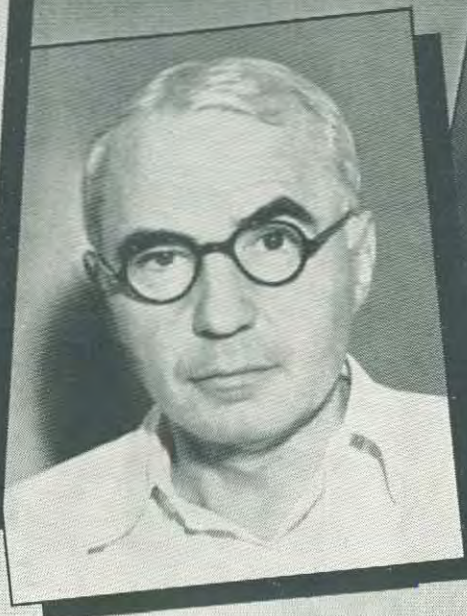
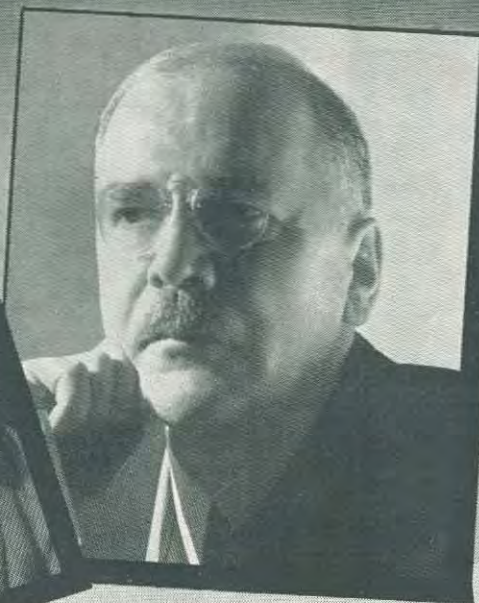

# MEN OF WAR AND CRISIS



**I**N THE thick of Europe's troubles since 1936, Edward R. Murrow now heads CBS' European staff, is one of radio's chief men of war. Native of North Carolina and product of three American universities, Murrow is famous for his word-pictures of London in the foment leading to war on September 3, broadcasts war news every day.

**N**EW'S HERO of previous crises was H. V. Kaltenborn, with his capacity for penetrating analysis and impromptu fluency. This time, however, other newsmen threaten to grab a share of the honors. Perhaps handicapped by his position in Europe, Kaltenborn has been criticized as lacking punch, but now in New York, he is tops.

**E**LMER DAVIS is one of the newer members of the radio news squadron, but he is a veteran of news analyzing. Davis was engaged by CBS to pinch-hit for H. V. Kaltenborn when the latter went to Europe, and he immediately plunged heroically into the midst of the international storm. Davis analyzes on-the-spot reports and interprets.

**J**OHAN GUNTHER, famous author of "Inside Europe" and "Inside Asia," has given listeners a roving picture of Europe against his magnificent background as newsman and traveler. NBC foresightedly engaged Gunther to do this job even before the crisis broke—an example of pains broadcasters took in advance to inform America.



**R**AYMOND GRAM SWING has been called by many experts the most level-headed war commentator on the air. With headquarters at MBS in New York, Swing, like other radio men, has lived, slept and eaten in the studios since Hitler pressed the button for his latest and most fateful crisis. Listeners call him calm, incisive, cautious.

**B**AUKHAGE is the NBC man from whose cryptic comment on the crisis as it looked from Berlin, listeners could draw such conclusions as they might. Of Prussian ancestry, Hilmar Robert Baukhage is a veteran Continental newspaper man, and is equipped to give America a fair interpretation of the Teutonic point of view.

# THE BELOVED BRAT

feared she was doomed, for Fannie Borasch of Forsythe Street was a brat, a guttersnipe.

One day a newsboy told her, "Gee, Fan, you're good. You oughta try one of them amateur shows. They pay money." Fan was thirteen.

"I didn't even know what the word amateur meant," Fan recalled. "Anyhow, a little Irish girl, Hannah Ryan, and I struck out for Keeney's Theater in Brooklyn. That place was packed. The crowd dared you to go on. They were ready to howl and hiss as you got the hook. I was watching the whole thing, when somebody shoved me out onto the stage. That's how my career began.

"I was gawky and my knees were quivering. My clothes were poor. The audience began booing and hissing. I wanted to cry and run off the stage, but

to school, anyway. My last sham attempt disappeared when a dime hit the board at Keeney's. I was an actress. I entered every amateur contest possible and some weeks I collected as much as \$35."

Her family raised Old Ned. Fannie got a job with a dressmaker at \$6 a week. She made clothes during the day and amateur shows at night.

"I still like to sew," she said, "and to make my own clothes. Often I used to make dresses for chorus girls just for fun. One time I was a partner in a Manhattan dress store."

She gave up dressmaking to sing at an Eighty-third Street theater. It was one of those places where a stereopticon flashed the words of the latest song hit on the screen. Fannie sang the words. "I got along fine," she said. "It was dark and the audience couldn't see me. I'm no glamour girl, you know; my face has never been my fortune."

She made friends with the ticket-taker and through her learned of an opening in the chorus of the new Cohan and Harris show. She couldn't dance a lick, but lied about it and got the job. After a few rehearsals, George M. Cohan lost his temper. "I can't stand it," he raged. "That girl is holding up the whole show. Send her back to the farm." Fannie lost her job, which paid her \$23.00 a week. It was impossible for her to get in amateur shows anymore, and she was in the calms until a spot opened with a traveling unit which put on a thing called "The Royal Slave." Fannie was the slave. She had to play the part of a swan and an alligator. Her mother heard about it and



several of my newsboy pals were in the peanut gallery. They began shouting encouragement and they made more noise than the hissers. I told the piano-player I wanted to sing. He asked me what key. I never knew what a key was. Anyhow, he began. I told him my number, 'When You Know You Are Not Forgotten by the Girl You Can't Forget.' I opened my mouth, and Fannie Brice was an actress.

"As I sang, the audience began throwing coins at me. I was afraid if I didn't pick up the money I'd never see it again. So, as I sang, I stooped down and gathered the harvest. It came to about four dollars. I also won the five-dollar first prize.

"The first coin that hit the stage cost me my education. I didn't want to go



THERE is a selfish, conceited urge in most men to feel sorry for Fannie Brice because she never has been able to hold her man, presuming fools believe that a man is a necessary accessory to a woman's happiness. Miss Brice has had two husbands and, looking at them objectively, neither was a bargain.

We have to restrain ourselves to keep from slipping into this story of the beloved brat gobs of maudlin tommyrot and mawkish bagatelles—"the show must go on"—"my man"—"the woman who loved and lost." Miss Brice wouldn't like it and we believe the American public is weary of it. Love has given Miss Brice a couple of vicious slaps, but she's still on her feet. She has been able to stand on her own feet since she was a child. She never has needed a man for a prop or a crutch. Nicky Arnstein, her first husband, was surplus cargo. Her second husband was Billy, the Rose, the little man who puts on big shows.

Miss Brice neither needs nor wants sympathy. There is a feeling that perhaps she has been very fortunate. She has friends, home and two children, and she has the confidence and respect of the American public.

She is childlike but never childish, a lovable person whom love always laughs at. She is a talented artist, designer, decorator, hairdresser and a

keen businesswoman. She has a marvelous sense of value about everything except herself, and she underrates herself. She is hypercritical of herself, supersensitive and sentimental, and has the restraint and poise of a finishing-school graduate, but she came from New York's Ghetto, not far from the gutter.

She was born Fannie Borasch on Manhattan's Forsythe Street in 1893 and was a misfit. She was loaded with inhibitions and her feelings were hurt easily. She had broom-straw legs, a big mouth and a lot of nose. The family used to upbraid her because she wouldn't study. She hated school. The family would throw up the other children to her and she developed into a supersensitive creature.

"I was the biggest liar in the Ghetto," said Fannie. But she wasn't. It's true she told some whoppers, but she merely was dramatizing herself, a perfectly healthy thing for a child. One of her favorite stunts was to go to Coney Island with money in her purse, and accost strangers and cry that she was lost, broke and desperate. The strangers would shell out carfare. Fannie did it just to see how people would react to her sobs.

She shunned school and was a tomboy. She organized newsboys in the neighborhood into a troupe and they played in poolrooms, alleys and back yards. Her God-fearing orthodox family

hied herself out to Hazleton, Pa., and took her child in tow. Fannie came home.

She was hired for a part in a burlesque, then fired ten minutes later from the chorus because she couldn't dance. But they let her sing. She realized she must learn to dance.

"I'm a bargainer, you know," she said. "I was a seamstress once and knew how to make dresses. I struck up bargains with chorus girls and would make them dresses for dancing-lessons. Soon I was pretty good. So were the dresses. I got a spot in the back row of a Hertig and Seamon burlesque, and might have been there yet if the leading lady hadn't got sick. I got her part. We were playing in Cincinnati. It was my first lead and one of my big breaks."

Back in New York, she fibbed again and told Max Spiegel she had a dozen specialties and landed with "College Girls" for \$25 a week. Her first assignment was to sing at a benefit for the Friars. Little Fannie was lost. The Friars could bust an actress merely by a glance. In desperation she went to a young friend, Irving Berlin. Berlin had written some songs for Fannie before and had helped her hold her job in burlesque. Berlin composed "Sadie Salome" for the Friars' doings and Fannie was sandwiched between the routines of Lew Fields and Raymond Hitchcock. Salome had the Friars shouting, and the great Hitchcock had to wait while Fannie took encores.

"The next day, before I had a chance to eat my eggs, without ham," Fannie recalled, "Spiegel induced me to sign

an eight-year contract at \$25 a week."

Wow! Child labor! Fannie was just a kid and signed it. She has learned a heap about money since then. But can you beat that—Fannie Brice's name on a contract for eight years for \$9,400! (She gets \$4,000 for a few minutes' work as Baby Snooks.)

The contract was no good, of course. She was a minor, thank goodness.



Free of that contract, she made personal appearances in burlesque and was good. Flo Ziegfeld heard about her, saw her work and offered her a job in 1907. Fannie's mother handled the business and handled it extraordinarily well.

"I remember when Mother approached him and said I would work for \$40 a week," Fannie said. "Mother said I wouldn't work for a penny less." Mr. Ziegfeld said the price was ridiculous and my heart sank. Then Mr. Ziegfeld said, 'Make it \$75 and I'll sign her for a year.' He was a plunger, all right. Many years later he came to me and shrugged his shoulders and said, 'I'm broke again. I just lost \$2,000,000.'"

She worked for Ziegfeld for fourteen

years and was a Follies star from the first. It was the giddy era. Diamond Jim Brady and the robber barons were stalking the land, shearing the lambs and receiving the plaudits of the sheep. It was the America whose slogan was "Root, hog, or die." Many died. Diamond Jim (oh, America, the sins you have committed in the name of justice and liberty!) threw a little party and invited Fannie. She was from the rim of the gutter and the cruel brilliance of the party bewildered her. She still talks about it. But, looking back at it now, it must seem tawdry to her, common. The guests wore ten-carat diamonds for buttons. One can't help wondering where the newsies were, the ones who had first helped Fannie, while she stared at diamonds on stuffed shirts. The actors and actresses found \$100 bills under their plates.

"I remember, too, the Prince of Wales," she said.

The latest one who had woman trouble.

He came to Fannie's apartment one night with the late John Wanamaker. Wanamaker told her, "Fannie, this is the Prince of Wales. He's visiting America and you are the one person he wanted to meet."

We have a strange hunch that the prince really didn't come over because Miss Brice was the "one person" he wanted to meet. Mr. Wales was a first-class drummer and soft-soap peddler, and the feeling persists that he visited us so the American sheep could see him and marvel at the glories of the British Empire and forget about the fleecing.

Miss Brice has taken some mean kicks from life, but when you think about her at Brother Brady's little break-down and entertaining Mr. Wales you can't feel that life has been wholly mean. All in all, the score-sheet is balanced. Miss Brice has had her share of runs, hits, sacrifices and assists.

"Time can't take away the glitter of those days," she said. "Names, names, names—everybody who was anybody.

Our paths met, our hearts met."

Now, that really doesn't sound like little Fanny Borasch. What does she mean, "everybody who was anybody." What happened to the newsies, and that little Irish girl named Ryan? Oh, they are just nobodies, eh?

"It was a world all of our own," she said. "It was the theater."

But soon Miss Brice came out of the land of make-believe, the world of props and bogus emotions, and stepped into the ring with life. She was knocked down twice, once on a foul, but there was no appealing, for life makes the rules and doesn't take orders even from "everybody who was anybody."

MISS BRICE married Nicky Arnstein, who was not a national asset as a citizen. Mr. Arnstein and law and order didn't get along and soon he was out on a limb, then on the lam. He and Fannie had two children, a son and a daughter, and she stuck by Arnstein when most women would have thrown him overboard as hopeless. It was a brave effort on her part to try to save him. Finally, however, she gave up the hopeless task.

Incidentally, Mr. Arnstein still is alive. He went to his old refuge, the law, recently, and threatened a \$400,000 suit against the studio that produced "Rose of Washington Square." He charged that he had been improperly characterized.

The folks in that show were pretty good folks. One guy jumped the traces, but he came back to Alice Faye's arms (who wouldn't) and law and a good living.

But Mr. Arnstein insisted he hadn't been done right by and the studio paid out \$25,000 to settle it. A dirty little old rumor has it that Mr. Arnstein fumbled when he stuck his neck out in Hollywood, for, it is grapevined, some of the boys will be glad to learn that Mr. Arnstein is healthy and back in the sugar, as the boys say when a fellow has more than a G.

## HOW TO LIVE TO BE 100

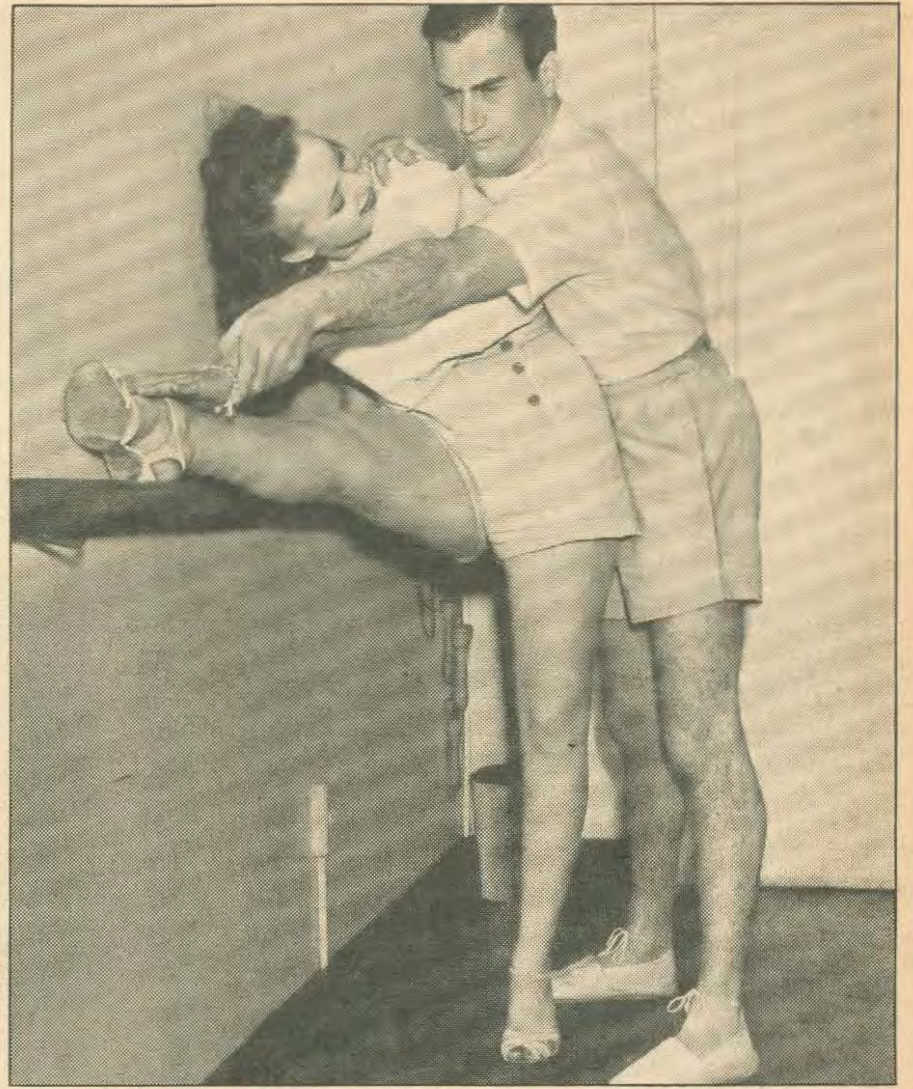
**M**ETHUSELAH lived 969 years, but he didn't argue politics, yell at baseball games, worry over wars in Europe or cut a rug in America. We don't live that long today. Most of us probably wouldn't want to. But we'd like to live a little longer than normal—say to the age of 100. As a foundation for long life nothing beats plain old exercise. That goes no matter what your occupation. Take dancing, for instance. Great-great-grandma minced through the minuet with appealing stateliness but without overtaxing her constitution. Mama glided to the strains of "Over the Waves" waltzes without excessive drain on reserve energy. It's different

now. Chorines, tap, acrobat and ballroom artists, and gyrating jitterbugs need plenty of extra oomph in organs and muscles. Even just furnishing music for dancing takes plenty of energy. Nobody realizes the value of sound health in this field more than Artie Shaw, who survived the rare disease agranulocytopenia, to go on to greater heights as swing king. (Shaw is now heard Tues. over NBC at 9:00 p.m. EDT, 8:00 EST, 8:00 CDT, 7:00 CST, 6:00 MST, 5:00 PST.) And Artie Shaw has a system that's guaranteed to do the job. Follow his four exercises, as demonstrated on the following page, and the swing king himself assures you that you'll hit one hundred easily.





**1. FOR THE LEGS.** Swingmaster Artie Shaw shows Yvonne Duval his exercise for strong, well-formed legs. Raising and lowering body with eight-pound dumbbells on shoulders like this, he says, is one way to long life



**2. FOR THE TRUNK.** A time-honored exercise for conditioning body muscles is touching the toes with the hands. Artie shows original "oomph girl" Duval the proper position to get most from the slow stretching movement



**3. FOR INTERNAL ORGANS.** To stimulate and strengthen vital organs Artie recommends this exercise, sitting on the floor and touching each hand with opposite foot. Watching at left is athletic announcer Ben Gage of NBC



**4. FOR TONING UP SYSTEM.** Stretching is the best way to build lithe muscles, quickening circulation and encouraging a healthy constitution. This exercise alone, regularly taken, will bring you well past ninety, says Artie

The Magic Key folds after next Monday night's broadcast . . . Bob Ripley ends his current series on September 22, but no doubt will be grabbed up by another sponsor before long. His program is much too interesting to keep off the air . . . "Cavalcade of America" will return to the air if it can find a suitable spot . . . The Tommy Riggs show will feature different guest vocalists on each program. Tommy, by the way, has hired an all-star supporting cast which includes Teddy Bergman, Minerva Pious and Charlie Cantor of Fred Allen's Mighty Allen Art Players, and Brad Barker, the animal imitator.

Listeners to some of the broadcasts originating from England may recognize the voice of Howard Clancy, former NBC announcer who is now associated with the British Broadcasting Company . . . CBS songstress Judith Arlen had seven programs in a row canceled because of special European broadcasts, and your reporter had his "If I Had the Chance" appearance canceled twice for the same reason, but went on last Saturday afternoon . . .

I ran into Bob Hope eating a spaghetti dinner a few hours after he got back from Europe and, although I didn't tell him so, the comedian looked as white as a ghost. I could readily understand the reason for his looking so bad

after telling us of his experiences while in Europe and how everyone on the boat was worried wondering whether or not they would land without interference from a German submarine. The Statue of Liberty never looked so good as it did when the passengers sighted it.

The easiest ten dollars I ever made was when I appeared in front of the "What's My Name?" microphone and gave the correct answer to the clue given me by attractive Arlene Francis. However, I'm a bit peeved at Arlene. As part of the clue she stated the famous actress (it was Ethel Barrymore) made her stage debut in 1896 and added I was a little baby at the time. I assured Arlene that I wasn't born until 1904 despite my gray hairs around the temples.

After the program we went downstairs for a bit of refreshments—Budd Hulick and his wife, Harry von Zell and his frau, my better half and a couple of other couples connected with the program. During the round-table discussion, Von Zell told us about a couple of musicians in Peter Van Steeden's orchestra coming up to him before the program and asking if he could arrange to slip them each a box containing samples of all the sponsors products which are given to each contestant. Harry replied, "Now, is that nice, fellows? The sponsor doesn't come around to you asking you to slip him a cornet or trombone." That ended that.

Then someone asked the time and Budd Hulick pulled out the watch which was given to him by RADIO GUIDE for being a guest on our radio program almost two years before. Budd then told us that when he received the gift he thought it was just another inexpensive watch with rhinestones around it. # Hollywood Showdown

HOLLYWOOD.—As this is written, immediately after a most hectic week-end of watching, through one's ears, the most publicized outbreak of war in history, American radio is settling down again to normal and doing its best to forget the worst phases of the European situation. But the war will affect your listening in various ways, to wit:

The major networks have issued a new code of dos and don'ts to editors of war newscasts. These will be carefully filtered to remove propaganda and falsehoods, or if the veracity of a flash is questioned, such doubt will be mentioned during the broadcasting of the item. Also, all newscasters are ordered to maintain impartial and neutral treatment of war news. The volume of broadcasts from the war capitals has been reduced by the networks, and only the most important or significant verified bulletins will be permitted hereafter to disrupt regularly scheduled programs.

Charles Boyer, slated to return from France to rejoin NBC's Woodbury Playhouse with its first Wednesday airing on October 4, is reported to have been included in the French army's second call for reserves and he will remain in service for the duration of the war. Pinch-hitting for the popular screen and radio actor will be Herbert Marshall who, incidentally, was disabled during the World War while serving his king and country. The general tone of your dial fare will remain much the same. Radio will not be hurt, as are the movies by the loss of their foreign markets. But at that, one big break-fast-food maker, who spent \$25,000 a week last year on radio talent, will not return this year on account of the rise in the cost of corn and his consequent inability to make a profit.

## One Man's Family Moves

Last week was moving day for the cast of "One Man's Family," when they returned from the San Francisco NBC studios to resume their airings from Hollywood—and October 5 the show itself will move from Wednesday to Thursday night, at 8 p.m. EST for listeners in the East and Midwest. Pacific Coast tuners will continue to hear the dramatic serial on Sunday nights. Sensible was writer Carlton Morse's admonition to his cast before their trip south from the Golden Gate: "If I hear of any of you driving over 45, I'll make you the villain of the family!"

Morse's "I Love a Mystery" de-

tective drama series will branch out and go transcontinental for Fleischmann's Yeast beginning October 2, and "Those We Love," the Agnes Ridgeway serial of Kit and Kathy Marshall's family and their friends, resumes broadcasting October 5 in behalf of Royal Gelatin. Latter show will follow the eastern rendition of "One Man's Family," which will mean Thursdays at 5:30 p.m. PST for western listeners.

## Live Mikings . . .

Jack Benny hasn't yet set the singer who will fill the void left by Kenny Baker, but if Jack's agent has his way, Dennis Morgan will be the fair-haired boy . . . Pat Friday, the Kraft singing discovery, has no new berth in sight when Bing Crosby returns to the mike, despite rumors that she's to replace a certain coffee-hour canary . . . The concert manager of what famous radio baritone is alleged to like to play soldier with the Hollywood Nazis?

Ken Murray and Mary Healy are carefully planning their elopement . . . Fibber McGee's and Molly's 21st wedding anniversary August 31 was marred by the war outbreak—for Fibber fought overseas the last time . . . His press-agent claims Dick Powell last week narrowly missed being shot by a loaded antique pistol—but the item may be a false report . . . Joy Hodges' marriage to Omaha publisher's son Gilbert Doorly was officiated September 2 at Des Moines; the couple are now on an aerial honeymoon . . . Indications are that Ann "Oomph" Sheridan has sloughed singing-mikeman John Conte in favor of Anatole Litvak, soon to be the ex of Miriam Hopkins, now paving the way in Reno.

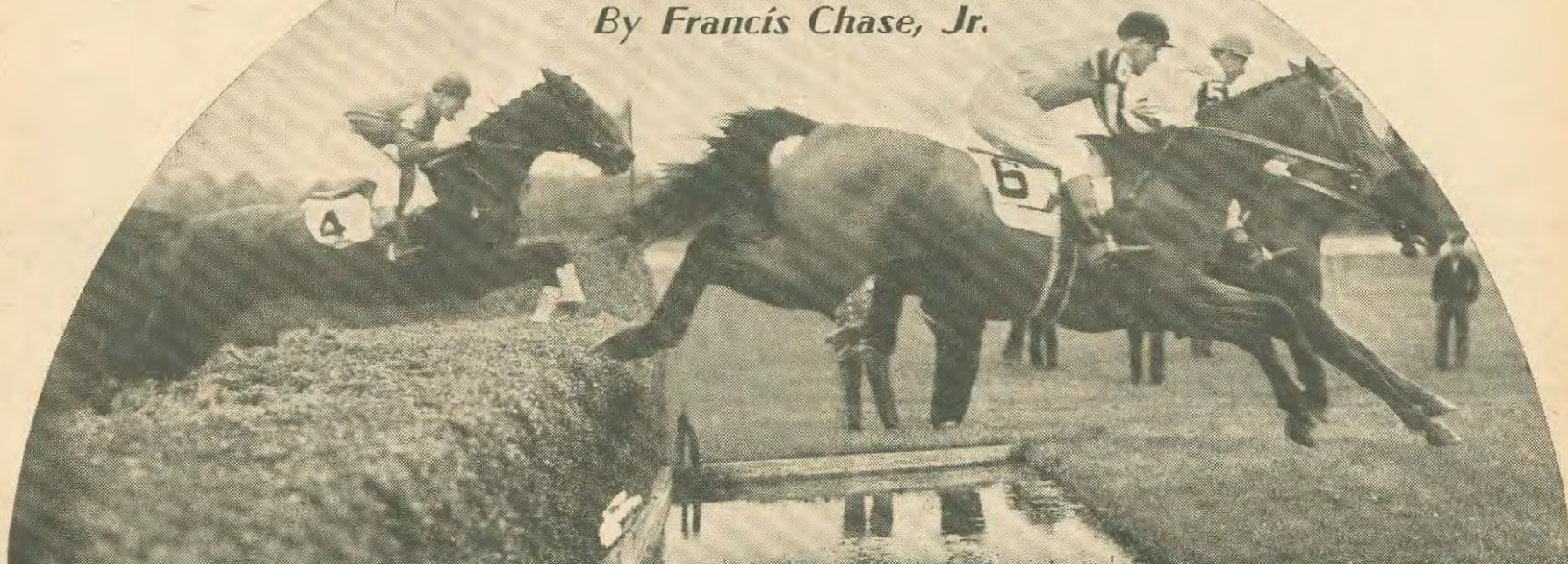

# THE BRAVEST HORSES IN THE WORLD

Radio finds the heart-stopping action of the steeplechase as NBC brings listeners America's greatest—the Foxcatcher

—International News

**A** STEEPLCHASE is a horse-race run the hard way—across country, over fences, brooks, plowed fields, hedges. And as if the natural obstacles which dot the countryside aren't enough, man has added a few of his own to insure thrills. "Steeplechasing," an English journalist wrote in 1819, "is a sort of racing for which the Paddies are particularly famous and in which, unless the rider has pluck and his horse stamina, they cannot expect to get well home." The writer couldn't improve upon that early definition unless he added the words "and luck" to it.

Steeplechasing started in Ireland, but so universal is the perilous appeal of high-jumping horses, the competition of the race, and the inherent quality of "anything can happen" that marks the sport that it soon spread to England, France, and now, at long last, to the United States. The oldest established steeplechase is the Grand National run each year at Aintree and which serves, also, as the occasion for the great Irish Hospital committee's lottery. The newest established steeplechase of importance is the Foxcatcher, run each season at Fair Hill, Maryland, over a course which closely resembles the Aintree course. For a thrill of thrills, we recommend that those who are unable to attend be sure to tune in on the afternoon of September 16, when the National Broadcasting Company puts a description of this newest important sports event on the air.

Sporadically through the South, where gentlemen riders still ride to hounds, an effort has been made to bring steeplechasing to America. A large amount of money and effort was spent at Grasslands, Tennessee, some years ago when English architects were imported to lay out a course, and the writer has, in more recent years, trained horses on fences still standing there. But it was out of the way and never attracted either crowds or outstanding "chasers" (horses used in steeplechases, a specially trained hunter stock, for the most part).

## For thrills and spills, listen to the Foxcatcher this Saturday

In 1933 William du Pont, Jr., in charge of a committee of the Foxcatcher Hunt Club, appointed to stage a race-meet for hunters, started America's Grand National when the Fair Hill course was laid out and the meet so publicized that it drew a crowd of twenty thousand that first year. It has been a popular and growing event ever since.

Steeplechasing is the natural result of the competitive fires which burn in every huntsman's breast. The facetious Lord Alvanley, about the year 1800, put the feeling of many hunters into words when he said that he "regarded the hounds as so many hindrances to what otherwise would have been a very excellent sport." In short, racing horses across the obstacle-strewn countryside was great sport for the horses, the riders and the onlookers, to say nothing of the betting element, and it was a shame to have a good race end when the hounds had cornered their quarry. The first real steeplechase was probably held in Leicestershire in 1803, when, after a hunt dinner, three gentlemen rode to settle a bet. No figures were given, but the "added money" was "a hogshead of claret, a pipe of port, and a quarter-cask of rum."

In the early "chases"—at St. Albans, and later at Aintree—the courses were fenced, but it was not against the rules for a rider to dismount and go through a gate providing he closed the gate after him. Good riders, however, preferred to take the jumps rather than lose time in dismounting and handling the gate.

It was at St. Albans that Jem Mason, one of the famous early-day riders, fixed it with a confederate to saw the top bar of a gate almost through so that, if he struck it, it would give way under his horse's weight. The gate was

steep and few riders would try the jump. Other riders, however, discovered the bar and repaired it so that it was stronger than before. In the race, Jem rode at the gate confidently—although he knew that it was an almost impossible jump—and was amazed to find himself sailing through the air with an ease that would have astonished the man on the flying trapeze, to land on his shoulder some twenty feet distant. He didn't race anymore that year because of the broken collarbone. Jem's attempt at fraud was smiled upon in those days, for even the gentlemen riders of the period attempted every ruse to win. Perhaps this was because some of the gentlemen fell—just barely—on the gentlemen side of the fence. "Black" Tom Olliver was one of these, born hopelessly insolvent but a gallant horseman. Once, confined in Oxford gaol for debt, a friend wrote and asked him if there was anything he wanted. He wrote back: "Send me a d—d good wall-jumper!"

**M**ANY superstitions have grown up around various courses, just as they will, with time, grow up around the Fair Hill course here. At Aintree it was said that no horse could win the Grand National two years in a row. In 1935 Major Noel Furlong's Irish gelding, Reynoldstown, won it, and in 1936, entered again, Reynoldstown was conceded little chance to repeat by the track-followers. On the first jump, its rider, Falke Walwyn, lost his whip, but Reynoldstown needed no urging to stay up with the leaders on the first trip around the course. Reynoldstown was second only to Davy Jones and, fortunately, the horse had never heard of the superstition. The only sound and dependable tradition about Aintree is that anything can happen. So, one

jump from the finish, Davy Jones' rein broke. His rider got him over the jump, but on the flat the horse swerved, and there was nothing for Reynoldstown to do but gallop home the winner and upset a track legend.

Becher's Brook, which is duplicated on the Fair Hill course, accounts for most of the tumbles at Aintree. This tricky hurdle has a blind approach, and the drop on the other side, across the brook, is much more precipitate than it seems to riders and horses. It was named for an early steeplechase rider, Captain Becher, who, thrown from his mount, saved his life under the hoofs of horses which followed by staying submerged under the brook until they had all jumped over.

Perhaps the most fantastic winner of the Grand National was Morifau, an elephantine swayback from New Zealand, in 1904. After a voyage half-way around the world, he was shipwrecked off the coast of Ireland and believed drowned. Two weeks later some Irish fisherman found him on the shore of an uninhabited island, unharmed. He had swum many miles to safety. Hurried to Aintree, he arrived in the nick of time and, in superb condition, took the cup.

Steeplechasing provides a thrill that no other sport approaches. Unlike straight racing, the race is not to the swift. Neither are the best jumpers consistent winners. The steeplechase goes to the horse that's a peculiar combination of hunter, race-horse and opportunist. Being lucky doesn't hurt any. Anyway, at least three horses have been taken from the shafts of milk-wagons to win the Grand National. Anything can happen, and that's what makes the Foxcatcher broadcast well worth listening to if you go for things like war scares, prize-fights, airplane races and invasions from Mars. It's all of them in one.

As Radio Guide goes to press, NBC has not yet announced the exact time of its broadcast of Maryland's Foxcatcher Steeplechase this Saturday afternoon.

### Our Own Refugees

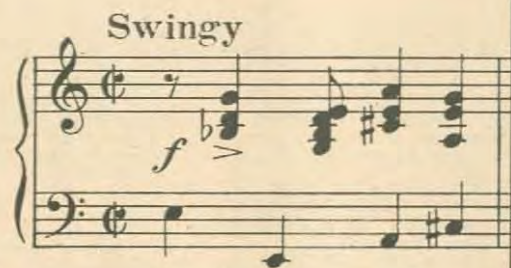
Dear V. O. L.:

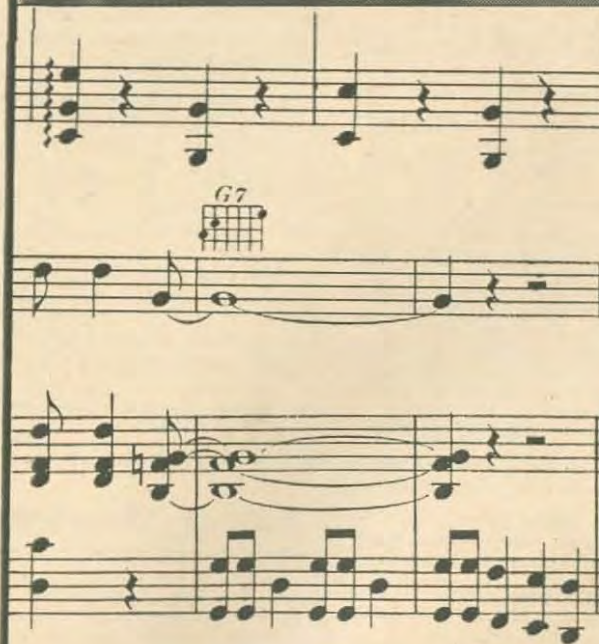

**On Short Waves**

THE long-impending conflict in Europe has become a dreadful reality. It is not a war of bullets alone, but a war of words—a war of wavelengths. Sentiment is molded, ultimatum delivered, war is declared, in fact history is made, by radio. Short-wave radio is playing and will play a role of such vast importance in this conflict that its implications are overwhelming. With ordinary cable and wireless communications crippled or completely disrupted, practically all war news is coming in via short-wave radio. Short-wave radio has now come into its own—not as a plaything for experimenters or as a vehicle for stunt broadcasts from strange spots but as the voice of world events. The time has come when all radio listeners will want to become familiar with short waves. A few frank facts in this connection are vital.

London, Paris and Berlin each have a powerful array of short-wave transmitters, but not all broadcasts from these stations are audible in the United States. The transmissions that you will be most interested in and that you will receive with good volume and intelligibility are those which are particularly directed or beamed on this country. Take for example London. Some thirty channels, each using a different call, are available for broadcast purposes. You don't have to remember all of these. For reception from London, from 6:45 a.m. to 5 p.m. EDT, turn your dials to GSG (17.79), almost in the center of the 16-meter band; from 5:20 to 7 p.m. EDT, turn to GSP (15.31), near the high-frequency side of the 19-meter band; from 7:20 to 10:15 p.m. EDT, turn to GSD (11.75), on the 25-meter band, and from 10:40 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. EDT, turn either to GSD (11.75) or to GSC (9.58) on the 31-meter band. You can hear Germany best from 5:55 to 11:50 p.m. EDT. DJB (15.2), near the center of the 19-meter band, is your best bet, but you have a second choice in DJD (11.75) on the 25-

meter band. Programs from Paris are directed to the United States from 9:30 p.m. to midnight EDT only. Turn your dial to TPB11 (11.885), near the high-frequency side of the 25-meter band. Transmissions from Poland are sent to the United States daily from 7 to 10 p.m. EDT, but these are seldom received with sufficient volume for practical reception. SPW (13.635) is Warsaw's best frequency.

Now you may hear French, German or Polish programs from other stations than those mentioned above, but those listed will provide best reception and are easy to locate and remember. I suggest you clip out this paragraph and hang it near your receiver for reference purposes. Programs from Germany which are rebroadcast on the networks originate over DJL (15.11) or DJB (15.20), if daytime; or over DXB (9.71), if night-time. England's new frequency, GSW (7.23), on the new 41-meter band, is now in use. Detailed English newscasts are still being made from England, France and Germany, at the times listed in our program listings, but news summaries or important news flashes are made irregularly throughout the program schedules, the same as they are in our country. France is using a new frequency of 9.62 megs, which provides good reception, almost nightly from 9:30 to 12 midnight EDT.

LYR (9.29), at Kaunas, Lithuania, power 500 watts, relays the programs of long-wave station Kaunas I, weekdays from 1 to 1:40 a.m. and from 3:30 to 4 p.m. and on Sundays from 2:30 to 3:15, from 7 to 8:45 a.m., from 12:30 to 2:15 and from 3 to 4:30 p.m. EDT. Both men and women announcers are employed. Apparently there is now an amateur-phone station in Mauritius. Listeners report hearing VQ8JM (14.11), near 8:40 a.m. EDT, while a correspondent in South Africa reports a station, giving its location as Mauritius, broadcasts music irregularly on a frequency of 7.19 megs.

This Mozart symphony dates from 1778, when the twenty-two-year-old composer was living in Paris with his mother, where she died just after he completed the opus. He discarded the original slow movement and andante for the present amiable andantino because some of his critical friends thought the former too long and too harmonically complicated (!). Reporting the premiere in a letter to his father, Mozart speaks of the success achieved and adds naively: "Afterwards I went to the Palais Royal, ate an ice, offered up the prayer I had promised, and then walked home."

Wallenstein, usually avoiding routine in his programs, keeps up the plan with the talented Morton Gould's opus and the Fortner score; but why, oh, why the "Romeo and Juliet"? It has been worked overtime in recent months and deserves a short, restful nap—especially because the theme is current in a popular song.

Mozart Piano Concertos, MBS. Alfred Wallenstein, conductor; Nadia Reisenberg, pianist. *Piano Concerto No. 2* (Mozart).

When the complete musical history of radio comes to be written, it will be something for Wallenstein to have the proud record of first producer on the air of the entire series of Mozart's concertos for the piano.

As with all great composers who wrote incessantly, Mozart's muse sent forth ideas of varying value, but in his particular case, even lesser material enjoyed masterful treatment in architecture and ornamentation. His facility in workmanship was so great that he could spin out almost inordinate developments of any subject.

Therefore, in the piano concertos there are some stretches that do not storm the heavens, but on the other hand there are also pages of inspired eloquence, ravishing beauty and compelling gaiety. Perhaps the aforementioned periods of mere display came from the fact that Mozart wrote the concertos primarily for his own use, and having prodigious command of the keyboard he occasionally made Mozart the composer consider Mozart the virtuoso. Extreme tunefulness distinguishes all the concertos. (The A Major and D Minor are the most familiar and best liked.) To play them traditionally, the pianist must have refined tone, authentic musicianship and delicate finger technique, as in the case of Nadia Reisenberg.

# LISTENING TO LEARN

## Don't Misuse the News . . .

On historic September 3, 1939, President Roosevelt warned Americans against misuse of news reports. He said:

"You are, I believe, the most enlightened and best informed people in all the world at this moment. You are subjected to no censorship of news, and . . . your government has no information which it has any thought of withholding from you . . . it is of the highest importance that the press and the radio use the utmost caution to discriminate between actual verified fact on the one hand and mere rumor on the other . . . I hope the people of this country will also discriminate most carefully between news and rumor. Do not believe of necessity everything that you hear or read. Check up on it first. You must master at the outset a simple but unalterable fact of modern foreign relations. When peace has been broken anywhere, peace of all nations everywhere is in danger."

"It is reported," "This is an unconfirmed report," "It is rumored"—watch for these qualifying statements that mean what you have read or have heard *may or may not be true*. Before you are alienated against one cause or drawn to the support of another, be sure that you have all the facts at your disposal. In the days to come you will be the target for a seemingly unending barrage of propaganda specifically designed to arouse your emotions, influence your judgment and poison your mind on matters of vital importance to every man of fighting age in this country. You will hear grim tales of war, of disaster at sea, but before you lend your voice to any move that might lead this country into that war, take our President's sage advice: "Check up on it first."

Frame the speech from which the above lines were quoted and hang it near your radio. Let it act as a reminder to you, every time you read

the newspaper or listen to the radio, of an unalterable fact: "When peace is broken anywhere, the peace of all countries everywhere is in danger." Unconfirmed news reports can be a threatening menace to our peace if not accepted with discrimination.

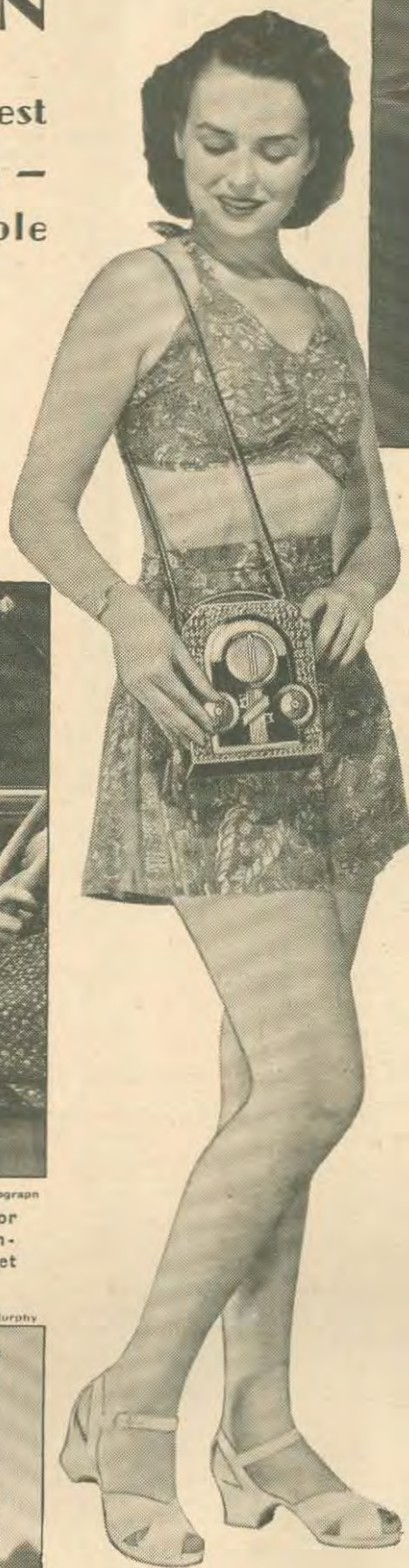

## Portable radios have swept listeners off their feet

"SHE shall have music wherever she goes" is the last line of a pure piece of Mother Goose imagery which has come magnificently alive during the past year with wide public acceptance of the portable radio, little giant of the airwaves. Now one can not only have music wherever one goes but news of the great war, drama, the hundreds of other daily features which were foregone whenever the listener happened to leave an electric connection.

It is no longer an uncommon sight to see strollers, with a tiny portable strung over their shoulder, listening as they walk; to see travelers in railroad stations or on trains and buses listening to their favorite serials.

Two reasons may be given for the new popularity of the portable. The first is that radio entertainment has become so much a part of the average life in America that we are unwilling—during those periods when we must be away from our living-rooms—to miss the grand entertainment this industry offers. The second reason is the new efficiency of operation which has been built into these midget self-powered sets, plus the reduction in their cost to meet the public demands.

The new portables range in price from \$7.50 to \$80, depending upon how elaborate they come. Stepchild of the old battery set, batteries in these new sets have an average life of three hundred hours, whereas the average life of the batteries in the first radio sets was, at most, 100 hours. At an average battery-replacement cost of three dollars, the cost of your portable entertainment is only one cent an hour, which is a little more than the cost of operating the average electric set.

What makes the portable work? Batteries, yes, but not the old, bulky type of battery first associated with radio. A number of the portables use a small

battery block made in a single unit for the portables, while others simply take a small "A" and "B" battery for power. Replacement of batteries is as simple as replacing a flashlight battery. The real secret of the portables' success lies in their tubes, which use little current.

One objection to the portable in the past has been its failure to perform under some conditions—when enclosed in a steel structure, on trains, in tunnels. This has been largely overcome in most sets. Zenith has a patented "Wavemagnet" feature, which makes its set highly efficient under these circumstances. The Zenith, like other portable sets, comes equipped with a pair of earphones which may be neatly stowed away in a cubby-hole in the carrying-case. You can hear, with these phones, any programs you desire without disturbing others in the room. At a recent prize-fight, many spectators were seen listening, as they watched, to the blow-by-blow account of the fight through their portable earphones.

PHILCO engineers claim credit for inventing and introducing the portable, self-powered radio. One Philco model is a set which weighs only nine pounds and measures six by ten inches, can be carried like a handbag. An even smaller set, which closely resembles a camera in appearance, has been made by the Majestic Corporation.

For the "platterbug" or record enthusiast, General Electric, Majestic, and others have perfected a combination portable and record-player which is as compact and neat as other portables. Carrying-cases are attractively styled, and you can find models to match your luggage, your clothes, your car or your temperament. And to prove that good things can come in small packages, the performance of the portables, in many cases, is hardly distinguishable from that of more expensive sets.

# PATTY CAKE, PATTY CAKE

THE GREATEST DANCE CRAZE IN YEARS



OUR MILLIONAIRE "lunatic fringe" has put dozens of goofy tunes and dance steps in the way of becoming national crazes, but few of them have caught on so quickly as that delightfully nonsensical song-and-dance specialty—the Patty-Cake. Listeners have already learned the catchy Patty-Cake ditty which dance bands are currently playing, but few know its origin or how the dance goes. Here is the story. Vincent Astor, socialite owner of

swank St. Regis Hotel in New York City, started it all when he commissioned dance-expert LeRoy Prinz to create the now-famous "St. Regis Ruffles" revue for his St. Regis roof. Out of that revue came the Patty-Cake, which "Ruffles" girls do above in voluptuous surroundings of Astor's night-club. But with all due credit to Messrs. Astor and Prinz, Joe Rines, St. Regis maestro, is responsible for the Patty-Cake dance craze



IT WAS WHEN the ruffled gals had finished their own Patty-Cake and stepped out to do it with men at the ringside tables, as one of them does above with male patron, that Joe Rines noted the hit Patty-Cake had made with guests. Columnist Cholly Knickerbocker called it "tops," and Countess Barbara Haugwitz-Reventlow, heiress to Woolworth millions, was one of those who cried "Give us more Patty-Cake!" Even now, with the revue in

its second edition, the Patty-Cake remains the only unchanged number, still a feature after five months. For those readers who have not yet learned the Patty-Cake, Radio Guide presents on the following pages a fully illustrated demonstration of the entire routine, with radio stars Noel Mills and Michael Loring demonstrating. # THE STARS LOVE TO DO THE PATTY-CAKE



**JOSEPH RINES** and his orchestra, seen above doing the Patty-Cake on the St. Regis Roof, are not the most widely ballyhooped bandmen in the country, but in recent years they have earned the reputation of being innovators and pace-setters for all dance orchestras. While the band's introduction of Lambeth Walk on St. Regis Roof in 1938 caused only a ripple among

guests, that first of the pantomime dances quickly swept dancing America. Patty-Cake, on the other hand, wowed the millionaire "fringe" from the first, and Rines made a point of explaining the steps nightly, later cooperating with song's publisher in sending instructions to all dancing-schools and instructors. Now follow his beat-by-beat directions as shown below



**1st Beat** **RADIO STARS**, like other folk, love to do the Patty-Cake. Above, actress Noel Mills and baritone Michael Loring, both of CBS, start by slapping thighs with palms of their hands



**2nd Beat** **DANCERS THEN** clap their own hands together, as Miss Mills, leading lady of "When a Girl Marries" (CBS serial drama), does here with partner Michael Loring



**3rd Beat** **PARTNERS CLAP** each other's right hands together. Loring, promising young singer heard over CBS several nights weekly, posed these special photos with Noel Mills



**4th Beat** **DANCERS CLAP** own hands together again. It's just a variation of the old "Patty-cake, patty-cake, baker's man" rhyme brought up to date for twentieth-century dancers



**5th Beat** **PARTNERS CLAP** each other's left hands together. This is how maestro Joe Rines did it for his St. Regis patrons when they cried out, "Give us more Patty-Cake!"



**6th & 7th Beat** **DANCERS CLAP** own hands together again, then, with palms forward, they clap each other's hands again, this time both right and left (above)



**8th-9th-10th & 11th Beat** **CLAP OWN HANDS** together once each beat (8, 9), snap fingers on each beat (10, 11)



**Break** **NOW THE BREAK**, which is done twice to a Charleston beat and consists of any gesture dancers wish to make, such as tweaking ears or sticking out tongue as above, with Rines' help

# WHAT DOES A TALENT-SCOUT LOOK FOR?

**T**ALENT-SCOUTS are a part of the radio and movie business. They scour the country for boys and girls with something extra on the ball. Daily, trains into New York, Hollywood, Chicago, haul young hopefuls—selected by wandering talent-scouts who dip into night-clubs, colleges, high schools, barnyard theaters, looking, looking. Yet many youngsters still await their opportunity, unnoticed. Too many are waiting in vain. Too many girls are dreaming of Hollywood or New York when they are hopelessly unfitted for

either. In order to give them some standard of judgment, Radio Guide tells what a talent-scout looks for. Generally, here are the points he notes, in order of their importance: (1) Face, especially eyes and teeth; (2) Legs, for symmetry and beauty; (3) Figure, with an eye to bust and hips; (4) Talent, in acting or singing; (5) Disposition, with boss and other workers; (6) Attitude toward life—does she expect to work for what she gets; (7) Hobbies, such as riding, swimming, tennis. For exact details on a talent-scout's dream, look below.

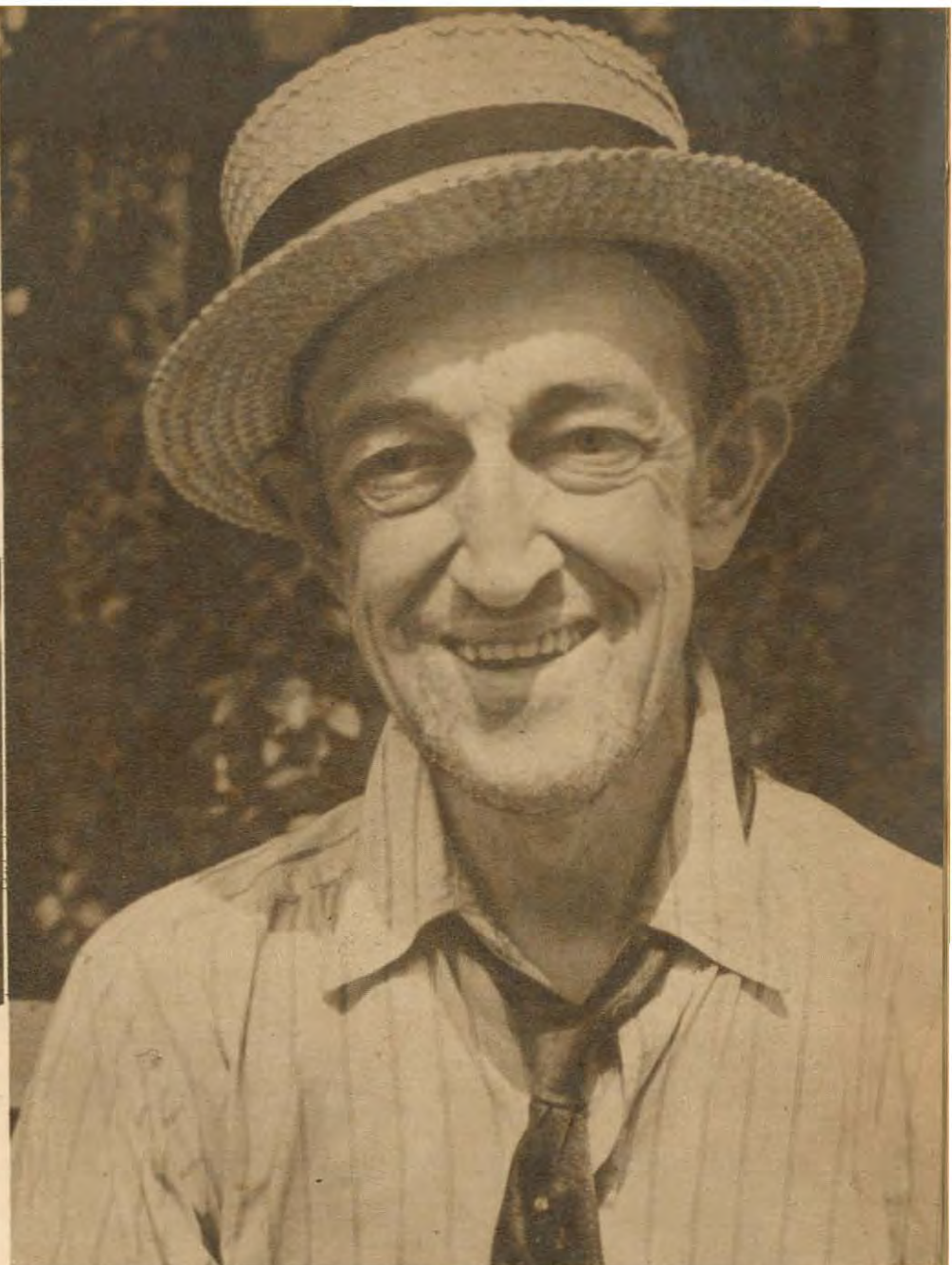
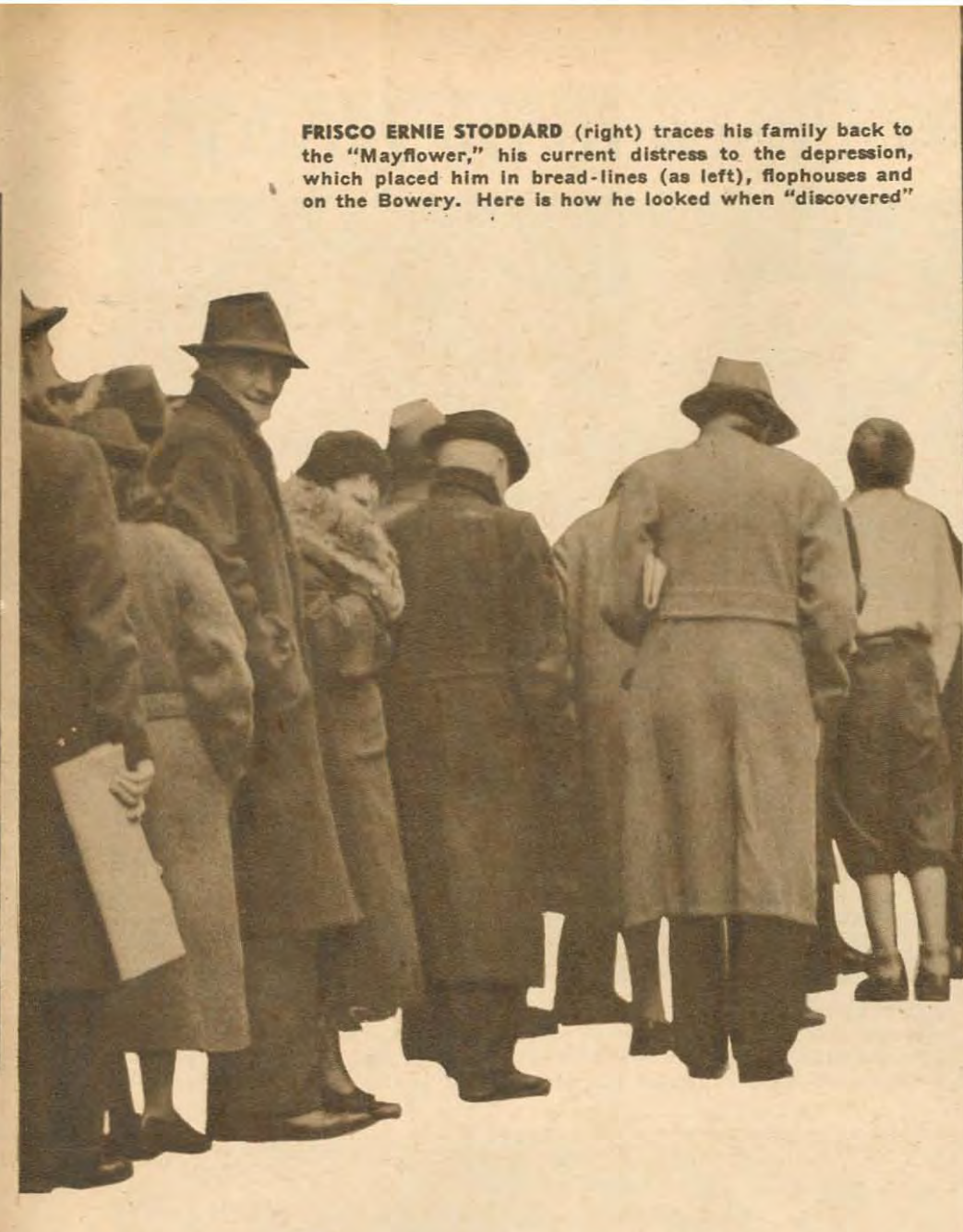
# FRISCO ERNIE'S DAY IN THE SUN

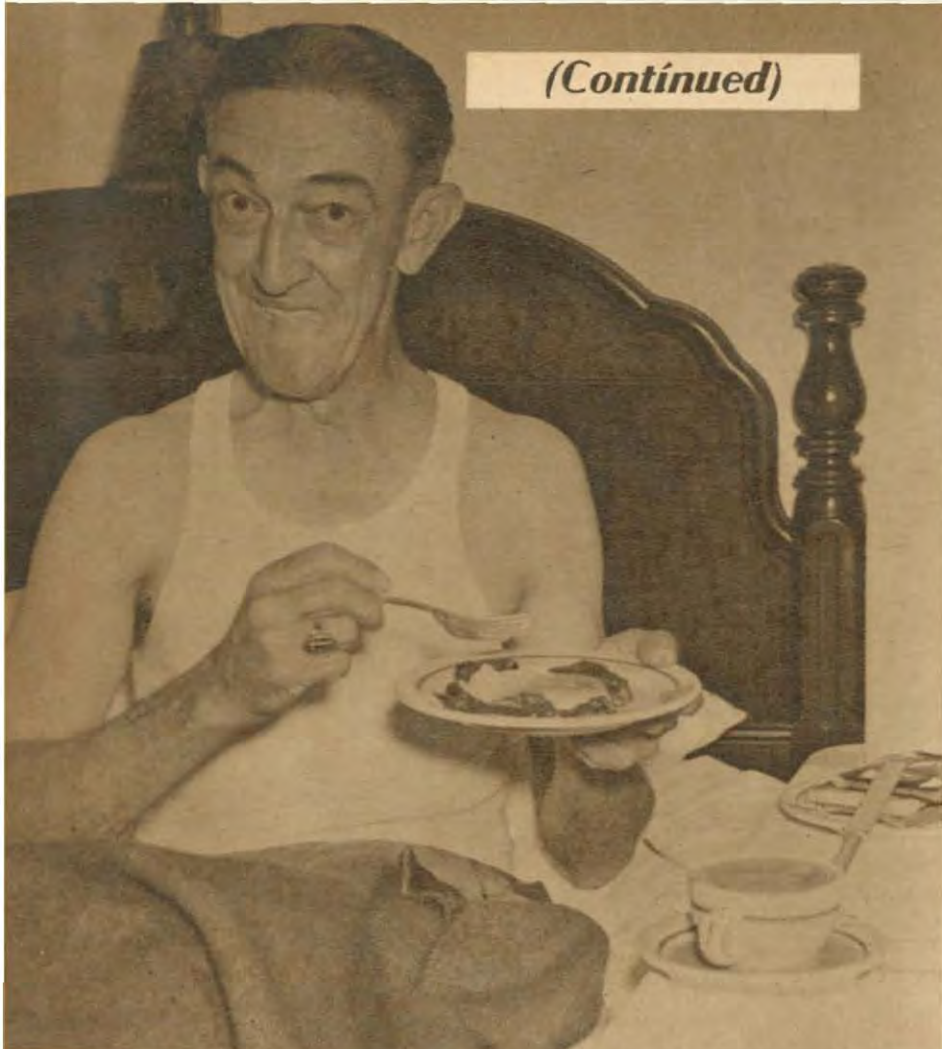

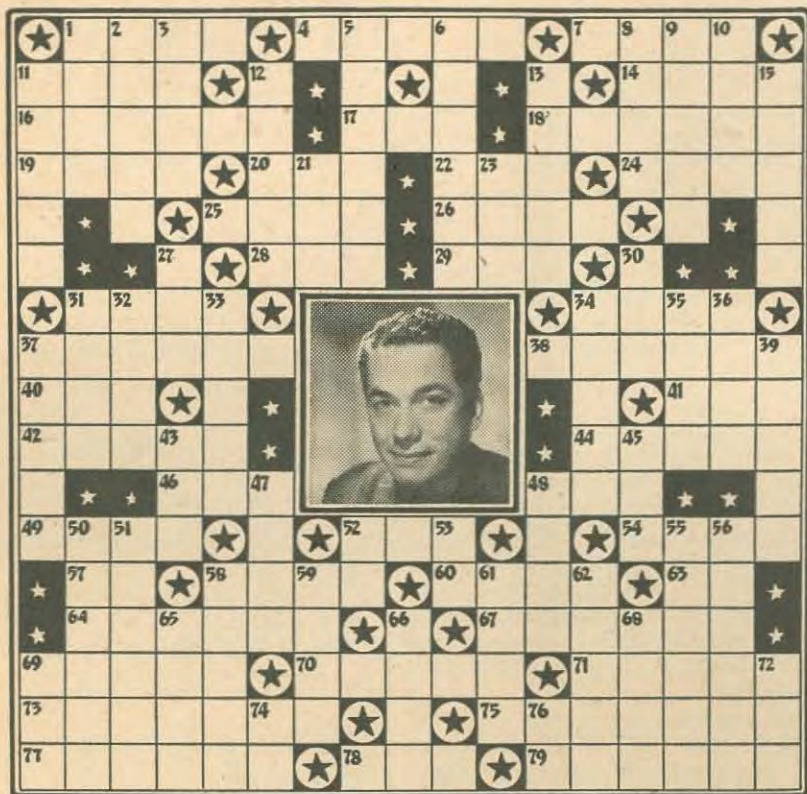

"Pandemonium broke loose when I sang it," Fannie said. "It was the song of every woman who had ever been in love. After I had left the stage at the conclusion of the number on opening night, Ziegfeld gave me a check for \$2,500."

The movies took her west for "My Man," an old silent picture. Miss Brice did her best, but Fannie Brice is not so hot unless she can sing or laugh. When she laughs she can be heard for three blocks. "My Man" wasn't a world-beater. Of course when the talkies came she clicked.

Meanwhile, she had been dabbling with radio, but no sponsor tore down doors to get to her. Her singing is not very effective unless she can be seen. It's the combination—her figure, nose, voice and personality—that makes her songs. Radio didn't have a gap for her, at first.

The "Good News of 1938" used her as a guest star, and following a friend's advice she did "Baby Snooks." Soon she was on the payroll, and "Baby Snooks" now is to America what the Katzenjammer Kids were a few years ago, and Foxy Grandpa's kids.

The character was created eighteen years ago, quite by accident. There was a song called "Poor Pauline" going the rounds. It was a take-off on the "Perils of Pauline," the old movie thriller. Fannie was at a friend's house one night and sang the song as a child might. It clicked, and Moss Hart and Dave Freedman wrote lines for Fannie and she used "Snooks" in the Follies. Today Miss Brice is "Baby Snooks," not the wife who sang "My Man." The giddy era has passed.

At the top of the heap, she married Billy Rose, but that one didn't take. Mr. Rose and Eleanor Holm are betrothed. Miss Holm is working for Mr. Rose at the New York Fair and recently she was late for a cue. Mr. Rose asked how come, and his sweet-heart told him she had been laughing so much at a radio program that she forgot the time. The program was "Baby Snooks" singing "The Little Fishes."

And so the woman who made the world cry with "My Man" now plays a brat who amuses the woman who won one of Miss Brice's men.

But when the convention actually gets under way in Chicago on September 25, many fine broadcasts are planned. **Miss L. B. Flewelling, Sussex, N. B., Can.**—Don Ameche was born in Kenosha, Wisconsin, May 31, 1910, christened Dominic Felix Amici. Don is the oldest son in a family of eight children. Don attended kindergarten and the Franklin elementary school in Kenosha and at the age of eleven was enrolled at St. Berchman's Seminary in Marion, Iowa. He spent two years at St. Berchman's, completing the first year of high school . . . then matriculated at Columbia College, Dubuque, Iowa, for five years (three years in high school and two years in college). After being graduated from Columbia, Ameche entered the law school at Marquette University, Wisconsin; from there he transferred to Georgetown University, Washington, D. C., and finally to the University of Wisconsin at Madison. While at the University of Wisconsin, Don starred in "Liliom," "Outward Bound" and "Young Woodley," then decided to tackle Broad-

way. He visited theatrical agents for a considerable length of time, finally was given the juvenile lead in "Jerry for Short," by Fiske O'Hara. After that he toured in vaudeville with Texas Guinan . . . then to Chicago, playing the lead in "Illegal Practice," which ran two weeks. Don's friends suggested he stay around Chicago, try for an audition at the broadcasting companies. He did, and two days later Don was called to play a part in "The Empire Builders." Later he played in "The Little Theatre Off Times Square," "Betty and Bob," "Rin Tin Tin," "The Foreign Legion," "Grand Hotel," and "First Nighter." He got his Hollywood start in "Sins of Man." Don married Honore Pendergast in the Church of the Nativity, Dubuque, Iowa, the day after Thanksgiving in 1932. They have two children, Donnie and Ronnie. Don is five feet eleven and one-half inches tall, weighs 170 pounds, has brown hair and hazel eyes.
