WFBL, WIBX, WWNY to air CBS "Adventure Theatre"

HAPPY DAYS star Tom Bosley to host the CBS GENERAL MILLS RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE...

It was announced on the January 8, 1977, edition of THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY (via a CBS Radio Press Release) that Tom Bosley, who currently stars as Howard Cunningham in the popular television series, 'Happy Days', has signed to serve as host of the GENERAL MILLS RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE, a new weekend dramatic series for young people to be broadcast on the CBS Radio Drama Network. The announcement was made January 3, 1977, by Himan Brown, producer-director of the series.

THE RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE, which will premiere on Saturday, February 5, 1977, will present every Saturday & Sunday original adventure stories, and classic tales of bravery and derring-do in literature and in real life. Each 50 minute program will be broadcast on the network at 6:08 PM, ET. (NOTE: Check the station in your area for the exact time and check the station list in NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS for local broadcast times.)

'I'm looking forward to this opportunity to bring to today's children the marvelous stories we once read but they probably haven't, as well as some exciting original dramas,' says Bosley, who for years has made it a practice to read to his 10 year old daughter, Amy Elizabeth.

'Radio drama can serve as a counterbalance to too many hours spent sitting in front of the television set. It can stimulate children's minds in a way that television can not -- much like the way that books do, forcing children to use their own imaginations.'

Bosley got his start as an actor on radio in his native Chicago in the late 1940's, just as radio drama was beginning to disappear. 'I played some roles in JACK ARMSTRONG and TERRY AND THE PIRATES but before I could make it into the coterie of actors who got the big parts, radio drama was gone. So, I'm really excited about taking part in the current resurgence of radio as a medium of quality entertainment.'

From radio Bosley moved on to the theatre, then to movies and television. On Broadway, he's best remembered for his starring role in FIORELLO! On television he was featured in many hit programs, and has many credits in movies during the past ten years. As mentioned, his current television role is as co-star on 'Happy Days' each week.

VINCENT PRICE in Syracuse-March 5

VINCENT PRICE, who is well known to radio, television, motion picture and theatre audiences, is equally well known to lovers of art, collectors of cook books, readers of his books and newspaper articles, as well as the thousands who have seen his one man show 'VILLAINS STILL PURSUE ME' will appear in Syracuse on SATURDAY, MARCH 5 at 8:00 PM under the auspices of THE SYRACUSE CINEPHILE SOCIETY at the Onondage County Civic Center. Born in St. Louis, Vincent Price's initial aim in life was to become a teacher and collector of art, an aim stimulated by his purchase of a Rembrandt etching when he was only 12 years old. He attended the Country Day School in St. Louis and went to Yale University to major in art. He continued studies at London University while working for a master's degree.

While in London he satisfied another artistic interest--the theatre, and obtained his first theatrical role as a lark when he applied for a role and got it. From that point on, his thoughts turned to the theatre and his first role was in the London production of VICTORIA REGINA, which was brought to New York by Gilbert Miller. Vincent Price was brought along to play Prince Consort Albert opposite Helen Hayes, and this American debut made him a star overnight.

Since that time he has been a leading radio, film, television and stage star, and it was as guest on the late Edward R. Murrow's PERSON TO PERSON program that a nationwide audience became aware of his extensive art collection. He has attained renown as a major art collector and critic and holds many honorary degrees, plus is on or has been on many committees concerning art in the United States and England.

Mr. Price also has an established reputation as a gourmet cook and is writer of a TREASURY OF GREAT RECIPES. He is also the author of I LIKE WHAT I KNOW, THE BOOK OF JOE and TREASURY OF AMERICAN ART.

Vincent Price is well known to old time radio fans as the last actor to portray THE SAINT, plus at least 1,000 other appearances on such programs as SUSPENSE, ESCAPE and many other anthology series. He has starred in more than 100 films including SONG OF BERNADETTE, LAURA, DRAGONWYCK, HOUSE OF SEVEN GABLES, THE TEN COMMANDMENTS, THE PIT AND THE PENDULUM, THE RAVEN, THE ABOMINABLE DR. PHIBES, plus one of the first 3-D movies, HOUSE OF WAX. He also has made recordings of Poetry and the works of Edgar Allan Poe which have become standard classics. In 1969 to keep up his devilish image he made a Capitol LP entitled WITCHCRAFT-MAGIC featuring all sorts of curses, spells and other bits of related information.
