WITHER GOEST THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY?

As we go to press, the future of our radio program, THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY, is very uncertain at best. Thus, you will find no listings for the program after the WCNY broadcast of April 16 and WRVO broadcast of April 22. Even if it continues (1) there would be no show on WCNY on April 23, and (2) beginning with the next program aired, the show would be just two hours in length. For up-to-date information, listen to the scheduled April broadcasts, and check the May issue of NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS.

COMEDY'S GOLDEN MOMENTS CELEBRATES FIRST ANNIVERSARY, AND THEN...?

Gerry Orlando's program, COMEDY'S GOLDEN MOMENTS, usually heard on WCNY-FM 91.3 Syracuse Sunday from 5:30 to 8 pm, celebrates its first anniversary with a 4-hour special from 4 to 8 pm on Sunday April 3. On Sunday April 24, it will be pre-empted. Then, when it returns on Sunday May 1, it will be in its new "contracted" two-hour version.

GOLDEN DAYS OF RADIO TV SPECIAL SYNDICATED:

Frank Bresee has announced syndication of THE GOLDEN DAYS OF RADIO Television Special. The program, available as either a one-hour or half-hour, is described as "a blend of nostalgia with the present... a television special that takes place in the 1930's when people dressed up to go out and watch radio." Starring are Milton Berle, Johnny Mathis, Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy and Bret "The Shadow" Morrison, with Frank Bresee as host. It is to be telecast on KNXT, channel 2, in Los Angeles early in April, and on the other CBS owned-and-operated stations at dates yet to be announced. In addition, other stations across the US and Canada may be expected to purchase and schedule it at later dates, so look for it in your area. THE GOLDEN DAYS OF RADIO is a long-running and popular Armed Forces (now American Forces) Radio Service and syndicated series, and Frank Bresee has been a good friend to THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY and NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS.

WCNY-FM: SUNDAY FROM 5:30 TO 8 PM

GERRY ORLANDO, HOST

MAR. 6: Tonight's episode of COMMAND PERFORMANCE from AFRS in 1945 stars Frank Sinatra as host, with guests Victor Borge, The Pied Pipers, Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall. ** THE EDDIE CANTOR SHOW from NBC on 3/13/46 features a sketch in which guest Jack Benny rents Eddie's Palm Springs house and makes a few "minor" changes. ** In response to numerous requests, an episode of THE ADVENTURES OF ARCHIE ANDREWS will be presented. This broadcast from NBC radio on 7/17/48 finds Archie, Jughead, Veronica and Betty trying to help Archie's father put up some new wallpaper... Tune in and find out how much help they really are! ** For some very early radio we have Billy Jones and Ernie Hare as THE TAYSTEE BREADWINNERS as syndicated in 1934. The boys treat us to novelty songs and "snappy patter". ** Also, a 15-minute BOB HOPE RED CROSS SHOW as syndicated in 1953. Bob is joined by guests Bing Crosby and Marilyn Maxwell in this variety show. ** Groucho Marx will be on hand in another installment from his 1972 Carnegie Hall concert. **

MAR. 13: The premier broadcast of THE DENNIS DAY SHOW from NBC on 10/3/46 will be heard tonight. Dennis tries to get guest Jack Benny's permission to star in his own show and has a pretty rough time of it. Don Wilson also makes an appearance. ** The world of journalism will never be the same on THE JOHNSON'S WAX PROGRAM WITH FIBBER MCGEE & MOLLY from NBC on 9/19/39. Fibber gets a job as a newspaper gossip columnist and runs into more trouble than he bargained for. ** THE FRED ALLEN SHOW from CBS/AFRS in 1943 features a sketch in which Fred is injured by a runaway beer barrel and "helped" by guests Ed Gardner as "Archie" and Charlie Cantor as "Clifton Finnegan" from "Duffy's Tavern." ** EDGAR BERGEN & CHARLIE MCCARTHY welcome guest Edward Everett Horton in a broadcast from NBC on May 3, 1942. Bud Abbott and Lou Costello (at this time regulars on the series) perform one of their classic routines. ** The comedy of George Carlin will also be spotlighted. **

MAR. 20: THE JIMMY DURANTE & GARRY MOORE SHOW from CBS on 6/13/47 treats music lovers to another of Jimmy and Garry's famous "Hot-Cha" operettas... this time with a western setting. ** We'll also listen to THE BOB HOPE SHOW from NBC/AFRS on 1/7/45 as Bob welcomes guest Tyrone Power in this broadcast from Pomona College. Regulars Jerry Collona, Frances Langford and Skinnay Ennis are also featured. ** THE KRAFT MUSIC HALL stars Al Jolson and Oscar Levant, with guest Groucho Marx telling Al about his new fur coat business. This show is from NBC/AFRS on 1/13/49. ** Hal Roary stars as THE GREAT GILDERSLEEVE from NBC/AFRS in 1946. Gildy's in trouble... he has two dates for the same evening! All of your favorite "Gildersleeve" characters are heard in this broadcast. ** George Burns is again featured in another portion of his 1974 concert. **

MAR. 27: It's Oscar night on THE JACK BENNY PROGRAM from CBS/AFRS on 3/23/52. Jack takes Mary to the Academy Awards ceremony and the evening's events occur in typical Benny manner. ** THE BOB BURNS SHOW from NBC on 10/6/46 features Bob, Shirley Ross and Jim Backus in a story concerning Bob's runaway hog and an unfriendly neighbor who refuses to return it. The result is a funny courtroom battle which is filled with surprises. ** Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll star as AMOS & ANDY in a broadcast from NBC on 7/6/48. Kingfish needs money and Andy Brown needs a new car... That combination develops into one of the Kingfish's wildest attempts at swindling Andy. ** Lucille Ball and Richard Denning portray Liz and George Cooper in MY FAVORITE HUSBAND from CBS radio on 3/24/51. Liz and George have agreed that Liz can buy a new Easter outfit if she loses a few pounds, but Liz has a sneaky plan cooked up! It's Lucy at her scheming best in this funny show. ** Foster Brooks will deliver one of his routines from the early 1970's. **

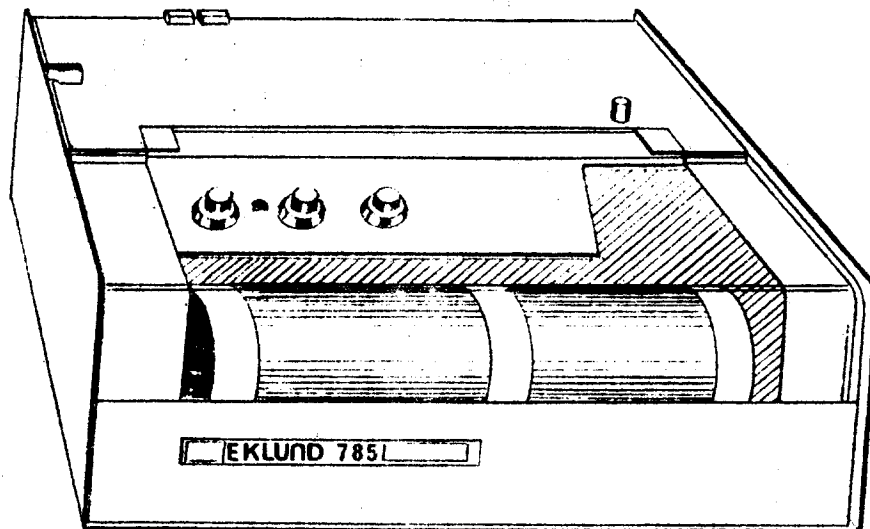

WRVO-FM MAR. 4: SEE LAST LISTING, PAGE 14 OF FEBRUARY ISSUE.

WCNY-FM WRVO-FM TONIGHT: LOCAL RADIO NOSTALGIA & A SUPERB RADIO PRODUCTION OF A GREAT
MAR. 5 & MAR. 11 FILM. First, in response to many requests, we bring back the recent
past with our own "Nostalgia Mini-Con" production of MR. AND MRS. NORTH,
"The Hair-Curling Adventure" starring members of Syracuse Theatre Wing, Inc. (then known as
The Actors Workshop of Syracuse). This live stereo recreation was performed in the WCNY-FM
studios on 6/26/76 from the original 4/14/43 script, for the 3rd anniversary of our program.
Many of you were there to see the performance, others may have heard it at home. In any
case, here's your chance to hear it again - or for the first time. It was recorded (and
will be played) in stereo, without edits of content (any goofs or flubs - mostly in the
sound effects or music - will be heard as they took place). ** We turn the clock back to
the late 1940's for local radio trivia as WSYR GOES CALLING on Mrs. Brennan in Mattydale.
This is an interesting example of 1940's daytime radio, featuring local personality Elliot
Gove, with announcer Hal Bowie. ** Then, we listen to the FORD THEATRE production from
NBC on 5/23/48 of the great 1937 dramatic film, "A Star is Born". There are no name stars
in this program, only competent radio actors, most of whom you never heard of, yet it's an
excellent production. You may recognize the title as the name of a 1954 musical film
starring Judy Garland based on the same story. **

WCNY-FM WRVO-FM We present THE LUX RADIO THEATRE production of "The Devil AND Miss Jones"
MAR. 12 & MAR. 18 from CBS on 3/12/45. This comedy stars Frank Morgan and Linda Darnell.
** We listen as Eddie Cantor hosts THE HEART OF SHOW BUSINESS, a syndi-
cated series for The Heart Fund from Feb. 1958. [^]Two 15-minute programs from the series are
heard, with guests Ethel Merman and Pat Boone. ** An episode of the NEW ADVENTURES OF
MICHAEL SHAYNE, PRIVATE DETECTIVE syndicated series from the late 1940's starring Jeff
Chandler is heard: "The Case of the Mail Order Murders". This is our tribute to Davis
Dresser, who wrote the Michael Shayne stories under the name Brett Halliday. He died at
age 72 on 2/4/77. **

WCNY-FM WRVO-FM British humour returns to our show as we present another zany go-round
MAR. 19 & MAR. 25 with John Cleese, Tim Brooke-Taylor, Graeme Garden, David Hatch, Jo
Kendall and Bill Oddie on I'M SORRY, I'LL READ THAT AGAIN! from the BBC
via NPR. The series is originally from the mid-1960's. ** We turn next to Roy Rogers in
a non-singing western role in THE LUX RADIO THEATRE production of "In Old Oklahoma" from
CBS on 3/13/44. (This may be a rehearsal) ** We pay tribute to character actor-western
sidekick-comedian Andy Devine who died on 2/18/77 at age 71. He'll be heard as host of
the AFRS 15-minute program MELODY ROUNDUP, also featuring the Sons of the Pioneers and the
Song Spinners from the mid-1940's. Then, we'll listen to Andy in his most famous part, as
"Jingles" in WILD BILL HICKOK from MBS in the early-1950's. The episode: "The Medicine
Show". Guy Madison stars in the title role. This was also an early TV series with the
same stars. (Please note: the sound quality of this program is NOT up to our usual stan-
dards.) **

WCNY-FM WRVO-FM FROM THE RIDICULOUS TO THE SUBLIME. We open tonight with THE GOON SHOW
MAR. 26 & APR. 1 episode "Under Two Floorboards, A Tale of the Legion" from the BBC on
1/25/55 via NPR on 11/15/76. Spike Milligan, Harry Secombe and Peter
Sellers are the resident zanies. ** Orson Welles stars in THE LUX
RADIO THEATRE version of "Tale of Two Cities" from CBS on 3/26/45. Charles Dickens' novel
of the French Revolution became a screen classic in 1936, and this - in its own way - is an
equally memorable adaptation from the film. ** By special request, we hear an episode of
SNOW VILLAGE SKETCHES from MBS on 3/31/46 called "Riz Biscuits." Arthur Allen, Parker
Fennelly, Kate McComb, and Sarah Fussell star. This series, not quite serious drama, not
quite outright comedy, was on network radio as early as 1928, and was revived in 1936,
1943 and 1946. It was one of several similar shows which Allen and Fennelly (better known
as Titus Moody in the Fred Allen shows) did together for the better part of 20 years. **
