The Babe in the Manger

EVERY Christmas since 1933, those homespun philosophers Lum and Abner—in real life Chester Lauck and Norris Goff, respectively—have broadcast the same script about the birth of a baby in a barn to a destitute carpenter and his wife. Again this Yuletide the veteran team (pictured below) will repeat the celebrated sketch on NBC.

Because Lum and Abner have given to radio a classic, it is here printed in condensed form for the benefit of those who may wish to preserve its beautiful thoughts:

The night is cold but clear, and fresh snow covers the ground. The light of the stars shows dimly on three men walking along a country road, each carrying a large bundle. It is Lum, Abner and Grandpappy Spears.

GRANDPAP: There it is right ahead of us. We're going right, men.

LUM: Yeah, we can jist foller the east star . . . How did you find out about these folks, Grandpap?

GRANDPAP: Well, Doc Miller and his woman et supper over at our place and we was settin' there visitin' after we got done eatin' and the telephone rung and told Doc to get right on over here.

ABNER: Well, who done the callin'?

GRANDPAP: Oh, some feller named Joe sompin-another . . . Said they'd been into the county seat to pay their taxes and they weren't no room at the hotel, so they come out here to this old barn to spend the night.

LUM: And he said they was sorter 'spectin' the baby to be born tonight, huh?

GRANDPAP: Yeah, that's the reason they

called Doc Miller.

ABNER: I doggies, my arm's gittin' tired.

LUM: Well, here, let me carry them blankets a while and you can carry this oil heater. Is that box of groceries gettin' heavy, Grandpap?

GRANDPAP: No, I'm all right. We ought to be there dreckly anyhow . . . Hit was mighty thoughty of you fellers to come over here at night this-away.

ABNER: Well, I'm jist glad you called me, Grandpap. I'm jist proud of a chance to help.

LUM: Yeah, this makes it seem more like Christmas to me—doin' for somebody else. Trouble with a lot of us, we sorter lose the Christmas idee altogether. Think too much about ourselves. The real Christmas spirit is the happiness we git outa makin' others happy.

ABNER: Yeah, there we was settin' there at home; thought we was enjoyin' ourselves and these folks out here about to spend Christmas in an old barn this-away. No, they wouldn'ta been no Christmas to it if you hadn'ta called us up, Grandpap.

LUM: Wait a minute—I b'lieve that's the barn yonder, ain't it?

GRANDPAP: Yeah, that's where they're at.

ABNER: That's due east from where we was all right, fer there's the east star right over the top of the barn.

LUM: Yeah, there's Doc's horse tied to the fence there.

GRANDPAP: We better not be talkin' too loud, fellers. Don't want to disturb 'em none.

LUM: Here comes somebody to the door—Hidy, Doc!

DOC: Oh, hello, there! Well, what are you

three old codgers doin' out here?

GRANDPAP: Why, we jist got to thinkin' after you left, Doc, these folks might be needin' somethin'.

ABNER: Yeah, Doc, we brung a oil stove and some bed-kivers.

LUM: And here's a box of groceries.

DOC: Well, they sure are needin' 'em. Haven't any heat of any kind in there. Usin' what little hay was left in there for a bed. Took and piled it up in the manger; made a purty good bed, but these covers'll come in handy.

LUM: How's the lady, Doc?

DOC: Gettin' along as well as could be expected. You men better stay out for a while.

LUM: Yeah, shore. We'll wait out here.

GRANDPAP: If there's anything we can do, Doc, let us know.

DOC: All right, thank you . . .

LUM: Well, sir, I was jist thinkin' here. Here we are three old codgers, gittin' along in years, standin' around out here waitin'—waitin' fer a little baby to be born. Hit's sorter like as if we was waitin' fer somebody to take our place.

ABNER: Well, course we don't like to talk about sich things, but we've 'bout sarved our time, I reckon.

LUM: Hit's sorter like the years. Here 1941 is almost gone. They's been a lot of things happen, but hit'll soon be forgot. Here'll come 1942 bringin' new hope and new courage. And we're sorter like the years, us three old fellers. We're sorter like 1941 and we're waitin' on 1942—the little baby in yonder. (Door opens.)

LUM: Any news yet, Doc?

DOC: Well, men—it's a fine baby boy!

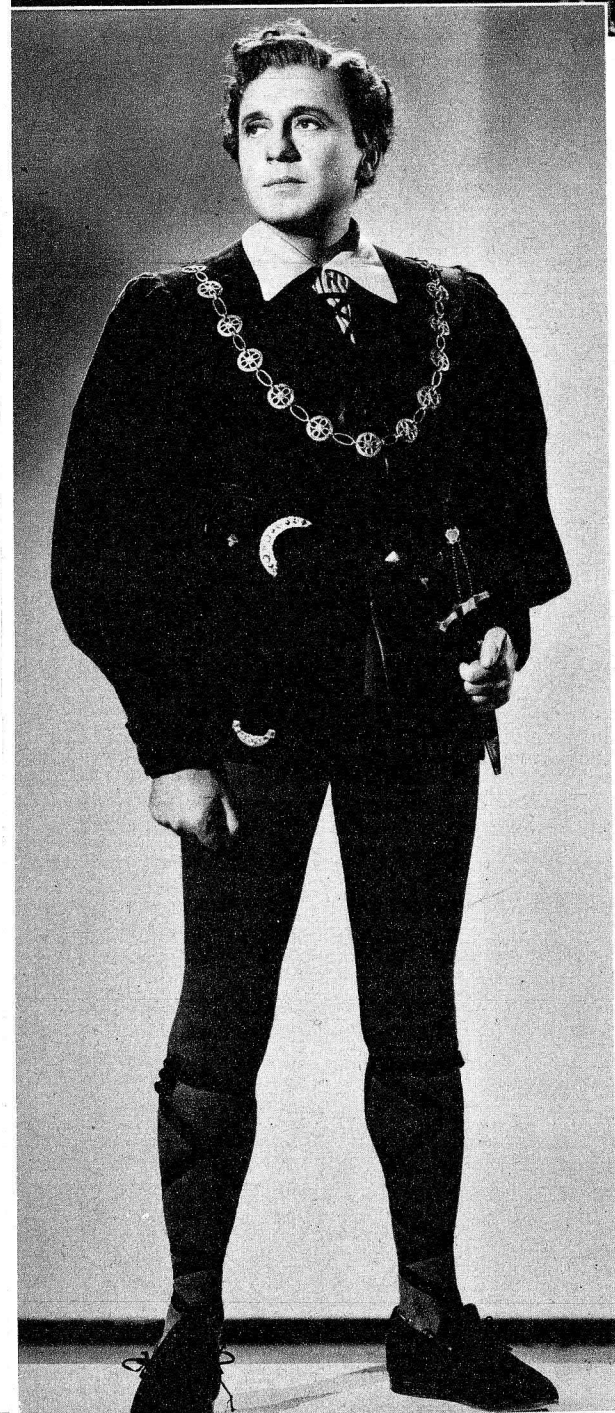

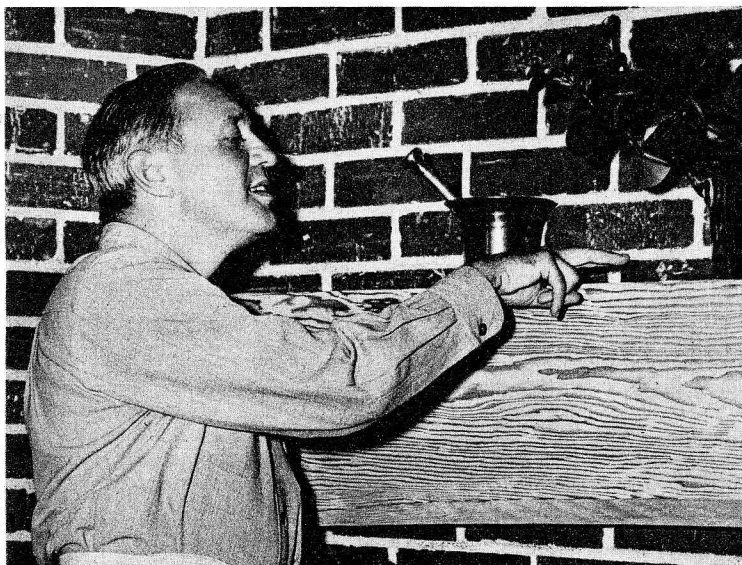

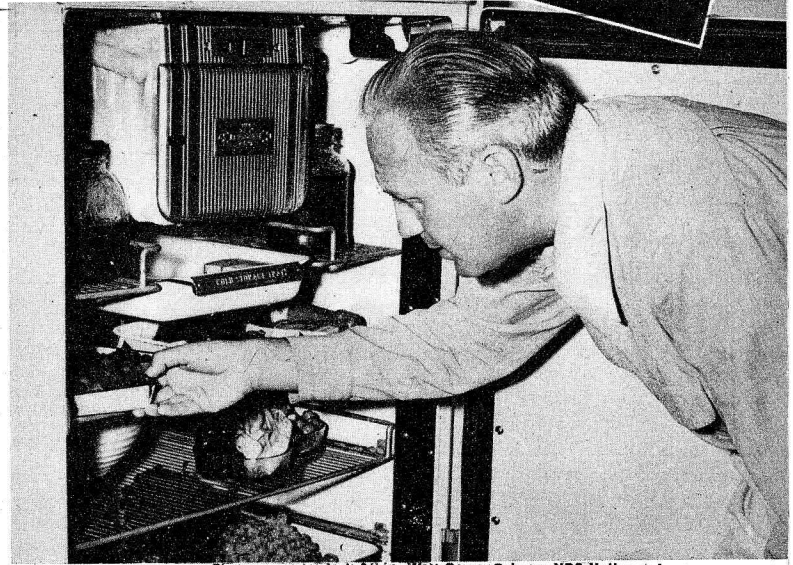

GARY COOPER

He's the Public's Choice for Screen "Lou Gehrig"

GARY COOPER, the former Montanan, one-time newspaper cartoonist and cowpuncher, is the choice of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE readers to play the role of Lou Gehrig in Sam Goldwyn's forthcoming screening of the ball-playing hero's life. The lanky Cooper, known during the past year as the star of such big pictures as "Meet John Doe," "Sergeant York," and soon to be seen in "Ball of Fire," is the star whom readers tendered the most ballots for in the recent poll to advise Mr. Goldwyn of the popular choice.

But oddly enough, despite the high-ranking vote of 1,243 ballots cast in Gary Cooper's favor and the coincidence that Cooper is under contractual commitments to Goldwyn, there is a drawback. Cooper

is right-handed, and Gehrig was a southpaw. If somehow this physical deficiency of the great Gary can be overcome, it looks like a head-on chance that Cooper will play the life of Lou Gehrig on the screen. But that left-handed business has yet to be solved.

When notified at Sun Valley where he was resting that he had topped the MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE poll, Cooper said little. He doesn't talk much. "Is that so?" he replied. Then he did an odd thing—he began to practise throwing snowballs left-handed!

With more than three-quarters as many votes as Cooper, John Wayne, an actor much like Cooper, was the runner-up. John Payne was a close third, and Bill Gargan wasn't far behind for fourth. In

the "second division," to paraphrase, in order were Spencer Tracy, George Tobias and Dennis Morgan.

There were more than thirty-five candidates for the role, including four major and former major league ballplayers. These include Jimmie Foxx, who polled the most votes—131—Mel Ott, Waite Hoyt and Bob Feller.

However, Sam Goldwyn isn't satisfied yet with the results of the many screen-tests he has given in his search for the perfect Gehrig. In fact, he is still testing, and at press time was at work setting up tests of George Montgomery and Dennis Morgan.

So, while Cooper is the public's favorite, he doesn't have the part yet. But he is practising throwing with that left arm of his! —E. P.

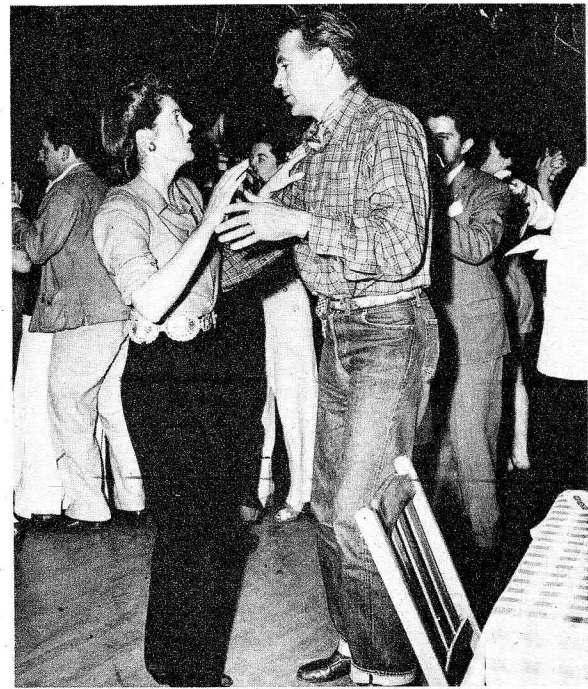

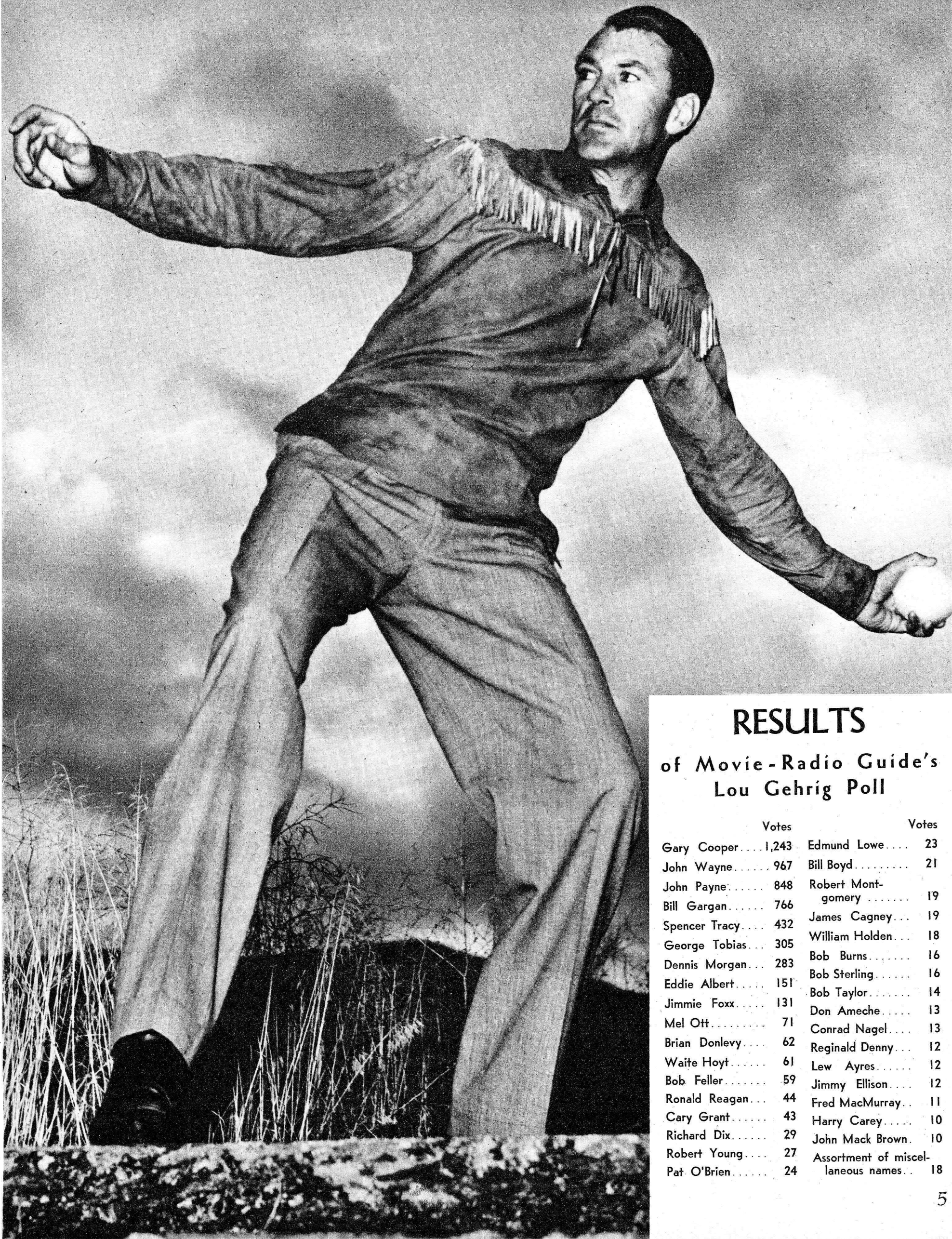

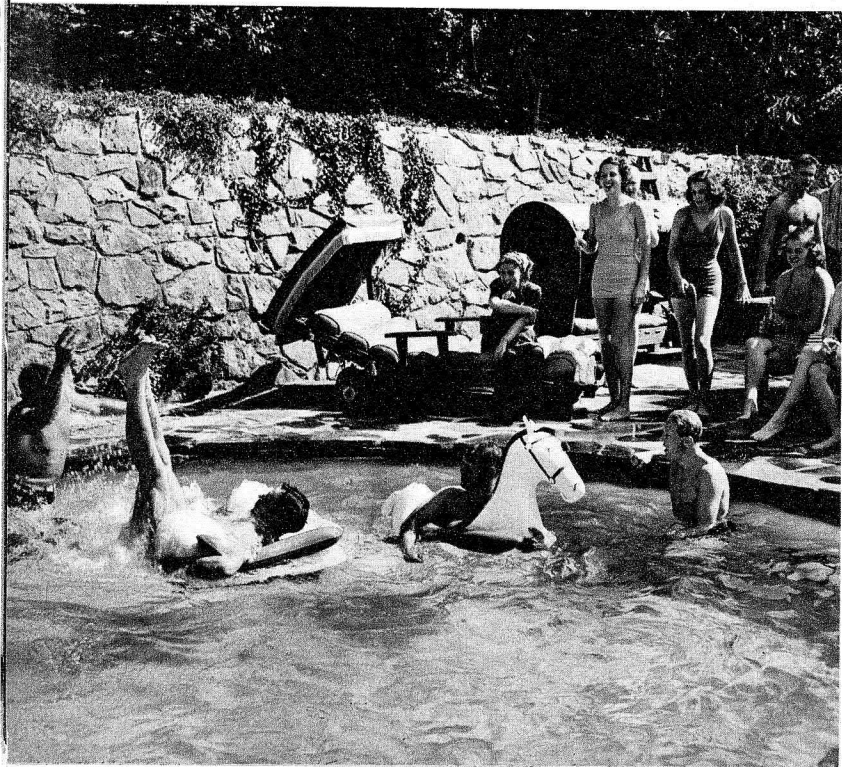
The boys deserve a real home holiday. Let's all pitch in and give it to them!

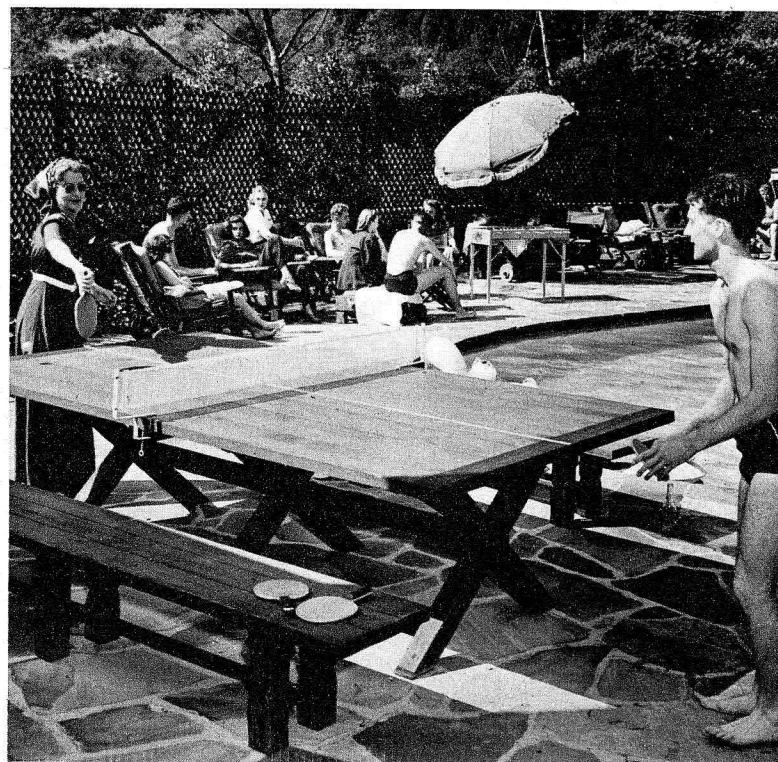


GENE tends the open fireplace while the young men and women chat and dance. The Raymonds have been holding their "Date Leave" parties every alternate week since early last summer

Beaver on Power

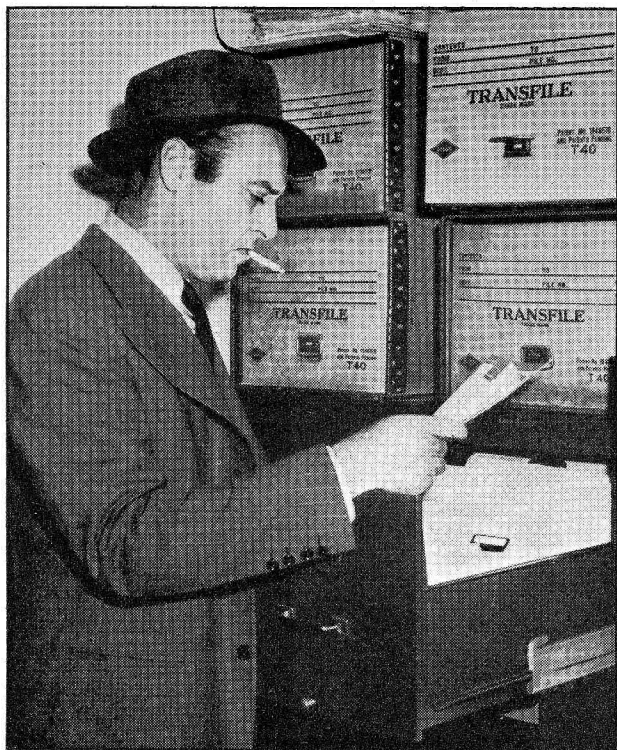

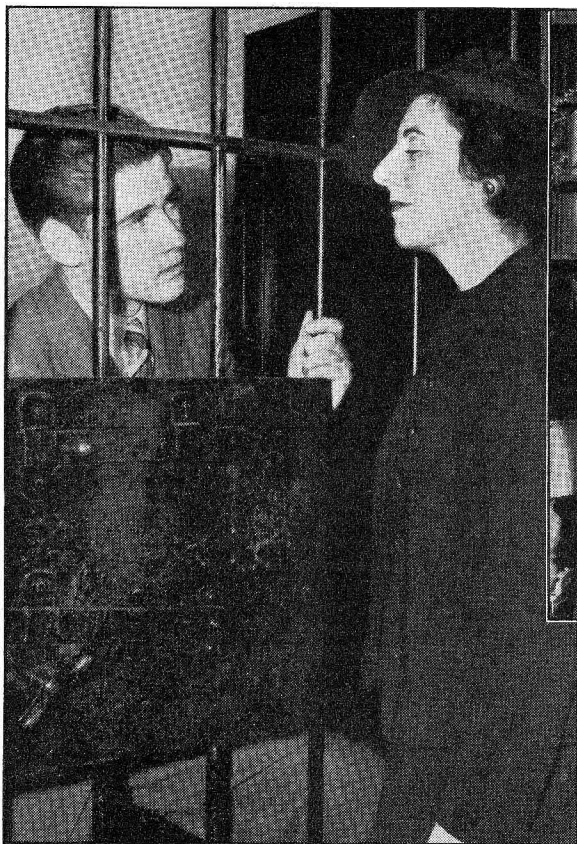

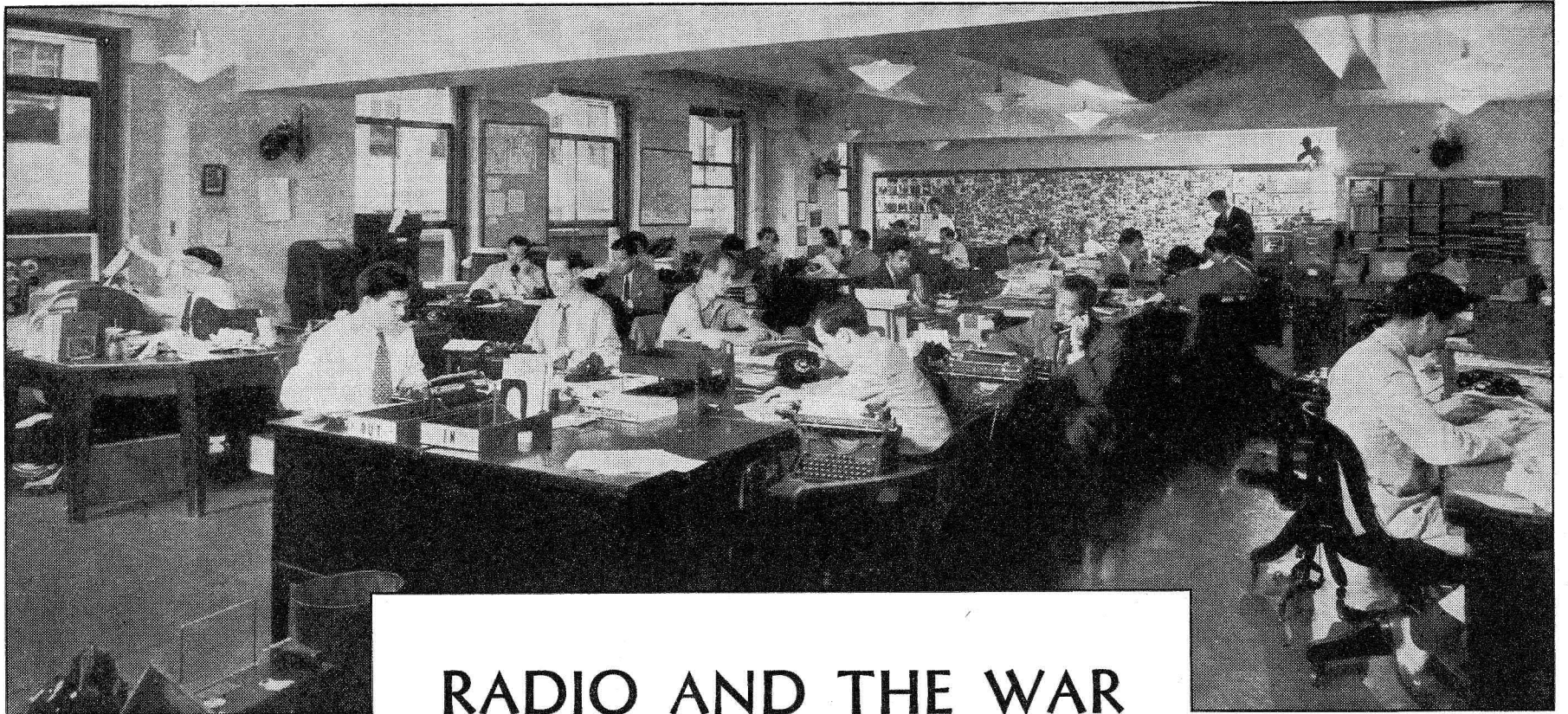

RADIO AND THE WAR

Broadcasting breaks the news of Jap attack, goes on 24-hour war schedule

AS WAR CAME to the U. S., radio newsrooms throughout the nation worked day and night to feed speedy, accurate news to America

For the record, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE presents herewith a resume of the first hectic twenty-four hours of war in the U. S. Surprising, yes. But MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE can point to numerous instances where readers have been offered accurate predictions. To wit: Edwin Hartrich's recent map-story, "Where Japan Will Attack Next." Now that our country actually is at war, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE proposes to intensify and enlarge its service, dedicate itself to cooperate in every way with radio in doing broadcasting's huge war-time job.—The Editors.

IT WAS 2:25 p.m., December 7, in New York and broadcasters were settling down to a normal Sunday afternoon.

Then eight fateful words flashed over the United Press news wire:

"White House announces Japanese have attacked Pearl Harbor."

Suddenly, newsrooms of all networks were in an uproar. Skilled experts went into action with lightning swiftness. Five minutes later Americans had the news—the U. S. was at war. And U. S. radio was at war, too.

From that moment radio was on a new footing. Comedy shows and dance bands went by the boards. News of the fast-breaking developments in the Pacific took over for the duration, interrupting any program at any time. Radio became a bulletin board for orders of the U. S. Army and Navy. Radio hams were ordered off the air. Radio studios were guarded against sabotage. Radio was indeed at war.

As could be expected, U. S. radio lived up to its reputation as the world's finest. Columbia Broadcasting System, about to go on the air with its "World Today" news round-up when the United Press bulletin came in, canceled broadcasts from Cairo and Geneva, in a matter of seconds set up calls to reporters in Manila, London and Washington. It was a war edition prepared with such speed as no newspaper could have touched. After reading of the bulletin by John Charles Daly came interpretations from London, Washington and New York. Then, suddenly, barely fifteen minutes after the first White House flash, Columbia's Ford Wilkins came in from Manila. But his voice—coming from nine thousand miles across the Pacific—was abruptly cut off. The censors were at work.

THIS RADIO ADDRESS BY PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT BROUGHT A DECLARATION OF WAR!

YESTERDAY, December 7, 1941—a date which will live in infamy—the United States of America was suddenly and deliberately attacked by naval and air forces of the empire of Japan.

The United States was at peace with that nation and, at the solicitation of Japan, was still in conversation with its government and its Emperor looking toward the maintenance of peace in the Pacific.

Indeed, one hour after Japanese air squadrons had commenced bombing in the American island Oahu, the Japanese ambassador to the United States and his colleague delivered to our Secretary of State a formal reply to a recent American message. While this reply stated that it seemed useless to continue the existing diplomatic negotiations, it contained no threat or hint of war or armed attack.

It will be recorded that the distance of Hawaii from Japan makes it obvious that the attack was deliberately planned many days or even weeks ago. During the intervening time, the Japanese government has deliberately sought to deceive the United States by false statements and expressions of hope for continued peace.

The attack yesterday on the Hawaiian Islands has caused severe damage to American naval and military forces. I regret to tell you that very many American lives have been lost. In addition, American ships have been reported torpedoed on the high seas between San Francisco and Honolulu.

Yesterday the Japanese government also launched an attack against Malaya.

Last night Japanese forces attacked Hongkong.

Last night Japanese forces attacked Guam.

Last night Japanese forces attacked the Philippine Islands.

Last night the Japanese attacked Wake Island.

And this morning the Japanese attacked Midway Island.

Japan has, therefore, undertaken a surprise offensive extending throughout the Pacific area. The facts of yesterday speak for themselves. The people of the United States have already formed their opinions and well understand the implications to the very life and safety of our nation.

As Commander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy I have directed that all measures be taken for our defense.

Always will we remember the character of the onslaught against us.

No matter how long it may take us to overcome this premeditated invasion, the American people in their righteous might will win through to absolute victory.

I believe I interpret the will of the Congress and of the people when I assert that we will not only defend ourselves to the uttermost but will make very certain that this form of treachery shall never endanger us again.

Hostilities exist. There is no blinking at the fact that our people, our territory and our interests are in grave danger.

With confidence in our armed forces—with the unbounding determination of our people—we will gain the inevitable triumph—so help us God.

I ask that the Congress declare that since the unprovoked and dastardly attack by Japan on Sunday, December 7, a state of war has existed between the United States and the Japanese empire.

With like speed, NBC burst into the august "University of Chicago Round Table," broke the news at approximately the same time, broadcasting simultaneously over Red and Blue networks and international short-wave stations. Mutual's key stations in New York and Chicago made separate announcements. Within minutes Americans had learned the shocking news. Within minutes they heard from

experts what portentful significance lay behind the terse bulletin.

But radio's real job merely started at this point. Broadcasting networks and many local stations throughout the country immediately went on a twenty-four-hour basis.

NBC's Loren Thurston in Honolulu brought the first details of the attack, scooping news services and newspaper correspondents. Other radio corres-

pondents brought the first news from other vital Pacific islands.

At home analysts and commentators stepped forward to help listeners realize the implications of war.

Almost immediately, too, David Sarnoff led a procession of prominent radio moguls in offering complete facilities of the chains to President Roosevelt for whatever use he saw fit. Quickly there came orders and announcements of many kinds from the Government. There were orders revoking leaves, ordering men to report for duty. There were warnings to industry to protect defense plants against attack. There were instructions from civilian defense officials for mobilization of air-raid wardens, police and fire departments. Ham short-wave operators were summarily ordered off the air by the FCC, an obvious precaution since many U. S. amateur signals are heard clearly in Japan.

In those first hours under attack America gathered its mighty sinews for the gigantic task ahead. As recruiting offices were stampeded, as politicians forgot their petty peevishness, so radio upset its elaborate entertainment schedules. Now that the first shock has passed, it is natural that radio should return to a more normal schedule. But radio will remain the watchdog of our safety, ready to throw schedules to the winds fulfilling its war-time mission. Radio will remain a great rallying force for the national effort. And in this work MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE intends to offer every cooperation, to use every opportunity to aid listeners and broadcasters alike, until the happy day of our "inevitable triumph" when America can return to "broadcasting as usual!" —J. C.

BLACKOUT STATIONS

At such times you will find it possible to tune in high-powered stations in other parts of the country that you ordinarily could not get. These stations will bring you newscasts and special announcements as well as many of the network broadcasts normally carried by stations in your own vicinity. Therefore, when the stations you usually listen to are off the air, try tuning to the nearest 50,000-watt station outside of the precaution zone. Here is a guide to great music on the air, planned to increase your listening pleasure

MUSIC NOTES: The hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the death of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart will be commemorated on the air by the Metropolitan Opera Company this Saturday with a performance of the composer's opera bouffe, "Le Nozze di Figaro" (The Marriage of Figaro).
One of the gayest and most melodious of operas, "The Marriage of Figaro" will be sung by a cast which comes from the four corners of the earth: Ettore Panizza, who will conduct, was born in Argentina; Ezio Pinza, who sings Figaro, was born in Italy; Bidu Sayao, who sings the role of Susanna, hails from Brazil; John Brownlee, the Count Almaviva of the performance, is from Australia; Rise Stevens, glamorous young star who portrays Cherubino, is American-born; Salvatore Baccaloni, the Dr. Bartolo, is of Italian birth; and Irra Petina, who sings the role of Marcellina, is Russian.
Based on Beaumarchais' famous comedy, the opera was first produced in 1786 in Vienna and was enthusiastically received. Revived specifically for basso Pinza last year by the Metropolitan, the opera, in its second century, seems as fresh and bright and popular as ever.

NBC Plans Separation

NEW YORK.—The Radio Corporation of America, parent company of the two NBC networks, has filed a certificate of reservation with the Secretary of State's office asking the right to the name United Broadcasting System. This presumably is a step toward the separation of the Red and Blue networks of NBC, though both may remain under the control of RCA. Last spring the FCC ruled that NBC would have to dispense with one of the networks, but the ruling was suspended in October.

Abbott and Costello Quit

HOLLYWOOD.—Abbott and Costello will leave the "Chase and Sanborn Program," effective January 4. It is rumored that friction between the pair and Edgar Bergen—the natural outcome of billing two top-flight comedy acts on the same show—is responsible for the action of Abbott and Costello, who leave the program cast voluntarily.

Comedy Causes Trouble

NEW YORK.—NBC, an advertising agency and the sponsor of the "Chase and Sanborn Program" show have been named as defendants in a plagiarism suit brought by Barney Gerard, script-writer. Gerard charges that the defendants broadcast two of his dramatic scripts, titled "Follies of the Day," which he wrote and had copyrighted in 1918 and 1920. Skits put on by Abbott and Costello on June 1 and June 15, 1941, were alleged to have been based on Gerard's scripts.

Uncle Sam Wants Sponsor

NEW YORK.—The U. S. Treasury Department has announced that after December 23 the Bendix Corporation will not continue its sponsorship of

the Government's "Treasury Hour" program, heard Tuesday nights. The reason given is that the Government does not wish to permit a private business concern to sponsor the revenue-for-defense program more than thirteen weeks. 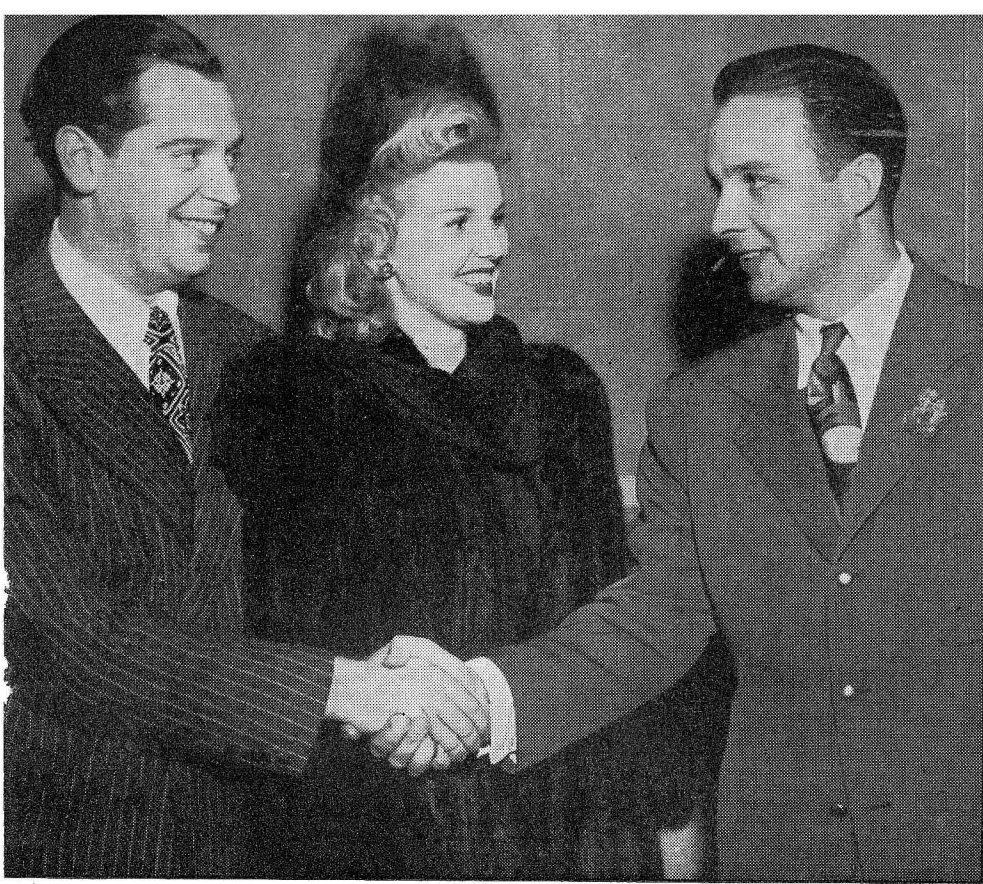

Listeners are twirling the short-wave dials feverishly trying to tune in Japan, Manila or Singapore. With this situation in effect we feel it timely to give you a list of what you can hear, when and where

NBC Inaugurates New Foreign-Language Schedule

Upon the shoulders of United States international broadcasters largely falls the burden of keeping people throughout the world informed as to the true policies and activities of our country in this time of great emergency. As a whole they are meeting the challenge nobly. By using greater power, more efficient beam antennae, a greater number of frequencies and more and more programs in foreign languages, they are finally giving the voice of the United States tremendous authority wherever listeners gather to listen, be it in the garrets of occupied countries, desert outposts of free territories or the cozy living-rooms of the democracies.

Last week I told you about the extensive schedule of foreign-language broadcasts that have just been initiated by the General Electric stations at Schenectady, N. Y. This week I have news concerning the latest and most ambitious foreign-language program undertaking of the National Broadcasting Company assisted by Westinghouse.

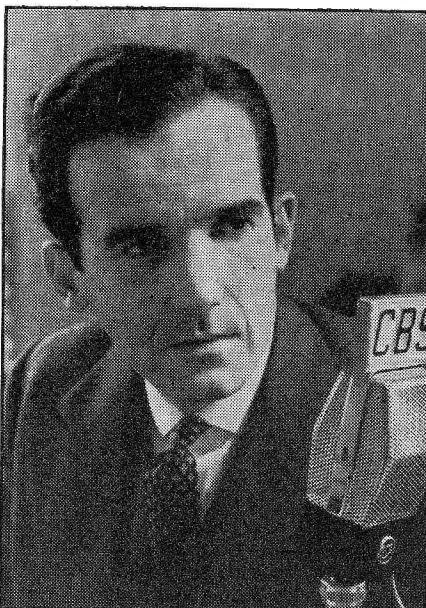

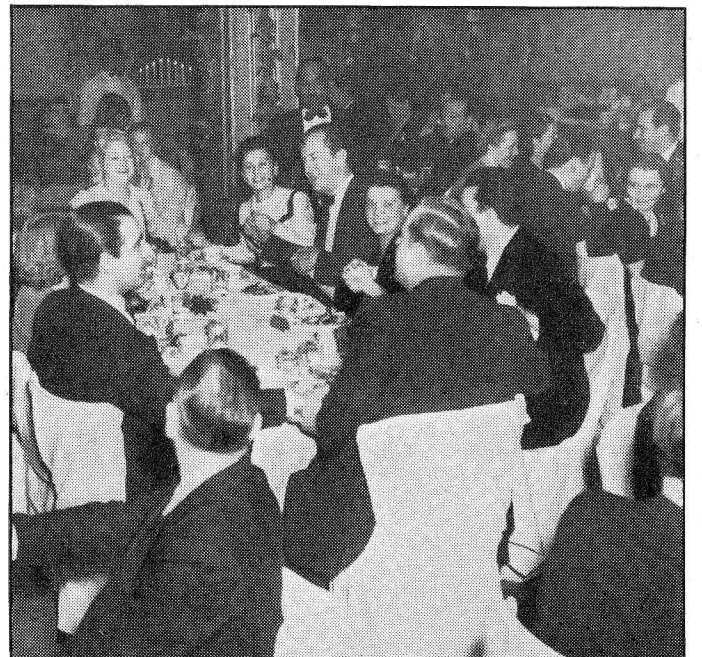

HOW would you like to have a long-distance-telephone tete-a-tete with Rudy Vallee? That was the rare prize awarded Mrs. Charles McLaughlin on the "Vox Pop" show (Monday, CBS), when Parks Johnson and Wally Butterworth staged their broadcast in Winner, S. Dak. And this is the photographic record of Mrs. McLaughlin's prize call.

In case you haven't caught the "Vox Pop" frolics recently it should be explained that Parks and Wally—who for some time have been trotting about the country broadcasting their show from conventions, college campuses, spots in the news—have a new wrinkle in question-answer programs. Each week the big prize, awarded to the most interesting and best-informed contestant, is a long-distance-telephone call to some famous star. The call to Rudy Vallee was especially coveted—by the ladies.

In Winner, S. Dak., the pheasant season was on and an improvised studio had been arranged in the local American Legion hall. With pheasant-

hunting as the general theme and with many pheasant-hunters present, Parks and Wally set out to interview a typical cross-section of the crowd. No pheasant-hunter, Mrs. Charles (Agnes) McLaughlin, housewife, turned out to be the most interesting quizzee, and to her went the prize call to Rudy Vallee, who answered at his home in Hollywood.

Interviewing Mrs. McLaughlin prior to the Vallee call, Parks Johnson laughingly touched on the romance angle, asked her about her marriage a year ago. "Were you engaged long?" Parks asked. Mrs. McLaughlin, who is known to her townfolk as "Big Sis," rose to the occasion, countered with another question, "Would you consider twenty-six years long?" When asked why the engagement had been of such record length, she answered, "Well, I wanted to pick my man!"

Movie-Radio Guide Visits:

FRED ALLEN & CO.

Follow Fred Allen on and off the air to see how his sixty minutes of laughter and levity are strung together

IT'S the irony of show business that Fred Allen should slave day and night for a week to build his Wednesday night (CBS) show and then see the audience go wild over the spontaneous quips he tosses in ad-lib.

The man who is regarded as radio's brightest natural wit goes at his job in dead seriousness. Using a writing-staff only to build rough plot ideas, he budgets his week, laboriously pecks out scripts, allotting one day to the "guest spot," another to the "college student feature," still another to the "newsreel," until almost every hour is accounted for. At eleven o'clock in the evenings he quits typing so as not to disturb other tenants of his mid-

town apartment, continues writing with a pencil. For between-times relaxation there are gymnasium boxing-sessions, dinner out with wife Portland, church on Sunday, and a movie or show the night before the broadcast.

After an all-day fury of rehearsal and rewriting on Wednesday, Fred appears on the stage of CBS Playhouse 3 shortly before broadcast time, armed with pencil-sharpener, several pencils and his script. He presents the cast. Jimmy Wallington is "an announcer formerly in great demand." Larry Elliott (who wears a mustache) is the announcer whose "upper lip is brought to you through the courtesy of I. J. Fox, the furrier." Just before

airtime Fred tells the joke he's been using on studio audiences for a long time. Typical Allen humor, it's "What Happens to a Laugh When You Stifle It." Another joke rounds out the guests' evening after the broadcast closes.

After the first show Fred goes backstage, shoves some coins into the hands of men waiting for hand-outs, and joins Portland and the others at the near-by Bryant Hotel Restaurant. This is his first good meal of the day. He and Portland don't leave their table until fifteen minutes before the second show.

Portland is a good deal like Fred. Quiet, pleasant, witty, she probably inherits her humor from her father, Dr. Frederick Hoffa, who named his children for the cities where they were born—Lebanon for Lebanon, Pa.; Portland for Portland, Ore.; Harlem for New York's Harlem. The fourth, Lastone, should have been the last one, but there was a fifth and Dr. Hoffa wanted the name to be Period. But Mrs. Hoffa rebelled at that point, so she's Fredricka!

Many nice things could be said about other Allen headliners—Kenny Baker, Al Goodman, Jimmy Wallington, and the Mighty Allen Art Players—but you'll meet them all in MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's camera-conducted visit.—J. C.



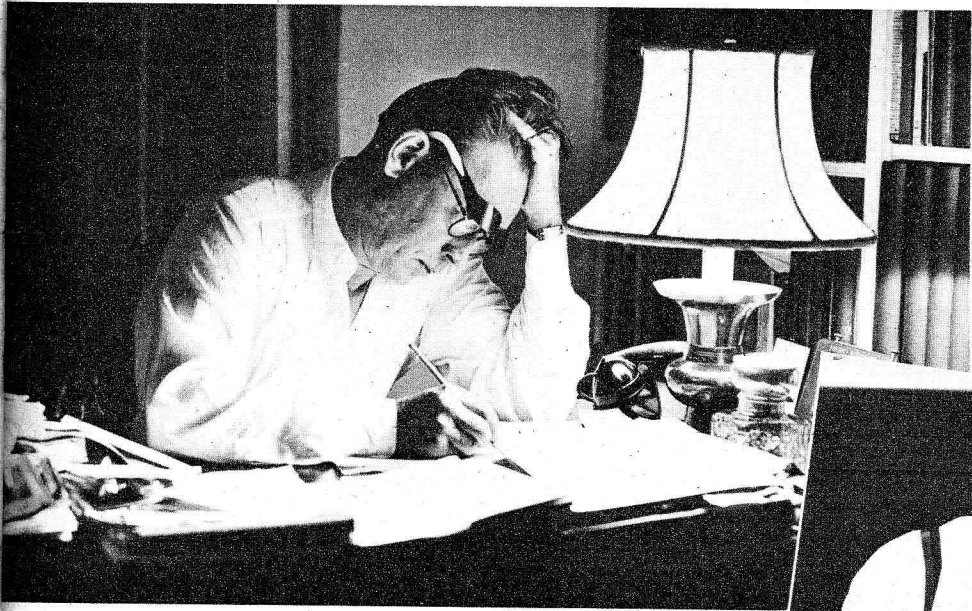

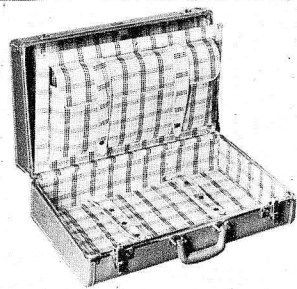
