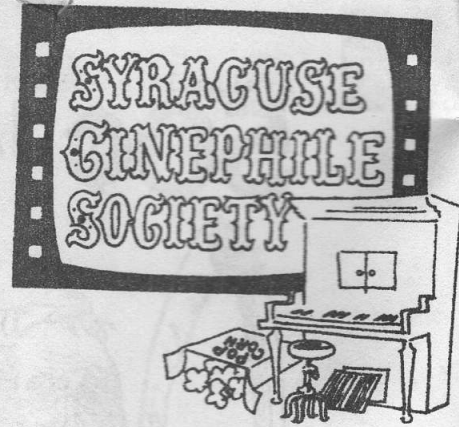
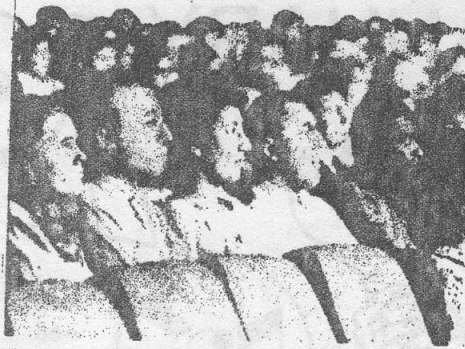

## Empire State theatre and musical instruments museum

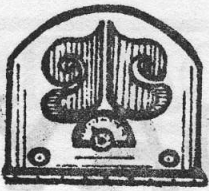
