

MISSING TAPES

Recently Mr. John G. Warden of PO Box 3521, Spokane, Washington, 99220 Joined the RHAC as a result of the KOA Radio broadcast featuring some of our members. We welcome new members and hope they enjoy the use of our tape lending library. One of our rules is that the library tapes be kept out for only 1 week so that they can be circulated to all members. Mr. Warden ordered 10 tapes from the library and the librarian filled the request. When John Migrala did not receive the tapes back, he wrote to Mr. Warden and asked that the tapes be returned. After a month passed without response, he asked me to write, which I did. Still no response. I have since redubbed the missing tapes, so they are back in circulation. I asked John Lloyd to put this in Return With Us Now and highlight it in the copies he sends to other radio clubs with a request that if they are in contact with Mr. Warden to let us know if he intends to return the tapes. We also want to alert the other clubs to the fact that Mr. Warden has not responded to our inquiries or returned our tapes.

I hope Mr. Warden returns the tapes eventually; it's a shame to keep tapes instead of returning them because the word will get out and traders and clubs will not be willing to trade with any individuals who act in

this manner.

DONATED DISCS

For those of you not in attendance at the June meeting, we were given eleven 16 inch discs and fifty 12 inch discs of local radio shows. Some of the shows will be dubbed onto tapes and if the interest is there, then the members can decide whether to dub all the shows. We also received 20 discs of classical music which will be kept, but probably not dubbed. Several iscs are broken and others have no labels. Among the shows are: "Dr. Tim, Detective"; "A Dream of Freedom"; "Science Reporter": "Death Calling" and "Paul Bunyon". Thanks to Reid Hansen for arranging to pick up the discs.

Commander: Why, Sergeant?


Sergeant: Well, sir, that on board computer is just too complicated for anyone to fully understand. They seem to be able to think for themselves after they've been activated.
