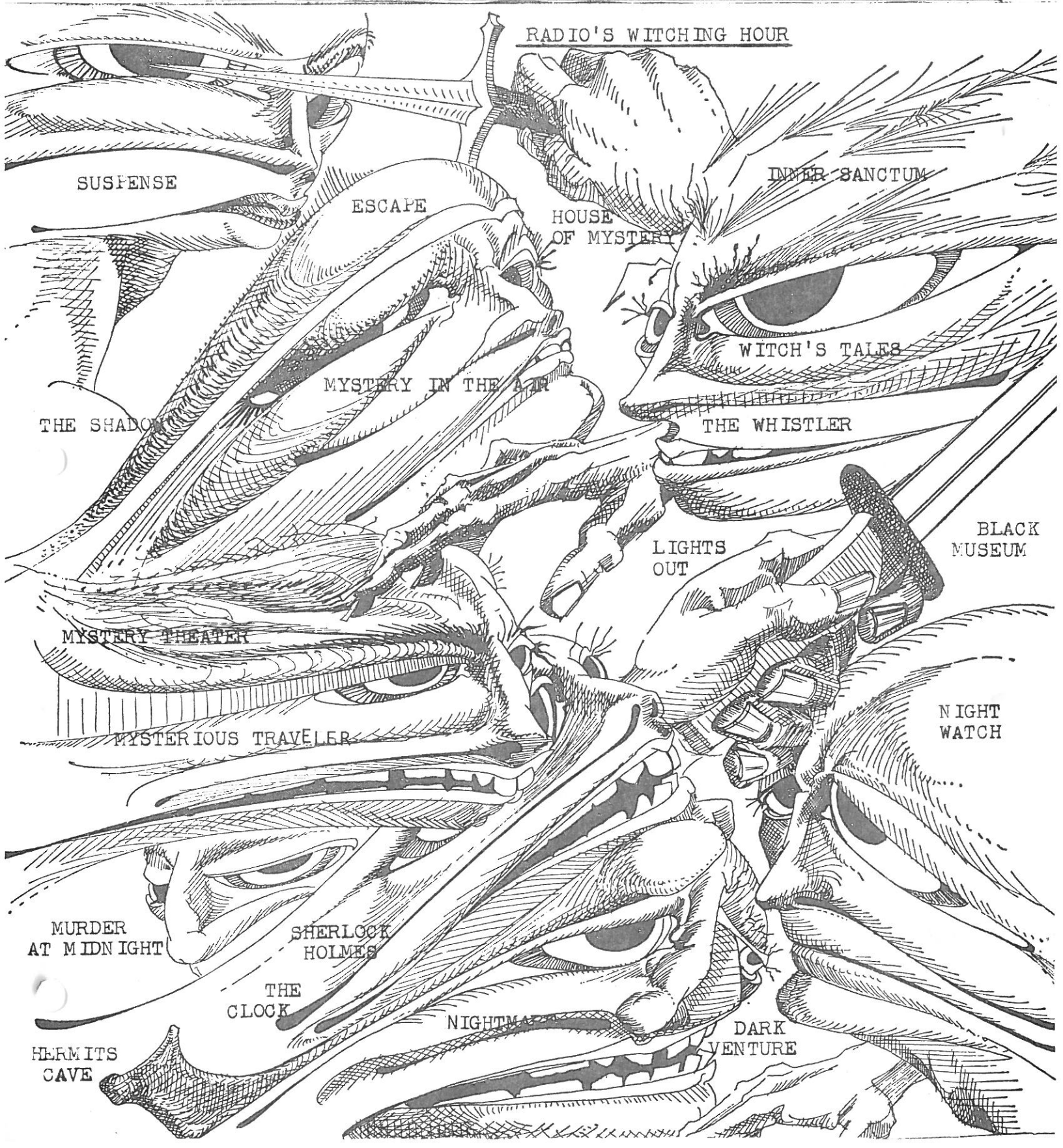

We agree with John that Phil Harris was one of the funniest comedy programs, and the series where Frankie is fired by the sponsor is among the best of the bunch.

JANUARY MEETING WITH STARR YELLAND -- No one who attended the January meeting will soon forget the absolutely spellbinding hour and a half that Starr Yelland spoke. As it happened, between the time we lined Starr up and January 11, he had his contracted summarily bought up by KMGH, and was let go.

It would be impossible even to summarize the talk, much less to catch the flavor of the fine way that Starr speaks, although his style can be recalled from his broadcasts. He believes in bringing a high level of craftsmanship to his profession, including impeccable diction, hard work, long hours and, when necessary, ingenuity to bring the report to the public. (One example of the last occurred when he had to report a baseball game from the roof of a building across the street from the diamond, when he was not allowed in the park.) Some interesting sidelights of his career:

- *The top guy at KOA made \$20 a week in 1940, the year Starr began there.
- *He did football games in Cedar Rapids with a man that may be the next Republican candidate, Ronald "Dutch" Reagan.
- *He had a show sponsored by Public Service who, as we know, also sponsors John Dunning.
- *He was on the nightclub circuit for a while.
- *He did the first talk show in Denver, in 1954.
- *In 28 years of broadcasting C.U. football, he missed one game.

Starr has made no secret of the fact that he would still like to work, and we were delighted to read in Dusty Saunders' column that he will do some free-lance work for Channel 9. We devoutly hope he ends up broadcasting full-time, again.

NO COVERUP -- Those of us who are good editors and fine writers (as well as being modest) are generally not great artists. The only exception occurring to me is William Blake, the poet. For the cover of Return With Us Now, I have had to rely on others, and I extend belated thanks to John and Pat Lloyd for last month's as well as this cover.

HARD TIMES -- We have mentioned the necessity of economizing on this newsletter. For a while, we will try alternating shorter and longer editions and, where feasible, we will shrink copy. Again, if any of you have any other ideas, especially where we can obtain cheap reprinting, let us hear about it.

SEARS SHOW TO BE BROADCAST HERE -- If you follow Dusty Saunders' or Clark Secrest's column, you read the good news that KOA is going to broadcast the "Sears Radio Theatre". It will be at 10:15 p.m. on weeknights, with Monday programs being westerns, Tuesday featuring comedy, Wednesdays having mysteries, "love and hate" shows (must be about marriage) on Thursdays and Fridays winding up with adventure programs. "CBS Mystery Theatre" will be broadcast at 11:05 p.m. Mondays through Saturdays and 7:05 p.m. on Sunday. It does no harm to let KOA know that you appreciate their efforts.

SUBTLE TOUCH -- Those of you that listened to "Joker Wild" on Suspense on January 7 know that it featured Elliot Lewis as a comedian who went to great lengths to be taken seriously. A deft stroke which proves, as John Dunning has often said, that Elliot Lewis's talents go far beyond playing Frankie Remley on the Phil Harris Show.
