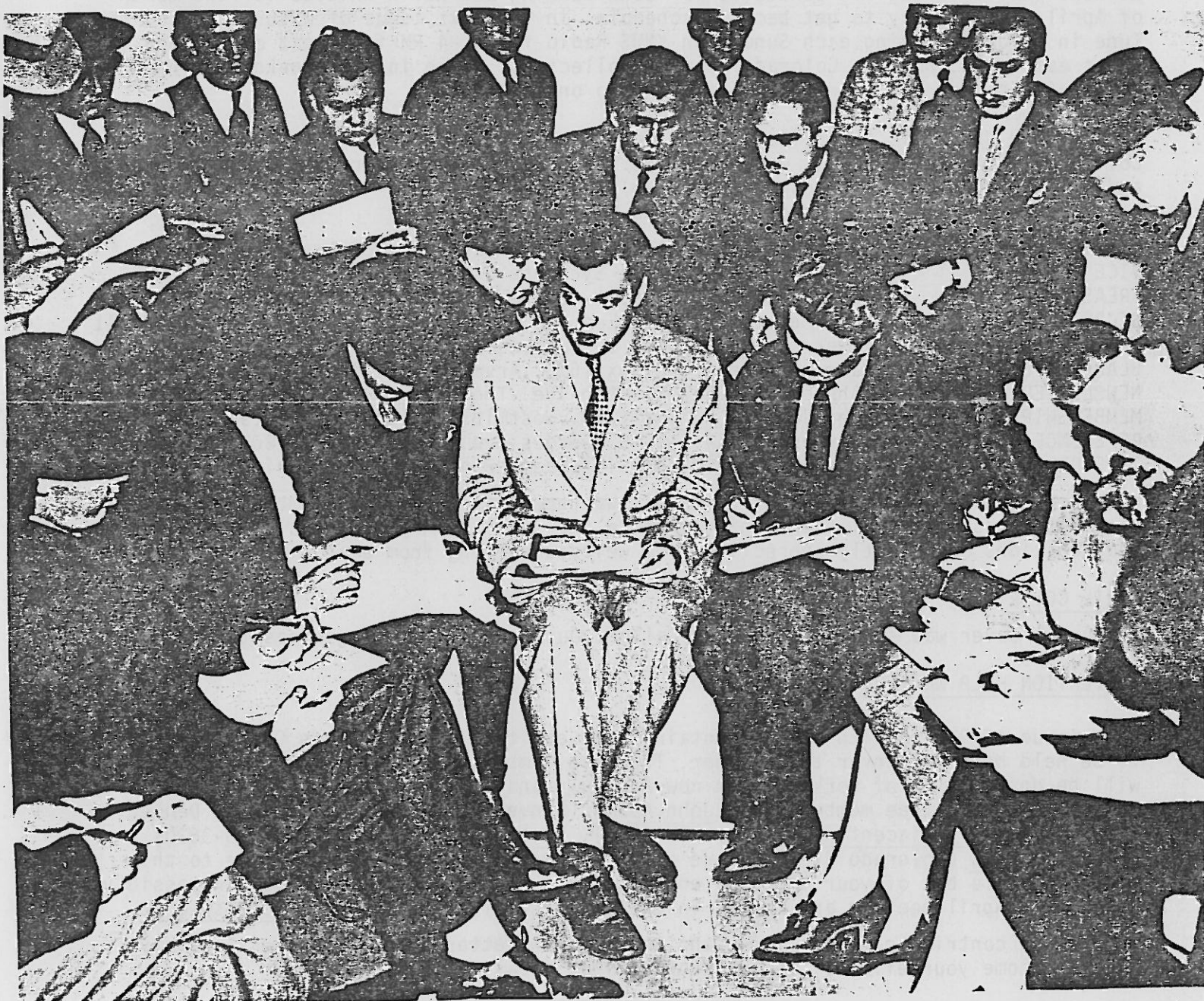

DENVER OTR CONVENTION

The anniversary committee made it's first report at the March meeting of the RHAC. The committee was formed to organize activities for the RHAC's 10th Anniversary. Those in attendance were delighted in the progress made by the committee in such a short time. Here are the highlights of the committee's report:

- \* A convention for OTR buffs will be held on Saturday, July 27, 1985 at the Super 8 motel in Denver. The ballromm will hold 250 people and has been reserved for the RHAC free of charge. The tentative times of the convention are 2 Pm until 8 PM.
- \* Sam Edwards of Gunsmoke has agreed to participate and we are arranging for many Denver radio personalities to attend. The committee will arrange for individual speakers and panel discussions of national and local radio. The committee will also try to arrange for a live radio drama to be performed at the convention.
- \* A charge of \$5 or \$6 per person will be made and this will include a buffet style dinner and all convention activities. This amount is tentative and will enable the RHAC to cover guests dinners, participant dinners, advertising and the anniversary newsletter printing costs.
- \* Displays of OTR memorabilia, membership information booths are tentatively scheduled. It was decided not to set up any workshops for this convention since those running the workshops would miss out on a great deal of the convention.
- \* The committee will discuss room rentals for those attending from out of town. If the rooms are not satisfactory (they are remodeling in some areas) they will check with nearby motels for those interested in staying over in Denver.
- \* The major point made was that the convention would be an overwhelming success with members support and participation. There is a lot of work to be done in the next 4

months and you will all be kept updated in the newsletter and at the meetings. It was decided that most business will be tabled or handled outside of the meetings so that the next 3 meetings could be exclusively convention planning.

The RHAC absolutely and positively needs your support for this convention. You are all members of this club because you like OTR and because you like OTR you will certainly enjoy a convention dedicated to it. We are sure you will enjoy meeting many of these radio personalities.

Right now the committee has 5 members and they need many more. Things will run very smoothly if a lot of people do a little bit to help. We would especially like to see some of our new members get involved.

A quick glance over the membership list and I see about 40 local members who rarely attend meetings and don't know one other member. What a great way to make new friends and help get the convention off the ground.

THE BRILLIANT BRITISH DETECTIVE WAS FIRST HEARD ON THE AIR - WAVES OCT. 20, 1930. THIS WAS 9 YEARS BEFORE BASIL RATHBONE PLAYED HOLMES IN THE FILMS, BUT RATHBONE WAS PRECEDED IN THE SCREEN ROLE BY MANY ACTORS INCLUDING RAYMOND MASSEY, CLIVE BROOK, AND JOHN BARRYMORE. IN FACT, THE FIRST SHERLOCK HOLMES MOVIE WAS MADE WAY BACK IN 1903.

WILLIAM GILLETTE WAS THE FIRST HOLMES ON RADIO. HE WAS FOLLOWED BY CLIVE BROOK, RICHARD GORDON, LOUIS HECTOR, BASIL RATHBONE, TOM CONWAY, JOHN STANLEY, AND JOHN GIELGUD.

THE GUIDING FORCE BEHIND THE DETECTIVE'S RADIO ADVENTURES WAS FORMER ACTRESS EDITH MEISER, WHO CONVINCED NBC TO AIR THE SERIES. SHE HERSELF THEN WROTE THE SCRIPTS. IT'S NOT SURPRISING TO LEARN THAT HER PET SCOTTISH TERRIER WAS NAMED "DR. WATSON."

At our Tuesday, March 19 meeting at Colorado College, all of us who could attend were greatly privileged to have as guest speaker Harry Elders, an old-time radio actor and media announcer from Chicago. If you listened to shows like The First Nighter, Sky King, A Life in Your Hands, Jack Armstrong, The Breakfast Club, and The Silver Eagle, among many, you may remember Harry from these shows. He was also the star of Curtain Time (Mike Wallace was the announcer). It's a safe bet that any member of the Old Time Radio Club who has seen his/her fair share of documentary and training films has sooner or later heard Harry's voice as narrator. At 76, after a half-century of work in the broadcast and advertising media, Harry Elders is still extremely active in radio and TV commercials, film narrations, and various acting jobs all over the U.S.

Harry was one of those busy actors in the heyday of radio soap opera who rushed daily from studio to studio to play various roles in daytime serials for the nation's audience. He told us a few stories and anecdotes about actors he'd worked with, including Marvin Miller and a young actress named Nancy Davis (she's Nancy Reagan today) who played his daughter in a 1940s Chicago daytime series. Today he travels to Chicago to play roles in a syndicated radio drama called "UNSHACKLED", which began over 30 years ago and is heard round the world. Harry said he'd like to come to the Club's convention in Denver this July.

We hope his schedule won't prevent his attending. It'll be a real treat to have Harry Elders among us at that time.

Two months ago in RETURN WITH US NOW, in reference to Kevin Shields' Old Time Radio program on KRCC (Colorado College public radio), I wrote, "Kevin will soon be completing his fifth year as host of the OTR show and this popular program promises to continue on for much longer. Kevin's schedule will be included each month in 'RETURN WITH US NOW'".

Less than a week afterward Kevin told me the OTR program would be yanked from its Sunday 8-10 P.M. slot and relocated to Monday through Friday, 12:00 Noon to 12:30 (Kevin's final Sunday night opus was February 17). That's only a half-hour a day, but better than no time at all. Let's hope the OTR show will be able to keep the same listeners who stayed with Kevin for five years on Sunday nights, as well as the fans his show picked up along the way. Too bad, though, that the KRCC management didn't ask Kevin what he thought of the time change before going ahead with it.

As for Kevin's schedule of shows, it'll be published . . . soon.

The April meeting of the Colorado Springs chapter of RHAC will be Tuesday, the 16th (following Income Tax Day; won't you be glad?), same time/place, 7:30, Room 203, Rastall Center, Colorado College; program to be announced. Harry Elders won't be an easy act to follow, but we'll work on it till then.
