OLD-TIME RADIO DRAMA: IN REVIEW SEPTEMBER, 1993

I give the DRAGNET episode, titled "The Big Mole," best dramatic award for the month. In addition to the commonly emphasized "Yes Ma'm...No Ma'm...How is that Ma'm?" numerous dramatical phrases were exchanged during the thirty-minute show, many being very humerous. How about Joe Friday's partner, Frank Smith, saying how much trouble his wife has with batting in pillows: "...Faye always has trouble with it. Stuff always creeps down to one end of the pillow. You've got one real fat end, and the other one just hasn't got anything in it. It's kind of uncomfortable when you sit on it." This was truly one of the "funny" shows from the DRAGNET series.

ESCAPE

GREATEST MYSTERY & ADVENTURE ON RADIO

"Tired of the everyday routine? Ever dream of a life of romantic adventure? Want to get away from it all? We offer you --ESCAPE!" That was the opening for Escape, which was, perhaps, the greatest mystery and adventure series ever on radio. As the show noted, you should step away from your everyday problems to live at the edge of your chair for a half-hour of suspenseful terror.

Premiering in 1947 and lasting to 1954, Escape starred many of the great CBS actors, including William Conrad of GUNSMOKE. Other stars were Parley Baer, Virginia Gregg, Sam Edwards, Jack Webb, Edgar Barrier, and John Dehner -- also known as Paladin on HAVE GUN, WILL TRAVEL. Story adaptations provided twist endings, similar to SUSPENSE material. "Leiningen vs. the Ants," "An Occurrence at Owl Creek Bridge," and "A Shipment of Mute Fate" are but a few of the horrifying stories of Escape. "Three Skeleton Key" was the rat story that was voted for best sound effects in RADIO-TV LIFE magazine and was later aired on SUSPENSE.

BOB HOPE'S GOTH

In 1940 Bob Hope's radio show was fourth in the ratings, and in 1943 he jumped to first place. Hope was a great hit not only with comedy, as he appeared in numerous other radio programs like SUSPENSE and LADY ESTHER'S SCREEN GUILD THEATRE. More success came when he teamed up with Bing Crosby and Dorothy Lamour in ROAD TO SINGAPORE. The three made about seven other "Road" pictures, including ROAD TO UTOPIA, MOROCCO, and HONG KONG.

Hope entertained the G.I.'s in World War II with Frances Langford and Jerry Colonna and later touched the hearts of troops in the Korean War, Vietnam, and Operation Desert Storm.

Bob has written eight books, such as DON'T SHOOT, IT'S ONLY ME; I OWE RUSSIA \$1,200; and HAVE TUX, WILL TRAVEL.

THE ADVENTURES OF THE SHADOW MOVIE SEEMS DRY

THE ADVENTURES OF THE SHADOW movie is far from the plot of the famed radio show of the '30s and '40s. The *new* movie portrays a man, Jimmy Pyrex Pootie [played by Douglas Balentine], who is tired of everyday modern life and decides to become a figure of the past. When Jimmy vanishes, his wife, Lucretia [Yanessa Klimek], calls Dr. Wier [Michael Goggans], who then uses hypnosis on Lucretia. She becomes the stillremembered companion of the Shadow, Margo Lane.

The film has humerous segments, unlike the original Shadow program, where the character used invisibility to solve dangerous crimes.

They look to us to represent virtue."

Keillor has recently built a new home in Wisconsin and has finished a book, titled THE BOOK OF GUYS, which will be released

in November. THE BOOK OF GUYS portrays 21 guys, including Keillor and George Bush. Keillor is also working on a script for Disney studios.
