

Initially titled *Challenge of the Yukon*, the Sergeant Preston radio program started out in 1939 as a 15-minute series with massive epics in serial format. By 1940, the series evolved into single adventures (and sometimes two-part adventures). Broadcast "live" over the Michigan Radio Network, the program could be heard in Chicago, northern Indiana and Ohio, and certain sections of Canada where radio receivership (and superb weather conditions) could allow someone with a superb radio set to pick up the broadcasts.

The program never went national until 1947. It was not until 1943 that the radio broadcasts were recorded on transcription discs. All of which makes these 1940 plot summaries treasured. Over the years I have been reading those pre-1943 radio broadcasts to fill in the gaps, progressing to a complete broadcast log of each and every radio adventure. The plots below are from radio scripts where recordings do not exist. (The plots are rough draft, not final draft.)

By the way, it would not be until the broadcast of May 30, 1940, that Tom Dougall began assigning script titles.

Episode #131 [NO TITLE LISTED] Broadcast May 16, 1940 Copyright Registration D-70148, script received at Registration Office May 24, 1940. Written by Tom Dougall.



Plot: Scotty and Hank Malloy offered to sell Marie's father a claim on the El Dorado, then switched deeds on him. Her father paid \$10,000 for a worthless piece of land on Caribou Creek. Scotty McGuire and Larry Reynolds own the claim her father paid for. Marie agrees to work with Sergeant Preston smash their confidence game, getting in good with the men at the Aurora café as an assistant which they always need for their scheme.

The next day, the men attempt to con a young man named Jim, who was also working in secret with Preston. In a back room the deal was arranged, with a \$10,000 payment. Marie was supposed to spill hot coffee on Jim, long enough for the cons to switch the deed. But under this scenario, the deed was not switched. The con men were puzzled until it was explained that Jim and his sister Marie have the last name of Chalmers. The men decide to kill the two youngsters to cover their attempted con, only to face Sergeant Preston and Pierre. The men are placed under attest, having had every word of the transaction overheard, and found guilty of attempted murder.

Trivia, etc. There was a mention of Daisy Mayme in Skagway, who was referenced in a 1939 story arc.

Episode #132 [NO TITLE LISTED]

Broadcast May 23, 1940 Copyright Registration D-70294, script received at Registration Office June 3, 1940. Written by Tom Dougall.

Plot: Jud Neville, the self-appointed mayor of Horseshoe Flats, and Bob Martin, his right-hand man, check on Harry McAtee, who lived west of town. Red Frazer threatened to kill Harry the other night in the saloon and while most in town found this to be an empty threat under the tongue of liquor, Jud felt he was also constable and therefore a check-up was necessary. Jim Henderson, Red's best friend, claimed he was sick and Red cared for him all night.

Sergeant Preston arrives in town, learns of the murder, and claims Red went up and married a woman named Rita Clark in the other town – Preston was witness to the ceremony. Jim was protecting his friend but his illness is real; Jim is slowly dying. When Red and Rita return to town, Red finds himself accused of murder by Jud Neville. Pierre, having been in town a week ahead of Preston, witnessed a confrontation between Jud and Red the other night over a deal on a piece of paper. Jud, realizing he accused the wrong person of the crime, in an act of desperation grabbed a gun but Red got the advantage and disarmed the killer.

Episode #133 "THE WEREWOLF HUNTS ALONE"

Broadcast May 30, 1940 Copyright Registration D-70295, script received at Registration Office June 3, 1940. Written by Tom Dougall. **Plot:** News of a series of trail robberies and killings in the Crater Canyon district prompted investigation by Sergeant Preston and Pierre, which takes seven days of travel to reach old Andy Marshall's way cabin.

There they learn of rumors that a large white wolf is responsible for the deaths and Indians claim a loup-garou, also known as a "werewolf." Pierre, suspicious, wishes to return to Dawson. Preston, however, suspects nothing supernatural. A settler named Bart brings in a wounded man for first aid, with evidence that a wolf slashed the man's parka, and Bart claims he shot at something that looked like a white man-wolf. Preston and Pierre travel four hours to reach the canyon and make camp. Since money was stolen, Preston insists there is no werewolf. Pierre, however, shivers from the thought of becoming another victim of the loup-garou.

Late at night, King gets into a fight with the loupgarou and after Preston calls for King to back down, the figure flees. Preston and Pierre followed the trail that led into the forest, under the cold white moon as the trees cast ghostly shadows. The trail led to Andy's cabin, where Preston finds Bart, and unveils the solution to the mystery. The two men trained a large white dog to be a killer.

First, they sent the beast after a traveler's dog team. The next night they sent the beast after the traveler. The old man who was wounded the other day was Bart attempting to cover his tracks with old Andy Marshall backing his story. The two men are placed under arrest as King barks. "Yes, King," Preston replies. "You were grand. Whenever we have more wolves to catch, we'll call on you."

Trivia, etc. This is the first episode of the series to have a script title.

Episode #134 "THE SERGEANT SETS A TRAP" Broadcast June 6, 1940 Copyright Registration D-70463, script received at Registration Office June 15, 1940. Written by Tom Dougall.

Plot: Young Roger Chapman's claim was on the upper reaches of Christmas Creek. Very few travelers passed that way so when a sled drew up

outside the cabin late one afternoon in December, Roger hurried to the door. His 77-year-old great-aunt Maria arrived from San Francisco, along with her son, Dr. Cyrcus Ainsley, and along with a million in stocks and bonds she plans to hand over to their great nephew as an inheritance.


Also arriving is Sergeant Preston and Pierre who she met at White Horse. He was asked to witness the transfer of the funds. Regrettably, the old woman died in the back room late that evening before she could make the transfer official. What would have resulted in a murder mystery was solved within mere minutes. Juneau, Roger's assistant, was really hired by Preston to ensure her safety. Knowing the doctor was trying to overdose her with strychnine, Juneau saved her from being killed and helped fake her death to trick the doctor into giving himself away. Little did she realize that her own son would have tried to murder her so he could inherit.

Episode #135 "THE DOOR OF DEATH"

Broadcast June 13, 1940 Copyright Registration D-70549, script received at Registration Office June 22, 1940. Written by Tom Dougall.

Plot: An 11-year-old boy, tied hand and foot, is huddled under a bear rug in the back room of a cabin about five miles from Tantalus. With frightened eyes he watched a masked man who was lashing a rifle to the top of a chest. When the muzzle pointed directly toward the door of the other room, the man was satisfied. Then he tied a cord around the trigger, drew it back and around a nail at the back of the chest, and walked toward the door. The door to the back room of the cabin was set to ensure whoever comes through the door to the rescue would receive a warm welcome.

Sergeant Preston and Pierre ride through the area when they meet with Ben Maitland, who inform them that his son was kidnapped and there was a ransom demand. Preston rationalizes where the boy could be held captive on the grounds that there were only a few possible places within five to ten minutes from town. Inside the cabin, Preston views the footprints in the dust and rationalizes a trap. Ben insists on racing inside the back room but Preston insists Lou Carter or Mort Price go inside first. Lou is practically forced to open the door and in the last second confesses a rifle trained on the door. Pierre, however, looked inside the window prior and already saw the trap and sprung it. Inside, the men found Pierre with the boy, the latter of whom was eating food, alive and well.

Let George Do It is one our most recent Maintained sets. Originally released 19 2008, an updated set was released in January 2023. The primary differences were upgrades of episodes from .mp3 format to .flac format. The exhaustive log was also updated by James Decker to reflect some corrections and changes identified over the years. The accompanying biographies were penned by Ed Sehlhorst who, due to health reasons, is no longer active in the old-time radio hobby. We hope you enjoy this updated set of a very popular series, Let George Do It.

Virginia Gregg Ed Sehlhorst

Virginia Gregg played Claire 'Brooksie' Brooks, George's assistant, replacing Frances Robinson, from 1949 until the show ended in 1954. She was born Virginia Gregg Burket in Harrisburg, Illinois, on March 6, 1916 to William, a businessman, and Dewey Alphaleta, a musician. She moved west with her parents at an early age and enrolled in the Fremont grammar school in Long Beach, CA. She played sports in school and excelled as a pitcher on the school's baseball team with her specialty pitch being the fast-curve.

Trained as a musician herself, Virginia first appeared professionally as a member of the Pasadena Symphony Orchestra. In 1937 she joined The Singing Strings musical group on KHJ, playing the double bass. She transitioned into radio acting in the 1940s and her extensive radio career included roles in *Gunsmoke*, *Suspense*, *Dragnet*, *The Lone Ranger*, *Yours Truly*, *Johnny Dollar*, as well as *Let George Do It*.

She was much in demand as she had the ability to play almost any role. As was the case with many of her contemporaries, she transitioned into movies and then television as the opportunities arose. Her first movie role was uncredited in the 1946 Hitchcock thriller *Notorious*. Her many subsequent appearances included *Dragnet* (1954), *The Fastest Gun Alive* (1956), *Operation Petticoat* (1959), and *Spencer's Mountain* (1963). She played the voice of Norma Bates, Norman's mother, in the classic *Psycho* (1960), as well as the sequels *Psycho II* (1983) and *Psycho III* (1986). Virginia had a long and distinguished TV career, commencing in 1953 with *The Public Defender* and ending with *Dynasty* in 1983. In between she performed in one or more episodes of most of the major hit series of the '50s, '60s and '70s, including *77 Sunset Strip, Perry Mason, Ben Casey, Gunsmoke, The Virginian, Dragnet, Adam 12, Emergency, Streets of San Francisco, The Walton's,* and *Charlie's Angels* to name but a few.

In 1947 Gregg married Hollywood Air Force Major and radio producer-director Jaime Del Valle. Gregg was of average height and build (5'7" and 129 pounds in 1949) with light brown hair and blue eyes. Her favorite sports were tennis and swimming and she enjoyed gardening and the symphony as hobbies. Virginia and husband Jamie had three sons, Gregg, Jaime and Ricardo. She died of lung cancer in Encino, California on September 15, 1986 at the age of 70.







Bob Bailey Ed Sehlhorst

Bob Bailey starred in the role of freelance detective George Valentine in the radio drama *Let George Do It* throughout most of the period that the show was on the air. Starting in 1946 he played the role until replaced by Olan Soule for the last few episodes at the end of the series in 1954.

Robert Bainter Bailey was born into a show business family in Toledo, Ohio on June 13, 1913. He grew up in a theatrical atmosphere and during the 1930s he became a regular member of the Chicago radio community with recurring roles on shows such as *The Road of Life*, *Scattergood Baines*, and *That Brewster Boy*.

As with most of his contemporaries, the call of Hollywood came and in 1943 Bailey broke into film starring as Chester Wright, worldly confidence man, opposite Laurel and Hardy in *Jitterbugs*. He was also selected for a not-quite-so-prominent role in Laurel and Hardy's next movie *The Dancing Masters*. Although his dialog skills were first rate, Bailey looked visibly uncomfortable in broad comedy roles and so 20th Century Fox turned him into a dramatic actor. He had minor roles in five different features during 1944, but since his soft, boyish looks were not of the matinee-idol variety and since he lacked the rugged look of the typical Hollywood leading man, his scope was very limited. As a result, Bailey returned to network radio.

Following his involvement in Let George Do It, Bailey was cast in the lead role of insurance investigator Johnny Dollar in 1955 when CBS revived one of its most popular detective series Yours Truly, Johnny Dollar. Bailey brought sensitivity and a new dimension to the 'tough guy' role previously played by Hollywood actors Edmund O'Brien and John Lund. In 1960 when the show relocated to New York, Bailey, who was unwilling to relocate, lost the job. His Johnny Dollar shows are among the most popular and collectible recordings of vintage radio. Bailey, now writing TV scripts, was given a small role in the movie The Birdman of Alcatraz in 1962, but following this he withdrew from show business and settled into a private solitary life, away from family and friends for years. Bailey suffered a stroke in early 1983 and then struggled with alcoholism as his health declined. He died in California on August 13, 1983 at the age of 70.



David Harding, Counterspy

Episode Summaries Larry Maupin

The best part about these episodes is that each features a doctor or a professor who is also a homicidal maniac.

1. This program begins with "Tonight, the Case of the Cold-Blooded Professor, Part 1. Brought to you each Tuesday and Thursday by Pepsi-Cola." The setting is Lipton, Illinois, on a country road. Harding stops to talk to a farmer. He asks him if a professor Howard works at a college in Lipton. The farmer replies, "Yes, he's a genius who writes articles for a scientific journal. The farmer gratuitously tells him that Professor Howard has a good housekeeper, but she is homely."

Harding arrives at the professor's home and is admitted. Recently, the Amberville Bank was robbed of more than \$100,000. Then Harding tells Howard that the car the culprit was driving went through a puddle of oil, and has been identified as his. Harding then arrests him on a charge of bank robbery. When Howard raises his hands, it triggers a gunshot and Harding falls down wounded. Then the professor tells his assistant, "We're leaving, pack the bags."

They take Harding, presumed dead, in the car with them and Howard poisons his assistant with a candy bar because he knows what Howard really looks like without a disguise. Sometime later Harding miraculously shows up at Howard's empty house to investigate.

Harding then visits a local doctor and learns that Howard has a severe case of peptic ulcers caused by a very high-strung nervous condition. Howard takes bismuth powders for his ulcers. Then Howard robs a bank of \$130,000. Howard takes pictures of everyone in the bank, including two unsuspecting police officers.

The home office in Washington informs Harding that a druggist expects Howard to arrive in less than two hours to pick up his bismuth powder. Harding boards a plane, hoping to be at the drugstore before Howard arrives. A girl from the bank named Gilda leaves with Howard and moves in with him.

The episodes concludes with the announcer stating that next week part two of "The Cold-

Blooded Professor will" be presented. Then "Pepsi-Cola presents Counterspy."

2. This episode opens with "Pepsi Cola presents *Counterspy*." Then "Tonight, Part 2 of 'The Case of the Cold-Blooded Professor,' another thrilling episode of *Counterspy*, brought to you each Tuesday and Thursday by Pepsi Cola."

Professor Horn is being held in a prison cell awaiting execution. He has a badly infected upper lip, and the prison doctor has to cover it with adhesive. Horn tells the doctor "I have ten days before being transferred to the death house." He has made elaborate plans to escape, and he does so successfully. Then he returns to Illinois and hijacks a car. Soon Harding arrests Horn, and tells him "That suit you are wearing proves you murdered Jack Blake in the desert two weeks ago, and your execution will take place shortly."

Note: I do not know why the professor's name changes in Part 2. Perhaps it is due to forgetfulness on the part of a scriptwriter.

3. *David Harding, Counterspy* (April 27, 1950). "The Case of the Murdered Professor."

The program opens with a commercial, then "Washington calling David Harding." This is followed by a commercial for Pepsi-Cola. One day a man arrives at the office of Dr. Gregor in Washington complaining that he has eaten too much Turkish candy and asking for help. The doctor, after treating the patient, orders him to drive to a Washington airport. When he arrives, the man finds a large crowd awaiting the arrival of a foreign diplomat. As the diplomat departs from the plane, someone shoots him.

The diplomat is taken to General Hospital. Gregor's assistant Jensen has a police uniform, and Gregor orders him to go to the hospital and finish the diplomat off. Then there is another commercial for Pepsi.

Harding's assistant Harry Graham goes to Gregor's office and tells him he feels very sick and that he thinks he is going to faint. Then the doctor has his assistant tie Peters to a chair, and injects him with a hypodermic solution. Gregor then shoots Peters, and Harding arrives and shoots Gregor. The episode concludes with "So that takes care of tonight's international intrigue." Another Pepsi commercial follows.


4. *David Harding, Counterspy* (October 3, 1950.) "The Case of the Foreign Fire."

The program opens with "The National Broadcasting Company presents *Counterspy*. These reports are brought to you each Friday night. Tonight we present 'The Case of the Foreign Fire.'"

Someone infiltrates a government building in Washington, D.C. one evening and commits arson. Harding sends his assistant Dave Peters to the Baltimore field office to investigate the incident.

Meanwhile, the two arsonists await their payoffs from a man named Pregger. When Pregger arrives he tells them he is very disappointed that no one died in the fire, then calmly murders them both.

Later, two men driving a black Packard with Montana license plates see a woman walking on the sidewalk. One of them guns her down. Police rush to investigate and she is taken to a nearby hospital for treatment. She is not hurt seriously. Harding visits the patient, and she tells him a man named Markoff plans to set fire to a government office in Virginia tonight. The episode concludes with a commercial for Pepsi Cola.

KYW TO BROADCAST PLAYS FROM STAGE

CHICAGO PLANT IS FIRST IN THE FIELD

Arrangements Are Completed to Put North Shore Players' "Bargain Day" on Air

CHICAGO.—Radlophans of the United States will be entertained on the evening of April 17th, with another feature attraction from Westinghouse Station KYW. Since the entire production of Shore Leavo was broadcast from Powers theater several months ago, Wilson J. Wetherbee and Walter C. Evans, director and chief engineer respectively, of KYW have endcavored to develop the broadcasting of spoken drama to meet the popular demand of the invisible audience for this form of entertainment. Their efforts have culminated in arranging through the co-operation of Jessie Royce Landis, director of the North Shore Players company, and daughter-in-law of Kenesaw Mountain Landis, barrister and baseball arbiter, a schedule of one-act plays to be produced from time to time in the studio of KYW.

First to Broadcast from Stage The first of these is entitled Bargain Day, and was arranged and directed under the personal supervision of Mrs. Landis. The part of the harassed husband will be played by Sidney M. Spiegel, Jr., who acted the roll when the play was given in Chicago. The finale lead will be interpreted by Jessie Royce Landis. Station KYW is now widely known to be the first broadcast an entire drama directly

The one thing that will never stop changing is that **change itself will always keep happening!** Certain aspects of oldtime radio, however, have never changed. Those who were great on radio always will be. The recordings will not change.

Some changes are in fact, exciting! The number of new shows that are still being found and brought to life with newer and better technology is exciting. Meantime, what started out as an available selection of a few hundred shows has now expanded into a number in the hundreds of thousands.

Today, it's impossible to print a "complete catalog" because it could never be "complete" because new shows are being added at such a feverish pace. This is mostly due to the work of those mentioned at the end of this mailer and every catalog. It would also require many hundreds of pages.

Our job is to polish the show to the extent they need to be then make them available to you. Today, however, it won't be in the form of cassette tapes! **That was one of those "chang**es" and there will be more as we move through time.

This past year, we lost one of the leaders of old-time radio, Jay Hickerson. Jay and I became good friends starting in the mid 1970s and thoughout his years as **Chairman** of the **Friends of Old-Time Radio** conventions (which I attended almost every year).

In addition, a few months ago, **Specs Howard** also passed who founded a Detroit area broadcast and media arts school some 50 years ago. That was following his esteemed career in the broadcast industry. **Specs** was my daytime employer for more than 10 years during which I built some 20 studios for both student practice and campus radio stations. I did that while teaching staff and students how to use the new equipment. That was my daytime job up until almost 10 years ago.

These are the changes I've seen that have impacted the way we package and deliver old-time radio.

Today, that seven foot rack of analog equipment is also no longer needed because most of the whole process is handled faster and better with computer software.

Changes. Sometimes at least the technical ones work out for the best, and we sure learned a lot in the process!

Thanks for your support and best wishes for 2023.




