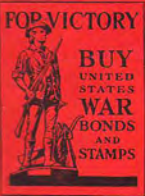

# WAKE ISLAND

WAKE ISLAND is one of the earth's loneliest outposts. Yet on its mere two and a quarter square-mile area was written one of the blackest and most heroic pages that history will ever record. In 1935 it was uninhabited. Then Pan American Airways made it one of the stepping-stones for the China Clipper. Gasoline storage tanks were built there. Living quar-

ters and a commodious hotel for the accommodation of Clipper passengers came next—every board and nail brought a distance of 6,000 miles. Picture at top of the page shows Wake in 1939 when Japan first protested proposed fortifying of the island, declaring that they intended to smash the American fleet if it was going to use Wake as a means of gaining a

foothold in China. From then on the little sea-born dot in the Pacific became a powder-keg guarded by valiant U. S. Marines. How the war-torch of yellow menace ignited it now belongs to history. From the story of the Marines' heroic defense of Wake, Paramount has made a great picture, one poignantly revealing the bitter struggle of a few for the cause of freedom!

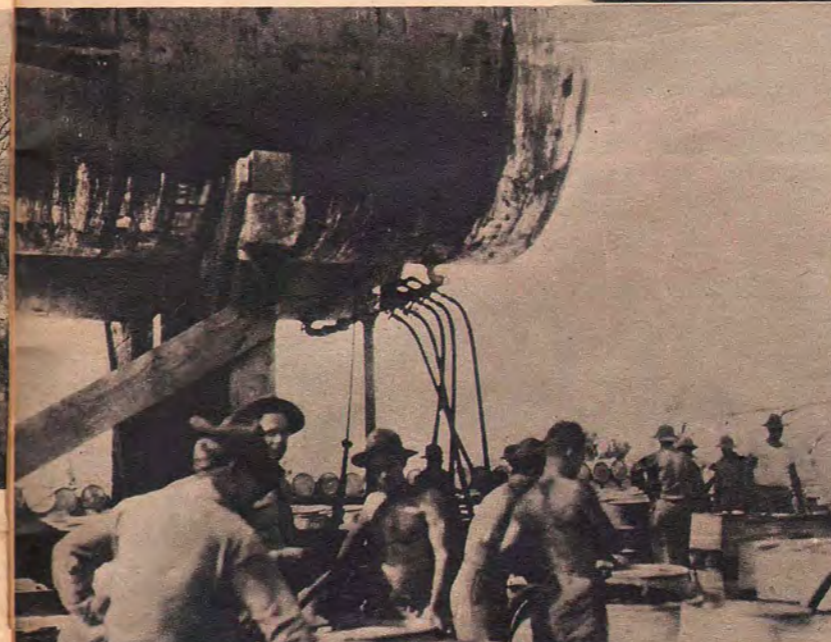

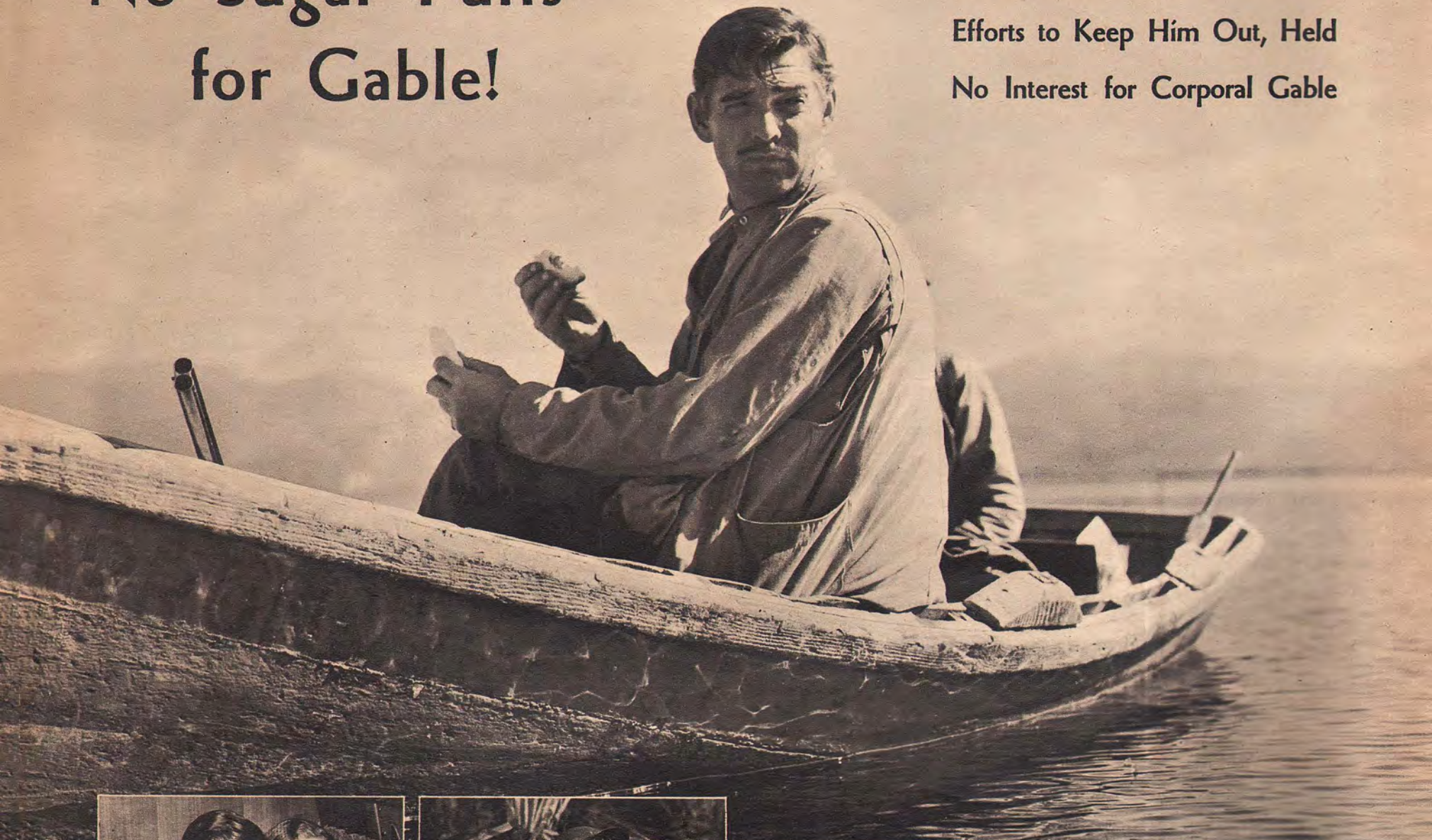

**This Is the Story:** Bette Davis as Charlotte Vail, a Back Bay Boston girl, portrays a woman's rebirth into normal useful life after an affection-starved childhood that drove her to the verge of

insanity. A wise psychiatrist (Claude Rains) turns the trick when he takes her—a plump, dowdy woman of twenty-eight—to his sanitarium and sends her out a striking lady of warmth and color, with a zest for life and love. The ending, too, strikes a new note. It isn't sticky, to be sure, yet it will find a responsive chord in the hearts of countless theater-goers because it accents a service to others that has a rare beauty. Paul Henreid gives Miss Davis excellent support. Gladys Cooper, as a viciously domineering mother, gives an outstanding performance. Next in line for honors is Janis Wilson in the role of a neurotic girl whom Charlotte Vail (Bette Davis) saves from an existence similar to that she experienced in her own unhappy childhood.

Eddie Cantor and Dinah Shore Give Their Best in Camp Entertainment; Bob Crosby Wins a Bet From Bing; Barbara Luddy Set for Wedding Bells

## WASHINGTON

Washington officials were surprised recently to receive a piece of War Department stationery bearing the following words: "The War Department invites you to attend a production of 'Command Performance.' This is a radio production designed to link the men in the armed forces outside the continental limits of the United States with the home front. Appearing in person will be Greer Garson, Irene Dunne, James Cagney, Edward Arnold, Abbott and Costello, Hedy Lamarr, Walter Abel, Dinah Shore, Ann Rutherford, Virginia Gilmore, Bing Crosby, Ralph Bellamy, Larry Adler, Kay Kyser and his orchestra, and Dr. Frank Black."

That announcement is indicative of several important things. The first is that once more the motion-picture industry has rolled up its sleeves in order to work for Uncle Sam.

Last spring a trainload of stars rolled into Washington in order to play in an Army relief show called "The Hollywood Caravan." Once more they have responded to their Government's call by forming a milky way of stars which will spread over the entire United States until all the people have been given an opportunity to see them and to buy a bond from them. "Buy a bond from your favorite star" is a persuasive idea. It should net millions for this war effort . . .

I met Eric Sevareid, CBS' voice in the capital, at a luncheon, and he told me of his wish to get back to the

world's war fronts. He is a tall, dark Dakotan, accustomed to summers that are hot and dry. This Washington summer, which has been tropical in its humidity, has almost done him up. Don't be surprised if CBS gives him another roving assignment soon.

He made one interesting observation worth considering. We Americans,

he said, hear about England from other Americans who are over in London to represent our networks. Bob Trout, for instance. In that way we get a good picture of what Britain is doing. But England's radio listeners hear about America not through English broadcasters but through Americans; Raymond Gram Swing, for instance. Sevareid asked Sir Cecil Graves, head of BBC, whether an American could ever give to Englishmen a proper evaluation and understanding of the American situation. Sir Cecil's answer was simply that in England no American could match the popularity of Raymond Gram Swing.

## CHICAGO

Twenty years is just about all there is to the story of broadcasting. So Ben Bernie, who made his first air appearance in August, 1922, is a guy to see when you want to chew about old times.

T'other afternoon I dropped in on the Ol' Maestro just before a rehearsal for his CBS Wrigley show. The result was the following rapid-fire interview:

Bill: "Well, Mr. Bernie, I wanted to ask—"

Ben: "Yowsah! Tell 'em about the guy who first tried to buck ASCAP. It was back about 1923, and this guy had a one-tube station at Aeolian Hall in New York, and he wanted me to play outlaw music. Turned him down, though, because I knew I had to play hits.

Bill: "Swell. Now about—"

Ben: "I went on WNYC for the mayor instead. Then WEAf with Graham McNamee. You know, mine was the first band to have a theme song, 'My Buddy.' We played it for one of the boys who died, and, well,

we got to like it so we kept using it."

Bill: "What was the biggest moment in twenty years of—"

Ben: "Biggest kick I had was when I went on the first network—two stations, New York and Philadelphia. We didn't think it was possible. Then there was the time Wanamakers had a centennial or something. They asked me to conduct the Philadelphia Orchestra—Stokowski's—in an arrangement of my own song, 'Sweet Georgia Brown.' They had about eighty fiddles and lots of other instruments. The orchestra was about a block long and I didn't even know how to get them started. Finally I told 'em, 'Boys, I'm going to start you off by counting one, two, for nothing,' and they started, and they liked it, and I got a big kick, too."

Bill: "That's fine. Now about—"

Ben: "Remember once we made a broadcast we hoped would reach Australia. We went on WEAf about five

a.m., playing our heads off. Right away we got a wire saying the program was coming in fine. It was from an Italian in Newark, New Jersey!"

Bill: "You were in vaudeville before—"

Ben: "Sure, I was on for years. Started in 1909. Used to team with Phil Baker as Baker and Bernie. I was blacklisted from vaudeville for playing on radio. Worked with lots of swell people. Had a saxophonist named Rudy Vallee and a pianoplayer named Oscar Levant. I paid George Raft forty dollars a week in vaudeville, but I had to pay a little more for Eleanor Powell and Ray Bolger."

Bill: "How do you like Chicago?"

Ben: "Breezy town. It's my lucky place. I came here in 1930 flat broke. I'd been cleaned out in 1929 and had to borrow the fare from Al Jolson. Opened at the College Inn with a four-week contract and stayed four years . . .

They liked me, but I guess they'd call me a long-hair now, or they would if I had much hair left. (He ruffled his thinning, graying thatch.) Put that in about calling me a long-hair. Good gag."

Bill: "There's a story around that you're going to team with Bert Lahr on a new radio program. Is that—"

Ben: "It's news to me. I'm doing a good job here, boosting war production. Yowsah, I really believe that this gum program is saving millions of man-hours, 'cause the war workers don't have to sneak out for smokes if they chew. I want to stick to this show for the duration."

Bill: "There is one other question I'd like—"

Ben (looking at the columnist's notes): "You've got lots of stuff there. Lots I never told anybody before. So long."

And that, friends, was that. I walked out of the studio with mixed feelings of admiration, helplessness and downright liking for a fast-talking, high-power trouper who manages to remain a swell guy after twenty years in this crazy business . . .

# NBC SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA TO BROADCAST SUNDAY AFTERNOONS THIS SEASON

Vivian della Chiesa, 1935 Contest Winner, Now Star of Three Networks;  
Rodzinski Directing Sibelius' "Fifth Symphony," Released by Columbia

**J**OSHUA of old blew into his trumpet, and the walls of Jericho came tumbling down. But what are mere walls when you think that Vivian della Chiesa sang a B full force, one day in a radio studio, and threw a whole network off the air. After that the soprano was cautioned to ease up on the high ones, and, in order to make sure that she would, the sound engineers suggested that she sing behind a screen. It seems her voice is of the type that feeds all the mikes in a studio—no matter where they are placed.

Miss della Chiesa, a native of Chicago, used to be called a baby Claudia Muzio. She thinks, however, that the epithet was rather exaggerated, for the only similarity between herself and the great opera star, as she sees it, was in the tremendous amount of work she did. "Muzio has always been my favorite," she said. "I loved the marvelous smoothness of her singing. I was only a child then, but I went to a good many performances of opera in Chicago and, more often than not, Muzio was the reason.

"My musical education, thanks be, started when I was very young," she explained. My parents, both born in Italy, where they practically haunted the opera house in Milan, placed me in a convent when I was eight, and there I took up piano. Incidentally, my sister is a very fine pianist. I am not; but, you see, I had other ideas.

"I don't exactly come from a family of musicians, but I'll say this for them, they were all great music-lovers, as far back as a half-dozen generations ago. My mother's mother was a gifted organist, and there were talented singers and instrumentalists, too, long before her. No famous names, you know, just people who got on famously with music."

The soprano proudly told of her mother's fantastic memory. "Why," she said, "mother knows the texts of the operas better than I do, and, believe me, I've had to learn a few."

In her radio work Miss della Chiesa is often called upon to sing operatic arias. That is a regular part of her routine. But she has also appeared in a number of opera broadcasts, which she hugely enjoyed doing. In a recent cycle of Mozart stage works, given over MBS, Miss della Chiesa added two other roles to her repertoire—parts in "The Magic Flute" and "La Clemenza di Tito."

In actual stage performances she has already sung in "Otello," "L'elisir d'Amore," "La Traviata," "La Bo-

heme," "La Juive" and "Don Giovanni." All told, she knows complete twenty operas, and the study of new ones goes on all the time.

Miss della Chiesa is by no means the type to do things by halves. Lessons in voice, in interpretation, in musical theory just go on and on, but she has also found the time to take up dancing, acting and, as we have seen, piano. That is not an easy schedule; in fact, it's a terrifying one.

In 1935 Miss della Chiesa walked off with top honors in a nation-wide contest conducted by the Columbia Broadcasting System. There were 3,700 lady competitors in that contest, which guaranteed to the winner thirteen weeks on a sustaining program.

After the second week she got an offer from a Chicago movie theater, which she immediately accepted. There she sang arias from the operas, concert songs, other songs and, in general, went for the works on the singing front. That led to other offers, which led to still others and now we find the young woman on at least two regular programs—the "American Family Hour" and "American Album of Familiar Music"—with a host of guest appearances on others, besides.

Miss della Chiesa wants most of all to sing in grand opera. That has been her one great ambition from childhood. And her five years of vocal study with Forrest Lamont, for many years a leading tenor of the Chicago Opera Company, naturally helped fire that ambition.

The soprano is very attractive, has blond hair, blue eyes; almost phlegmatic in demeanor. She hasn't had much time for hobbies or sports,

though she likes to swim, to play tennis, to walk.

## Sunday Symphonic Festival

With NBC's decision to program its concerts of the National Broadcasting Symphony Orchestra on Sunday afternoons at 5 p.m., starting September 27, and with the already established 3 p.m. hour of the Philharmonic-Symphony concerts on the same day, beginning, however, several weeks later, it looks like a Sunday afternoon music feast for the coming months.

NBC, after due investigation, selected 5 p.m. as the most likely hour for its broadcasts, which will feature famous conductors, two of them being Arturo Toscanini and Leopold Stokowski, who will share the latter portion of the series. Mr. Toscanini, and probably Mr. Stokowski, will also conduct the Philharmonic-Symphony at a number of Sunday concerts. So, more about that in the near future.

## Concert Records

The September recordings of concert music, recently released, hold numerous points of interest. Heading the Columbia list is Artur Rodzinski, leading the Cleveland Orchestra in a competent performance of the Sibelius Fifth Symphony. Mr. Rodzinski appears to be thoroughly conversant with this work. The first movement is replete with short, crescendoed—now there is a word—phrases, which under less capable hands might easily go the piecemeal route. The conductor, though, gives each of these its proper importance, yet tying them all into the whole pattern with praiseworthy continuity.

Victor features the Tchaikowsky "Nutcracker Suite" this month, as played by the Philadelphia Orchestra under Eugene Ormandy's direction, but since I haven't received it yet, we'll take it up later. In the meantime, Hans Kindler and the National Symphony Orchestra collaborate on an especially good reading of the Richard Strauss tone poem "Don Juan." I'd say that this performance just about represents the best work this orchestra has done so far for Victor. The "Don Juan" is no sinecure. It is an extremely difficult piece to play, full of mercurial twists and turns and shot through with wide-varying dynamics. It calls for a conductor possessing sure control, not to omit a soaring knowledge of its content. I like this performance, with the exception of a few minor things, such as occasional thin tone in the strings and one or two instances of incorrect pitch.

## POPULAR MUSIC



"Gipsy" Emery Deutsch is a typical New Yorker

**W**E'VE all heard of Latins from Manhattan, now someone has thought up a good name for Emery Deutsch—he's a Gipsy from Manhattan. Reason? He has built up a radio following through the playing of Gipsy melodies on his violin. Of course, there still is a slight

controversy flickering—not to say raging—over the question: What is Gipsy music? But because this corner is in no controversial mood the subject will be dropped forthwith.

At any rate, Emery Deutsch, who holds forth for CBS and tzigany, is what you might call anything but a Gipsy, since he is a typical New Yorker. He wears made-to-order and not mail-order clothes, he is better known among the tunesmiths than among the tinsmiths, and he doesn't tell fortunes professionally, though he has done some expert palm-reading in his time.

Mr. Deutsch took his first step in the direction of a professional career by way of a local dance band. He soon went to CBS as violinist and later became a conductor. He has been active in fields other than radio. For instance, he conducted the orchestra at New York's Paramount Theater in 1934, replacing that other gipsy soul, Dave Rubinoff. He then appeared at the Radio City Music Hall and at the Roxy Theater, besides having a fling at the night-clubs and movies.

The heavy radio, recording and what-not schedule he adheres to has not interfered with his composing, in which respect he shone as the author of two outstanding hits—"Play, Fiddle, Play" and "When a Gipsy Makes His Violin Cry." To complete the picture, Mr. Deutsch is quite an inventor, having casually tossed off an automatic sliding top for autos.

## Popular Records

Irving Berlin's score for the all-soldier show "This Is the Army" has been put into an album by Victor. Two of the songs you have heard before, "Mandy" and "Oh! How I Hate to Get Up in the Morning," but Mr. Berlin has a habit of renewing old acquaintances with himself that way. The rest of the items include "This Is the Army, Mr. Jones," "I Left My Heart at the Stage Door Canteen," "How About a Cheer for the Navy?," "That Russian Winter," "I'm Getting Tired So I Can Sleep."

# WORDS AND "WORD-MUSIC" VITAL TO RADIO, THEATER OF THE EAR

Margaret Cuthbert Discusses Importance of the Word in Radio; Writers' War Board Pools Talents of American Radio Writers

## Words and "Word-Music"

**A** COMMENT Margaret Cuthbert, director of women's activities for NBC, once made about words and "word-music" intrigued me.

"Even a few moments spent listening to the passing crowd in Times Square," she explained, "will demonstrate what I mean by 'word-music' as a part of our every-day life.

"Why not transpose this to radio?" she asked. "There are writers in radio who are doing this . . . If we do not continue to develop this art, radio will become stereotyped and produce static results."

Margaret Cuthbert's ideas on this subject will interest you, too, I am sure. She's one of the busiest women executives in the radio industry, handles the many problems that cross her desk daily with enthusiasm but without the slightest trace of excitement. Her greatest interest is in keeping American women better informed and more able to participate in all activities—local, national and international—through the medium of radio.

Convinced that her observations on the impact of the word on the listener would be interesting to the listener, I asked her to further develop her ideas on this provocative subject. Her answer to my request follows:

I, too, am intrigued with the impact of the word on the theater of the ear. Radio is theater, but contrariwise the carry-over stage-technique of the theater doesn't always make good radio.

The Elizabethan theater parallels

radio in that there was no scenery. A placard saying "a castle" was put on the stage. The poet, with words alone, had to build the castle, the hangings, the corridors, the ramparts, everything, using spoken words as his only material. So must writers for radio create scenes, moods and situations with words plus sound background to simulate reality.

In radio one writes for the ear alone. That is why word-approach derived from the theater (which was written for the eye and ear) loses much of its edge when transferred to the air.

Clarence Menser, vice president of NBC's programs, makes his staff understand that the microphone in the final analysis is the ear of the listener; that an effective program must establish intimate contact between performer and listener. He puts it this way: "There is no audience of ten million people. There are ten million audiences of one or two persons sitting close to their loudspeakers in their home." There is no assembled multitude to whom the performer must project his voice. The universal principle upon which all production of radio programs is built is that radio is first, last, and always an intimate, audible experience for every single listener.

An infinite variety of "word-music" or sound exists in life. The experience of groping through the dimout of the Pennsylvania station in war-time New York vividly demonstrates this fact. Sensitive writers and director-producers of radio programs such as Arch Oboler, Stephen Vincent Benet, Norman Corwin and countless others concerned with the communication of words and ideas, are developing and exploring the rich and unusual shadings that the medium of radio offers. Each artist concerned develops his own devices—the way all things have developed since the world began.

Anyone familiar with sailboats would have found an episode in a juvenile serial completely satisfactory because of its irresistible authenticity. As the boat jibed in an attempt to avoid running aground, it pulled free of its own anchor-line. The mast groaned and creaked, the ropes squealed through the blocks, the waves pounded and the water gurgled. There was also a combustible excitement in the accelerated tempo of the action.

No landlubber wrote the script from a second-hand description. The flavor of the sea was created and re-created by the accuracy of the sound-effects. No doubt was left in the mind of the

listener that the writer and director-producer of the show had been down to the sea in ships.

A much simpler device for bringing the mass mind automatically to attention by a combination of sound and words is well illustrated in this short but effective introduction of our "Consumer Time" program produced by Consumers' Counsel Division of the U. S. Department of Agriculture:

1. SOUND: CASH REGISTER . . . RINGS TWICE . . . CLOSE DRAWER
2. NANCY: That's your money buying food.
3. SOUND: CASH REGISTER
4. JOHN: That's your money paying for a home.
5. SOUND: CASH REGISTER
6. NANCY: That's your money buying clothes.
7. JOHN: Buying you a living in war-time.
8. SOUND: CASH REGISTER . . . CLOSE DRAWER

Does the following brief excerpt from "Bud Barton," a serial that NBC is justly proud of, paint a mental picture of Grandma Barton and Joy?

- Joy: H'lo, Grandma Barton—look-it my new bicycle, new dress, new wrist-watch, new socks, new shoes—new braces on my teeth—see?
- GRANDMA: Goodness sakes!
- SOUND: (BICYCLE BELL)
- Joy: Isn't this a musical bell?
- SOUND: (RING BELL)
- GRANDMA: Well, Joy!
- Joy: New wrist-watch, too. Lookit.
- GRANDMA: Come on in . . . I was just having a cup of tea, will you join me?
- Joy: Thank you very much. With cookies?
- GRANDMA: (CHUCKLES) With cookies.
- SOUND: (OF MOVEMENT—DOOR CLOSES—FURTHER MOVEMENT)
- Joy: How do you like my braces?
- GRANDMA: Let's see 'em.
- Joy: (WIDE-LIPPED) See?
- GRANDMA: Very neat.

Wynn Wright, in charge of NBC production, repeats a story of Pavel Orlienief, the great Russian actor who toured the provinces of Russia as Oswald in Ibsen's "Ghosts." During the last scene, Oswald has the line "The sun, the sun!" The interpretation of these luminous words by the great actor had such an impact on the peasants that they told Orlienief they had seen the sun for the first time. What visions might he have conjured up for the listeners had they been able to hear him through radio?

I am sure Virginia Wolf would have

considered this story a perfect illustration to her conclusion that "One word is sufficient. But if one cannot find it?"

Words are such a challenge to the imagination that one must stop somewhere—else the excursion turns into an obsession. This is where I stop. Let others continue from here on.

To Margaret Cuthbert's train of thought may I add one car of my own. You may call it the caboose if you wish. This is it.

The names of Corwin, Benet, Oboler and—may I add—Orson Welles have made brilliant marks on radio's horizon because these men have heeded the power of the word, have explored deeply its potentialities, and have considered the peculiarities of the radio as a medium of communication. The greatest future development of radio as an art, I feel, will come from the efforts of those who struggle along on the course set by these men.

## War Scripts for Schools

The Writers War Board, pooling the talents of most of the country's outstanding writers, is one of the many agencies which have sprung up to promote the war effort. Among the activities of this group is a war script project through which schools and colleges are supplied with a royalty-free "War Script of the Month." Selection of the scripts is in the hands of a committee headed by Erik Barnouw of Columbia University. The first script sent out to schools was Stephen Vincent Benet's "They Burned the Books," which was followed in August by Dorthea J. Lewis' "Time Is Short."

# NAZI INTERVIEWS WITH BRITISH AND AMERICAN WAR PRISONERS FLOP

New Schedule of Programs From London; Nazi Broadcasts for Home Consumption View Likelihood of Another Winter Campaign in Russia

## Snake Invades Cockpit

**L**IEUT. ROBERT BROUGHT of Los Angeles, a pilot "somewhere in Australia," had one of the most exciting stories of the war to tell the other morning over the Melbourne short-wave station.

Flying at a low altitude on a scouting detail the lieutenant was suddenly aware of a movement on the floor of the cockpit. Peering out of the corner of his eye he saw to his horror the head of a large snake protruding from behind the control-box near his left foot. His first instinct was to get out of that cockpit as fast as possible, but better judgment warned him that any attempt to bail out or even to reach his service revolver would cause the snake to strike. Almost imperceptibly he began moving his foot away from the reptile, but even this caused it to turn its ugly head toward him. Next he decided to put the plane into a skid and endeavor thus to throw the unwelcome visitor over to the side of the cockpit as far as possible from his foot. To do this he had to move the rudder with his foot. Instantly the snake lashed out like lightning and struck his left leg. Before it could cause any further trouble the pilot grabbed his leather jacket and, throwing it over his hand, he seized the snake just behind its venomous head, lifted it up (it was a good four feet in length) and flung it out of the window. He was sorry that he wasn't higher so that it would have been dashed to the earth with greater force. By that time the pilot was becoming dizzy and his leg, already swollen, was rapidly becoming stiff. He set his course to return to the airport, but realized almost immediately that he must land at once, as his leg was now almost useless and it took the greatest will-power to avoid passing out. He found a dry swamp and somehow managed to set the plane down. As soon as he could drag himself from the plane he applied a tourniquet to his leg, but he realized he must have medical attention. Seeing a rude building at the edge of the swamp, and hoping to find aid there, in the greatest pain he managed to drag himself over to it only to find it was a cow shed and an empty one at that. There was plenty of mud in the shed, and thinking this might draw out some of the pain he plastered it liberally on his leg, rubbing it into the wound as best he could. He then buried his whole leg in the mud and promptly passed out. Several hours later he awakened to find the pain somewhat less but the leg still stiff and useless. Again summoning a supreme effort of will he got to his feet and hobbled back to the plane; got it into the air, manipulating his foot-controls with his left hand. By using his oxygen supply profusely, he kept from pass-

ing out again, and after an eternity arrived back at the airport and managed to set his plane down amid tremendous cheers from his colleagues, who had feared he had crashed.

For his fortitude and resourcefulness and for bringing his plane back unharmed after a harrowing adventure, Lieut. Brought has since been decorated.

## Allied Prisoners "Won't Talk"

"We now have an unusual item on our program. We take you to a large football field near Dieppe, where about four thousand British and American prisoners of war are assembled. They will give brief messages to the folks back home." Thus the Berlin announcer of the German short-wave station introduced what was supposed to be a prize piece of propaganda, proving not only that many prisoners of war had been taken at Dieppe by the Germans but that they were being well treated by the kindly and chivalrous Nazis. The announcer at Dieppe then took over. "Here we have a young flier from New Zealand. What is your name?" After an embarrassing pause the flier finally reluctantly said, "McCuhen." "Well, go ahead and tell the folks how you feel," the Nazi announcer prodded. Another pause and then, "I feel well and am all right—I guess." Next the German speaker tried to corner a young Canadian but he refused to

give his name or say anything at all. "Now, now," countered the frustrated announcer, "there is no compulsion about this, boys, say anything you want to. Just tell the folks at home that you are unharmed and well treated. All right, who will be next?" More silence ensued. Once more the announcer tried to get a statement from the prisoners, but no one would utter a sound. Only a tremendous silence reigned. Then came this: "Well, here we are back in the studios at Berlin again. We have just brought you a special feature from Dieppe. In twelve minutes we will have a studio concert. In the meantime we will be entertained by some recordings." So ended one of the most ludicrous broadcasts ever attempted by the Berlin short-wave station.

## Tapping the Short Waves

According to propaganda-analyst W. A. Sinclair of the London short-wave station, Goebbels has already begun to broadcast in German to Germany that another winter campaign in Russia is likely, that a long war is probable. The Budapest radio, broadcasting for home reception, has already instituted a vigorous campaign for winter clothing for the Hungarian troops in the Caucasus . . . Nazi propaganda in the past often has inferred that, pushed too hard, the British would give up and ask for peace. Recent propaganda trends infer that Brit-

ain can be overcome only by an overwhelming preponderance of arms and manpower . . . William Holt, speaking from London about the influence the arrival of our troops in Britain is having on British-American relations, remarked that Columbus discovered America in 1492 but that the Americans were discovering Britain in 1942. He feels, as do many of the American soldiers with whom he had talked, that the newspapers have been overplaying the differences between the Americans and the British; that left alone the American and British boys get along fine; that they discover they have much in common and that fundamentally their dislikes and likes are about the same.

"Britain Speaks" continues at 8:30 p.m. (repeat at 11:15 p.m.), but new speakers have been added. The new roster follows: Sundays, Sir Thomas Birkett, famous British lawyer; Mondays, "Education in War-Time"; Tuesdays, "Voice of the Enemy," a propaganda review by W. A. Sinclair; Wednesdays, war production talk, featuring various leaders in the field of production; Thursdays, J. B. Priestley; Fridays, "Reviewing World Affairs," by Wickham Steed . . . "Freedom Forum" is now heard Saturdays at 8:30 p.m. EWT (repeat at 12 mid. EWT).

## News About the Stations

The Melbourne, Australia, transmission for night reception on the western coast, broadcast daily from 12:25 to 1:10 a.m. EWT, will soon shift to a fall frequency of 11.71 megs, according to August Balbi of Los Angeles, Calif. . . . Tokyo was heard testing recently with music and voice from 1:00 to 4:00 a.m. EWT on a new frequency of 12.14 megs . . . The "Indian Independence Station" (12.00) at Shonan (Singapore) broadcasts a talk in English daily at 11:15 a.m. EWT . . . "The Voice of Free India," clandestine Nazi-operated station, is now being heard with excellent signal strength from 10 a.m. to 12 noon EWT on 15.22 megs, according to John Wilson of Wilmington, Del.

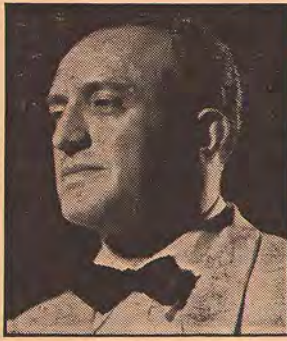

Actor Jim Kelly, heard as Mike Clancy in "Mr. Keen, Tracer of Lost Persons," like a prophet, is without honor in his own home. His five-year-old son, a chronic radio dialer, tuned in on the "Mr. Keen" program recently, heard the voice of Clancy and said, "That's only Pop, talking funny."

## Talks to Himself

Few actors talk to themselves over the radio, but Bob Jellison, of Des Moines, Iowa, does that very thing in the CBS program "That Brewster Boy." Jellison plays two characters, Clarence (The Blimp) Clark, and Clarence's older brother, Herbert. One is a poetry-spouting, romantic sort; the other a fat lad with considerable conceit because his father publishes a newspaper. Ellison, son of a concert singer, was in vaudeville before invading radio as a sound-effects man.

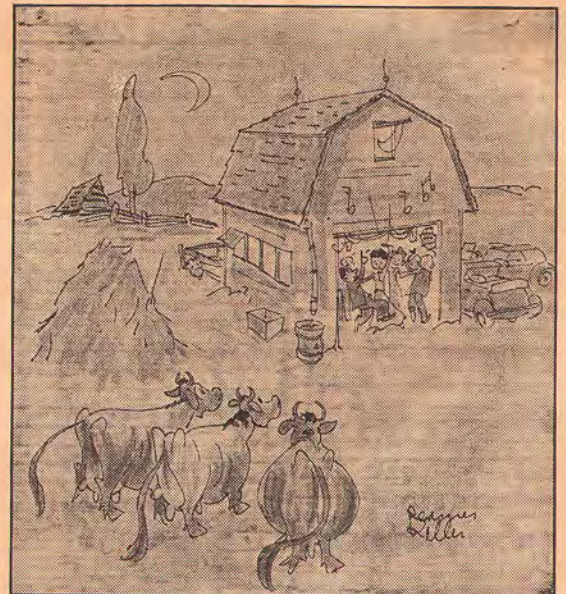

**B**Y THIS time you're probably very well acquainted as well as pleased with the new fall fashion silhouette—the slim, fluid lines, the graceful draping that uses ingenuity rather than material to achieve infinite variety of designs. But have you considered how your own silhouette measures up? It's no longer popular, nor even possible, to hide oversize hips beneath the flattering folds of a voluminous skirt. A slim waistline must be an actuality, not an illusion created by the clever manipulation of yards and yards of fabric. Fashion's dimensions are frozen, so you'll just have to whip yours into a shapely mold—one that keys in with the 1942 style idea.

There was a time when one dieted only for beauty's sake, but it has now been discovered that correct weight is vital to health . . . to life itself. It's a fact that when insurance companies find that an individual under thirty is underweight, or one over thirty is overweight, they put a lien on his policy, and he has to pay more for his

insurance than others of an average weight. It's been found, too, that the death rate among overweight persons is greater than in those of normal weight, since there is an accumulation of toxins or poisons in fatty tissues. So for the sake of future health as well as present appearance, buy yourself scales, a measuring-tape, and consult your physician for the weight that is suitable for your age, build, and type.

Fortunately for you, science has developed methods for reducing weight without reducing health and energy. The best diets allow you plenty to eat, but the foods prescribed are of a non-fattening variety. Beware of the diet which leaves you listless. It's not only unnecessary but will definitely lead to serious complications. It is also unsafe to lose too much weight all at once. Most diet-setters agree on two pounds a week as a maximum recommended loss. If you accompany your diet with daily exercises, designed to correct your particular posture and figure faults, then you're distributing your

# WHAT'S COOKING!

By GEORGIA SCOTT

## Try Fowl on "Meatless Days"

**Y**OU American housewives may be marketing for meats with a ration card before very long. And voluntary "meatless days" like the ones you planned during World War I should be on your menu calendar. Actually, there is enough food in the aggregate in America to provide every family in fighting U. S. with an ample, serviceable diet. However, according to Roy F. Hendrickson, administrator of the Agricultural Marketing Administration, there will be shortages in a number of important foods.

Although farmers have broken all production records this year, the increasing demands of our fighting forces, together with lend-lease allotments, bring the available supply of meat (3,000,000,000 pounds) below the quantity that the average consumer, with his ever-increasing income, can buy at ceiling prices. Higher wages, increased employment and a record-breaking national income account for the current unprecedented demand for meat. Besides, our men in uniform are eating three times as much meat as they did when in civilian life. And since it's a historical fact that the meat-eating races are the best fighters, it's up to your family and your neighbors to institute a schedule of dairy or meat-minus days.

The great expansion in poultry production created this summer to meet war-time egg requirements has provided one solution for your menu-planning problems. And the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture's leaflet on poultry cooking will help you make the most of fowl, whether you're aiming to broil, fry, roast, stuff or steam the bird.

To begin with, chicken or young birds are best broiled at a moderate heat for even cooking. And you'll find that broiled chicken is easier to manage on the plate if the joints are broken and the wing tips are removed. Or with practise and a sharp knife, broilers can be boned completely. Before cooking, wipe the chicken as dry as possible. Then coat with melted fat, sprinkle with salt and pepper, and if the family likes theirs coated dust the bird lightly with flour. Never skin a chicken! The skin holds in juices

and flavor, and is delicious in itself. Start the cooking with the chicken skin side down on the rack of the broiler, or in a roasting-pan several inches from the source of heat. Slow, even cooking keeps the juices in while the outside of the fowl turns a delicate brown. A two-pound chicken (dressed weight) will probably take thirty to forty-five minutes if broiled at a moderate heat. Serve it hot off the grid with the pan-drippings or melted fat poured over, and garnish with toast points and a sprig of parsley or cress.

**I**F, HOWEVER, you're a-yearning for fried chicken, disjoint and cut plump young bird into serving portions. Before cooking, wipe fowl dry, season and roll in flour, or dip in an egg beaten with a tablespoon of water, and coat with bread crumbs or corn meal. Put the thickest pieces into a skillet or chicken-fryer that has been filled with a half-inch or more of fat. Leave space for fat (heated to a frying temperature) to come up around each piece. Don't crowd. Cover, cook at moderate heat, and turn when brown. Serve with a luscious cream gravy, made from pan-drippings.

### Cream Gravy

To every 2 tablespoons of fat in the skillet allow 2 tablespoons of flour, cook for a few minutes, stir constantly, add 1½ cups of milk, and cook until thickened. Season to taste and serve hot.

Select a young, plump, well-fattened bird for roasting. Pull out the pin feathers and singe off the hairs over a flame quickly so as not to darken or scorch the skin. Scrub the bird with a wet cloth and a little corn meal. Rinse thoroughly and wipe the bird dry. Cut off the oil sac on the top of the tail and save the giblets to stew for the gravy. If your family likes their bird stuffed, sprinkle the inside with salt and fill the body cavity with your favorite filling—but don't pack it. Stuffing swells as it cooks, so be sure to give it plenty of room to

expand. If you're ready to cook the bird immediately, filling should be hot, but if you're holding the bird overnight put the stuffing in cold, keep the bird well chilled, and it will absorb filler-flavor.

Place the stuffed fowl breast down on a rack in a shallow pan. And start roasting the bird with the back up and breast down. It allows the thighs to cook thoroughly without cooking the meat away from the breast-bone. Turn every half-hour and baste with pan-drippings or melted stock. To test for "doneness," run a steel skewer or a cooking-fork carefully into the thickest part of the breast and into the thigh next to the breast. If the meat is tender and the juice does not show a red tinge, the bird is ready for the carver's knife.

For that professional "chef touch" try—

### Giblet Gravy

Simmer the giblets (liver, gizzard, and heart) and the neck in a quart of water for about an hour, or until tender. Drain the giblets, chop them fine, and save the broth.

Skim off excess fat from the drippings in the roaster. Leave about ½ cup, and stir in 6 tablespoons of flour. Then gradually add the cook-broth and enough more cold water to make a thin, smooth gravy. Cook for 5 minutes, stirring constantly, and add the chopped giblets. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Add chopped parsley, if desired.

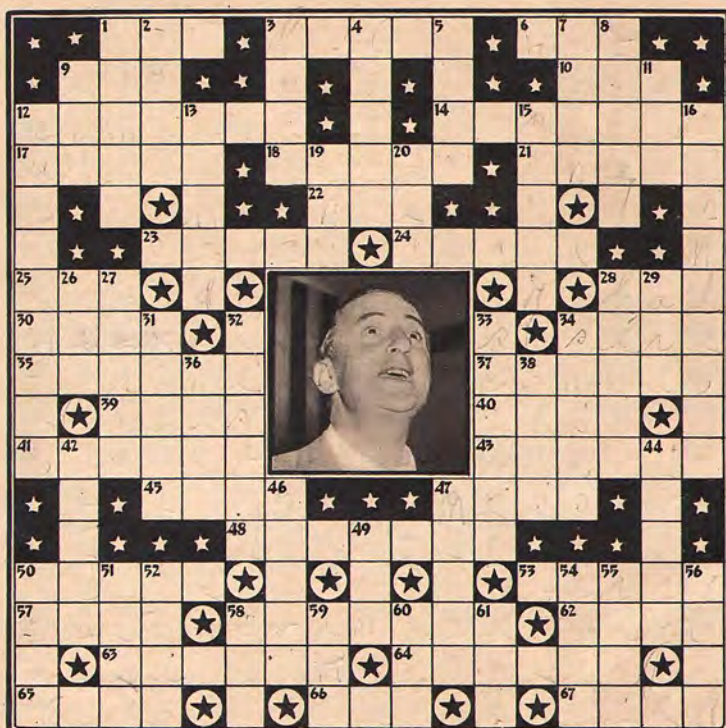

weight so as to achieve correct figure proportions. The nice thing about exercise is that it benefits those who are underweight as well as those who are overweight. For the former, it creates a natural appetite, assists digestion, and so gradually increases your weight. For the latter, if you're on a medically sound diet, exercise will exchange fat tissues for muscle tissue and you'll feel stronger to boot!

The gist of most of the better diets today recommends the following:

**Foods to avoid:** Fat meats, such as pork, duck, goose; fried foods; starchy vegetables — potatoes; cream soups; rich salad dressings; breads; butter; sugar; and fat fish, such as salmon, mackerel, herring and shad.

**Foods to eat:** Lean meats; codfish, flounder and haddock; fruits; green vegetables, radishes, carrots, celery, cucumber, onions, turnips, tomatoes, and squash.

Some of the general rules agreed on by research physicians and reprinted in Dr. Jas. W. Barton's latest book, "Overweight and Underweight," are:

1. Eat meat or eggs or fish at least once a day. These are animal protein foods that build and repair body cells.

2. All liquids must be cut down. Fat tissue holds more water than other tissues and excessively heavy individuals are water-logged. Every pound of fat can hold three pounds of water.

The amount of food required by each individual varies with age and the amount of work or exercise accomplished. For the average woman, 5' 4", weighing 130 pounds, lying at complete rest all day and doing no work, 1,400 calories are required. If the woman has a "sitting down" job, the required calories are 1,700. And if she's very active and hard-working, the requirement is 2,500 to 3,000 calories. Your own physician has a list of foods and their caloric values, or he can tell you where to get one. In this way you can regulate your own diet by choosing the right foods in proportionate amounts. A wonderful "bible" to have with you during diet days is the "Complete Weight Reducer," by C. J. Gerling. Practically every subject relative to diet, weight, exercise and general health is discussed here—it's of particular value as a debunker of fraudulent diets and reducing devices. It also contains hints to alleviate your hunger-urge like:

Drink water, unsweetened fruit juice, tea with lemon, black coffee, or vegetable juice for between-meals hunger.

A cigarette before meals is claimed by some to inhibit appetite and make it easier to adhere to one's diet.

A small piece of candy after a meal has been said to help satisfy the hunger left by a diet meal, but it would have to be very small.

Long and thorough chewing of food is sometimes held to give more "satisfaction" when you're seeking satisfaction from small diet proportions.

But, perhaps after all, as Mr. Gerling suggests, the best plan is merely to put all one's energies into developing will-power enough to eat the diet allowance and let it go at that. So here's to your will-power, your welfare, and your new winter waistline!
