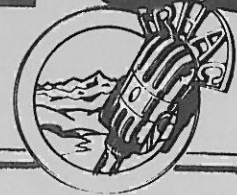

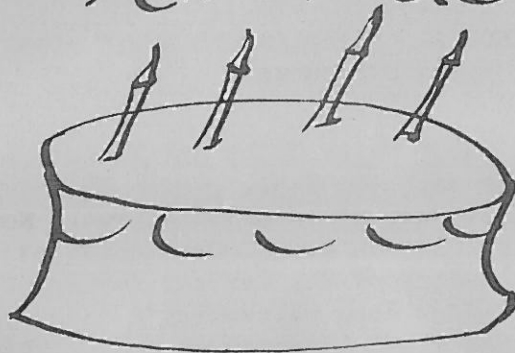

JULY MEETING - BIG SHOOTOUT COMING

July 1: **THE LUX RADIO THEATRE.** "Brewster's Millions," starring Jack Benny and Mary Livingstone, 2-15-37 (60 min.).
SCREEN DIRECTORS PLAYHOUSE. "It's In The Bag," starring Fred Allen, 2-14-50, third of three SDP shows.

July 8: **ON STAGE:** "Call Me A Cab," with Cathy and Elliott Lewis," March 1953.
DRAGNET: "Kevin and Bruce," 8-28-52.
ONE MAN'S FAMILY. First show of an extended run. Note: One Man's Family was first heard in 1932, on an NBC west coast station. It ran for 27 years, telling the story of the Barbour family of Sea Cliff, San Francisco. Patterned after John Galsworthy's "Forstye Sage," the serial was heard during its first 17 years as a 30-minute continuation, once a week. In 1950, it converted to a five-a-week, 15-minute show. Always concentrating more on character than action, it built a huge, devoted audience, whose listeners still remember and ask for the shows. Starting today we open an extended OMF run. If these are successful, we may blend into the 15-minute run on the daily show at 8 a.m., later in the year. We begin with Book 71, Chapter 2: "Two Lost Barbours Begin to Find Happiness," 7-11-49.

RADIO HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION OF COLORADO BY-LAWS

NAME

1. The name of the organization shall be known as the Radio Historical Association of Colorado.

PURPOSES

1. To promote interest in vintage and contemporary radio programming.
2. To make tapes of such programs available to members as economically as possible.
3. To make such programs available to organizations such as charities, institutions for the blind and senior citizens groups.
4. To collect, research and distribute historical and modern information on vintage and contemporary radio, and to distribute a newsletter and other publications on such matters.
5. To maintain a library of radio programs on tape and information related to them.
6. To carry out such other related purposes as the members deem appropriate.

MEMBERSHIP

1. Any person may become a member who is interested in one or more of the purposes of the association.
2. Classes of membership are Regular and Honorary.
 - a. Regular Membership- A person who has paid their dues for one full year.
 - b. Honorary Membership- A person who has contributed to the association and has been approved for Honorary membership by the officers.
3. Appropriate dues for membership may be established which will be used for carrying out the purposes of the association.

OFFICERS

1. The elective offices shall be: President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary. No two offices may be held by the same person except for the offices of Treasurer and Secretary.
2. Such other appointive or elective offices as deemed necessary by the membership may be established.
3. The term of each elective office is one year, commencing October 1 of each year and running through the following September 30.
4. Elections will be held during the month of September each year. Special elections to fill vacant offices may be held at other times.
5. Elections of officers will be by a majority of those present at the election.

LIBRARIES AND PUBLICATIONS

1. Tape Library- The Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall maintain a tape library of radio programs which will be available to all members. It shall endeavor to periodically supplement this library with additional selections. All members are free to recommend additions that should be made and to assist with additions at any time.
2. Reference Library- The Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall maintain a reference library of radio information which will be available to all members. It shall endeavor to periodically supplement this library with additional information. All members are free to recommend additions that should be made and to assist with additions at any time.
3. Newsletter- The official publication of the Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall be known as Return With Us Now. The association shall endeavor to distribute this newsletter on a monthly basis to all members. The primary purpose of this publication is to inform members of meetings and other notices and information of the association. Members are free to make recommendations concerning the publication and to assist with contributions at any time.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Elective Officers

- a. President- The President of the Radio Historical Association of Colorado will be the official spokesperson of the organization. The President shall ensure that the purposes of the association are carried out in all instances. The President shall have the responsibility for the planning and conducting of all meetings.
- b. Vice President- The Vice President of the Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall assume all of the duties and responsibilities in the absence of the President.
- c. Treasurer- The Treasurer of the Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall be responsible for maintaining all of the financial records of the association. The Treasurer shall be responsible for notifying the officers and committees of any membership changes.
- d. Secretary- The Secretary of the Radio Historical Association of Colorado shall be the official correspondent of the association and shall keep records of such correspondence.

2. Appointive Positions

- a. Tape Librarian- The Tape Librarian shall be responsible for the maintenance of the tape library, selection of new material for the tape library and informing members of the new material, distribution of the tapes, replacement of lost or damaged tapes of the library, disposal of obsolete material and financial records of the library.
- b. Reference Librarian- The Reference Librarian shall be responsible for the maintenance of the reference library, selection of new material for the reference library, informing members of the new material, distribution of that material, replacement of lost or damaged material, and financial records of the library.
- c. Newsletter Editor- The Newsletter Editor shall be responsible for the publication and distribution of the newsletter. It shall be the responsibility of the newsletter editor to inform members of future meetings and that all material appearing in the newsletter is in good taste so that it does not reflect negatively on the association.
- d. Membership Chairman- The Membership Chairman shall be responsible for ensuring that all new and prospective members receive information of the benefits of membership in the association.

3. Advisory Board

The Advisory Board shall be a group whose main purpose is to give assistance to the officers in association business. The Advisory Board shall consist of the tape librarian, newsletter editor and membership chairman. The Advisory Board shall have the authority to make decisions for the association. Any decision shall become association policy but may be overruled by a 2/3 vote of the membership in attendance at the following meeting.

MEETINGS

1. Meetings will be held periodically, and at least every two months.
2. Written notices of meetings, including new business to be discussed, will be mailed to each member prior to the meetings. Other appropriate publicity of the meetings will be arranged.

AMENDMENTS AND BY-LAWS

1. These by-laws may be revised and amended by a 2/3 vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the association where written notice of such amendment has first been given to all members.

DISSOLUTION

1. The Radio Historical Association of Colorado may be dissolved by a 2/3 vote of regular members upon 30 days written notice of such action.
2. In the event of dissolution of the association, the members present shall decide about the distribution of all the associations assets.

WHAT ABOUT THE FUTURE? by John Lloyd

It seems like every year on the RHAC's anniversary, we look back on what has happened since we first started and also look ahead to see where we are going. This year will be no different.

When we first gathered at the Peacock's home in Northglenn four years ago we had nothing but a common interest in OTR. We had no library of tapes, no newsletter, etc. We just had a gratifying feeling that we would be able to form a group in order to cut down on our individual expences by buying things as a group.

Four years later, we have had over 200 reels of taped shows go through our tape library. We have a new reference library of information on almost every show ever on radio. We have had about 8 or 9 guest speakers at our meetings to share thair experiences with us. We have an excellent newsletter, full of old time radio information. We have an opportunity to get stereo repairs at discount prices.

We have had our share of failures, too. Picnics, banquets and meetings are poorly attended. Our efforts to gain new members by exhibits has failed because of lack of members support. Personnally, I consider things as failures if there isn't 100% support by our members.

What does the future look like? It is impossible to predict the future but there are a lot of things I would like to see happen. I'd like to see more individuals make contributions to the tape library, the newsletter and the reference library. I would like to see more involvement in RHAC activities, especially at the meetings. I would like to see one member assist on the newsletter with a column about second hand equipment available around the city (It would really help newer members or those on a tight budget). There are a lot of things we can all do to make things really great in the years to come. All we need is a little effort from EVERYONE.

We have come a very long way but we can go even farther in the years to come.

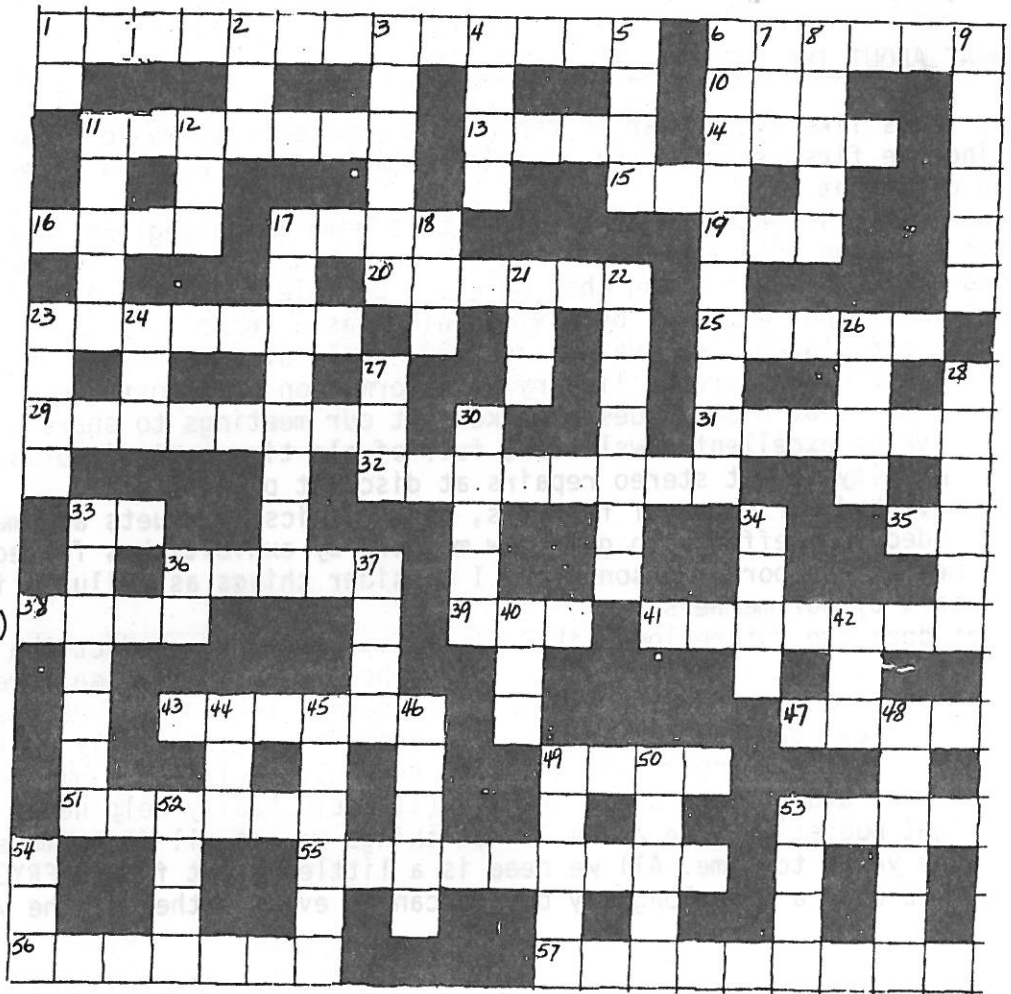
