KOA RADIO DRAMA SERIES POSTPONED. by Jerry Appleman

At the last meeting, I told you of KOA Radio's plans to begin a 13 week series of live radio dramas on May 31. My news was a bit premature. Everying was ready to go at this time except for one important factor. NO SPONSOR. With today's inflation, the cost of professionally producing a series of radio dramas was too high to attract a sponsor for broadcast on a single station. A study was made on ways to cut production costs but KOA felt that they did not want an amateurish production. To achieve a first class professional production, another route must be taken.

"October Radio Group" was formed to produce the shows.KOA would allow this production company to use the KOA studios to produce the shows and would air the shows live on KOA Radio. October Broadcast Group would then syndicate the shows to a group of other stations in a number of different markets in hopes of being able to attract a national sponsor to underwrite production costs. The local stations would get the shows "free", for airing the national commercials and would also have spots available for local sale.

To achieve this goal, "Dead Man Switch" will be used as a pilot show. The actors have all signed releases to allow the show to be used. A new opening and closing will be produced and the show will be sent to a selected number of stations, licensed for a single broadcast on each of those stations. The listeners will be asked to send their comments to the stations. If the stations receive a positive response, they will probably indicate a desire to broadcast the new series when it begins. Armed with a potential line-up of markets, October Radio will look for a national sponsor for the series.

I will try to keep you posted on the developments and, hopefully, we will be watching radio history as it happens. Out-of-town members might not to watch for the possible broadcast of "Dead Man Switch" on their cal stations.

ECHO CHAMBER

Thanks to you readers, two of the questions brought up in this column have been answered. First, the query by John Adams of Denver about a Spike Jones disc, *The Man On The Flying Trapeze* has been resolved by several letters.

From Walt Mitchell of Oriskeny, NY: "It was ten years ago, or perhaps a bit longer that I learned the following information from Spike Jones authority Randy Morris: In the first place, since stories travelling from mouth to mouth often get mixed up due to failing memories, somebody apparently told Mr. Adams the tale I learned from Randy. But whoever told it to Mr. Adams got it backward. The Man On The Flying Trapeze was not withdrawn by RCA, it was the song which replaced the song RCA withdrew from circulation shortly after it was released.

"Here's the scorecard: RCA released The William Tell Overture by Spike Jones on RCA Victor 20-2861. The flip side was Spike's version of the old vaudeville song, By The Beautiful Sea. RCA decided that a portion of the record was a joke in bad taste, and 20-2861 was recalled. The Man On The Flying Trapeze was substituted in place of By The Beautiful Sea. Then The William Tell Overture was reissued coupled with The Man On The Flying Trapeze and retaining the same catalog number (a radical departure from RCA's usual procedure in such cases)!

"As for the trouble Mr. Adams is having in locating the record, or even anyone who knows about *Trapeze*, that is the *real* mystery, I've been a Spike Jones collector for twenty years (among many other artists) and I've found *Trapeze* to be among the most easily-found Jones records. It sold well as 20-2861.

"By the way, RCA never said specifically why they withdrew By The Beautiful Sea from circulation, other than they felt it was in bad taste, but I think I can guess what the offensive gag was. The gag with no words spoken to indicate the actual outcome, involves a daredevil diver who accidently plunges to his death because somebody couldn't find the damp dishrag he was supposed to dive into!"

And from Skip Craig of Van Nuys CA more information to add to the above, "The second issue of *Trapeze* was a million-seller; the rare one is the first issue with *By The Beautiful Sea* on the flip side.

What RCA thought they heard in the lyric was, 'over and under and then up her (rear)' instead of, 'over and under and then up for air'. The 'blue' lyrics are not there, but someone at RCA thought they were and the record was recalled, causing By The Beautiful Sea to become a rarity.

"By the way, I was Spike's biggest fan from 1947 on and finally got a job touring with him from January 1951 to May 1952 until I got drafted to go to Korea. I have the largest Jones collection in the world.

"Two released sides were banned from the air, *Tennessee Waltz* and *I Went To Your Wedding*. Neither are rarities, nor recalled, nor dirty. Another rare item does exist, an unreleased Bluebird side from 1942 called *Beautiful Legs (She Sold Those Beautiful Legs)*."

Skip Craig has solved one question, but may have opened up a 'can of worms'. Now John Adams will be seeking out the three other rare sides that Skip has written about! John Adams has been in contact with Skip Craig and Walt Mitchell and reports fully:

"I think what got me off on the wrong foot at the start was the fact that the record store misled me, in the beginning. I had stepped on the 78 when it was laying on the floor and rushed down to purchase a new copy. It was then I was told that the record had been replaced with a new side. It was the record dealer who got the sides mixed, as in listening to the record I could not hear anything wrong with *Trapeze* other than what I read into my hearing.

"So by giving me the clue of *By The Beautiful Sea*, Walt and Skip have cleared up thirty-two years of the wrong search. By the way, *Trapeze* was released in the summer of 1948. I learned this by listening to a Coca Cola Spike Jones Show from that time, and they played *Trapeze* on the program. A large number of the 1948 Spike Jones Shows are available to OTR collectors.

"After 45's were issued, RCA repressed about twenty-five of his old 78's. Off hand, I think I had them all—or all which were issued from 1949 to 1951, but like all good things, the collection was passed on to a nephew and lost.

"If I recall correctly, Spike Jones released singles with RCA until 1952 or 1953. Now the question is where do I find a copy (on tape or otherwise) of William Tell Overture backed with By The

Beautiful Sea (Victor 20-2861)?

"I do have a copy of I Went To Your Wedding backed with I'll Never Work There Anymore (Victor 47-5107). Now the search is on for Tennessee Waltz and Beautiful Legs! I have received a kind offer from Skip Craig. He will furnish taped copies of the records I want, for me

"Walt Mitchell, and Skip Craig are nice persons. We need others like them to help out fellow collectors. Many, many thanks to you, too.

Dan Singer of NYC advises John that there is an RCA 33 No. J.PM 2224 entitled Thank You Music Lovers which is like a Best Of Spike Jones. On the record is Cocktails For Two, William Tell Overture, Chloe, My Old Flame, Glow Worm, None But The Lonely Heart, Laura, Man On The Flying Trapeze, (sung by Doodles Weaver 3.05), You Always Hurt The One You Love, Der Fuehrer's Face, Dance Of The Hours and Hawaiian War Chant. It should be available in most record stores.

Dan suggests that the syndicated radio show *Doctor Dimento*, heard on many rock radio stations frequently programs Spike's records.

Dave Baker of West Fargo ND sent me some information about Spike Jones, which I passed along to John Adams.

Paul Bezanker of Hartford CT has information on a repressing of Spike's records: "I have an RCA 45 (WY407) (470221) which consists of *Trapeze* and *Blowing Bubble Gum*. Above each song title: 'Little Nipper Junior Series' and 'Music Fun With Spike Jones'. The label is the old turquoise style and the vinyl is opaque yellow. It might be a part of a boxed set or one of a two-record sleeved set. Whether there's a different release number on the regular 45 single, I don't know."

Thanks so much to all of the above for being helpful, I printed so much on the Spike Jones records to prove two points. One point is that there are the kindest readers who read *Kastlemusick* and are willing to help each other. The second point is that I chose the title *Echo Chamber* as I wanted this column to be a sounding board of your thoughts. Both points have been well observed. Keep the letters coming, I'll answer every one.


