for me. People thought it was unfair that I worked on the air without pay, but I actually pleaded for the chance." That is what is known as hindsight.

In February Dinah got her first paying job. It was with Leo Reis-man's band, playing on Broadway. Dinah was paid \$75 for her week's work but before she left the theater

Someone stole \$60 of it.

Back at WNEW she bagged an audition date from radio producer Vick Knight, who was then handling Benny Goodman's broadcast. But the audition faded into another one of those heartbreak curves as Dinah tried to compete with a ham-on-rye sandwich which, Dinah says, had maestro Goodman hypnotized at the vital moment.

Then came the "Basin Street" assignment. The record-making dates

and the personal appearances. People began to talk about that "moanin' low" voice. Her records spread like a prairie fire through the juke-box world. Broadway audiences were impressed. Suddenly the young Tennesseean was headed down a broad, smooth straightaway to success. All that she needed was a big-time radio spot. And into this perfect setting walked Eddie Cantor.

Moving his show from Hollywood to New York, the comedian needed a singer, and again Vick Knight called in Dinah. Smart showman, unafraid of new faces and new talent, Cantor leaped to the bait.

The only trouble Dinah has had since is in turn-

ing down other job offers.

Last month Dinah clinched her radio career with a broadcast of her own—Sundays over NBC. Eddie Cantor was on hand to do the honors, let loose a veritable torrent of Cantorian emotion. Eddie Cantor had played star-maker again. Now will Dinah Shore, as her predecessor, Deanna Durbin, leap from the Cantor show and her own program to even more glittering heights of stardom and wealth? It's very possible. Just keep your eyes on Dinah!-J. C.



Gene's entire "Melody Ranch" radio cast were there to do their regular Sunday broadcast from an empty flat car.





I have been asked by Movie-Radio Guide to select America's All-Laugh Radio Eleven—and nothing I've done in years has given me so much enjoyment.

Not just on Saturdays. Not just on Sundays. Not just on holidays.

Radio's All-Laugh Eleven has been in there every day, making and throwing passes at your ribs and mine.

I am making my selection on the basis that the All-Laugh Eleven has no one man who is better than any of the others. Each player is the best man in his position—and they're all stars. If you are one of those fans who like ends better than tackles or guards better than backs, that's your privilege. But, for mass attack on Uncle Sam's funnybone, I defy you to pick a finer combination.

Benny is the left end to end all left ends. He is left on the end every time Rochester calls, every time he tries to throw a bluff past Mary Livingstone, and every time he gets in a row with Phil Harris or Dennis Day.

Skelton, a comparative newcomer, is a natural tackle. He tackles bigwigs in the day's news; pokes fun at

any subject and has tackled humor with an easy-going twist that makes you wonder why nobody else ever thought of making stooges out of people like Ozzie Nelson, Harriet Hilliard and Wonderful Smith.

Fibber McGee, one of the old triplethreat, vaudeville-movie-radio artists will guard America's right to laugh as long as he keeps opening that closet door and poking Mayor La Trivia and Mrs. Uppington at the listeners. Fibber's ace play, however, is the Molly maneuver, which just about makes him perfect.

McCarthy I pick as center, only because whenever there is a fancy play (at the glamour girls) being made, Bergen's boy is in the middle of it. Charlie can think up more angles and jump through more holes than a flea in a bird-cage.

Pearce needs no introduction to guard play. His Elmer Blurt play has


been getting him past a lot of front doors in radio, and as a salesman his top product has been laughs wrapped around Artie Auerbach-to-Andy Devine-to-Lou Bring-to-Pearce.

George Burns is the tackle who makes it the hard way. Everything he tackles finds Gracie running around him in circles. This is sure-fire technique in the grandstands.

Putting Fred Allen on the right end is a trick the hecklers have been trying for years. Here is a quick-kick expert who can ad-lib his way through the Congressional Record and leave 'em laughing. Also a vaudeville-movie-radio expert, Allen tacks or a musical-comedy record that they're still talking about and he knows every joke in Mr. Miller's book by its first name. While this guy can carry the ball on his own, he is at his riotous best in a combination play with Portland Hoffa, Kenny Baker and his

Cantor in quarterback position gives us a fellow who mixes his signals between human interest, fall-guy comedy and music. He has a Discovery Play which brings out stuff like Deanna Durbin and Dinah Shore—and mixes this with a mad rushin' play that keeps the stands yelling for more.

Putting Ed Gardner in at left halfback is handing the ball to a fastmoving guy who invented the "Archie" play. This big fellow is hard to stop, especially when it comes to the celebrated New York Diction Play. He breaks up the dictionary defense like a lighted cigar in a balloon-peddler's business.

Hope springs eternal to the halfback position. This guy has a Mc-Carthy - in - the - flesh technique for making passes—and need we say what kind? His Yehudi Play is still a national pastime and he can run riot anywhere from your front parlor to an Army camp with Jerry Colonna and Skippey Fine rights picksback

and Skinnay Ennis riding pickaback.
Our fullback may come last, but far from least in the line-up. Morgan has been carrying the ball for years and there never was a shiftier guy on the air (gnarrrr), on the land (bam, bam, bam), or on the high c's (whoop, whooop, whooopop).

All in all, it's too bad there isn't some kind of Congressional Medal or Distinguished Service Medal for these eleven men.

I've always thought that one of America's prime privileges was the right to life, liberty and laughter.

And when they write the history of this present world headache, this All-American Eleven will go on the records as the crew who kept people smiling when three-quarters of the world had lost the knack.



No reason is given for Bate's replacement. Bate returned to London last May following several months in this country for rest and further treatment of injuries sustained the previous fall when an aerial bomb struck the building in which he had taken shelter during a London air-raid.

Gunther for Swing

New York.-When Raymond Gram Swing goes on a three-week holiday beginning Christmas Day, the person who will substitute for him on his radio program will in all probability be John Gunther, noted newspaperman and author, whose "Inside Europe," "Inside Asia" and his most recent work, "Inside Latin America," have all been best-sellers. Gunther will arrive in New York December 15 from London, where he has acted as a correspondent for NBC. Gunther had hoped to be able to go from London to Russia. Last year Hendrik Willem van Loon, noted author and lecturer, subbed for Swing.





Code Operators Prisoner in Libya Station Spotlighted

COPERATING in one of the greatest short-wave radio projects ever undertaken in, this country, WGEO and WGEA, powerful international stations of the General Electric Company in Schenectady, N. Y., have revised their schedules to send a continuous stream of news to Europe from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. EST six days a week. The schedule includes broadcasts by WGEA (15.33) in seven languages: Swedish, Finnish, Italian, German, French, Portuguese and Spanish, and by WGEO (9.53) in Spanish, French and English. In addition, WGEO will continue its fifteen minutes of news sent out six evenings a week in Czech and its Sunday afternoon broadcasts of news in Greek.

"Designed to present unbiased facts

and to throw light upon world events for the people of the occupied and war-torn nations, most of the broadcasts will be devoted entirely to news of the minute," said Mr. Pearce, General Electric manager of broadcasting. "A few fifteen-minute musical periods will be retained, and other periods will feature background news—that is, what the United States defense program is, progress being made, what we are doing to help Britain, the program of cooperation among the countries of the western hemisphere—any information calculated to bring listeners up to date on the world situation and to spread throughout Europe a message of hope."

WRUL Code School for Defense

Every Monday at 6:30 p.m. and again at 10:15 p.m. EST, Bill Chamberlain, WRUL's radio code teacher, sits at his key and his microphone while eager code students in many different parts of the world sit by their radios with pencils handy to take down the day's lesson.

In these days when all America is girding for national and hemisphere defense, the role of the radio operator is becoming increasingly important. Both the Army and the Navy need thousands of men qualified to send and receive the international Morse code—pilots, tank drivers and, of course, naval and merchant ship radio operators.

Through WRUL's radio school of the air—a new term has just started—students with no previous knowledge can learn code in a pleasant, easy way with a cost of only \$1.00 as a

registration fee. Since WRUL is a non-commercial and non-profit organization, this fee covers merely the cost of printing and mailing the course material. Enrollment gives the student the privilege of having his weekly tests and his final examination corrected by Mr. Chamberlain, who is code instructor for the Massachusetts State Department of Education.

Beginners are made familiar with the sounds of the dots and dashes and from there they gain familiarity and speed until after passing their final examination they can send or receive at the speed of fifteen words a minute.

This national defense World Radio University course has already enrolled students in several Latin-American countries, but this year Mr. Chamberlain hopes to have students in all of the twenty republics south of the Rio Grande as well as in all states of the United States and across Canada.

Last week Hildegarde Dolson wrote of Kate Smith's childhood and early successes on the stage up to the auspicious moment when she met and merged her fortunes with Ted Collins. This week the story continues.—The Editors

HAT was the start of a partnership that has prospered as the green bay tree for ten years. When "Flying High" closed, Collins argued NBC into giving her a trial broadcast of songs. After this epic event NBC officials were somewhat apathetic and the rival CBS network offered Kate Smith the fifteen-minute spot competing with Amos 'n' Andy. "Don't take it," a friend counseled her sagely. "That's too tough a spot for a beginner." That settled it. Kate scowled thoughtfully and accepted the CBS offer. After her first number on this new program, a group of bored musicians, idly dialing a radio in another CBS studio, dispatched a mesenger post-haste to the floor below. "Go find out who's the girl with the big voice," they instructed him tersely.

Listeners at large reacted with equal speed and flung their choicest superlatives into fan letters, which began to pour in at the rate of two hundred a day. Collins showed several of the more lyrical passages to potential sponsors. "Read 'em," he said. A cigar manufacturer read, and promptly hired the singer for a half-hour program at a tidy jump in salary to \$1,500 a week. That was in the fall of 1931. The fan letters doubled in number and fervor. A woman listener wrote in to say that as a proof of her devotion she had taken to smoking the cigars. "They are all that your announcer claims for them," she said loyally. "Mellow and full of contentment.

Those early broadcasts brought her an invitation to appear in vaudeville at New York's famous Palace Theater. Her success there held the act for eleven weeks, still the long-run record.

It was on the cigar program that Kate Smith launched her themesong, "When the Moooooooon Comes Over the Mountain." Seven years later, when it was announced that Kate Smith was to sing at the White House for the King and Queen of England, the King asked, "Isn't she the girl that sings about the moon and the mountain?"

Three years ago, local prophets shook their heads forebodingly over the news that Kate Smith would make her debut as a radio commentator. But this "Kate Smith Speaks" program recently zoomed to top ranking among daytime shows. In these five-day-a-week chats, Kate talks about patriotism, new books and spring bonnets, has lectured women sternly about hoarding silk stockings, takes hefty cracks at magazines printing naughty pictures and tells homey little anecdotes that point a moral.

Fan letters from her listeners on this program and her Friday evening hour average three thousand a week. About half are requests for money, advice, recipes, autographs or auditions. A few suggest diets or criticize Kate's habit of saying "Tm gonna."

OTHER admirers, organized into Kate Smith fan clubs, get out a mimeographed magazine filled with members' lushly worded compositions about their idol. Feature of a recent issue was "What I Would Do if Kate Smith Spent a Week-End at My Home."

Backed by this dogged loyalty, Kate Smith's name has led most of the radio polls for the past ten years with a walloping majority. During this time she has had four sponsors-La Palina cigars, Hudson cars, A. & P., and General Foods. They have paid the pretty sum of \$5,092,176 to the CBS net-work for her time on the air. Of this sum, General Foods, her sponsor since 1937, has-spent \$3,187,707. Surveys show that her biggest following is in the middle- and lower-income brackets, and that her rating among city dwellers is forty-six percent higher than in rural areas. In 1938 she was selected as one of America's ten outstanding women by the editor

of a woman's "Who's Who."

Even black-hearted cynics who fail to appreciate the charms of Radio's First Lady admit that her programs are wholesome. This determined theme of wholesomeness is summed up nicely in Kate Smith's autobiography, published several years ago. In it she says, "When we are planning a series of programs, I picture in my mind a little blue-eyed girl of four or five, sitting on her daddy's knee, listening intently to every song that is sung, every word that is uttered."

The Kate Smith variety hour hews faithfully to this line, featuring songs by the star, a dramatic skit and a comedy team. Hollywood guest stars often appear, at an average \$2,000 a throw, to play a scene from their latest movie. A press-agent explained this prettily in a recent press release. "Today Hollywood sends its brightest stars to the Kate Smith program, knowing that their sometimes slightly tarnished glamour will come away with a brighter finish for having been washed in the Kate Smith elixir." This might be news to Warner Bros.

Scripts for all Kate Smith programs are turned out by staff writers of Kated, a corporation formed by Ted Collins and Kate in 1932. Kated now pays salaries to fifty-five people weekly. This includes twelve staff members: Script-writers, press-agents and secretaries. It also covers twenty-eight orchestra members, ten chorus singers and three to seven actors, comedians and guest stars for the evening show. Approximate salaries range from \$42 for a choral singer and \$90 for a supporting actor to the \$1,000 to \$3,000 fees paid to Holly-wood guest celebrities.

Collins, as manager, handles all finances and allows his star \$350 a week as personal spending money, a sum referred to pleasantly by Kated staff members as "Katie's Coca-Cola money." Part of the \$350 goes for colored movie film and antique glass bottles. Her biggest extravagance is speedboats. At her summer home, Camp Sunshine, on Lake Placid, she pilots one of these super-jobs with a jolly, reckless abandon that makes nervous guests close their eyes and pray for sudden delivery. She also swims, golfs and plays noisily at a slot machine installed in Camp Sunshine-all proceeds to the U.S.O. In New York, Radio's First Lady rides sedately behind a chauffeur, and lets off steam by sticking her head out the side window to heckle cab drivers. "Hey, you big lug, stop blockin' traffic," she yells playfully.

Noon programs are broadcast from the star's apartment over a special CBS hook-up. After a hearty breakfast at nine, she settles down with that day's script, making revisions with the writer, and whacking out any phrases she complains of as being too "hifalutin'." When the final draft of the script is typed, longer words are written out phonetically (archeologist, for example, becomes AR-KAY-OL-O-GIST) so that Kate can pronounce the words trippingly, even if she doesn't know quite what they mean. Most of her afternoons are spent trying out songs for the next week's evening show.

EVERY Friday the entire script for that evening's show is rehearsed and timed piece by piece in an all-day workout at the Columbia studios, where Kate has her own dressing-room complete with shower and electric grill. She can read only a few notes of music, but members of her orchestra are both appalled and impressed by her musical memory, since she's apt to point out firmly that their current playing of a song varies by one note from the way they played it six years ago. "It should gone vumpee, vimptee, voom-tee-ay," she'll say reproachfully. She's always right.

Several years ago, when the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra was forty percent behind in a money-raising drive, the committee decided realistically to give a benefit beer party, with Kate Smith as the star. During rehearsals, with Stokowski conducting the orchestra, Kate kept shaking her head glumly as they played her song. They weren't getting the right doo-ah dum-dee-OOM into the closing bars, she said. Suddenly she grabbed the baton from the startled Stokowski and directed the orchestra energetically until the boys gave forth with the proper dum-dee-OOM. The beer party was a wowing success. Afterward the pleased Stokowski told Kate, "God gave you that voice. Don't let anyone change it."

As her press-agent has said, "Kate Smith is satisfied with things just as they are, perched as she is on the top rung of success." This was demonstrated at a birthday party given for the singer, when guests played a game called "Who Would You Like to Be?"

Clifton M. Utley

CHICAGO long ago spotted Clifton M. Utley as its leading foreignaffairs expert. For years, before the networks went overboard to give Americans a picture of World War II, Mr. Utley was giving clear, concise interpretations of foreign affairs over station WGN under the sponsorship of a women's clothing store. During those years he also has been director of the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations, which brings to three thousand members addresses by ambassadors and potentates of Europe, leading American international seers. Now Mr. Utley has extended his field of operations, is broadcasting to the U. S. five days a week over NBC.

But here is no provincial voice from a hinterland American city. Although a native of Chicago, Clifton Utley has been all mixed up with Europe for quite a long time. Just now he has three French refugee children as members of his family for the war's duration. Before the war he spent every summer abroad, drove his own automobile from one end of Europe to the other, poking about to get a realistic picture of what was happening. Before that he had topped his University of Chicago education with work at the University of Munich and the University of Algiers and the National University of Mexico.

As most radio commentators, Clifton Utley has a background of newspaper reporting, begun during his University of Chicago days. A double exposure to Europe and to the newspaper world gave him his bent for foreign affairs, got him his job with the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations.

But broadcasting and Council work account for only a part of his time. Besides, he finds time to deliver 150 speeches a year, edit Foreign Notes (a biweekly review of international doings), make frequent appearances on such broadcasts as "University of Chicago Round Table," "People's Platform," "Northwestern Reviewing Stand."

That doesn't leave him too much time for the Utley family, composed of two children, David, eight, and Garrick, two, in addition to the three French youngsters of Andre Philip, former member of the French Chamber of Deputies and professor at the University of Lyon—and, of course, Mrs. Utley, who is herself a radio commentator. But the hours he does

manage to squeeze in at the rambling house on Blackstone Ave. are jam - packed with excitement and fun.—J. C.



"America's Town Meeting of the Air"

TO FIVE or six million U. S. citizens there's nothing in radio quite so exciting as "America's Town Meeting." Nor quite so worth while. Well into its seventh season, the Thursday night meeting in New York's Town Hall holds most of the thrills of the arena, with leaders of national thought locked in verbal combat and 1,500 spectator-hecklers to spur them on, to put them on the spot. The showman in charge is a remarkable gentleman

mamed George V. Denny.
"Town Meeting" is Mr. Denny's
remedy for a common but un-American ailment: Our refusal to listen to the other fellow's opinion. Mr. Denny has noticed that people, generally, associate only with those people who share their own attitudes, read only those books which express their own viewpoint, buy only those newspapers which support their own prejudices. Realizing the danger to democracy apparent in this situation, Mr. Denny decided that America needed a radio

program where listeners would have to listen to more than one side of a question. He got NBC to broadcast it,

Town Hall, Inc., to manage it.
Today "Town Meeting" goes out
over one hundred NBC-Blue stations,
also over short waves. There are 1,400
Town Meeting Clubs throughout the country, conducting their own discussions after hearing the broadcast. There is a weekly parade of the nation's outstanding statesmen, scientists, businessmen, thinkers before "Town Meeting's" microphone.

"Town Meeting" is run simply, keeps close to the public pulse. Subjects are determined by moderator Denny, working with advisory pro-gram board and NBC. Once a subject is chosen, speakers secured, Mrs. Marion Carter of Town Hall sends each speaker a letter of instructions, telling how long the speech should be, suggesting points to be included so that all sides may be fully represented.

The speeches arrive, usually a day before broadcast—sometimes not until 8 o'clock on Thursday evening, straight from the speaker's perspiring hand as he dashes backstage at Town Hall. Mrs. Carter checks all speeches with Mr. Denny for time, duplications-but not censorship.

An interesting feature of "Town Meeting" is the character of the audience. Tickets are free and always are distributed with an eye to representing all points of view in the audience. Letters requesting tickets usually are a dead give-away to the writer's attitude and if it appears that the requests are running too heavily on one side, a balance is effected by selecting from organizations in Town Hall's file known to hold opposite views.

"Town Meeting" audiences are the

ace up showman Denny's sleeve. Such colorful debaters as Dorothy Thompson and "Ironpants" Hugh Johnson have created plenty of excitement, but they aren't in it with the heckling, highly articulate 1,500 guests. Mr. Denny, who has been a dramatics instructor at University of North Carolina, knows showmanship from A to Z, knows how to handle his audience.

At a preliminary meeting he gives them instructions. They may applaud or shout "No." They may not indulge in prolonged cheering or hissing. They are reminded that a spirit of fair play must always prevail, that personalities

will not be tolerated.
Obviously, the excitement and entertainment value of "America's Town Meeting" is merely a by-product. The real aim is to get the great American public to think for itself about vital national problems. And Mr. Denny's broadcast has done more to accomplish that aim than one hundred years of political bombast.

RADIO stars go all out for Santa Claus. They may be all in after they go all out, but they enjoy it all just the same.

Their broadcasts are profusely sprinkled with "shop early" admonitions and boosts for the Christmas seal drive. They join whole-heartedly in the Christmas parade on Santa Claus Lane in Hollywood and participate in

all kinds of similar stunts for the sake of Santa and the public. Many of the radio stars carry on campaigns to get toys, clothing and food donated to the poor; and their own charity keeps pace.

In addition to these special Christmas activities and the ordinary planning and shopping and decorating that go with the season, the radio stars have another once-a-year job that is pretty arduous—posing for seasonal pictures. Picture-taking, both for the publicity of the stars and for the promoting of charity campaigns, reaches its zenith at this time of the year. It really takes a lot of valuable time and energy in the cases of some of the more famous artists. But they take it all in stride in the real Christmas

spirit. Their efforts often are ludicrous or plainly posed, but the result has a deep, serious significance. The stars—especially the comedians—may "gag" the pictures, but they know it's all in a good cause. They realize that they themselves owe much to the general mood and welfare of a country where free radio entertainment can still flourish.

Mary Ann Mercer, singer on "Uncle Walter's Dog House," will tour with Bob Strong's orchestra when the latter plays a series of dance dates in the Midwest this month . . . 
Songstuff




