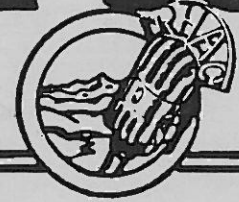

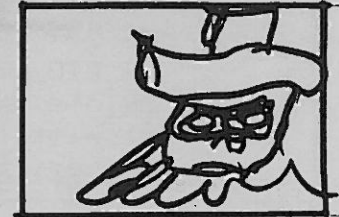

On June 24, 25 and 26th in a small New York town known as Arcade, the Lone Ranger rides again! During those three days the person of the Lone Ranger and Tonto came alive. And, what better why to celebrate than to honor it's creator Fran Striker. At the celebration there was a live radio broadcast put on by the crew at WEBR the station which Fran Striker first got into radio. The man behind this celebration is the son of Mr. Striker, Fran Striker Jr.

Fran Striker Jr. has written a book called His Typewriter Grew Spurs.....A biography of Fran Striker--writer. The book is 150 pages of facts and warm stories about it's creator Fran Striker. It has many rare photos of Earl Graser, Brace Beemer and Clayton Moore. It tells of how Mr. Striker was contacted by George W. Trendle at WXYZ and how he adapted one of his Covered Wagon Days scripts about a masked man on the side of law and order. It not only tells about Fran Striker the wizard of words who typed out thousands of words a week but as Fran Striker the family man. It also contains a list of books by Fran Striker, chronology of the Ranger's radio years and the first Ranger radio script. The book fills in many of the gaps left by other books about the Ranger and Fran Striker. It is written with all the warmth and impact that a book about two American legends can cover.
