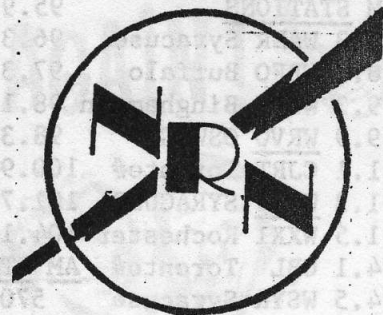

SPECIALS SALUTING NBC RADIO'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY: OVER 21 HOURS of special programming saluting NBC radio on its 50th



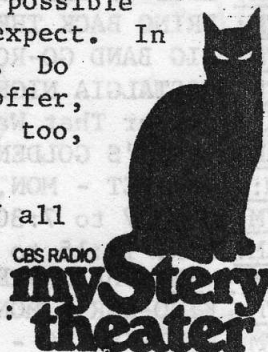
anniversary have been scheduled by NBC radio (a 5-week hour-long series titled THE FIRST FABULOUS 50 - see pages 2 & 8 of this issue), NBC-TV (a 4-hour special on Sun. Nov. 14 - see our next issue for more info) and THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY (5 entire 2½-hour shows, in Nov. & early Dec. - see our next issue). You won't want to miss any of these! And you won't want to miss our next issue, saluting NBC on its 50th anniversary, November 15, 1926-1976.

MORE ON SCI-FI DRAMAS ON PUBLIC RADIO: We have been able to verify that two half-hour pilot shows were produced. However, copyright problems have developed which, unless satisfactorily resolved, will prevent the broadcast of the two programs. In addition, funding problems have arisen which make it unlikely that the series will be completed even should the copyright difficulties be ironed out. By the way, both local public FM radio stations (WCNY-FM Syracuse 91.3, and WRVO-FM Oswego 89.9) have indicated they are ready, willing and anxious to carry the programs if and when they are made available.

CONVENTION UPDATE: See Page 3 of this issue for an insert on the Oct. 30 SAVE Radio Convention in Meriden, Conn. Please note the following changes & additions: the line reading "9 am to 5:30 pm" should read "9 am to 10 pm", also registration does NOT end at 10 am, but continues all day. There will be live sound effects demonstrations, and a live radio broadcast. Allen Rockford and Don Richardson expect to go, and hope to see you there.

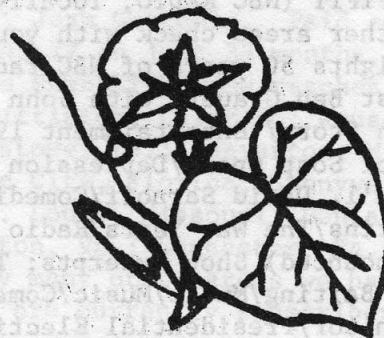
