Happy Listening

IT TOOK one of the world's most famous summer resorts to teach us a lesson about broadcasting and happiness.

Recently we stopped with friends at one of the most expensive summer hotels in America. Its rooms were full of wealthy vacationers. Most noticeable to us, however, was the number of wealthy men's wives who had fled north from the heat. At first glance these women appeared to have everything good the world could offer. Their clothes were fashionable, their coiffures were perfect to the last finger-wave. The crook of a finger brought flunkies to serve them whatever they required.

But during our second and third days we noticed how desperately each was attempting to escape boredom. Every face had a tired, hunted look. Throughout the days, those rich but bored women drank cocktails and played bridge. Throughout the nights they drank cocktails and gambled. Hungrily they sought distraction afresh with the passing of every hour. And the passing of every hour only served to remind them of their boredom.

We talked to some of those women and asked them if they ever listened to "One Man's Family." None of them had ever heard of it. We asked if they knew about O'Neill's dramas and the Bayreuth festival and the Chicago Cubs' baseball games, all on the air. But none of them listened to the radio.

And we thought of another woman in whose home we had stayed while driving through the country. She ran a home for tourists. Her husband had

died and left her with nothing but a house full of furniture. Her bright, eager eyes are still in our memory. Her questions about radio personalities are still to be answered in a letter we promised to write. She was not bored, for one of the pieces of furniture her husband left was a radio. And through it, she was a citizen of the world.

So the lesson we learned about broadcasting and happiness was this: The woman in the house by the side of the road knew much more of the joy of living than any of those rich men's wives, despite their money and their clothes and their power. She knew more because a man who died just last month once turned his genius into a machine for sending sounds through the air. She had learned, as every real citizen of the world must learn, that switching on the radio that Marconi invented is like raising the curtain on life.

We hesitate to touch a subject which is so thoroughly wrapped up in politics and special pleas, but we do want to voice the listener's point of view in connection with complaints made recently about Station WLW and its exclusive use of "super power."

It just happens that WLW is depended upon for staticless reception by more listeners spread over more states than any other station in the country. It has been alleged that WLW has profited by its use of the super-power permit issued by the government, and now politicians would penalize WLW by withdrawing that permit. Actually, listeners would be hurt most by this.

DON AMECHE, BEWARE!

LES TREMAYNE THREATENS TO BECOME
THE NEW MATINEE IDOL OF THE AIR!

NOT too long ago for vivid remembering, Don Ameche was America's number one Radio Romeo. Young, dark, sleek, romantic, he was the script-show's lone eagle of the air-planes, his feathers unruffled by competition's ugly breeze, his wings strong and rival-resistant, his monarchy of the microphone absolutely unchallenged.

But time flies, scenes shift, and new faces keep appearing.

That's why I say that Don Ameche'd better watch out.

He'd better watch out because there's a newer, younger, Romeo menacing his monarchy. This fellow is a Briton, his name is Les Tremayne, and he gave up a sizable legacy just to become an actor!

Now in case you happen to be one of the few who may not recognize Les offhand, let me remind you that this 24-year-old landed one of radio's most coveted assignments only recently

when he stepped firmly into the elegant boots Don Ameche left vacant at the "First Nighter" microphone in the Little Theater Off Times Square.

A year or so ago Tremayne was a comparative unknown. Today, only a few months after his "First Nighter" debut opposite Barbara Luddy, he is generally conceded to be one of the most important figures in the industry. In fact, he's become so important that there's an unmistakable creak of uneasiness emanating from the starched-shirt fronts along radio row.

"That Tremayne," the boys mumble into their black ties. "Something the matter with a guy that'll give up a fortune just to be a radio actor. He must be touched in the head."

Touched he is. But not in the head. Touched with ambition—that's Les' trouble, if you can call it trouble.

Sitting high up in the shadows of the Merchandise Mart which houses Chi-

cago NBC studios, I asked Les to tell us something of his lost legacy and something of the ambition that skyrocketed him from bit-player to star—a star with a contract said to be one of the most unique in radio.

"Really," he stuttered, and here a fog of British reticence enveloped the room, "there's not much to tell. I've always wanted to be an actor, ever since I was born."

He didn't have to wait long after this event to become an actor, for his mother, Dolly Tremayne, was a motion-picture star in England before the World War. That's why crashing the

better than anything else in the world."

Aunt Kathy leaned forward on her cane. "If you'll do as I say," she told him, "you won't need to be an actor. You won't even have to work at all. But you must promise . . ."

"No," shouted Les.

"I'll give you ten more years," Aunt Kathy said briefly. "You can decide then."

This was in April, 1921.

Soon afterwards, Les and his family moved to America, where Dolly Tremayne, acceding to her husband's wishes, decided to give up the stage permanently. "I didn't, though," Les says now. "It's really surprising when you stop to think how many jobs I lost just because I wanted to be an actor—long before I ever became one. I was errand boy, paper boy, cherry picker in an Oklahoma orchard, private secretary to a Chicago physician, barker in a cheap amusement park, jockey on a third-rate race-track, pin boy in a bowling alley, bus boy, bell-hop . . ."

"I tried everything," he flicked an ash airily. "Finally, on my 18th birthday, one of my fellow bellhops introduced me to a radio production man, who cast me in a local Chicago show without even so much as an audition."

FROM that second on, acting was definitely in and Aunt Kathy, definitely out. A bird in the hand, Les figured, was worth two in the bush, and radio work in America was worth twice as much as a hypothetical fortune waiting somewhere in England. After all, Aunt Kathy might change her mind.

So he sat down and wrote to her. He was eighteen now, he reminded her. Old enough to know what he wanted. He still wanted acting. Radio was a medium he wanted to explore. He was sorry if she couldn't understand. He hoped she'd forgive.

The answer to his letter came back by cable. "You act," Aunt Kathy growled. "I'll disinherit."

Les acted, all right, but he didn't collect.

His first eight months in radio not only paid him very little but cost him money in the bargain. Cannily enough he had held on to his hotel job, thus, every time he got a studio call, he had to hire a substitute to hop bells. Soon he was paying out more than he was taking in.

"Radio cost me a lot that first year," Les says now, "but I've never been sorry." And there's no reason why he should be sorry, for after that first difficult apprenticeship, he never had to hop another bell. He was too busy hopping back and forth between microphones.

In the space of six months, he worked for NBC and CBS and the

IF YOU'VE ever seen a football game, you've heard the remark. Everybody has heard it at one time or another.

"Sure, these college boys are good—but put them up against a tough professional team and you'd see a rout!"

Don't you believe it! Not for a minute! There's not a bit of truth in the statement, and if you're hard to convince, you have only to tune in the College All-Stars-Green Bay Packers game on Wednesday night of this week. You can't be sure who'll win, you can't be sure who'll turn out to be the top-flight star of the encounter—but you can be sure that you'll hear one of the closest, hardest-fought games of this year or any other year! You won't be witness to a rout!

Four years ago there was some justification for the then-common idea that good professionals could beat good college players without much trouble. The experiment had never been tried, and sports fans had nothing to judge from except the infrequent—and always disastrous—professional-college baseball games. In baseball, there was no question about it: the pros would win. They did—almost invariably.

BUT football? Well, there've been three All-Star games, and so far the total margin of victory in favor of the professionals is five points. The first game, in 1934, was a 0-0 tie. The next year it was a 5-0 win for the pros, and last year another tie, this time 7-7.

And when the finest football players in the whole wide world trot out under the glaring field lights of Soldiers' Field in Chicago for the 1937 tussle, a good portion of the 80,000 fans in the stands, and just as big a contingent of the millions listening to the radio broadcast, will be betting on the college squad, hand-picked from campuses all over the land!

By the way, the All-Stars game is not to be confused with the annual classic between a picked team of east-

ern college players and the New York Giants. That game will be played this year on September 8. It differs from the All-Stars game in that the players, from eastern schools only, are not chosen by popular vote but by newspaper experts, and their professional opponents are always the Giants. The All-Stars play whatever professional team happens to be champion at that particular time.

And that combination makes the "dream game" of the year. Reason

for that isn't hard to find. If you sat down with paper and pencil tonight, to pick two teams of the toughest, fastest, all-around best football players in the country—and that means the world, because American supremacy in football can't be questioned—you'd have to choose the men who'll be facing each other on Soldiers' Field September 1!

And as a matter of fact, that's just how the teams were chosen! A nationwide poll was conducted by 150 news-

papers under the sponsorship of the Chicago Tribune. Fans in big cities and hamlets, on crossroads farms and prairie ranches made listings of the players they considered worthy of a place on the honor team of college football. Their votes were carefully tabulated, and the players they named have been in Chicago in rigorous training for the game since August 14!

EASIER to choose, because they play in more unified leagues, are the professionals. Whereas the college teams are divided into dozens of groups, all competing within themselves and with each other, the professionals play in two leagues. Since the All-Stars game has been played, the champions of the National League have upheld the professional side of the argument. In 1934 the Chicago Bears were tops, and in 1935 again. Last year it was the Detroit Lions, and this year the champion Green Bay Packers, whose home stamping-grounds are in Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin, will try to win a decisive victory over their so-called "schoolboy" opponents. They're apt to find the going hard, because by the time a schoolboy has grown to a height of six feet, weighs 190, and has three years of college competition under his belt, he's apt to be a fairly rugged customer. He'd better be, or he won't have any business crouching across the line from men like Arnie Herber or Don Hutson of the Packers! It will be interesting to see what happens when Herber, who played college ball at Wisconsin and St. Regis, meets, for instance, Sam Francis, the great Nebraska fullback who polled the terrific total of 1,104,372 points in this year's All-Star selections.

ALTHOUGH the fans pick the coaches for the All-Star squad as well as the players, the methods are different. To make a choice of players, each voter sends in his best complete team. These votes are tabulated, and the player

COMEBACK: JAY C. FLIPPEN—SUN.

BACK in the Twenties when vaudeville was the cream of show-business and "Ramona" was the tune on everyone's lips, a bushy-haired comedian by the name of Jay C. Flippen was knocking them for a loop.

In those days Jack Benny was a violinist who played his fiddle feebly and told feebler jokes, Edgar Bergen was a ventriloquist in the opening act along with trained seals and acrobats and Bob Burns couldn't get booking outside of the tank towns. But Flippen was a star, the envy of his contemporaries.

Today—

Well, you know what's happened to the first three. Benny has been signed to a non-cancelable three-year contract for \$1,000,000. Edgar Bergen and Bob Burns are the biggest money-making newcomers in radio. But Flippen? Well, he finally has his chance at the networks. As yet it's only for three weeks on the Good Gulf Summer Show from August 22 to September 5. And at that he's just subbing for Harry von Zell, who is subbing for Phil Baker.

Some would call it a come-down. But Flip hasn't been traveling around in the two-a-day most of his life without picking up vaudevillian's happy philosophy.

Flippen is irrevocably tied up with Broadway. His pals are the old-timers who frequent Lindy's Restaurant more to meet their cronies than to eat, and his open-handedness is typical of the actor who never quite lost the free-spending habits of his palmier days. The Big Street, which has taken a beating by Radio City and that upstart known as Hollywood, is keeping its fingers crossed for its son who has received the same trouncing. If Flip clicks on the Good Gulf program the merry parade of sponsors holding out fat contracts will be on his trail. If he doesn't—well, Flip will have to go back to his Amateur Show on New York's local WHN.

FLIPPEN'S breezy manner dovetails to the best Broadway traditions, but it smacks also of the bigness of the West. He was born on a windy morning in March in Little Rock, Arkansas. After high school there was a window-dressing job for a dry-goods store. When the small-town boy heeded the call that every small-town boy and girl at some time or other hears, he left to go on the road as an actor.

He went through all the ropes of a dyed-in-the-wool trouper. Burlesque, musical comedy, night clubs and vaudeville. And like the dyed-in-the-wool trouper he was deaf to the blasting of radio and the movies. His technique was the sure-fire, quick comedy that is best across the footlights. Not for him the business of calmly reading off lines a hired gag-writer had written before an impersonal round little gadget suspended by a wire.

But the fellows who were reading off words from a typewritten sheet were beginning to ride around in imported phaetons, and Flip was still hailing twenty-cent cabs. He appeared as one of the guests on Rudy Vallee's program in 1932—he made the audience laugh, but nothing else happened.

When Major Bowes left the WHN original Amateur Hour to hit the gong on the networks, there was a vacancy on WHN for another master of ceremonies to carry on where Bowes had left off. Vitriolic, wise-cracking, quick-tongued Flippen was the perfect answer.

And yet, although he did as masterful a job of conducting the Amateur Show as his predecessor had done, Flip wasn't being baited by the network sponsors who held the money bags. Week after week he joked with amateur violinists, tap-dancers and bird imitators. Week after week he saw newcomers like Milton Berle, who had hung around his dressing-room in the old days, become high-ranking comedians with audiences counted in the millions.

When the sponsors of Phil Baker's program were rounding up guest artists to fill in the gap while Phil was vacationing, Flip was one of those who were signed. His first appearance on August 8 was a hit. It had to be a hit, for upon that appearance depended the question of whether or not he would be signed to round out the three weeks during Von Zell's vacation. Now, if Flip clicks on these three programs, it may be the break he needs. His Broadway cronies hope so.

ON TUESDAY afternoon of this week, over the CBS network, Bob Trout, whose announcing duties take him to presidential inaugurations, on submarine dives, to golf links and on Easter parades, goes to Briarcliff Manor, New York, to interview smiling, youthful delegates to the first International Girl Scout Jamboree, in session at Camp Andree.

The celebration marks the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Girl Scout movement, begun by Juliette Gordon Low in Savannah, Georgia. The Juliette Gordon Low Foundation has made possible the visits of Girl Scouts of twenty-six countries to the American camp. And CBS, with Bob's help, will bring that Jamboree directly into the parlors of every Scout-loving home in America.

Camp Andree, the scene of the broadcast, has an interesting background. It was named for Andree Clark, daughter of United States Senator William A. Clark of Montana. The Clarks spent a great deal of time, during Andree's childhood, traveling in foreign countries, so that when they returned to their native land Andree felt strangely unlike an American girl. It was her association with the Girl Scouts that helped her to overcome her shyness—live like an American girl.

After her premature death at sixteen, Andree's parents discovered in her diary a great appreciation for what the Scout movement had done for her. And to express their own appreciation, the Clarks presented the land and the camp to the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to be used as a gathering-place.

Today, a hundred and one girls are gathered there, both American and foreign born. It is a little experiment in international relations, for the "Big Sister" system is in force and each group of foreign girls lives in a group of Americans, so the former can be helped with their English and learn American customs. One delegate from Czechoslovakia learned all the English she knows in three months.

CAMP routine includes sports, arts and crafts, entertainment and study. All plans are in the hands of the Scouts themselves. They have set up many interesting evenings of fun, to which the foreign delegates have contributed their talent.

One international evening included a sword dance by the Chinese representative, a fencing dance by the Japanese, group and individual dances and songs by the Scandinavian delegation, and songs by the Polish girls.

The Irish Girl Scout instituted a regular community sing by teaching the audience some Irish jig-tunes.

Bob Trout will interview several of the delegates, asking them questions about their camp activities, their impressions of America, and about their Scout branches at home.

Bob is a veteran of Scout interviews. He has officiated at Boy Scout Jamborees for the past two years and remembers particularly the meticulous care with which the English delegates answered his questions.

Just what the Girl Scouts will be like at the microphone, Bob isn't prepared to say. But one thing he feels sure of—that they will probably not be so much addicted to the practise of "swapping" each other's unique possessions as Boy Scouts usually are!

STORIES IN SONG: BY HORACE HEIDT — MON.

THE mad scramble for something new, something different, is the bane of every orchestra leader's life. But Horace Heidt, genial leader of the band he calls "The Brigadiers," is never at a loss for an idea. Often he takes care of the problem by arranging a program of songs that were popular yesterday and would be today if it were not for the incessant public demand for new material. Such a program is going on the air from Toronto on Monday of this week when Heidt and the Brigadiers, on tour, broadcast from the Canadian city.

"Vagabond Lover," "The Very Thought of You," "Nola," "When My Baby Smiles At Me," are among the yesteryear favorites scheduled for the Monday Heidt broadcast. Songs with a story, every one of them, and every one of them dear to the heart of some famous orchestra leader.

Still more closely associated with Rudy Vallee than any other song is "Vagabond Lover," written in April, 1929, by Rudy himself and Leon Zimmerman, and the most popular song in America during the entire summer of that year. Heart and soul of "Vagabond Lover" are probably in the lines:

*"Some girls are quickly forgotten
And gone with the dawn of the day,
And some you remember
Like last glowing embers . . ."*

VALLEE used "Vagabond Lover" as a theme song for years, picked up the title for the story of his life, and the song was used in the film of the same name.

"Nola" is another melody that will always live in close association with one man and one orchestra: Vincent Lopez and his band. No one else can play "Nola" as Lopez plays it, and very few feel like trying. He found the number while idly leafing through a music publisher's catalog in 1921. Lopez remembered hearing a recording of the song, remembered, too, that he hadn't liked it. But Miss Catherine Joyce, an employe of the company, suggested he run it over on a house piano. He did—three times—decided he liked it. Since then Lopez has played "Nola" thousands of times. Not long ago, Nola Arndt, who really inspired the song, wrote one of her own, called "Trying To Say That I Love You." Lopez, in appreciation of what "Nola" had done for him, introduced it on one of his broadcasts.

The oldest song Heidt will play Monday night is "When My Baby Smiles At Me," known for years, from one end of the land to the other, as the personal theme of Ted Lewis, the grand old master of jazz. Lewis didn't write the song. It was "discovered" about twenty-five years ago by Harry von Tilzer, who heard it played at Churchill's old restaurant, then located at Broadway and 49th Street in New York. Tilzer called Lewis' attention to it, they looked up the composer, then re-wrote the number. No one in America can sing "When My Baby Smiles At Me" as Ted Lewis sings it.

Very British indeed in origin is "The Very Thought of You," which Heidt plays Monday night in honor of its composer, Ray Noble. Noble, English orchestra leader who created a sensation when he came to this country a few years ago, wrote "The Very Thought of You" when he was musical director of the British Victor Recording Company. He uses it as a theme.

MELODRAMA: RADIO GUILD—FRI.

LISTENERS who confine their dial-twisting to nights have been missing a lot of good dramatic programs. The hour from 3 to 4 p.m. EDT Friday on NBC is chuck full of thrilling tales. On the red network, in succession, come "Pepper Young's Family," "Ma Perkins," "Vic and Sade" and "The O'Neills." And on the blue network is NBC's sustaining pride and joy, the Radio Guild.

There's a program that packs a punch. It has no policy; it follows no trend; it aims only to produce plays that entertain.

On Friday afternoon of this week, Radio Guild presents a good old Western yarn—a thrilling story of crude love, adventure, loyalty and sacrifice. It's Clyde Fitch's "The Cowboy and the Lady."

True to typical melodrammer, the story opens with the boys of Teddy's ranch returning from a lynching party. The boys just got tired of old man Tanner's drunken fits and the way he treated folk thereabouts, went out and strung him to a tree. But they like Tanner's daughter, the pretty young Midge. In fact, a couple of the boys secretly love her. So does Teddy, boss of the ranch. Only Teddy's love is different. To him, Midge is only a child. He wants to make a home for her. With all the boys around, the only way he can do it is to adopt Midge as his sister. There is a lot of amusement as Teddy tries to reform the boys now that a girl is around.

Mrs. Weston, wife of a cowpuncher, comes to pay the boys of Teddy's ranch a visit to invite them all to a dance. She isn't getting along with her husband, as everyone knows, and Teddy confesses that he would like to win her. As Mrs. Weston leaves, she falls over a ledge. Teddy rescues her but takes advantage of her unconsciousness to forbid the boys to let it be known that it was he who was the hero. Not until Mrs. Weston is gone does Teddy let it be known that he broke an arm in the rescue.

Act II takes place in a dance hall two weeks later. It is the scene of Mrs. Weston's dance for her eastern friends, who are on their first visit to the West.

Midge shows up in her Sunday dress and the boys go wild about her. Dave calls Teddy aside and begs him to help win Midge's love. No sooner does Dave leave than Pete comes to seek Teddy's assistance as cupid. Then comes Joe. Meanwhile, Midge had already confided to Teddy that she loved Joe.

The villain enters in the person of Weston, the irresponsible husband. He dances with Midge, then takes her for a walk. Midge flies in screaming, saying Weston said things that were insulting.

TEDDY'S ire is aroused and a fight seems inevitable. But Midge begs Teddy to be calm and Mrs. Weston holds them apart. It is agreed that Teddy and Weston will meet outside later in the evening to "have it out."

Mrs. Weston takes advantage of this incident to tell her husband that she is through with him. She orders him to go his own way.

It turns out that Weston is making a play for any woman that comes his way. As soon as his wife leaves he goes to the room of Molly, owner of the dance hall, and they plan to run away together. As Weston and Molly come down the stairs, Jim, a half-breed Indian who is madly in love with Molly, picks up Mrs. Weston's gun, which is lying on the bar, and shoots Weston.

When the lights are turned on, Teddy and Mrs. Weston are both in the room. Each thinks the other did the shooting. Midge brings the sheriff, who starts to arrest Mrs. Weston. But up steps Teddy to say, "I am the one you're looking for."

Act III takes place in the courtroom where Teddy is on trial. He is acting as his own attorney. In questioning Joe, one of the ranch hands, it is brought out that Joe did pop the question to Midge and that she accepted. And Teddy makes Mrs. Weston confess she loves him.

The jury finds Teddy guilty. As he stands for sentence, Molly, who is a spectator with Jim, jumps up and shouts, "He didn't do it!" Jim grabs her and yells, "Shut your jaw," draws his gun and shoots. Thinking Molly is dead, Jim confesses all. But Molly lives, Mrs. Weston says she still loves Teddy, Joe and Midge gets hitched, and thus ends the Radio Guild show for September 3.

"HAMS" THEY CALL THEMSELVES

UP AT Joe Cook's place one night someone was fiddling with the radio, tuned to the amateur band. Out of a storm of static came the call, "CQ, CQ, CQ . . . CQ, CQ, CQ."
"Whatzit?" asked one of the group. "Somebody missing a cue, maybe?"

"That's a radio amateur," explained round-faced Sam Schriro. "They're great people. 'Hams,' they call themselves. 'CQ' means 'I'm a lonesome ham and won't some other ham please talk to me?'"

"They're the craziest people in radio. The other night I heard one of them telling a buddy how the plumbing in his house made interference. So he took out some of the pipe, which meant some of the bathrooms were without water, but it had improved his sending, and he couldn't complain. His buddy topped that one. He said he'd had the same trouble with his furnace, so he took out the furnace. He was pretty cold, but he's sending a great signal now."

Maybe the Joe Cook atmosphere was leading Sam into a little harmless exaggeration, but you know yourself that the amateur bands today do send out some fairly strange conversations. "Ham talk" is a code unto itself, a queer gibberish of abbreviations: QSN for static; QSM for man-made interference, such as refrigerator or vacuum-cleaner or electric-sign noises (your typical amateur has no use for any or all of these devices); QSO for signal, DX for distance.

A short-wave addict in the family is really no worse than a golfer, a chess player, or a stamp collector. The golfer may protest he's building up his health, the chess fiend may boast of his terrific powers of concentration, and the philatelist may brag that his stamp collection would be worth millions, if he had the right stamps—but the short-wave operator has more valid arguments. Year in and year out short-wave operators take part in heroic little dramas, often unnoticed, wherever disaster appears. These men and their playthings, if you want to call them that, have saved thousands of lives.

The floods of last spring studded newspaper headlines with heroic stories of what short-wave operators had accomplished in alleviating one of the worst disasters of modern times. With the Mississippi and Ohio rivers threatening to wash away whole cities, radio's hams stuck by their sets, maintained communications, coordinated rescue work. Broadcasts to the wondering, waiting world outside the flood area were made possible only by short-wave sets, and without them, authorities agree, the toll of property destroyed and lives lost would have been infinitely higher.

The exploits of these radio hams are not always set against a background of grim disaster. When the New York National Guard started its annual maneuvers last summer the latest radio equipment was set up for communication between units. In the field with them were short-wave operators of the national networks, broadcasting progress of this military carnival. Ranks of one National Guard company included an ingenious radio ham who thought of a scheme to confuse the enemy. With a few odds and ends of apparatus he set

up a radio interference to blot out the enemy's radio communications. The strategem might have led to a noble victory, but unfortunately the interference also blanketed the neighboring wave-length that network announcers were using for their portable short-wave sets. NBC had to cancel one program from the encampment, and then amused officers told the over-zealous young man, "Don't do that any more."

It is in times of distress, however, that newspaper headlines most frequently ring with exploits of hams who the night before were casually chatting their strange gibberish into your own radio set. Frigid North Atlantic storms lashed at lonely Halfway Rock Light one night, ripping away the landing slip and marooning Pendell, assistant keeper of the light. Robert Strout, lighthouse-keeper ashore at the time, remembered that Pendell had often fiddled around with a short-wave radio set and talked to a fellow amateur at Fal-mouth Forside, Perley Swasey by name.

Strout rushed to Swasey, got messages to Pendell's anxious wife and encouragement to Assistant Pendell as waves pounded at the lighthouse foundations. That's one of the smaller services amateur radio has performed for the men on lonely lighthouse vigils.

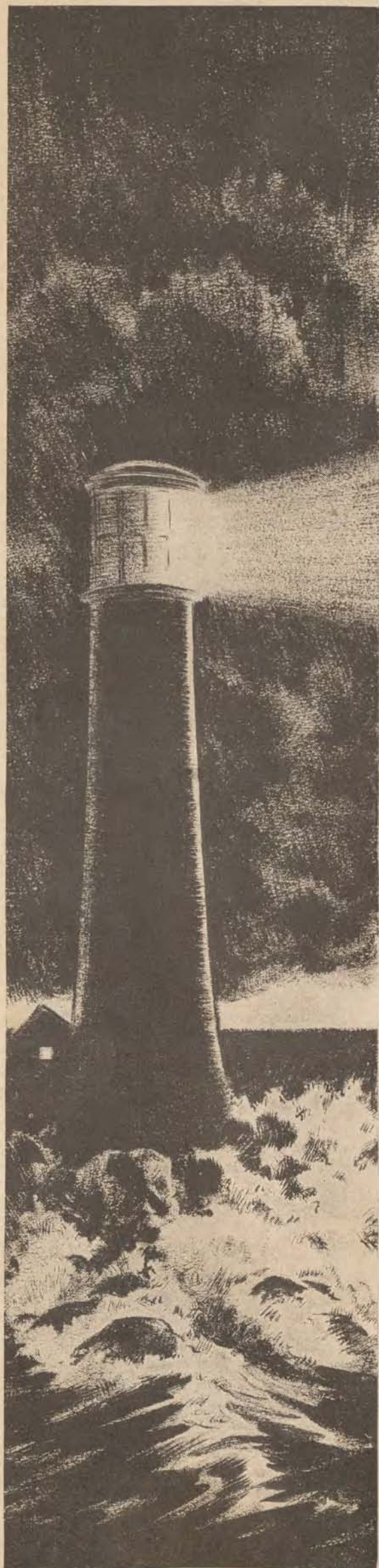
There was another night on another coast when Pacific gales flung torrents over the top of the 135-foot-high Tillamook Rock lighthouse on the Oregon coast. Rocks were hurled through the lenses of the light, submarine cables washed away before word could be sent that the warning beacon on this dread reef had failed. This lighthouse-keeper, Henry Jenkins, was a radio ham too, but there was no set in his lighthouse.

BRAVING rain, wind and wave he managed to rig an antenna at the top of the tower, improvised a set from a broadcast receiver and miscellaneous equipment below. From this came his feeble QRR, the landsman's SOS. Another ham picked it up and sent word to the United States Lighthouse Service. Immediately marine wireless began sending messages that warned vessels away from those rocks.

The Army and Navy have taken their count of the forty-five thousand amateur radio operators in America. If war should come, they will be part of the first line of defense—with need for secret radio communications multiplied ten thousandfold by war conditions.

War has already made use of American radio hams. Early in 1915's submarine warfare days German U-boats seemed to be unaccountably getting word of sailings from American ports. Uncanny luck could not explain the presence of submarines in the path of Allied food and supply transports time after time. Governmental check began to locate any possible leakage of secret sailings. A German subsidized station on Long Island was suspected but nothing incriminative could be found in its messages.

A pioneer amateur, Charles Apgar, with a little home-made set in Westfield, New Jersey, was interested and used to listen to the messages from

Attempting to open the car doors, he found them jammed, and then he first noticed his car—with emergency brake

Fortunately, the Hays seemed to have escaped with nothing more than a bad shock. Their car, however, was a write-off.

Sunday coffee hour songstress, Dorothy Lamour, and her mother Carmen, are pals of Producer Dwight Cooke. The other night Cooke invited them to a return dinner engagement at his home—and was presented (of all things) with a complete set of interior decorations for his den, including drapes with a design of musical notes. . . . PERSONAL APPEARANCE

A GALAXY of stars, heroes, champions, and assorted national figures! An enviable group of radio guests that cannot be found outside the national network programs. That is, excepting the "Ladies First" program, broadcast from WCCO, Minneapolis, five days a week.

When Florence Lehmann, mistress of ceremonies, decided that listeners to this half-hour show would appreciate hearing personal interviews with famous people passing through or stopping in Minneapolis, there began a parade of personages that has established a record of some sort. With the program approaching its first anniversary, Miss Lehmann has interviewed over six hundred people, and the majority of these were nationally known.

"I've presented everyone from actors to parachute jumpers," Miss Leh-

maid Eleanor Holm Jarrett, Evelyn Chandler, the ice-engraver, are a few from the world of sport that were brought to the WCCO program. Mr. and Mrs. Piccard, the stratospherists, told of their experiences in the ether over the ether. Elmer Hinck, stunt pilot and parachute jumper was another aviation representative. Kate Hepburn wouldn't talk, but her mother did a nice pinch-hit job. Writers Margaret Banning and Irving Stone had their say, and even Antonne, the famous French hair-dresser, "set" a few airwaves.

IT IS not always easy to obtain guests who are only pausing in the city. "Our program begins at three o'clock, and that happens to be train-time also," says Miss Lehmann. "Sometimes I wire ahead, but usually it is a case of coercion, violent diplomacy,

mann says. "We get the actors when they're up and the parachute jumpers when they're down. Actors are favorites, especially one like John Boles, who was the direct cause of an avalanche of letters. (Perfumed.)"

Two to five guests appear on each program, but not all are exactly famous. People visiting the United States for the first time from far-flung countries such as South Africa, China, India, Iceland and others, are brought to the microphone. There has been also a conglomeration of guests with queer or distinctive jobs. A train announcer, auctioneer, calliope tuner, and the only other trainer in the country made their debuts on the "Ladies First" program.

BESIDES John Boles, Hollywood names appearing on this show were Gladys George, Mary Carlisle, and the stage star Blanche Yurka. Ted Shawn, the dancer; Charles Coleman, Metropolitan tenor; Helen Jepson of opera and Paul Whiteman fame, were interviewed here. Eddy Duchin, Bob Crosby, Leon Belasco and Cab Calloway are a few of the orchestra leaders who have been on the local air. In the history of the program there have been only two cases of temperament. Segovia, the Spanish guitarist, refused to enter the studio until the large audience was removed. This task accomplished, Miss Lehmann began introducing him to the radio listeners. At that moment, two more people walked into the studio. Segovia gave one artistic snort, dashed out the door, and disappeared. Miss Lehmann hurriedly introduced another guest and the program went smoothly on.

The other "case" was when Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins consented to appear. As she was about to enter the studio, however, she announced she would exercise her woman's prerogative, and she changed her mind.

Most of the visitors have been very gracious. Artur Schnabel, the pianist, supplied the studio staff and audience with many laughs when he appeared. He was told not to smoke in the studio so he laid his cigar down and forgot about it. Later he began his search for the stogy, and announcers and engineers joined in. The only trouble was they thought he was looking for his glasses or some mislaid music sheets.

It would take page upon page to list the people of renown who have appeared here, but if you, too, are a movie actor, champion, famous musician, or flea-circus trainer, drop a line to Florence Lehmann and she'll find room for you on her very notable show of notables.

Mutual networks. Dozens of local stations spotted him on twice that many programs. He was director, announcer, narrator, actor.

He became famous for the quality of his impersonations—quality that became quantity after he had imitated successfully the voices of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Clarence Darrow, Charles Lindbergh, Mussolini, Al Smith, Hitler, Schnozzle Durante, the late King George V, Marconi, Admiral Richard Byrd, G. B. Shaw and—yes—Mahatma Ghandi.

Meanwhile, sponsors of the "Betty and Bob" program were not unaware of Les Tremayne. Don Ameche, who had the lead in their morning script-show, had decided that his "First Nighter" and "Grand Hotel" programs furnished enough work for him.

"Find a substitute for me," he begged "Betty and Bob" executives.

Cudgeling their brains for a pinch-hitter, Ameche's bosses considered Les Tremayne. "That fellow, Tremayne," one of them ventured. "Let's give him a try." Thus the youth who had relinquished a fortune to try his luck on the air came into his first really important radio role. He thought maybe he was going to get places after all.

AND he wasn't far from right, for not long afterward Don Ameche signed a motion-picture contract and left Chicago for Hollywood and a picture career. This time it was the "First Nighter" sponsors who held a conclave. They could move the "First Nighter" show to Hollywood, they knew, thereby keeping Ameche as head man. On the other hand, there was "Grand Hotel" to be considered. Ameche was head man there, too. It would be pretty inconvenient to move both shows to Hollywood. Why not do the "First Nighter" from the West Coast with Ameche in the lead and get a new partner for Anne Seymour and "Grand Hotel"? That's how Les got his second major break.

When Ameche and his "First Nighter" sponsors decided to go their separate ways, Les Tremayne was the logical choice for his successor.

That's how Les got his "First Nighter" contract—a contract that sets a radio precedent in that it guarantees him 52 weeks' work a year for a period of three years. Now he's so busy he's given up his part in "Betty and Bob." His last broadcast in that role was on August 20.

Tall, handsome Les Tremayne is my idea of an actor who will go far and stay long. He's pinch-hit himself to the pinnacle of radio, and if my hunch is right, it won't be many years before you'll be seeing him in pictures too. He's got all the making of a star.

NO, MR. SMITH

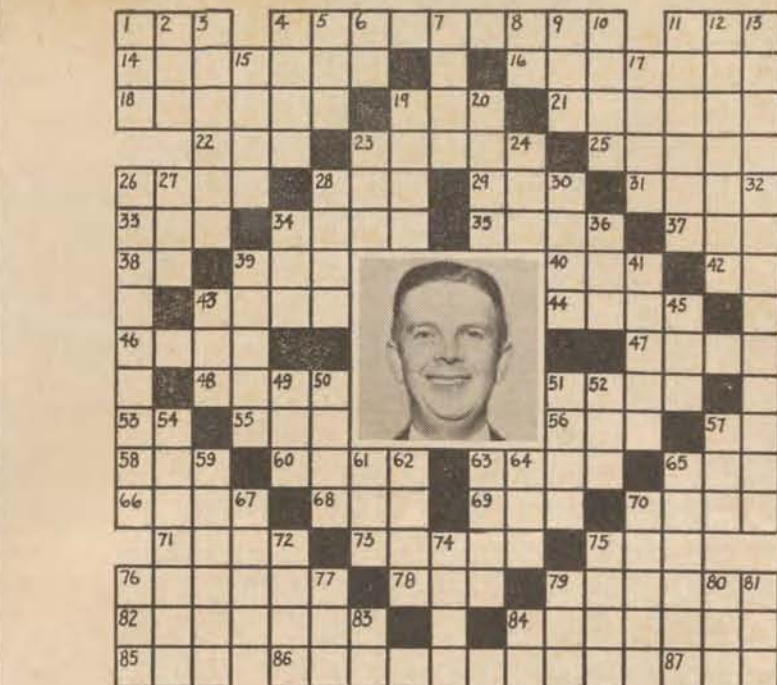

receiving the greatest number of votes is named for his position on the varsity, or number 1 team. The player with the second highest total ranks immediately beneath him, naturally, and when a first-string player is taken out of the game, substitutions are made in order.

To select the coach—this year Charles Dorais of the University of Detroit—the fans name first, second and third choices. This method allows for selection of assistant coaches. Lynn Waldorf of Northwestern, Elmer Layden of Notre Dame, Jimmy Phelan of the University of Washington, and Bernie Moore of Louisiana State are aiding Dorais in training the 1937 All-Stars.

Coaches of that caliber should be able to turn out a pretty fair team, especially working with material that is little short of perfect. To have merely two or three of the 1937 All-Stars report to him for a season's play, any coach in America would cheerfully mortgage the old homestead.

HERE they are, eleven men who'll face the Green Bay Packers when the opening kickoff spins into the air at Soldiers' Field:

ENDS—Gaynell Tinsley, Louisiana State, and Merle Wendt, Ohio State. TACKLES—Edwin Widseth, Minnesota, and Averill Deniell, Pittsburgh. GUARDS—Steve Reid, Northwestern, and Max Starcevic, Washington. CENTER—Bud Svendsen, Minnesota.

QUARTERBACK—Vernon Huffman, Indiana.

HALFBACKS—Robert LaRue, Pittsburgh, and John Drake, Purdue.

FULLBACK—Sam Francis, Nebraska.

And right behind them are such players as Steinkemper of Notre Dame, Golemgeske of Wisconsin, Glassford of Pittsburgh, Kuhn of Illinois, Basrak of Duquesne, Wilkinson of Minnesota, Danbon of Notre Dame, and Buivid of Marquette.

All told, there are 65 men in training in Chicago now, every one of them a star in his own right.

THE Packers are in rigorous training, too. They don't expect a walk-over, far from it. And no wonder! Not only are they facing the cream of the college crop of footballers, they're facing men who may be after their own positions! For many of the All-Stars, this will be the last game of their amateur careers. Some of them are already signed up with professional teams, and more of them may be after the final whistle of the game.

Interest in the game—which costs the Chicago Tribune \$60,000 to stage and which netted \$35,000 for charity in 1936 after expenses had been paid—has increased by leaps and bounds every year it has been played. In 1934 the votes sent in by the fans totalled 782,000. When the last adding-machine had clicked out the last digit this year, the figure stood at 5,036,466. Eighty thousand of those five million and more voters will crowd into Soldiers' Field Wednesday night. The rest of them, and you and you besides, will be sitting next their radios, straining to hear every play of the game that comes but once a year—and is worth waiting twelve months to hear!

heckler had no terror for the quick-witted George Bernard Shaw. His willingness to enter into verbal conflict—and his ability to more than hold his own when involved in a battle of wits—are no new developments in Shaw's life. In his younger days, of course, his sharpness did not have the world-wide reputation that it has today—but it was there just the same, and Shaw was never at a loss for words. Indeed, it has been this faculty that has carried him upward through a number of jobs to a position that is unique in the world of drama.

Shaw was a journalist, a critic of music and art, an indefatigable pamphleteer, a ranking debater, an essayist, before he finally sprang into the limelight as a playwright. It is in the field of drama that he has made his greatest successes and will be best remembered, although many of the other works from his pen—Shaw's total production is amazing—will probably share immortality.

No writer in our time has attracted so much attention to himself as Shaw. For years, his least remark has been front-page news—because he wanted it to be! For instance, when he was last in America, a year or so ago, his caustic remarks about the uselessness of the United States Constitution made news from one end of the land to the other. He has denounced Mr. Average American as being ninety percent moron, has frequently called him "The Great American Boob"—and has been extravagantly praised by Americans from Coast to Coast in spite of it!

THOSE who know Shaw best realize that he is not merely an impish group clown but a great writer, perhaps a genius of the first rank, and a thinker possessed of a deep social conscience. Shaw's clownings and cavortings on the world's stage are simply a part of the campaign he planned when he stood, penniless and without prospect, before the literary citadels of London so many years ago. He realized that, to be known, one must be talked about; and since he could not at that time make people talk about the things he wrote, he set about making them talk about the things he did. It worked so well that he has never given it up. Shaw's instinct for forthright honesty and his dislike for red tape are sometimes confused with his prankishness. For instance, a few months ago an American writer whom Shaw knew wished to adapt one of his plays for the screen, but was refused permission by the Hollywood producers. When Shaw heard about it, he transferred the copyright of the play to the American, making him the absolute owner, putting him in a position to dictate not only what should be done about the adaptation of the play but everything else about it!

INTO "Back to Methuselah" Shaw has put his conception of life itself, his answers to the plagues question, "What's it all about?" Beginning in the Garden of Eden with that very first of all dramatic casts, Adam and Eve and the Serpent, he takes us, in the last of the five plays, titled "As Far As Thought Can Reach," to the year 31,920 A. D. Here we find that people have learned to live, barring accidents, forever. But although the secret of living to be 300, 400, 500 years is known to them, in the end they prefer to give it all up, to return to the Garden of Eden, to go "Back to Methuselah."

MUSIC of the MASTERS

BY CARLETON SMITH

THE most important revival of the 1937 Salzburg Festival was Mozart's "The Magic Flute," conducted by Arturo Toscanini. Neither its first nor its second performance—both of which were broadcast to the United States—was satisfactory.

Mr. Toscanini, after scouring Central Europe, had to accept singers who were not only incapable of becoming the characters Mozart wanted or of making the beholder conscious of their symbolic significance, but who could not publish the external beauties of his music. Second, several of the participants did not have the same feeling and conception of their roles that Mr. Toscanini had, and though they yielded to him, there was an essential conflict. It might be said that they had a Teutonic, a heavy, somber approach—and he, that of a Latin, light and lyrical. Finally, if one judged from several changes of tempi in the overture and the increased speed with which the second act was taken at the second performance, Mr. Toscanini is still searching for the ideal.

His efforts to make the work alive and moving, his attempts to shake the cumbersome tradition which so frequently turns the solemn scenes into a "Parsifal-like" affair, were to the good. The clarity of tone and the exquisite balance of form which he achieved are certainly Mozartian. If the total effect is to accentuate the contrast between the comic and the serious scenes and to intensify the former, there is good precedent for it.

This opera was given in Mozart's time as a popular entertainment in a Singspiel theater, scarcely more than a barn. The popular melodies of Papageno were repeated, orchestra players were applauded for their virtuosity, and Mozart himself playing the glockenspiel offstage could not resist the temptation to make fun by adding an arpeggio or two after Schikaneder, the original Papageno, had finished and the bells were supposed to be silent.

It is in this spirit, as well as with an understanding of the deep moral purport of the allegory, that "The Magic Flute" should be approached.

The orchestral portions of the performances were a source of constant delight. There were innumerable instances, as in the scene between Tamino and the priest, where orchestral chords played precisely and as they are marked—each *forte*, a *forte* and each *piano*, a *piano*—were infinitely more expressive than the words of the singers.

It was when one's attention was concentrated on the voices that the bitter realization came that here even Toscanini was helpless. And in "The Magic Flute," to a greater extent than in any other opera he conducts in Salzburg, first-class singers are essential. Mozart's orchestration is fragile and transparent. The voices are heard as if they were naked; no flaw can be concealed.

Julie Osvath, the Queen of the Night, has a strong coloratura capable of decided accents. Her second act aria was transposed down a whole tone but even then she concentrated on the mechanics of singing and did not express the supernatural character of hellish rage of the demon-Queen. Jaromila Novotna, who showed signs of having worked over her role, poured out hard, shrill top tones, displayed more voice than one thought she had, but was unable to reflect the inner beauty of Pamina. Helge Roswaenge, the Tamino, with a voice robust and strong, is also not an ideal Mozart singer.

Mr. Toscanini's idea to have the three guiding spirits sung by boys instead of women provided a refreshing purity and a necessary impersonality

and was a welcome contrast to the impassioned voices of the ladies of the Queen of the Night. However, not the best voices of the *Wiener Saengerknaben* were chosen, and this was unfortunate. The ladies, Hilde Konetzni, Stefania Fratnikova and Kerstin Thorborg, possess good voices but voices which do not blend and they were not always careful to sing together.

Best of all the cast, perhaps, was Willi Domgraf-Fassbender, released from Germany to sing the Papageno. If one did not object to his rather hard, North German pronunciation, he was exactly what he should be, a healthy, lusty, likable fellow, intent on the simple pleasures of living.

The great central figure of Sarastro, the commanding high priest, was beautifully sung and carefully drawn by Alexander Kipnis, who all but filled the character with its requisite depth of soul and warmth of heart.

It may be that we ask too much from these singers . . . more, perhaps, than was expected in Mozart's time. If so, it is because we realize better than did his contemporaries the true stature of his music. There was a greater ease and freedom in the second performance than in the first, and subsequently the nervousness and tenseness should entirely disappear. It is doubtful, however, if all of the artists can be expected to "grow" into their roles and make us feel, as they should, that for the moment, time stands still while we commune with the "soul of our soul."

Those who were present in Salzburg saw the scenes painted by Wilderman of Frankfurt after models made for the Berlin Royal Opera in 1818. They had the advantage of not repeating themselves and of following a steady progression from the night to the light, from the realm of the Queen to the Sun itself. They were intended to be symbolical of the development of character within the lovers. All of them are built on the old-style perspective, so that they can be properly viewed only from the center of the house. Several are overlaid with fantasy and one, the first in the second act, looks exactly like rows of Washington monuments from our national capital.

Certainly, the difficulties of presenting this opera on the small *Festpielhaus* stage were considerable. The many breaks of scene—the curtain fell eight times in the second act—tend to suspend interest and disconcert especially the hearer who does not understand German. Many in the audience, in spite of the best intentions, were obviously bored. They could not grasp the meaning of the lengthy passages of spoken dialog and they never succeeded in reconciling the inconsistencies of the libretto. Yet despite its faults, the presentation of "The Magic Flute" is good entertainment, well worth the listeners' while.

SHORT WAVES

BY CHAS. A. MORRISON, president, INTERNATIONAL DX-ER'S ALLIANCE

GIVING station announcements in English, followed by church chimes, CO9BZ (8.998), "Radio Salas" of Havana, Cuba, has been coming on the air recently at 7:55 a.m. EST (6:55 a.m. CST). . . . The Overseas hour from Tokyo, radiated each morning from 8 to 9 a.m. EST (7 to 8 a.m. CST), and intended primarily for reception in Australia, is now being received with almost local volume over JZJ (11.8). . . . The 13-meter band is beginning to live up a bit and almost any day between 9:15 a.m. and 12 noon EST (8:15 and 11 a.m. CST) GSG (21.53) of Daventry, England, may be heard with good signal strength, while GSH (21.47) is usually much weaker. W2XE (21.52) of New York City, due to its European beam aerial, is seldom heard with anything but poor volume. . . . Transmission Three from Daventry, England, is broadcast on a frequency of 17.79 megacycles, daily from 9:15 to 10:30 a.m. EST (8:15 to 9:30 a.m. CST), over two transmitters, operating simultaneously under the call GSG, but with aerials beamed in different directions. On Sunday morning, August 15, the double signal caused by the two waves from GSG, arriving at this point at slightly varying intervals, was plainly audible. . . . That evening at 7:45 p.m. EST (6:45 p.m. CST), a Latin station, presumably PSE (14.935) of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, was heard broadcasting a musical program.

Another new Japanese station has taken to the air on 9.625 megacycles, relaying JFAK, Taihoku, Taiwan, daily from 4 to 10:30 a.m. EST (3 to 9:30 a.m. CST). On Sundays, however, the station signs off at 10:15 a.m. EST (9:15 a.m. CST). The last fifteen minutes of each broadcast is given over to news reports in English—mostly comments on recent developments in the Japanese-Chinese situation. This station has an extremely strong signal. . . . JIB (10.535), Tyureiki, Taiwan, joins this newcomer in the JFAK relays after closing down its commercial telephone circuits with Tokyo around 9 a.m. EST (8 a.m. CST).

FZE5 (17.28) of Djibouti, French Somaliland, states that musical test programs are broadcast the first Thursday in each month from 6:45 to 7:15 a.m. EST (5:45 to 6:15 a.m. CST).

On Sunday evening, August 15, another new Cuban station, COCM, relaying broadcast station CMCN in Havana, made its debut on an approximate frequency of 9.85 megacycles. The address, given in Spanish, is believed to have been Apartado 33. Volume and tone quality was very good. . . . Earl Roberts of Indianapolis, Ind., reports a further new Cuban as COBT. This station, which relays CMBT, has been operating on 18.75 megacycles, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. EST (7 a.m. to 1 p.m. CST).

It is reported that FIU, "Radio Tananarive" of Tananarive, Madagascar, has finally finished testing on various frequencies and has settled down on

9.53 megacycles where it can be heard irregularly from 9:45 to 10:45 a.m. EST (8:45 to 9:45 a.m. CST).

The Danish short-wave station, heard almost daily from 6:30 p.m. EST (5:30 p.m. CST) on a frequency of 11.805 megacycles, also broadcasts on Sundays from 8 to 10:30 a.m. EST (7 to 9:30 a.m. CST), on 9.52 megacycles, according to a letter received by Paul Sampson of Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada. A power of 6,000 watts is being radiated by the broadcaster.

The program of Argentine propaganda, formerly broadcast over LSX on Monday and Friday evenings, from 5 to 6:30 p.m. EST (4 to 5:30 p.m. CST), is now being radiated by LSY (18.115) and LRX (9.66), both of Buenos Aires.

Listeners to Daventry, England, are to hear how Charlotte Corday, one of the most tragic figures of the French Revolution, was tried for her life before the Revolutionary Criminal Tribunal. The trial has been reconstructed from the dossiers in the national archives of France, and will be heard on Friday, September 3, at 7 p.m. EST (6 p.m. CST). . . . A program entitled "The Silver Greyhound," which consists of dramatic incidents in the history of the King's Messengers, the men who carry confidential dispatches from the Home Government in London to the King's Ambassadors and Ministers in foreign countries, will be recalled in a talk from Daventry, England, on Sunday, August 29, at 12:20 p.m. EST (11:20 a.m. CST).

"Radio Corriere," official publication of the Italian E. I. A. R., states that a new directional aerial beamed on North America, which is soon to be placed into service by short-wave station ZRO of Rome, will increase the effective power radiation of the broadcaster about four times.

Roy Myers of Los Angeles, Calif., has received a letter from M. B. Anderson of the Aerial Medical Service, Box 103, Cloncurry, Australia, which states that VJI, the "Flying Doctor" station, a pedal generator type transmitter with a power of 400 watts, is the headquarters station used for communication with the 46 interior medical stations. All interior transmitters have automatic keyboards similar to a typewriter that transmit the morse code perfectly at 10 words per minute and which can be operated by any member of the household without the slightest knowledge of the code. The daily schedule, with the interior stations operating on 2.02 megacycles and VJI on 2.05 megacycles, is from 4 to 5:30 p.m. and from 1 to 2 a.m. EST (3 to 4:30 p.m. and from 1 to 2 a.m. CST), while all stations operate on a frequency of 8.63 megacycles, from 5:30 p.m. to 2 a.m. EST (4:30 p.m. to 1 a.m. CST).

From Sintonia, I learn that Buenos Aires, Argentina, broadcasting station LR3, "Radio Belgrano," is soon to be relayed by Montevideo, Uruguay, short-wave stations CXA8 (9.505) and CXA14 (15.17).

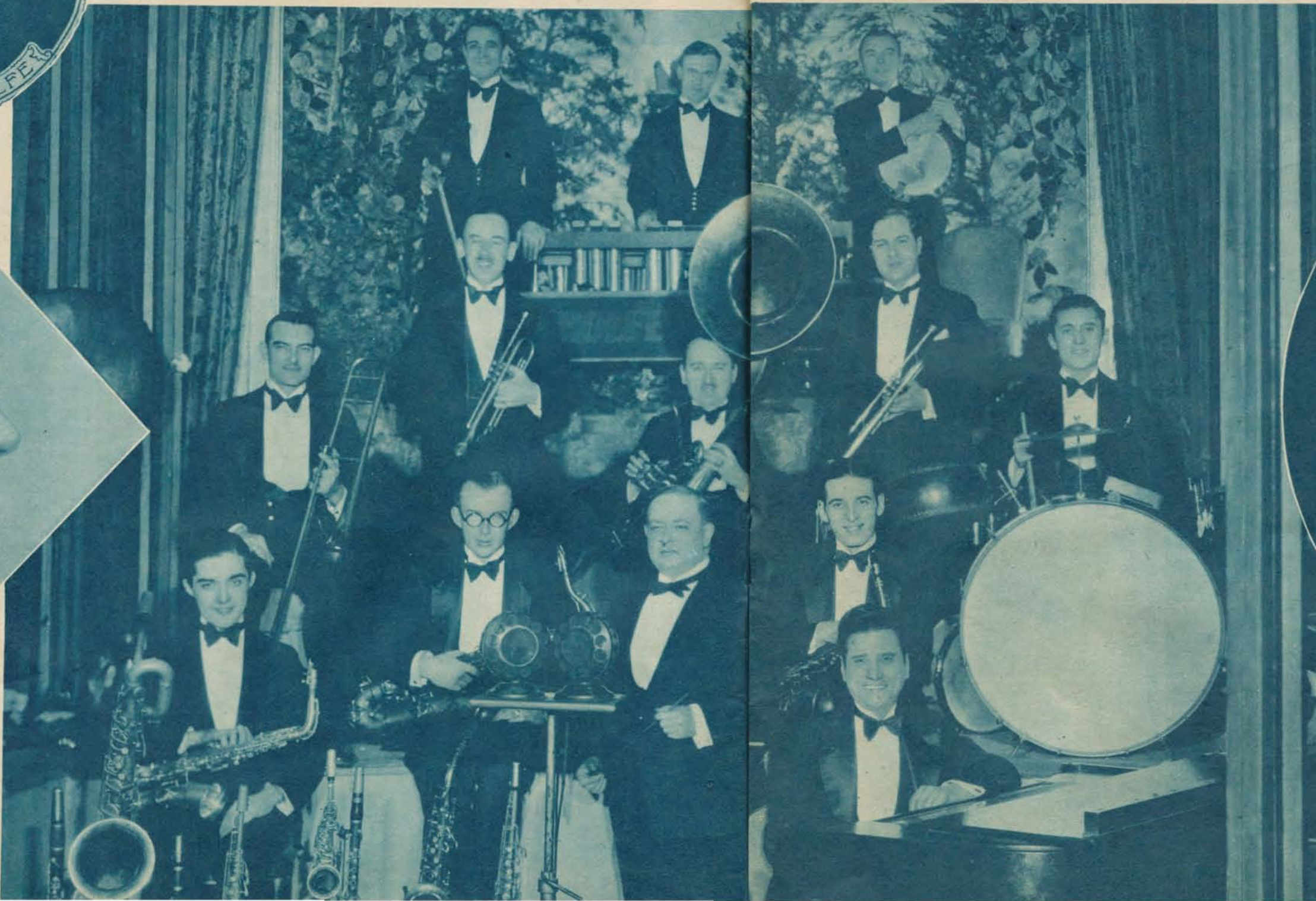

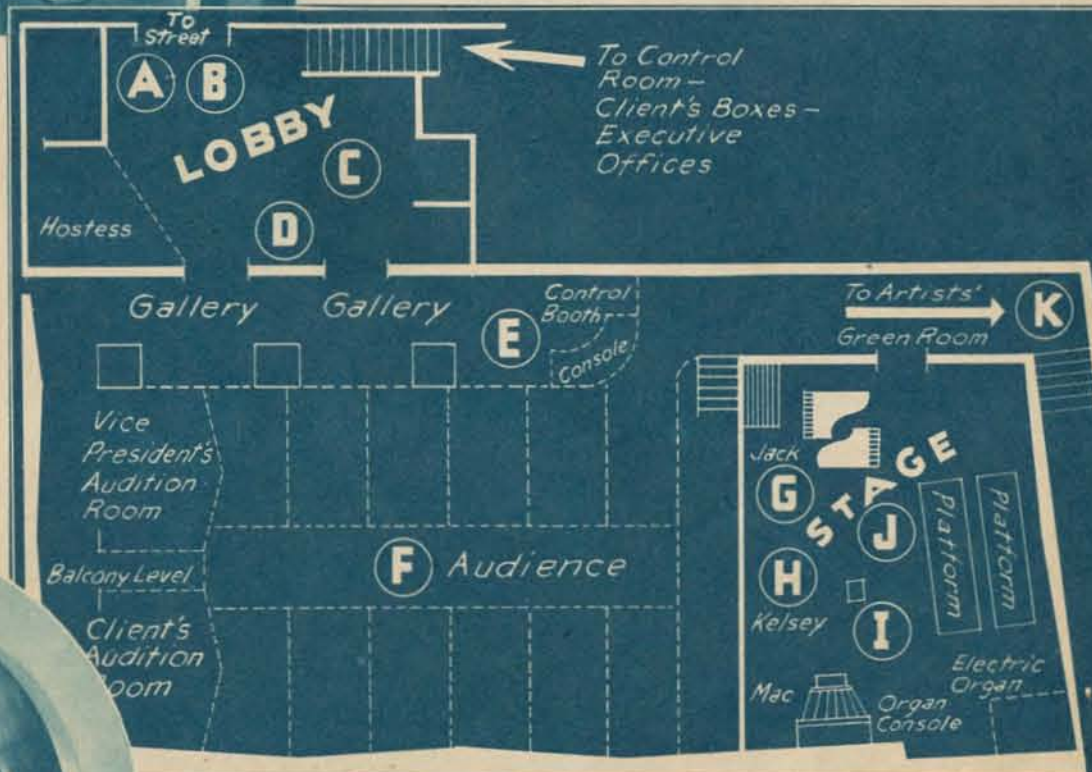

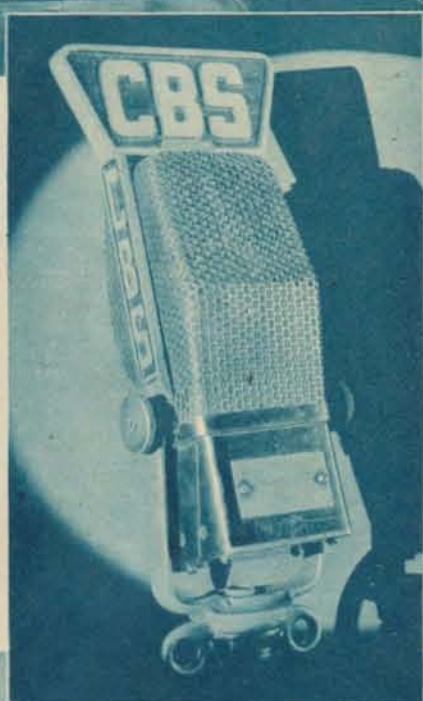
